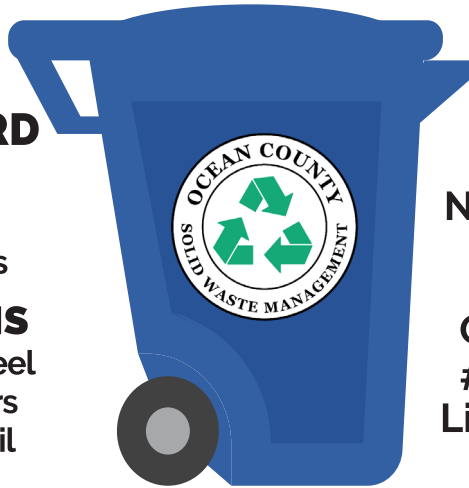

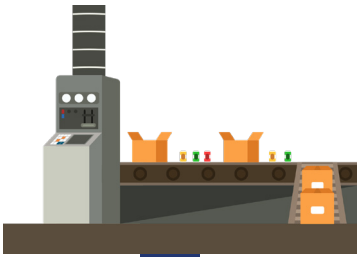
The Journey of Your Recyclables

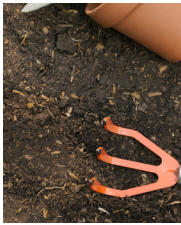


Brush Less than 4 inch diameter

Free Garden Products



Finished Leaf Compost

A great choice for intensively planted flower, shrub and vegetable beds. Compost adds organic matter back to the soil faster than mulch. Ideal to use during Spring.



Single Ground Mulch

Excellent for walkways or garden beds, great weed suppression and moisture retention.

Double Ground Mulch

Perfect for garden beds, finer mulch.

Programs are subject to the store sponsoring it, and locations might change their policy.


