WHEREAS, Ocean County recognizes that Veterans and their families face unique issues and concerns requiring specific attention and resources; and

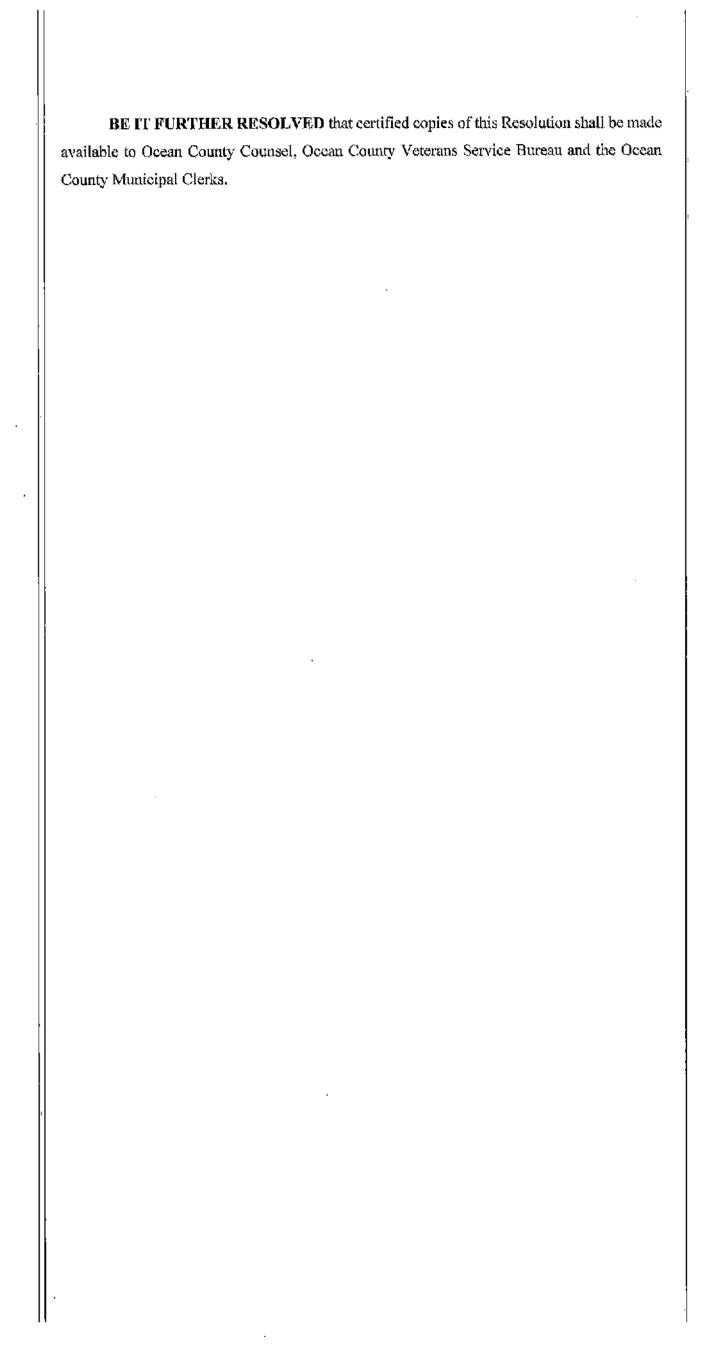

- The Ocean County Veterans Advisory Committee is hereby established to help Veterans and their families and shall consist of one Veteran member from each Ocean County municipality plus one representative from each American Legion and VFW Post within Ocean County.
- 2. The Ocean County Veterans Advisory Committee as formed, shall meet no less than quarterly in each calendar year.

ESTABLISHING THE 2025 RATE FOR OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT OF OFF-DUTY SHERIFF'S OFFICERS

December 18, 2024

WHEREAS, on February 16, 2022, the Board of Commissioners approved a resolution adopting the amended Revised Rules and Regulations for the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Sheriff's Officers, which were effective February 3, 2022; and

WHEREAS, paragraph 4. of the Revised Rules and Regulation adopted provides the rate for 2025 will be set based upon a determination of the average hourly salary of sworn officers whose titles are represented by majority representatives as of Docember 1, 2024, multiplied by 1.5, and then rounded to the next highest five-dollar increment, plus a \$15.00 administrative fee, provided the rate is not decreased from the 2024 rate; and

WHEREAS, this formula has been run by the Office of Employee Relations based upon the salaries of the sworn officers represented by majority representatives (PBA 379 and PBA 379A) as of December 1, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Employee Relations has determined the rate must increase in 2025 to be in compliance with the 2022 Rules and Regulations:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE OCEAN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY ON THIS 18th DAY OF DECEMBER 2024, AS FOLLOWS

- The Off-duty rate for the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Sheriff's Officers for the year 2025 shall be \$90.00, which represents \$75.00 payable to the officer, plus \$15.00 administrative fee.
- 2. Any outside entity seeking to engage any off-duty sheriff's officer for off-duty work shall pay the rate set forth in paragraph 1, and shall provide the necessary escrow and agreement as required by the Revised Rules and Regulations, and comply with all other Revised Rules and Regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution shall be made available to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, County Auditor, Chief Financial Officer, County Counsel, the Employee Relations Department, the Office of the Sheriff, and any applicable majority representative.

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:90-2-3, the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders established the Ocean County Youth Services Commission to provide services to juveniles in need within the County in accordance with the regulations promulgated by the State Juvenile Justice Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Youth Services Commission has revised their bylaws and has submitted same to the Ocean County Board of Commissioners for its approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY that the Board does hereby approve the amended bylaws as submitted by the Ocean County Youth Services Commission, a copy of which is attached hereto.

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ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Ocean County Youth Services Commission, (OCYSC).

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

New Jersey P.L. 1995, c.282 established county youth services commissions in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Juvenile Justice Commission (JJC). These rules published in the New Jersey Register, Subchapter 2. County Youth Services Commissions (CYSC) 13:90-2.4 through 13:90-3.11, consolidate within a single county agency (CYSC), the planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the juvenile justice service system. The CYSC will perform all the duties and responsibilities set forth in this subchapter in order to qualify for funds from the Partnership Program and/or other funds administered by the Juvenile Justice Commission, including submitting yearly applications and obtaining Juvenile Justice Commission approval of a comprehensive plan of sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent and delinquency prevention programs that promote the goals of the Partnership Program and/or other funds administered by the Juvenile Justice Commission and that satisfy all additional requirements set forth in N.J.S.A. 52:17B-180(a)(2).

These by-laws are written to be in compliance with all New Jersey State statutes and JJC rules and regulations as currently known. In the event of changes or discrepancies between these by-laws and state rules, the Ocean County Youth Services Commission (OCYSC) will conform to the state rules and regulations as they are enacted, until such time as amendments to these bylaws can be made. Reference to the "Commission" means the Ocean County Youth Services Commission. Reference to the "State Commission" or "JJC" means the state Juvenile Justice Commission.

ARTICLE III: BYLAWS REQUIREMENTS

- A. The youth services commission shall adopt bylaws and shall update the bylaws at least once every three years as well as when any changes to the provisions in this chapter have been made. The bylaws shall be submitted to the Juvenile Justice Commission annually for its review, to assure compliance with applicable rules. Bylaws must minimally include the following:
 - 1. A statement identifying which parliamentary procedures are used when conducting meetings;
 - The quorum necessary to conduct a meeting;
 - 3. The quorum necessary to vote on matters before the youth services commission, as well as what constitutes a majority for voting purposes;
 - 4. A statement that a 2/3 majority is required when voting on whether to allow a county to allocate up to 1/3 of its program component of a Partnership Grant Program allocation for county-provided sanctions and services pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:90–3.11(c)7iii;
 - 5. A description of voting procedures, including what methods of voting are permissible;
 - 6. A description of the appointment process for youth services commission members, including term limits, if any;
 - 7. A requirement that the youth services commissions follow the Senator Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6;
 - 8. A description of all committees within the youth services commission, including their roles, in accordance with the roles identified pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:90–2.7;
 - 9. A conflict of interest policy pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:90-2.9;
 - 10. The minimum annual number of meetings required to be held, which shall be no less than six meetings per year;
 - 11. A description of the permissible method(s) of conducting a meeting (for example, in person or by video conference), which must comport with N.J.A.C. 13:90–2.8; and
 - 12. A list of the duties of the youth services commission, which shall comport with the contents of this chapter.
 - 13. The Youth Services Commission may, by a vote of the commission, allow individuals who are not voting members of the YSC to sit on the committees established, provided that a voting majority of each committee shall at all times be made up of members of the county youth services commission.

ARTICLE IV: DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A. Responsibility for administering a county youth services commission, including the oversight of a designated entity designated under the provisions of N.J.A.C. 13:90-2.3, shall rest with the county in which it sits.

B. The OCYSC shall:

- 1. Make recommendations to coordinate and integrate existing sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent and delinquency prevention programs;
- 2. Assess and prioritize the needs of youth adjudicated or charged delinquent;
- 3. Assess existing delinquency prevention programs to determine whether such programs meet the needs of youth, are effective in meeting program goals and in ensuring financial accountability:
- 4. Determine, through the collection and maintenance of data, the nature and scope of juvenile delinquency and related problems in the county and identify the geographical regions within the county where such offenses and problems are most prevalent;
- 5. Propose a system of sanctions and services for youth adjudicated or charged as delinquent, that includes identifying geographical regions within the county where existing programs do not satisfy the needs of such youth, and developing proposals for closing gaps in the delivery of such sanctions and services;
- 6. Review, evaluate and monitor through at least one site visit annually, existing sanctions and services under the jurisdiction, or control of, or proposed by, the OCYSC, for juveniles adjudicated or charged delinquent and existing delinquency prevention programs to determine effectiveness in meeting program goals and in ensuring financial accountability;
- 7. Cooperate with other state, county and municipal agencies in the planning of ongoing efforts relating to the county's juvenile justice service system; delinquency prevention programs;
- 8. Inform the public of the breadth scope of juvenile offenses, the needs of youth in the county and the availability of sanctions and services, and advocate for the needs of youth by publishing the county's plan or plan update and application on its website, within 60 days of the Commission's approval of the plan or plan update and application;

- Serve as the advisory body of the county on issues relating to sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent and delinquency prevention programs;
- 10. Coordinate the efforts of municipal and regional Youth Services Commissions and ensure their participation in the county planning process, if applicable;
- 11. Appoint liaisons to participate in planning and related activities with appropriate county bodies, such as the Human Services Advisory Council, the Mental Health Board, the local Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse, and the County Children's Inter-Agency Coordinating Council (CIACC), as invited, to maximize efficient and effective use of partnership funds:
- 12. Determine whether a need exists, and if so, sponsor the establishment of a multidisciplinary team (MDT) to plan specific sanctions and services to individual youth;
 - a. As an alternative to detention for a juvenile charged as delinquent;
 - b. As a recommendation for a disposition option for a judge of the Family Court upon adjudication of delinquency; and
 - e. As a component of reentry following the commitment of a juvenile to the Juvenile Justice Commission by a judge of the Family Court;
- 13. Coordinate the planning of reentry sanctions and services for juveniles returning to the community following commitment to the Juvenile Justice Commission by a judge of the Family Court, if needed'
- 14. Recommend to the county governing body, the approval or disapproval of contracts with providers seeking to participate in the Partnership Family Court Program and any other funding administered by the Commission;
- 15. Use the Commission's web-based Juvenile Automated Management System (JAMS) for purposes of periodic reporting to the Commission of programmatic, contract and contractor, fiscal, monitoring, and all other information material to juveniles served by the Partnership/Family Court Program and any other programs administered by the Commission
- 16. Subject to review by the Executive Director, or designee, prepare and submit written monitoring reports and evaluations:

- a. Monitoring the operations of programs receiving Partnership/Family Court Program funds and/or other funds administered by the Juvenile Justice Commission for compliance with program requirements; and
- b. Evaluating the impact of those programs on targeted beneficiaries;
- 17. Encourage the involvement of youth and families in the planning of services and sanctions and program development; and
- 18. Establish and implement methods for youth, families, and the community to have input, beyond their required membership on the youth services commission articulated pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:90–2.4, in identifying the services and sanctions to be included in the comprehensive plan and plan updates.
- C. Duties and Responsibilities of the OCYSC Administrator:
 - 1. The day-to-day business of a county youth services commission shall be the responsibility of an administrator.
 - a. The administrator shall be an individual who on the basis of education and prior job experience has demonstrated an understanding of and the ability to manage public grant programs and an understanding and knowledge of the juvenile justice system and services for at-risk youth.
 - b. The youth services commission administrator shall:
 - i. In conjunction with the executive committee, draft agendas, prepare meeting materials, and identify items that require voting action;
 - ii. In conjunction with the chair of the youth services commission, ensure the youth services commission meetings follow the parliamentary procedures identified in the bylaws provided pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:90-2.6, and are in compliance with the Senator Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq.;
 - iii. Keep, or otherwise ensure accurate minutes are kept, of all youth services commission meetings;
 - iv. In conjunction with a standing committee, prepare plans and applications as required at N.J.A.C. 13:90–3.11 for youth services commission review and approval prior to submission to the Commission;

- v. Ensure the full commission is notified at the next available meeting of any budget modifications that reallocate funding in the same category and any line items which do not change the overall contract ceiling that were approved by the administrator or committee, and all other requests and supporting documentation for budget or programmatic modification are vetted through and approved by the youth services commission;
- vi. Communicate county procedures to the youth services commission that may impact their responsibilities to ensure proper planning and allocation of funding; and
- vii. Communicate to the youth services commission and its committee member's communication from the Commission to ensure transparency.
- 2. The Executive Director or designee shall review and approve reimbursement of reasonable salary costs as provided in annual program management budgets submitted as part of the annual application, for the administration of programs and services funded in whole or in part through the Commission.
- 3. The administrator shall maintain membership in, and shall regularly attend meetings of, the New Jersey Association of County Youth Services Commission Administrators.
- 4. The county shall designate such additional staff and organizational resources necessary or appropriate to administer the duties and responsibilities of its youth services commission.

ARTICLE V: MEMBERSHIP

- A. The OCYSC shall consist of no fewer than 23 voting members and shall include both voting and non-voting members.
- B. The commission shall be composed of members who have knowledge relevant to the county's population involved in, or at risk of involvement in the juvenile justice system. The membership of the Commission shall include:
 - 1. The Presiding Judge of the Family Part of the Superior Court of the vicinage within which the county is located, or, a Superior Court Family Part Judge who hears delinquency matters in the county, as his or her designee;
 - 2. The Vicinage Family Division Manager or the Assistant Family Division Manager or senior staff person, as designee;
 - 3. The Vicinage Chief Probation Officer or the vicinage assistant chief probation officer in charge of juvenile matters, as designee;
 - 4. The highest elected official of county government or other elected official, or senior staff person, as designee;
 - 5. The county prosecutor or the highest-ranking assistant prosecutor handling juvenile matters, as designee;
 - 6. The regional public defender or the highest ranking assistant public defender handling juvenile matters, as designee;
 - 7. One official from the State Agency responsible for issues of child abuse and neglect;
 - 8. The county mental health administrator;
 - 9. The county superintendent of schools;
 - 10. The superintendent of the county vocational school;
 - 11. The director of the county Human Services Department or such other department of county government directly responsible for providing services to youth;
 - 12. The director of the youth shelter located in the county;
 - 13. The administrator(s) of the detention center serving the county or for the counties that do not operate a detention center, their detention liaison;
 - 14. The director of the juvenile family crisis intervention unit established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A: 4A-76;

- 15. The president of the juvenile officers association of the county or other law enforcement representative who works primarily with youth;
- 16. The county alcoholism and drug abuse director;
- 17. A representative of the regional Workforce Investment Board (WIB), established under Executive Order No. 36 (July 12, 1995); and
- 18. A representative of the business community that serves at-risk and justice involved youth in the county;
- 19. A parent of an at-risk or justice involved youth or a representative from an organization working on behalf of parents of an at-risk or justice-involved youth;
- 20. A youth with exposure to or experience in the juvenile justice system who has not yet reached the age of 26 years;
- 21. A representative from a nonprofit community organization located in or working on behalf of one of the most densely populated areas within the county;
- 22. At least two (2), but no more than eight (8) individuals in total, from the following groups.

 These individuals should have demonstrated knowledge relevant to the county's population involved in, or at risk of involvement in, the juvenile justice system:
 - a. The education sector;
 - b. Mental health, family counseling, child advocacy, domestic violence, and/or victim's rights groups;
 - c. Parents or parent organizations;
 - d. Clergy;
 - e. Family Law practitioners, as identified by the county bar association;
 - f. The Supreme Court Committee on Diversity, Inclusion, and Community Engagement of the Administrative Office of the Courts;
 - g. Civic organizations;
 - h. Municipal youth services commissions;
 - i. Other interested persons who deal with children; and
- 23. At its discretion and based on its needed representation, up to six (6) additional individual members who have knowledge, experience, or interest in local youth, the local community, or the juvenile justice system.

- C. A Juvenile Justice Commission Court Liaison shall be a non-voting ex-officio member of a county youth services commission. In addition, one representative of each of the following state agencies may sit on a youth services commission as non-voting ex-officio members:
 - a. The Department of Human Services;
 - b. The Department of Labor and Workforce Development;
 - c. The Department of Education;
 - d. The Department of Health;
 - e. The Department of Community Affairs; and
 - f. The Department of Children and Families.
- D. Each voting member identified in (B)2 through 23 above may be represented by a designee who is qualified by knowledge and/or experience to perform the duties of a member of a youth services commission. The names of the designees shall be submitted to the youth services commission. annually.
- E. Appointments pursuant to (B)17 through 23 above shall be made in such a way as to fulfill the objective that membership of a county youth services commission reflects the racial, ethnic, and cultural demographic make-up of the youth in the county served by the sanctions, services, and delinquency prevention programs planned, implemented, monitored, and evaluated by the commission.
- F. Members should be appointed based on the county's appointment procedures, as articulated in the bylaws provided pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:90-2.6.
- G. If a single voting member fulfills two roles identified at (B)1 through 23 above, then that voting member shall only have one vote.
- H. A youth services commission may include additional non-voting members.
- I. For the purpose of approving Commission funding, vote shall be taken by roll call vote.
- J. Members shall be appointed to up to a three (3) year term of office unless appointed to an unexpired term, and then the appointment will be for the unexpired term. Members will serve without compensation and shall be eligible to succeed themselves. Statutory members will serve for the duration of time in which they hold the designated statutory position. Upon separation from their statutory position, any unexpired YSC term will be filled by the person holding that statutory title.

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ARTICLE VI: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- A. The following Conflict of Interest Policy has been submitted to the Board of Commissioners and the JIC with a written statement by County Counsel that the policy is in compliance with applicable law:
- 1. No Commission member or employee of the Commission shall have any interest in a business organization or engage in any business, transaction or professional activity that is in conflict with the proper discharge of their duties as a Commission member or employee.
- 2. No Commission member or employee shall use, or attempt to use, their official position to secure or warrant privileges or advantages for themselves or others.
- 3. No Commission member or employee shall act in their official capacity on any matter in which they, or a member of their immediate family, or business organization in which they have a direct or indirect financial interest or personal involvement.
- 4. No Commission member or employee shall undertake any employment or service, whether compensated or not, which prejudices their judgment in the exercise of their official duties as Commission member or employee.
- 5. No Commission member or employee, or member of their immediate family or business' organization in which they have a direct or indirect financial interest, shall accept or solicit any gift, favor, loan, political contribution, service promise or other thing of value whether given or offered for the purpose of influencing them, directly or indirectly, in the discharge of their official duties as Commission member or employee.
- 6. No Commission member or employee shall use, or allow to be used, their public office or employment, or any information, not generally available to the members of the public, which they acquire in the course of, or by reason of, their office or employment, for the purpose of securing financial gain for themselves, or any member of their immediate family, or any business organization with which they are associated.
- B. Members shall refrain from voting when matters being voted upon present a conflict of interest.

 No member of the Commission or any of its committees shall participate in the discussion or vote regarding the awarding of monies or any contract or budget modifications if they have any direct

- or indirect financial interest in such official action. Members of the OCYSC shall abstain from voting on matters when that individual or agency they represent may be the grant recipient.
- C. "Financial interest" is defined as the employment or board membership of the OCYSC member or their immediate family, i.e. spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, uncle, aunt, brother, sister, sister-in-law, son-in-law, or any other member of the immediate household, by any business organization funded by or affiliated with the OCYSC.
- D. "Business organization" means any corporation, partnership, firm, enterprise, franchise, association, trust, sole proprietorship, union or other legal entity.
- E. Any member may challenge a Commission member's voting privilege in a matter that could be perceived as a conflict of interest. This question will be decided by a majority vote of the then-present members.
- F. OCYSC members will be asked to evaluate, on a yearly basis, their personal relationship with any county or private agency that conceivably could apply for State/Community Partnership and Family Court Appropriations funding, or other funding that utilizes the OCYSC funding allocation process and submit a signed conflict of interest form to the YSC Administrator.

ARTICLE VII: OFFICERS

- A. A Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson shall be elected annually from the membership.
- B. In order to avoid a conflict of interest, or a perceived conflict of interest, the chairperson or vice-chairperson shall not be the supervisor of the youth services commission administrator.
- C. The Chairperson shall:
 - 1. Preside at all OCYSC meetings and decide all points of order or procedure in accordance with "Roberts Rules of Order";
 - 2. Vote on motions only in the event of a tie or when necessary to attain a quorum or minimum requirement of statute or state policy;
 - 3. Set meeting schedules and agendas;
 - 4. Call special, non-regularly scheduled meetings;
 - 5. Serve as official spokesperson for the OCYSC;
 - 6. Establish committees that may be found necessary;
 - 7. Appoint chairpersons of all standing and ad-hoc committees;
 - 8. Delegate responsibilities or tasks to committees and commission members and staff with the advice and consent of the OCYSC;
 - 9. Appoint a Nominating Committee in September to present a slate of officers in November for election by the Youth Services Commission in December;
- D. In the absence of the Chair, the Vice-Chair or a designee shall perform all of the above functions necessary to conduct a specific meeting.
- E. Officers shall be ex-officio members of all committees.

ARTICLE VIII: MEETINGS

- A. The OCYSC shall schedule and hold regular meetings in accordance with the provisions of the Senator Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq. There shall be at least six (6) full YSC meetings each year, provided that no more than nine weeks shall elapse between meetings and at such other times as deemed necessary by the chair, or by the Executive Director or Designec. No meeting shall be held unless presided over either by the chairperson or by a co-chairperson of the youth services commission. The time, date and location for OCYSC meetings shall be held at such times and in such locations as to encourage maximum public attendance and will be established annually at the last meeting of the preceding year.
 - 1. Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson, or any five (5) members of the OCYSC, provided that at least forty-eight (48) hours' notice of such meeting is given to each member and the public pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act.
 - 2. Emergency meetings of the OCYSC may be held without giving notice required by the preceding paragraph if substantial harm to the public interest is likely to result from a delay in the holding of the meeting. The subject matter of such meeting will be limited to discussion of and acting upon such matters of urgency and importance. The minutes shall reflect the urgent nature of such meeting and the reasons why the required notices were not completed.

B. Conduct of OCYSC Meetings

- 1. The OCYSC will conduct its meetings in person, but may provide at its discretion, a hybrid, on-line component. In the event that in person meetings are prohibited, virtual (on-line) meetings will be an option, otherwise, no more than half of Youth Services Commission scheduled meetings shall be held virtually.
- 2. The quorum for OCYSC meetings shall be a majority of at least one half plus one of the membership.
- Likewise, on issues pertaining to public position or policy decisions, a majority of at least one half plus one of the voting membership present shall be required.
- 4. On issues pertaining to expenditure of grant funds, a roll-call vote is required. For issues not pertaining to expenditures, a voice vote will be conducted.

- 5. If voting to allow the county to allocate up to one third (1/3) of its program component of a Partnership Grant Program allocation for county-provided sanctions and services pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:90-3.11(c)7iii, a two thirds (2/3) majority is required.
- 6. All official actions of the OCYSC shall be in the form of motions, duly seconded, and carried by a majority of the Commission members present, provided a quorum is present.
- 7. Any OCYSC member wishing to introduce an item of new business on which formal Commission action is desired, shall do so by submitting the item, as well as the proposed Commission action, in writing to the YSC Administrator at least one week prior to the regular meeting.
- C. In accordance with the provisions of the Senator Byron M. Baer, Open Public Meetings Act, all Commission meetings shall be open to the public. Members of the public shall be permitted to ask questions or make comments at such times as the Chairperson deems appropriate. Comments and questions on agenda items can be made during discussion of the motion. Non-agenda comments and information can be given during the "Announcement" portion.
- D. The order of business at OCYS Commission meetings shall include but not be limited to the following:
 - 1. Roll Call
 - 2. Approval of Minutes
 - 3. Reports of Liaisons
 - 4. Report of the MDT Chairperson
 - 5. Report of the Administrator
 - 6. Reports of Committees
 - 7. Old Business
 - 8. New Business
 - 9. Announcements
 - 10. Adjournment
- E. YSC staff shall keep minutes of all meetings of the OCYS Commission, showing the time and place, the members present, the subject considered, the actions taken, the vote of each member, the names of the members addressing the board, the names of persons appearing by attorney, and

- the findings made by the Commission and reasons therefore. A draft of the minutes shall be provided to Commission members prior to the next meeting.
- G. The minutes of the OCYS Commission shall be available for public inspection during normal business hours at the office of the Commission located at Ocean County Youth Detention Center, 165 Sunset Avenue, Toms River, New Jersey 08754-2191. A copy of the minutes of each meeting shall be provided to anyone requesting it.
- H. All meetings of the OCYS Commission shall be recorded verbatim by either stenographer, mechanical or by electronic means. Recordings may be listened to in the Commission office during normal business hours. Upon request the Commission shall furnish a transcript to any interested party at their expense.

ARTICLE IX: COMMITTEES & DUTIES

- A. Committees, subcommittees and ad-hoc committees shall be designated by the OCYSC chairperson. The chairperson(s) of each committee shall be appointed by the chairperson of the OCYSC from among the voting members of the OCYSC. Each Commissioner-appointed OCYSC member must serve on at least one committee. Committee membership may include non-voting members and any interested person with expertise in the area under study, including non-commission members. Committees shall report to the OCYSC at meetings unless otherwise directed by the chairperson of the OCYSC with consent of the full commission.
- B. The OCYSC shall have the following standing committees to consider the issues set forth in the JJC's regulations for CYSCs:
 - 1. A Bylaws, Membership, Committee, which shall,
 - a. Review OCYSC Bylaws and make modifications as needed for approval by the OCYSC, Board of Commissioners and the JJC;
 - b. Nominate candidates for Commissioner appointment to the YSC in order to ensure compliance with the bylaws and the rules and regulations governing CYSCs, in addition to the Commissioner nominations.
 - c. Accept nominations annually for YSC Chair and Vice Chair positions, and make recommendations to the YSC for approval.

2. A Monitoring & Proposal Review Committee, which shall,

- a. Monitoring and evaluation of contracted agencies providing sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent, and delinquency prevention programs, which includes: reviewing the results of each monitoring conducted by the monitoring team convened in accordance with any guidance issued by the Commission; discussing the acceptability of corrective action plans submitted by the youth services commission administrator, monitoring team, and funded providers; ensuring a process is in place to evaluate the programs and services; and providing "timely recommendations to the youth services commission for consideration as part of the decision to renew a contract.
- b. Make recommendations for renewing such contracts to the OCYSC.
- c. The review of proposals from providers seeking to provide sanctions and services

and/or delinquency prevention programs, ensuring mechanisms are in place to review and score proposals to determine whether proposals meet the requirements of the County solicitation processes, which shall include a review of prior year monitoring findings; reviewing solicitations prior to release to ensure they reflect the services and programs approved by the youth services commissions; and ensuring no conflicts of interest exist among individuals participating in the review of proposals tied to any particular solicitations.

d. Select provider agencies and make recommendations of the same to the OCYSC and the Board of Commissioners for the awarding of contracts.

3. A Needs Assessment & Program Development Committee, which shall,

- a. Develop a Comprehensive County Youth Services Plan and updates prepared in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 13"90-3.11 that includes a needs assessment of sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent, and of delinquency prevention programs. Submit the Plan to the OCYSC for approval;
- b. Analyze all relevant data pertinent to the target populations of youth and develop recommendations to enhance the service delivery system for these populations of youth and their families.
- c. Review and analyze annual data for Plan Updates and Applications; make recommendations as needed.
- d. Receive data from the Policy and Practice Committee that identifies service gaps or enhancement needs that could be met by the design of a future program blueprint, or proposed policy and practice changes;
- e. Develop future program blueprints for sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent, and the delinquency prevention programs for identified service gap areas and present to the OCYSC for approval and promulgation to interested service providers.
- f. Explore alternative funding sources for programs and services.

4. Policy, Practice, Ethnic and Racial Disparities, Legislative and Education Committee, which shall,

a. Work to ensure youth involved in the justice system have opportunities to develop into

healthy, productive adults as a result of policies, practices, and programs that maximize their chances for personal transformation, protect their legal rights, reduce their likelihood of unnecessary or inappropriate incarceration, and minimize the risks they pose to their communities by;

- i. Building and maintaining the collaboration and leadership required for the challenging work of system reform,
- ii. Relying on data to inform justice system policy and program development,
- iii. Implementing effective, objective detention admissions policies and practices,
- iv. Enhancing available alternatives to secure detention,
- v. Reducing unnecessary delays in case processing and corresponding length of stay (LOS) in detention,
- vi. Focusing on challenges presented by "special populations," including youth detained for violations of probation and warrants, and youth awaiting dispositional placement,
- vii. Identifying strategies to reduce racial disparities in the detention system, and
- viii. ensuring that youth, families, and communities are active partners in system transformation efforts, and that reform efforts expand beyond detention to all facets of the youth justice system.
- b. Evaluate and address racial and ethnic disparity in the juvenile justice system, with a focus on making recommendations regarding how to reduce racial and ethnic disparities in the county's juvenile justice system through data-driven practices, community-based programming, and coordination of system reform initiatives.
- c. Research, study and comment on all state and federal legislation that impacts on court-involved and at-risk youth. Communicate comments and concerns to state and federal legislators and advocate for legislation that is in the best interest of children and their families;
- d. Education, training and community awareness, including educating the community on the youth services commission's roles and responsibilities and developing and implementing a community engagement plan to enlist the community's participation in identifying the needs of youth and strategies to address those needs.
- c. Be comprised of any member having an interest in proposed legislation.

5. An Executive Committee, which shall,

- a. Be comprised of the OCYSC officers and the chairs and vice-chairs of all the subcommittees;
- b. Meet at the direction of the Chairperson as needed;
- c. Address executive and administrative matters, and shall set the agenda for youth services commission meetings, review committee progress and corresponding reports to be presented at the youth services commission meetings, and determine the need for and call any special meetings of the youth services commission,
- d. Examine and address long-range and systemic planning issues, or items that cross the purview of more than one committee.

ARTICLE X: CONTRACTING & APPEALS PROCESS

- A. All contracts for services will be awarded according to N.J. State Law and County of Ocean procedures, commonly known as Competitive Contracting. Included in the process is the requirement for an appeals process.
- B. The Appeals Process will be as follows:
 - 1. A description of this process will be included in the "Request for Competitive Contract Proposals." Included will be a timeline giving the dates for filing proposals, filing an appeal, when recommendations would be made to the Commission and when services would be expected to begin;
 - 2. All agencies submitting proposals are advised of the Proposal Review Committee's recommendation via email, telephone and in writing. Agencies not recommended for funding are given a brief explanation of the decision and advised of the procedures for appeal. Appeals must be submitted according to the previously stated timeline;
 - 3. The appeal must indicate that there has been a violation of a statutory or regulatory provision of the law in the award of the grant. No appeal will be heard based solely on a challenge to the evaluation of the proposal or presentation by an agency;
 - 4. An appeals committee consisting of at least three Commission members, who were not on the Proposal Review Committee, will hear the appeal. The Chairperson of the Proposal Review Committee shall be in attendance but shall not vote. The Commission may also choose to hear the appeal as a "Committee of the Whole."
 - 5. Those agencies involved in the appeal or potentially affected by the appeal will be notified and permitted ten (10) minutes each to make a presentation;
 - 6. The Committee will either uphold the Proposal Review Committee's recommendation or propose an alternate-funding plan specifying agencies to receive funding adjustments. These recommendations will be presented to the Commission for action unless the Commission acted as a "Committee of the Whole."

ARTICLE XI: ADOPTION & AMENDMENTS

- A. The OCYSC shall vote to recommend amendments, which shall be submitted to the Board of Commissioners and to the JJC for its review to assure compliance with applicable rules. Amendments shall take effect after approval by the Board of Commissioners.
- B. Amendments to the by-laws shall be made by the following process:
 - 1. Anyone wishing to suggest an amendment shall submit the change in writing to the YSC Chairperson for referral to the By-laws Committee.
 - After review, the by-laws committee shall present all proposed amendments to the OCYSC
 meeting in writing. Copies of the proposed amendments shall be distributed to members of
 the Commission at least two weeks prior to the OCYSC meeting at which it will be voted
 upon.
 - 3. Amendments must be approved by a 2/3 majority of voting members present.

ARTICLE XII: MISCELLANEOUS

- A. In the absence of any provisions herein, the proceedings of the OCYSC shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, as revised.
- B. The terms Chair and Chairperson, and Vice-Chair and Vice-Chairperson, respectively, are used interchangeably by custom or for clarity.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Transportation Advisory Committee for Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities was created by the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders to review, comment and advise the Board on matters related to transportation services for senior citizens and person with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Transportation Advisory Committee for Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities periodically makes revisions to the committee By-Laws to reflect the committee structure, roles and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, revisions to the By-Laws were previously approved by the Ocean County Transportation Advisory Committee for Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities and were subsequently formalized by action of the Board of Chosen Freeholders on May 21, 1991, September 17, 1997, February 2, 2000, February 15, 2006, April 4, 2007 and December 18, 2013.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY that the Director and Clerk of the Board are hereby authorized and directed to adopt the attached amendments to the By-Laws of the Ocean County Transportation Advisory Committee for Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities as approved at their meeting on November 19, 2024.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution shall be made available to Ocean County Department of Transportation Services, Ocean County Human Services Department, County Counsel, Ocean County Senior Services Department and NJ TRANSIT Local Programs Support Unit,

Ocean County Transportation Advisory Committee for Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities **Bv-Laws**

Article I: Purpose and Function

The purpose of the-Transportation Advisory Committee is to advise the Ocean County Board of Commissioners on the specialized transportation needs of the County and to suggest strategies to meet those needs.

The Transportation Advisory Committee duties and functions are to recommend to the Board of Commissioners strategies to maintain, improve and coordinate specialized transportation services that affect senior citizens and persons with disabilities of Ocean County. The recommendations of the Advisory Committee shall be subject to review and approval by the Board of Commissioners.

Article II: Membership

Appointment:

The Ocean County Board of Commissioners may appoint a maximum of twenty (20) Committee members. The Committee shall consist of County representatives, various social services agencies, and persons with disabilities and senior citizens. The Committee membership shall consist of 51% consumers. Consumers are defined as persons 60 years of age and older, people with disabilities and parents or legal guardians of minors with disabilities and non-professional advocates for developmentally or emotionally disabled persons.

Ex-Officio Members: Ex-Officio members will include the Ocean County Commissioner Liaison, Ocean County Transportation Services Director and the NJ TRANSIT Regional Administrator for the Central Region (Senior Citizens and Disabled Resident Transportation Assistance Program). Ex-Officio members shall not have voting authority and will not to be counted when determining a quorum.

Length of Term:

The term of appointment shall be three (3) years.

Resignation:

Members may resign from the Committee by sending a letter to the Ocean County Board of Commissioners. If a member is unable to attend a schedule meeting, the person should contact the Transportation Services Department. If a member misses three (3) unexcused absences in a row, the member could be removed from the Committee. An excused absence is defined as having notified the Transportation Services Department in advance of any meeting of your reason for not attending the meeting.

Voting:

Only official committee members may vote. Ex-officio members appointed to the Committee shall not vote.

Article III: Officers

Chairperson:

The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings and shall conduct all meetings in accordance with the current edition of "Robert's Rule of Order". The Chairperson shall serve for a term of one year.

Vice-Chairperson:

The Vice-Chairperson, shall, in the absence of the Chairperson or in the event of the Chairperson's inability to act, perform the duties of the Chairperson. The Vice Chairperson is elected for a term of one year.

Secretary:

In the absence of the Chairperson and the Vice-Chairperson the Secretary will perform the duties of the Chairperson. The Secretary is elected for a term of one year.

Election of Officers: The Chairperson will appoint a Nominating Committee of at least three (3) persons at the last scheduled meeting of the calendar year. The Nominating Committee will present a slate of officers at the first meeting of the new calendar year. Additional nominations will be taken from the floor. Election and installation of officers will occur at that same meeting. No person shall serve as an officer for more than two (2) consecutive terms in the same position.

Officer Vacancies:

Vacancies of officers will be filled by vote of the Committee members at the next regular meeting.

Article IV: Meetings

Regular Meetings:

There will be a minimum of four (4) regular meetings each year. The Ocean County Transportation Services Department staff will prepare all meeting correspondence and will record and transcribe meeting minutes. Members will receive agendas, minutes, and meeting notices by staff at least two (2) weeks in advance. The Department shall send written advance notice to the Clerk of the Board as a means of providing public notice for the Transportation Advisory Committee. Such notice shall include the time, date, location and to the extent known, the agenda of the Transportation Advisory Committee meeting. Meetings of the transportation Advisory Committee are open to the public.

Quorum:

A quorum shall be defined as a minimum of 30 percent (30%) of the then-appointed membership of the Committee. Subcommittee meetings are not required to meet quorum requirements to conduct business matters in an effort to make recommendations to the Transportation Advisory Committee.

Conduct of Meetings: The rules contained in "Roberts Rules of Order" shall govern the Committee in all cases in which they are applicable but not in which they are inconsistent with these By-Laws. County Counsel will be consulted regarding Parliamentary Procedure questions.

Article V: Adoption of the By-Laws and Amendments
