WHEREAS, **CONSTITUTION WEEK**, an American observance to commemorate the adoption of the United States Constitution, was officially enacted on August 2, 1956 by President Dwight D. Eisenhower from a congressional resolution petition by the Daughters of the American Revolution; and



SECTION 1

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the **BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS** of the **COUNTY OF OCEAN** hereby requests the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to approve the insertion of an item of revenue in the Budget of the year 2024 in the sum of \$277,384.00 which item is now available as a revenue from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Attorney General, pursuant to the provisions of statute; and





WHEREAS, the federal government and the State of New Jersey have agreed to provide the Borough of Harvey Cedars (Borough) with funding to undertake the New Jersey Hurricane and Storm Reduction Projects (hereinafter "the Project"), subject to the Borough securing funding for twenty-five percent (25%) of the non-federal share cost of the Project (hereinafter "Municipal Share"); and

WHEREAS, the project is necessary in order to protect and preserve the County's beach ecosystem and to assure the continued use and enjoyment of the beachfront by the residents of Ocean County and the State in general; and

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean, in recognition of the necessity of the Project has agreed to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Borough, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:29-10 , to provide the fifteen percent (15%) Local Share, in an amount not less than \$1,241,348.69, the estimated re-nourishment cost as outlined in the State of New Jersey Project #6006-HC-R2 (see Exhibit A) and Federal Flood Control Coastal Emergency Project; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has requested the County of Ocean apply their respective grant funds from the County through the American Rescue Plan funding to be applied to their required ten percent (10%) Municipal Share of the project, in an amount not less than \$827,565.79; and

WHEREAS, funds are now available in the 2024 County Budget from the appropriation entitled "ARPA-Revenue Replacement Beach Replenishment-Long Beach Island" Account Number 016-015-4609.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the **BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS** of the **COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY**, as follows:

THIS AGREEMENT made and executed this 11th day of July, Two Thousand and Twenty Four **BY AND BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS**, a Municipal Corporation in the County of Ocean, New Jersey, hereinafter called the "Municipality", and the **STATE OF NEW JERSEY, DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION**, hereinafter called the "Department", **WATERSHED AND LAND MANAGEMENT DIVISION OF RESILIENCE ENGINEERING & CONSTRUCTION, OFFICE OF COASTAL ENGINEERING**, hereinafter called the "Office".

WHEREAS, Construction of the Barnegat Inlet to Little Egg Inlet, Long Beach Island, New Jersey Hurricane and Storm Reduction Project, hereinafter referred to as the "Project", was authorized by Section 101(a)(1) of the Water Resources Development Act of 2000, Public Law 106-541; and

WHEREAS, Section 103 of the Water Resources Development Act of 1986, Public Law 99-662, as amended, (33 U.S.C. 2213), which applies to the Project, specifies the cost sharing requirements applicable to the Project authorized by the federal government, hereinafter referred to as the "Government," through a delegation to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, hereinafter

referred to as the “Corps,” to extend Federal participation in the initial construction and periodic renourishment and construction of shore protection features of the Project for fifty years; and

WHEREAS, The Department, as the Non-Federal Sponsor, and the Corps entered into a Project Cooperation Agreement hereinafter the “2005 PCA”, for construction, operation, and maintenance of the Project on August 17, 2005, attached hereto as Appendix C-1; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the 2005 PCA, the Corps and Non-Federal Sponsor completed Phase I of the Project, defined as the initial construction of the beach and dune features of the Project in the majority of the Borough of Surf City in 2007, the Borough of Harvey Cedars in 2010, and the Brant Beach portion of the Township of Long Beach in 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Government and the Department entered into a Project Partnership Agreement, hereinafter referred to as the “ 2014 PPA,” on July 10, 2014, attached hereto as Appendix C-2, for “Phase II of the Project,” defined as the initial construction of the beach and dune features in the remaining sections of the Township of Long Beach, the Borough of Beach Haven, the Borough of Ship Bottom, and the remaining sections of the Borough of Surf City, pursuant to the requirements of Disaster Relief Appropriation Act of 20, Public Law 113-2(127 Stat.24-25), hereinafter “DRAA 13” and for periodic renourishment, operation, and maintenance of the Project, which includes the storm damage reduction features constructed pursuant to the 2005 PCA; and

WHEREAS, on July 10, 2014 the Government and the Department amended the 2015 PCA to recognize the 2014 PPA, attached as Appendix C-3; and

WHEREAS, the Department and the Corps entered into PPA Amendment No. 1 on January 16, 2018, to modify the original agreement to allow for reimbursement and crediting of real property interests taken and is attached to the original PPA in Appendix C-4; and

WHEREAS, the periodic renourishment portion of the Project is authorized for fifty years from the execution of the 2005 PCA, at a seven-year renourishment cycle, and is subject to subsequent State Aid Agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Department has the full authority to perform all of its responsibilities for the Project under New Jersey State Law PL 1992, c. 148; PL 1995, c. 19 and N.J.S.A. 12:6A-1, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality has the full authority to perform all of its responsibilities for the Project under N.J.S.A. §§ 40:56-1, et seq., 40:69A-1, et seq., and 40A:12-1, et seq. and the applicable municipal code, and the Mayor of the Municipality is duly authorized to enter this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Department and the Municipality entered into a State Aid Agreement, Project Number 6068-1, to facilitate initial construction of the Project on September 18, 2009, and entered into a State Aid Agreement, Project Number 6006-HC-R1 to facilitate construction of the first renourishment within the Municipality on January 22, 2019; and

WHEREAS, future renourishment costs over the fifty-year life of the Project are 65% federal and 35% non-federal, as set forth in the PPA. In the event of periodic renourishments, 75% of the non-federal share will be paid by the Department and the remaining 25% will be paid by the Municipality, and each future renourishment will be subject to a subsequent State Aid Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Office and the Municipality desire to enter into this State Aid Agreement, 6006-HC-R2, for the construction of the second periodic renourishment cycle of the Project within the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of the second renourishment cycle within the Municipality is projected to be \$23,644,736.93 with the Government's 65% share of such costs projected to be \$15,369,079.00 and the non-federal 35% share projected to be \$8,275,657.92, with the Department paying 75% of the non-federal share projected to be \$6,206,743.44 and the

Municipality's 25% share projected to be \$2,068,914.48 as detailed in the Project Cost Analysis, Section I, in Appendix A. This cost will include beach and dune renourishment, installation of dune crossovers, fencing, and grass within the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality requested repairs to private crossovers be completed during the renourishment cycle to be paid at 100% municipal cost; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost for these repairs is \$40,013.00 bringing the total estimated cost share for the Borough of Harvey Cedars to \$2,108,927.48 as detailed in the Project Cost Analysis, Section II, in Appendix A; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality previously provided perpetual easements for the properties listed in Appendix B necessary for public access to and use of the entire beachfront and tidal lands in the Project construction area; and

WHEREAS, as required by previous State Aid Agreement, the Municipality provides public access to the beachfront at the following street ends: Bergen Avenue, Cumberland Avenue, Cape May Avenue, Gloucester Avenue, Salem Avenue, Hudson Avenue, Passaic Avenue, Burlington Avenue, Atlantic Avenue, Mercer Avenue, Middlesex Avenue, Sussex Avenue, 73rd Street, Lee Avenue, 75th Street, 76th Street, 77th Street, 78th Street, 79th Street, 80th Street, 81st Street, 82nd Street, 83rd Street, 84th Street, 85th Street, and 86th Street. All existing agreed upon public access locations must be maintained and open to public throughout the project life; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality currently provides approximately 1,802 on-street parking spots, 158 parking spots at Sunset Park on the bayside lot between Salem and Burlington Avenues, 33 parking spots at the Municipal bayside parking lot located at 75th Street, and 20 parking spots at the Municipal Building lot located at 76th Street and Long Beach Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality currently provides restroom facilities located at Harvey Cedars Borough Hall; and

NOW THEREFORE, both parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

(1) Unless otherwise stated in this Agreement, the rights and obligations set forth in the State Aid Agreement for initial construction and any subsequently executed State Aid Agreements are still in effect.

(2) The Department will pay 75% and the Municipality will pay 25% of the funding for this renourishment phase of the Project. The total cost to the Municipality, for its share of this phase of the Project and the private crossover work, as detailed in Appendix A Section I and Appendix A Section II is **\$2,108,927.48**. The Municipality shall make full payment within 30 days of its receipt of this fully executed Agreement.

(3) All parties understand and agree that the intent of this Project is to provide shoreline stabilization and storm damage reduction along the Atlantic Ocean in the Borough of Harvey Cedars. This Project has been designed by the Corps and reviewed and approved by the Department and the Municipality. Due to natural forces and/or changing conditions, there is no guarantee that the beachfill will persist or maintain its engineering integrity and effectiveness post construction.

(4) The Municipality shall continue to acknowledge all property interests and rights previously provided to the Department necessary for construction, operation, and maintenance of the Project, as listed in Appendix B. This includes, allowing the Corps, the Office, the Department and their representatives, agents, contractors and assigns the right to access and conduct Project operations along the beachfront during and after periods of construction, surveillance, monitoring, engineering, and environmental data collection and for protection of threatened and endangered wildlife and vegetation. Project operations shall include any activities necessary for effecting or verifying any provisions of this Agreement. Should changing conditions require additional property interests necessary specifically for this phase of the Project, the Office shall identify such interests and the Municipality shall provide same prior to the start of renourishment.

(5) The Municipality shall continue to provide and maintain all existing public access and public parking. All public access resulting from the operation of this Agreement shall be provided in a nondiscriminatory manner in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey.

(6) In satisfying its obligations in this Agreement, the Municipality is responsible for any required permits and shall comply with all the Department's Coastal Zone Management Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:7 et seq.) including but not limited to: Dunes (7:7-9.16); Overwash Areas (7:7-9.17); Coastal High Hazard Areas (7:7-9.18); Erosion Hazard Areas (7:7-9.19); Beaches (7:7-9.22); Endangered or Threatened Wildlife or Plant Species Habitat (7:7-9.36); Coastal Engineering (7:7-15.11); and Public Access (7:7-16.9), as amended.

(7) The Municipality's obligation to create a Beach Management Plan for the management of Federal and State endangered species, previously agreed to in the State Aid Agreement for initial construction of the Project 6068-I, and in subsequent renourishment State Aid Agreements remain in full effect.

The federally approved management plan entitled, **Borough of Harvey Cedars Beach Management Plan, January 2010** was approved by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Department's Endangered and Nongame Species Program and adopted by Municipal resolution RESO20210-024, attached in Appendix D. The plan expired in January of 2015 and shall be reviewed, updated, approved, and adopted accordingly. The Municipality shall abide by the above referenced expired plan until it is updated and reapproved. The Municipality must make initial contact with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service within thirty (30) days of receiving the executed copy of this Agreement. The Municipality must submit a draft beach species management plan within six (6) months of making initial contact and have a final executed agreement within 6 months of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Plan approval.

(8) The Municipality as a public entity recognizes its continuing obligation to ensure compliance with the Public Trust Doctrine in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey, including N.J.S.A. 13:1D-150 through 13:1D-156, as well as enforce the public use and access rights provided for in the perpetual easements for the properties listed in Appendix B.

(9) Once any portion of the Project is completed, accepted, and conveyed, the Municipality is responsible for all future maintenance and costs associated with upkeep and repair of the Project between jointly performed beach renourishments. The Municipality is not required to independently perform Project renourishment. In order to perform certain beach and dune maintenance activities, the Municipality must have a valid beach and dune maintenance permit issued from the Department's Division of Land Resource Protection.

(10) Bulldozing, excavation, or mechanical alteration of any dune is strictly prohibited, except as permitted by the Department's Standards for Beach and Dune Activities (N.J.A.C 7:7-10) as well as its Dunes rule (N.J.A.C. 7:7-9.16).

(11) All Project costs are estimates subject to adjustment by the Federal Government, increases or decreases in equipment and material costs, and inflation, and are not to be construed as the total financial responsibilities of the Federal Government, the Department, and the Municipality. The cost of the Project may increase due to unforeseen reasons and the final cost will be based on actual cost as documented by records maintained by the Office. The cost of the Project may also increase due to requested betterments, i.e. additional work to the Project paid for at 100% cost by the non-federal sponsor at a 75% / 25% cost share or 100% by the Municipality for non-shore protection work. The Office will provide written notification to the Municipality for the Municipality's share of any increase in Project cost, prior to the closeout of the construction contract for the Project. The Municipality shall make payment within 30 days of its receipt of the written notification, unless the Office agrees to a longer time period.

(12) If the Municipality fails to provide its share of the funding in the time and manner required or otherwise breaches any obligation under this Agreement, then the Office reserves all legal recourse including but not limited to seeking injunctive relief to force compliance or commencing an action in a court of appropriate jurisdiction to obtain an accounting and to recover the State's share of any funds provided to the Municipality under this Agreement, plus interest, legal costs

and other expenses if available by law. If the Municipality fails to provide its share of the funding in the time and manner required or otherwise breaches any obligation under this Agreement, the Office reserves the right to cease its performance under this Agreement. Further, if the Municipality fails to provide its share, or any portion thereof, of the funding in the time and manner required, the Office reserves the right to withhold from the Municipality payment of funds for present or future work on any phase of the Project necessary for the Office to recover that share of the funding that the Municipality has failed to provide. Prior to instituting any action under this provision, the Office shall serve the Municipality with a written notice of the violation of the Agreement and the Municipality shall have 60 days to cure any breach or nonpayment. In addition, if the Municipality fails to perform in accordance with this Agreement, its eligibility for future shore protection funds may be impacted.

(13) If the Department fails to receive annual appropriations of the Federal share provided for under the PPA in amounts sufficient to meet the Project costs for the then current or upcoming fiscal year, the Office shall so notify the Municipality in writing, and 60 days thereafter either party may elect without penalty to terminate this Agreement or to suspend future performance under this Agreement. Such suspension shall remain in effect until such time as the Office receives sufficient appropriations or until either party elects to terminate this Agreement. Any such termination shall not relieve the parties of liability for any obligation previously incurred.

(15) The Municipality herein represents that it has complied with all conditions and obligations imposed by any prior State Aid Agreements with the Department or the Office or has entered into

a compliance schedule, which is made a part of this Agreement by reference. Unless otherwise stated in this Agreement, all previous State Aid Agreement rights and obligations remain in effect.

(16) The waiver of a breach of any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement by the Office or the Department shall not constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach. Any consent by the Office to a delay in the Municipality's performance of any obligation shall apply only to the particular transaction to which the consent to delay relates, and it shall not be applicable to any other obligation or transaction under this Agreement.

(17) If the Municipality does not fully comply with the requirements set forth in this Agreement, the Municipality will be in breach of its obligations under this Agreement unless the Office, in its sole discretion, authorizes an extension of time for compliance. If the Office elects not to extend the time for compliance, the Municipality will be deemed in breach, and the Office may exercise any remedy available to it under this Agreement or at law or equity, including a remedy to require specific performance by the Municipality of its obligations under this Agreement.

(18) In the event that any one or more of the provisions of this Agreement shall be determined to be void, invalid, or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, or by law, such determination will not render the remainder of this Agreement void, invalid, or unenforceable and the remaining provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.

(19) Nothing contained herein shall be construed so as to create rights in any third party.

(20) This Agreement will take effect upon execution by all parties and will remain in effect, except as otherwise provided in the Agreement, and can be amended by agreement of the parties.

(21) This Agreement may be executed in counterparts. This Agreement is not considered fully executed until the Department signs this Agreement. The first page of this Agreement shall reflect the effective date of this Agreement upon Department execution.

(22) This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey.




owned by the State of New Jersey and that title to any lands which cease to be flowed by the mean high tide as a result of the shore protection or dredging project remain in the State of New Jersey.

1. All "government records" as defined in N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1 are subject to public access under the Open Public Records Act ("OPRA"), unless specifically exempt.
2. A request for access to a government record under OPRA must be in writing, hand-delivered, mailed, transmitted electronically, or otherwise conveyed to the appropriate custodian, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(g). In accordance with OPRA, custodians will generally have seven (7) business days to respond, unless:
 - The requestor seeks "immediate access" records as outlined in N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(e); where the custodian must respond "immediately" disclosing responsive records not to exceed twenty-four (24) months old.
 - The requestor seeks information required to be disclosed by N.J.S.A. 47:1A-3(b), where the custodian must respond disclosing the information within twenty-four (24) hours or as a soon as practical;
 - The requestor is seeking records for a "commercial purpose" as defined in N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1, where the response time frame is fourteen (14) business days, but the custodian shall notify the requestor of the additional time within seven (7) business days, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(i). However, the response time frame can be reduced to seven (7) business days upon payment of no more than two times the cost to produce the responsive records.
