A. **STATEMENT** Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act.
John C. Bartlett, Jr., Freeholder Deputy Director, read the following statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act:

"In compliance with the 'Open Public Meetings Act', adequate notice of this Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders has been advertised in the Asbury Park Press on Saturday, November 30, 2013 and in the Press of Atlantic City on Friday, November 29, 2013 which constitutes at least 48 hours notice as required by law."

1. Call to order.

2. Roll Call.

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on August 20, 2014 at 4:01 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Deputy Director Bartlett presiding. Members Kelly, Lacey and Little were present at the call of the roll. Freeholder Director Vicari was not in attendance.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "We welcome you this meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders. As some of you may be new to this meeting, let me explain our procedure a little bit. We will go through the printed agenda forthwith. All of the items on this agenda have been previously discussed at the Board's work meeting which occurs, and is an open meeting of course, which occurs on the alternate Wednesdays of the month followed by the regular public meeting that is today. We will go through this agenda. At the conclusion of the agenda there will be comments, if any, from members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, and then I will open the meeting to public comment and I would remind you of our longstanding provision of and ask that you respect our five minute rule so that everyone who wishes to address the Board will have that opportunity. And we certainly look forward to that.

Also on the agenda there are two public hearings and they, again, are open for comments specifically on those items on those public hearings. So with that I would....well before I get to the agenda itself, you see before you a display of beautiful quilts. Freeholder Little has been working with the group and I'd like to turn the meeting over at this time to Freeholder Little to explain what's before us and what their purpose is because I think this is admirable. Freeholder Little "

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. We're very pleased today that the Board of Freeholders was invited and particularly I was invited to represent the Board before a group of wonderful ladies this morning. It's called the Peaceful Shores Quilters Guild and it is a guild of ladies, most of them are in the southern part of the County. Some on Long Beach Island. They go from Lacey Township to Waretown, Barnegat and Manahawkin, Stafford Township and some on the island and some below there. It started in 1993 and they now have 85 members. They meet, the group...half of them meet in the morning and half of them meet in the afternoon. Their goal is to make beautiful quilts and to use them to provide to nursing homes and other charitable organizations.

Well they contacted us because they had a 'Patriots Day' where they brought in several veterans, World War II Veterans and Korean War Veterans, and gave them a quilt and they asked us, the Board of Freeholders to be represented. They wanted to present us and our Veterans Bureau with these quilts and they will be given to elderly veterans in nursing homes. Two nursing homes here in Ocean County and perhaps more, but we have already contacted the Concord Nursing Home in Lakewood and the Crystal Lake Nursing Home in Bayville and they wonderfully agreed to accept these and provide them to elderly veterans in their nursing home. So, we are so proud of this group for providing these absolutely gorgeous quilts. They're handmade and they had a nice presentation and they welcomed the opportunity to honor Ocean County's veterans. So I was very pleased and honored to represent the Board this morning and Director John Dorrity.

We're going to ask the Freeholders to come up and stand behind the quilts along with John Dorrity and we're going to take a picture for our Website and if there are any veterans....I know there are a couple. Other veterans from the audience why don't you come up and join us. Anyone who's a veteran please come forward, whatever service branch you may have been in, and join us in the photograph.

Ocean County has the most veterans. We say it over and over. Mr. Director (John Dorrity) you can distribute these please and thank our veterans."

JOHN DORRITY, DIRECTOR, VETERANS SERVICE BUREAU: "Yes sir."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Gerry thank you much for that presentation and this certainly is a beautiful display and beautiful handiwork for our veterans. We thank you and the Veterans Bureau for all the work that you do. Before we actually get to the agenda I'd like to announce that I'm running the meeting as Deputy Director because Director Vicari is on vacation and has been for a few days. So it comes to me to run the meeting. I haven't done this for five years. I might be a little rusty so please bear with me. Could I then call on the Clerk of the Board to take the agenda."

C. RESOLUTION - PUBLIC HEARING

CLERK VASIL: "Next Freeholder is a Public Hearing a Resolution."

Clerk Vasil read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Before we get to the Public Hearing itself, as liaison to our County Natural Lands Trust Advisory Committee, I'll make a brief report to the public. I've made this report to the Board, but the public I'm sure is well interested in this as well.

The County was approached some time ago by Toms River Township to join with them as a junior partner in the acquisition of a 58 parcel of land formerly known as Camp Albacondo in Toms River Township. The parcel is currently owned by the Trust for Public Land. This a nationwide organization that buys environmentally sensitive land in the short run, in the interim, with the hopes of being able to market that land, to sell that land at their cost to relevant public bodies and public institutions. The Trust for Public Land in 2013 was able to purchase this land for \$4,100,000.00. I should also like to point out that a number of years before, well two years before, Green Acres, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Green Acres program had certified a market value of this land at \$5,900,000.00. So the TPL was able to buy this at a considerable discount over that formerly appraised value.

Dover Township or Toms River Township approached the County to be a junior partner. They would contribute, I believe \$2.2 million, and asked the County to contribute \$1.9 million to purchase this site. I think this map which may be a little small for the entire audience, but what we're talking about is the area in yellow. And as is quite clear from this map, all of the rest of the green is in public ownership, in the public domain. It has either been formerly purchased by the County's own Natural Lands program or it's owned by Dover Township. It is,quite clearly, a missing link to the entire corridor. This is by the way the north stem, the north branch of the Toms River going down to the river itself. So there's public land on the watershed and in the right-of-way in the stream corridor to the north. This is Winding River Park owned by Dover Township. Below it is Winding River Park. And this is, as you can see, a missing piece.

So the County's been asked to be a junior partner with Dover for \$1.9 million. We will subdivide and I have a map of that, but it's not really I think too relevant. But in the subdivision of the property, the County would take ownership of the light green area.....yes, which....do I have that right? Well anyway the County takes ownership of this area.....right this is already owned.....of this area in here which is 30 acres for \$1.9 million. Just to protect ourselves, the County did it's own appraisal of that land and that came back at over the \$1.9 million we have been asked to contribute to this project. All right, Dave McKeon, have I covered all the relevant points that I should at this time?"

DAVID MCKEON, PLANNING DIRECTOR: "Yes. I believe so."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Okay. With that brief explanation, I will now open the Public Hearing on this. This is the public's chance to weigh in on their ideas about this acquisition and I would first like to call upon Kathy Haake, the representative who has been able to put this together from the Trust for Public Land who we've done business with many times before and very efficiently and very happily."

Deputy Director Bartlett opened the Public Hearing on the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory

Committee recommendation resolution to the public for comments.

KATHY HAAKE, TRUST FOR PUBLIC LAND: "Yes. I appreciate all the efforts the Freeholders have made in the past acquisitions and I appreciate the support on this project. I'm really just here for questions if anyone has any questions. TPL's owned the property for about a year and a half in the hopes that we were going to be able to transfer it to the County and Toms River Township and we're working toward that goal."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Kathy, while you're here, since you represent TPL, one of the questions that often comes up is that if TPL already owns this, it's held, what would the TPL do if this was not purchased by the County or Toms River or someone for open space?"

KATHY HAAKE: "We're not a land holding agency. We are a facilitator. We make an effort to transfer property into public ownership for public use. If we were not able to transfer it to public ownership we would probably have to sell it on the open market and that could very well be to a developer.

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you."

KATHY HAAKE: "We wouldn't want that to happen, but that's what we would have to do if we couldn't transfer it to a public owner."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I realize that we did discuss this at our PreBoard last week, but today we are at a public meeting with everyone and it's just good to reaffirm why we are looking at this as a good purchase for our Open Space Program."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Any other questions from the Board? Are there any other comments with regard to this? Mr. Black. Your name and address for the record. I forgot to say that. I told you I was rusty."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "One thing, I know it does get cold in here."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "I get hot."

GARY BLACK: "As I've pointed out at many other, thousands of other times, that properties purchased under the Natural Lands Trust Fund, one might point out like I'm about to do now that this is all voluntary. None of this is forced. None of this is Agenda 21. None of this is something where we are forced to give up their property. All of this, even through private organizations here, to purchase property or with a Natural Lands Trust directly buys off of somebody, it is brought to them. Not the other way around. If the government and the people can agree on the price everybody goes their own merry way. Now there's a good chance that all these properties, a good large part of it would be developed. With development especially of residential housing comes cost. Aside from road improvements you have police, fire, schools. Schools should be mentioned about four times if you want to talk about cost. So even though I've heard people complain about the amounts that are here and 'Oh my God, it's overpriced'. You've heard all the crap as well as I have. No matter what the price is even though the best price is, of course, better obviously. Duh. But it will pay for itself through the services we don't have to provide as taxpayers to that property to whatever building is ever done there. That savings alone more than pays for it. And it's actually a fund that builds as time goes on. Taxpayers money has been saved again. Residential housing, especially residential housing, it brings in revenue but it actually most times is a loss, which is a loss to the taxpayers. It also increases the value of the property generally around the area. When there's less of something it goes up in value. Less buildable property means buildable property will go up in value means the people in Ocean County who own their homes, their houses will not only go up in price, but in value as well, which is two different things which a lot of people get confused on.

Again, of course I agree on all the environmental pluses with the watershed and all that. But a lot of times that's focused on....I just take a little more time to focus on the money part of it as well. This is not money going down the drain. This is not anything from anybody getting stolen. This is a win-win all the way around. It's a voluntary program. The people voted for it. It's a good system, a good program and a program that more than pays for itself. Thank you."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Black. Are there any other comments on this acquisition. Yes sir. And again, your name and address for our record."

WILLIAM GUMPER, HOLIDAY CITY, BERKELEY: "I've been on that piece of land a number of times and it is a beautiful piece of property. I mean really. I had spoken to Freeholder Vicari some time back on that property and he had mentioned that the Board of Freeholders would want to negotiate on that and be a part of the ownership of that land for the benefit of the residents of the County. The land has at least two, two large clear water ponds. Now as a former freshwater fisherman from years ago, I've found that we don't have much clear, non-salty water. So this is a blessing for the County. This area may have a third pond which I haven't looked at yet, but I know it has two clear, freshwater ponds and there's a lot of fish in those two ponds and it's just a lovely, lovely area. So I'm very pleased that this is taking place. That's so much for this one Public Hearing. I'll have something to say under, later under the public segment. Thank you."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Gumper. Are there any other comments regarding this acquisition, this proposed acquisition? Going once. Going twice. I close the Public Hearing. What is the will of the Board?"

No additional comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

On motion duly made by Freeholder Lacey, seconded by Freeholder Little, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution was adopted on final reading.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Before we move on to that. Item 15 on that resolution providing for the Issuance and Sale of County General Improvement Bonds. Let me just make some explanation for that. This is the County's annual Bond Sale. That is to say, during the course of the year we have passed various Bond Ordinances and we gather those together in one lump, if you will, and then actually go out to the bond market to sell those bonds. So we are authorizing the County CFO to sell approximately \$40 million worth of General Improvement Bonds for the County. This is somewhat higher than our normal. We have been running around \$25-\$26 million a year. That's what we are this year, however, this also includes an additional \$14 million for the County's share of improvements in the Garden State Parkway to County roads that are intersecting with the Parkway. That is the.....Jack you can help me with this."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Well much of.....many of the improvements initiate improvements on County roadways to really improve, especially in Brick Township who asked us, it improves the traffic flow within the municipality and now allows access to the Garden State Parkway on these new interchanges. So this is our share that is dedicated to County roads. This not our share of the Parkway project. We do not pay for that, the Parkway does. This is our share for what we do leading into these new interchanges. Anything I missed Frank?"

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "So that has made this sum higher than it would normally be, but we are very happy to get the Parkway improvements and to do what is our job, again, with our roads associated with them. Also, when we go out for this Bond Ordinance we will be receiving bids on Tuesday. They're electronic bids that is, and we take the lowest interest rate all told on the \$40 million issue. We are very happy that to be holding a AAA bond rating, one of the few counties in New Jersey to do that. I am intensely proud of that because Ocean County has.....what the bond rating agencies look at is your ability to repay and that's what they look at. Ocean County is not a rich county. The average family income is only 80% of state average and it is usually unlikely that a county who is in that category would be able to receive a AAA bond rating. But because of the way we have been able to manage the finances, not spending any more than we have and being very cautious about what we do borrow and what we underwrite. Even given Hurricane Sandy and a 20% reduction in our tax base, we were sweating it, but we were able to maintain the AAA bond rating. I certainly hope that when we are rated again, I can assure you that we are in better position this year than we were last year. We insured that by the fact that we have, to some degree, increased our surplus position and the rating agencies always look at that and we have by and large received most of our FEMA reimbursement that we put out on behalf of the municipalities which was over \$100 million. We've received most of that back. Most of that reimbursement. So we can show the rating agencies our very good liquidity. Liquidity means cash flow, money you can put your hands on if you have to, plus what is sometimes called a free balance or surplus, which is at a somewhat higher position this year than last year. So we've done everything we can to maintain the AAA which will decrease the cost, the interest cost on this issue. We do this every year. This is very important for the County. We only borrow the money that is actually going to go out the door in these projects. We don't borrow ahead so that we are sitting with a pile of cash that runs into arbitrage problems and we wouldn't do that. So I did want to make that report one time. Betty if you would continue."

P. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:29 PM, Freeholder Deputy Director Bartlett received the following comments from members of the Board:

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Starting with my right, Freeholder Kelly. Do you have anything for the good and welfare of the County?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Just a real brief report. You know we talked about the revisions at the (Juvenile) Detention Center. I had recently met again with our professional staff and Walt Hopson at the Detention Center to move that program along and they are in the process of developing an RFP to go out and look at that service and make decisions whether we are better to do that in-house or better to contract that out. I suggested that we look at a combination where we contract the service out for a year or two while we train under the contractor in-house employees. Both Walt Hopson and his assistant thought that was a good option to consider and they are looking at that right now."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Again, we thank you for saving money in one part of the operation so that you could begin this more effective program. And again, without spending any dollars than we spent before on this. So I certainly applaud that approach. That's what we have to be doing and thank you. Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. One of the traditions that we have begun here some time ago is when our Veterans Office receives notification from the Defense Department regarding our POWs and MIAs who we have recovered. There is a specialized office in the United States Defense Department that goes around the world looking for the remains of our lost servicemen and we simply acknowledge them very briefly and thank them and their families for their service. We have been notified that three additional servicemen, two from World War II and one from Korea.

Army Air Forces 1st Lieutenants William D. Bernier and Brian E. Poulsen, both 1st Lieutenants of the 321st Bombardment Squadron of the 5th Army Air Force, if you remember in World War II it was called the Army Air Force as opposed to just the Air Force. That change was made later after the War. They were lost on April 10, 1944 in New Guinea. Their remains were accounted for last month and plans are underway for a military burial. We were not given the place of their hometown. Usually we are. This did not accompany it.

Army Corporal Alva C. Groves who was 18. He was from Four States which is a town in West Virginia and he was assigned to Company D, 1st Battalion and he was attacked in Korea by Chinese forces and was determined to be Missing In Action. He died in captivity of the Chinese from tuberculosis.

So we thank their families and loved ones and honor them as a nation. Thank you Mr. Director."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Freeholder Lacey."

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Nothing to add Mr. Director."

Q. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5) minutes** per speaker.

At 4:33 PM, Freeholder Deputy Director Bartlett received the following comments from the public:

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "At this point I would like to open the meeting to public comment. Again, I would remind you that we would ask you to respect our five minute rule. Mr. O'Malley has contacted the Board saying that he wished to attend the meeting and be recognized. So since we heard from you, Mr. O'Malley, we would like to invite you to the microphone first. And if you would give us your name and address for the record because we may need it for some strange reason."

TOM O'MALLEY, FOUR SEASONS, LAKEWOOD: "Thank you very much for that courtesy. To reiterate some of the things that I want to say to you today, I want you to know that they come with all sincerity. I consider you political friends because I am a County Committeeman and I've supported you for over fifteen years in every election any of you have ever been in. Not only did you win handsomely in my district, but I was proud of the fact that you did. I agree because of that and because we are political friends, I think I have the right to come forward and tell you when I think you're making a huge mistake. And that mistake, gentleman, is this. Everything you people do from Mr. Kelly and all of you do an excellent job in all your departments and I'm proud to say that. But I'll tell you one thing, you really, really have to readdress the emergency part of your budget. This year I believe (inaudible) you improved it by \$2 million more and you're up to close to \$8 million I assume. Is that correct?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Eight. No. You're not correct."

TOM O'MALLY: "What is the figure?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "\$23 million."

TOM O'MALLEY: "No I'm talking about emergency shelter."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Oh. I'd have to get the......"

TOM O'MALLEY: "Well I can tell you. It was \$5 million last year. You put \$2.2 million in this year plus you got

seven hundred and some thousand dollars from the State so you're close to \$8 million. Whatever the figure might be. What I'm trying to say gentlemen is this, year in and year out you address the same issue. What you do is you put this money and I can sympathize with you, I really do because your back is against the wall. These poor souls have no place to go and right now in the County and I don't want to mention names, you know where they go, you have thirty in there full time get 60, 70, 75, 80 dollars a day millions of dollars over the years.....and I visited there twice last year. You know what? One of them told me that they couldn't even get toilet paper from management when they need it. When is the last time any of you ever really visited? And don't answer that. I mean when is the last time that you ever ran down to talk to people. Who ever talked to that woman over on Route 88 that's sitting in that room with two little children? The County's paying over \$2000 a month for her. And you know we could take a lesson out of Monmouth County and I don't want to (inaudible). They are doing a better job than we are. They really are. I'll tell you why. They're on a (inaudible) program there in Tinton Falls. They have about 27 units and they're basically somewhat like the concept of what we're trying to propose to you people. It's a little place. Just little tiny cottages. The fellow runs it and the State refers and they have about 21 young families there. Families that are supervised by Catholic Charities. They're educated. All their issues are addressed and so forth.

Here.....my group, here we are we're stationed here as Catholics with a Heart for the Homeless here in Ocean County. Proud to be in Ocean County. We got to take thousands of dollars worth of diapers, formula, all the utilities, all the things that these people need in Monmouth County. Why? Because there's no place in Ocean County that we can take that to. Oh I know you have programs all over the County and people doing it, but you don't have a central place for this. I mean why aren't you listening to what's happening all over the United States? Every county all over the United States is addressing micro-homes. The Federal Government. Private research groups will tell you the same thing. I mean everywhere you go.....I mean you're seeing these micro-homes. They're economically sound. They save the taxpayers tons of money. I can take the one that we just finished and by the way, Point Borough last night voted to allow us to display the unit in front of their borough hall. Something that you people did not agree to. Anyway, what I'm trying to say gentlemen is that it cost us \$7200 to build that unit. \$7200 with volunteer help. If I put that unit right next to that unit that you're paying over \$24,000 a year for with that woman and those children, right next door, you would save over \$20,000 just for that unit. And by the way, we can hook up the water and sewage just like all these other units could be. That's not a problem. Believe me.

What I'm trying to say gentlemen is do your research. Mr. Lee Johnson, the spokesman for HUD came out the other day and said people like you that take Federal money and you take billions of dollars every year give a careful look at my micro-homes. Give it a careful look. Leading universities are telling me that. Research groups. Everybody. I'm telling you today, not me personally, but the people I represent are telling you that. You cannot invest \$8 million this year or whatever the figure may be another year, you invested probably fifteen, twenty, maybe who knows how many millions of dollars last five, six years on emergency housing. Where is it? Did you build a building? Did you build a school? Where is it? It's gone. And I understand. These poor souls if they got that, it was only three nights and mostly in a hotel. Those people are strong. They would find a place to spend those three nights anywhere. What I'm saying is spend it more wisely. And Mr. Little, I have....I really respect you highly, but even your own pastor, Pastor Jacobs, who I met accidentally by the way, told me he wants to do the same thing with the unit we have on display now and he wants to put it at your parish. Right in your front lawn. And he told me to tell you about it so you better watch. He's got a couple people...... But anyway, what I'm saying is that....."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "I'm fine with that."

TOM O'MALLEY: "I don't understand why you gentlemen are so entrenched on just staying with our past aid programs. Believe me, you talk about AAA? That program for emergencies, that's a -P. The program I'm telling you is a AAA+ and sure program. It really is. You cannot go year in and year out spending millions and millions of dollars for something that's not working with no return. And I don't want to sound like a broken record which I know I am, but I'm telling you gentlemen you have to do this. You'd be amazed what the conversation is going out there in your own party. People are starting to look at it. Don't be afraid. Change is good and when it's good it's real good."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "With due respect may I ask you to close?"

TOM O'MALLEY: "I'll close in one second, but I must say you know that what if all of us were President of a large corporation and we went before our Board and said look, 'I want another \$8 million this year for a program and when they look at that program, the results and they look at the previous results of the program, we better have our meeting on the first floor with that window open. Believe me. And I say that in all sincerity really. Please gentlemen, revisit this. You know what it is and the only reason why I'm here is because you didn't want to talk to me in private. So I'm here to tell you don't be afraid to open up your minds a little. Change is good. Thank you very much."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "You are always welcome to come in public. Does anyone else.....what I would like to do is to stay on this topic and then we will respond to it."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Before we do, may I just say one thing to Mr. O'Malley?"

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Sure."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I just want you to know that I did get the letters of recommendation that you sent us. I was very impressed what the Senators had to say about your long term service. I got one from Senator Singer and another one...I think you sent them to me. Correct?"

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Senator Kyrillos."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Senator Kyrillos was one of the Senators. They talked about your long term service and how they've worked with you and I was very impressed with that."

TOM O'MALLEY: "Thank you."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Does anyone else wish to address this topic? Okay. Seeing none, we will close this topic and I think Freeholder Little since you are liaison to the Board of Social Services, if you would please, respond to Mr. O'Malley."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Sure. Thank you Mr. Director and as always we appreciate the many visits you have made here. To my knowledge, I have never said I wouldn't speak to you in private so I would like to correct that statement number one. And.....we don't debate back and forth. Number two....."

TOM O'MALLEY: "The letter said...the letter you sent me says that you would rather you took...."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "I never sent you a letter."

TOM O'MALLEY: "The whole Board signed off on the letter."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Okay. We are not going to have any back and forth."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "In any event, thank you for being here. We wish your project success. We have absolutely no problem with it. We are very proud that we have St. Stephen's Church in Ocean County. We have the Interfaith Hospitality Network which provides shelter. We have Family Promise. We have House of Hope. We have Church of King of Kings. We have Salvation Army. We have a brand new Samaritan House in Lakewood Township that Freeholder Kelly and I represented the Board with. And the County is funding all of those projects with the exception of one. The taxpayers of our County are funding all of those. When you get your approvals and when you get your location, you get your State Certification, you get your local Planning, we will be happy to consider funding your project as part of our network of care in the charitable organizations. Our government, our taxpayers funded programs, we are sheltering about 4000 people a night. They are predominantly in apartments and individual rental houses and some motels, about 200 or so, 260 maybe up to 300, and some boarding homes. All of those places are certified by the DCA. They are inspected annually. They are given room service. They have their own private bathroom. They have security. They have cable television, air conditioning, a kitchenette in most instances I believe. So that is the same process that is used in all of the counties and we're very proud of that. We have a good Board of Social Services. We have a Continuum of Care Committee that is responsible for that and you are welcome to participate in that program and advocate for funding. And very truthfully, we are hoping that you succeed. Just like we worked with Samaritan House. We work behind the scenes very diligently with that organization as they have gone through the process. It was actually reported that it was closed. That is not true. They are open and they are serving about ten clients I think and they discharged some and they are having great success. So we're very happy with that. And we will cooperate and participate with you. So that's what we pledge to you, that we will continue to support your efforts like we did all of these. But they didn't come to us and demand us to do something. They requested us. They got their approvals. They got their programs started. They got their team together and we cooperated with them. And, we the taxpayers of this County, are funding all of those programs. We are funding \$23 million this year to the Board of Social Services. In matching grants we get back roughly \$660 million in Federal taxpayer funding for only four major programs. Forget the rest of them. General Assistance, Medicaid, Food Stamps, TANF. We're spending \$15 million for Mental Health Services in the County. We're spending millions of dollars for Substance Abuse Treatment through our Board of Health LACADA. So we are very actively participating to support, to care for, those who need help and services in the County and we will continue to do that and we wish you every success. We are not against micro-housing in any way, whatever you want to call it. If you think about it, an individual apartment or particularly a motel room is a micro-unit. It has everything in there that you're proposing in your micro-units.

The State sets the price and that's something that's never pointed out. We don't set the price. The State sets the cost for those and all counties use motels to one degree or another. All counties use rental apartments to one degree or another. So that's the process. Can it be improved? You bet and we hope that you participate in this, that you are a willing partner and go to our Ocean County Continuum of Care Committee. You are well aware of that program. And we will cooperate and support you in way that we can. Thank you Mr. Director."

TOM O'MALLEY: "May I...."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "No sir. Are there other comments? Other people would like to address the Board."

"On this subject?"

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "I asked that before on this subject and there were no comments then. I would like to move on to other subjects. I offered that opportunity before and no one took it. Yes sir. It just makes for a more orderly meeting."

SAM FOSTER, 108 TEAKWOOD DRIVE, BRICK: "I just want to follow up on...."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "108?"

SAM FOSTER: "Oh let me speak more clearly. I'm just a little out of breath."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "That's okay."

SAM FOSTER: "Yea. I've got to lose weight. You know what I mean? I'm used to a podium here so I'm a little bit out of.....disoriented. Anyway, I want to first thank you Freeholder Bartlett on the way you are running the meeting because I've been to a lot of meetings over the years in Brick and Board of Ed public meetings and Toms River Council meetings and all of them are pretty well run, but all of you have really run meetings very well. I've complimented you about that in the past. So I wanted to compliment you. Actually give you some compliments because of what was on the resolution F-2, Ocean County College."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "The 50th Anniversary sir?"

SAM FOSTER: Yes because I attended there and I've complimented you in the past about Ocean County College. It's a great campus. Wonderful. I always tell everyone when I go there to the library because I go there a lot even though I'm not currently enrolled, they have a beautiful, beautiful library. Beautiful campus. The people at the library have always been helpful with me whenever I needed any help like when I was executor to my mother's estate. They are wonderful people. I had to do legal research and I had to do it on my own and everything. Wonderful, wonderful people and it's really good that you're recognizing a really great asset to the County. It's really wonderful because it's training and educating young minds to get them out into society to participate in our society and be effective members of society. Hopefully I've learned stuff from there. I'd like to think I did regarding my education. That's the first thing because these are wonderful people. They have great laser light shows. I'm a Pink Floyd fan and believe me Pink Floyd laser is really......no I can't go up into New York. I don't want to...I'm afraid of getting mugged up there. I hope the Mayor doesn't hear me say that about New York. My few trips to New York were not very....well they were scary. I'll put it that way. It was years ago, but.....

Well that's the first thing. So thank you very much for that. The library is a wonderful place at the College. Also all the libraries. Brick Library, we really have a wonderful educational system here in Ocean County. The library system is wonderful as well. I tell this to the people at Brick Library. I requested a DVD and even though it's got like a few hundred before me, they get it so quickly it's incredible. I say 'this is great'. Because it really is wonderful. People think library books, but there's so much more that libraries have to offer us. It's really wonderful. It really is. And I think that you Freeholders have been doing and have done a good job now and you've done a great job in the past. I really thank you.

Freeholder Bartlett I think mentioned to you that they (inaudible) in my paralegal course in the building named after you. You'll be happy to know they have the fastest elevators in the State of New Jersey. Seriously. I mean it was clean, it's wonderful, it has very fast elevators and you should take a trip there some day just to ride the elevator. I'll tell you, it's fast."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "I have to tell you a funny story about the elevator. My mother hates elevators and she was still alive when we dedicated the building and she was almost 85, but in good shape, although she passed away shortly thereafter. So we went in the first floor and I said, 'Mom, you want to take the elevator up?' She looked at me and she said, 'No I'll take the stairs.' So she did. But I'll tell you this whole Board is very proud of Ocean County College. We believe it's our job to provide the resources to the College. I don't have the map here, but we have now been successful in buying all the land through Natural Lands or whatever around the College to screen it from further development. We are very happy with the Kean and Ocean initiative which is going to provide, does provide and will continue to provide, the opportunity for a Baccalaureate Degree and even Masters programs. And that wasn't going to happen by itself. It took a lot of work and especially Freeholder Lacey with all the clearing that needed to be done. He was able to accomplish this within house, with our own Road Department. We tore up a little bit of equipment in the process, but we got it done. So we're proud of it and I can't tell you how much I appreciate your coming here and saying it. Thank you."

SAM FOSTER: "Thank you because it's also very nice....."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Can I interrupt? Sam, you may not know, but Freeholder Director was in the first class."

SAM FOSTER: "The first class at the College?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Yes. He graduated in the very first class."

SAM FOSTER: "It's also very nice with the wonderful little pond there and it's funny because I was there and I was going to register for some courses I saw a red-tail hawk flying there. It was very interesting. So it's very ecologically sound over there too. So it's very nice. And final thing I want to comment on and I think....I'm touched, (inaudible) but it keeps cutting out. (inaudible) try to save paper to be environmentally friendly.

The Garden State Parkway in Brick Township, it looks very good there. Route 70 construction is going on very well. And I see the Freeholders have done a wonderful job over the years not just with the College, the educational system, library, parks and roads you've done a very good, great job over the years. I wanted to thank you. And that's something I appreciate because I have to drive on those every day. And just one question I have though? A quick

question. My time is almost up. But I was at the Ocean County Theater and I was speaking to the people representing Cattus Island. I used to love that butterfly garden they had there. But that building there is shut down. There was damage they told me from the storm, Sandy. They're not sure about when it's going to be rebuilt. Do you know? Do you have a time schedule on that?"

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "When you've finished I will respond."

SAM FOSTER: "Okay. Do you want me to sit down?"

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "If you're done."

SAM FOSTER: "Yes. I'm done. That was my final comment. Thank you."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Very good. I'll be happy......I think maybe we have been remiss in not talking about that enough. The building suffered significant water damage, flood damage, water level damage. Obviously the County's first priority was to get the debris off the roads. And as I think we mentioned before, we spent a \$100 million of County funds for municipalities to clear debris off the roads and waiting for FEMA reimbursements to us for that work and now the municipalities are reimbursing us their 10% and we will soon be whole. But anyway, that was our first priority.

But back to the Cattus Island building. It presented us with major problems. So we had to do an engineering study to say what we should do with the building. Can we raise it? Should we raise it? How does it meet or not meet current Federal standards for ADA accessibility, etc., etc. Well anyway, that took some time, but I can report to you here's the final determination on that. The building is not...we cannot raise it. If we tore it down we could not rebuild it because of environmental restrictions so it either stays or it's gone. What we've determined to do is to, in a sense, rebuild it in place, but not to put a carpet floor. It's poured cement right now. To leave that poured cement floor and to coat it with an epoxy type coating so the water won't damage it. On the exterior and interior walls to use something like wonderboard or some of that stuff that they use in bathrooms that takes water and to move all the electricity up and all the HVAC things up into the attic. So there's nothing that could flood that would damage it again. Then we have to reconstruct the bathrooms to meet current standards because they don't. That configuration doesn't even allow it, ADA. So they have to be gutted and completely rebuilt. So the building inside needs to be reconfigured. But we now know where to go, how to go, and again, this took time for the engineering to be done on that. The building will be redone. It is next on our list. We haven't done the Bond Ordinance yet for that because we're first going to rebuild Berkeley Island.

All of these have taken time, but we didn't think they were our first priorities and we probably should have explained that better. It will be rebuilt. It will be as good as new when it is rebuilt and I apologize for the time it's taken to. We should have been saying more about that all along and that's my fault."

SAM FOSTER: "Thank you very much."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Anyone else wish to address the Board? Yes, Mr. Ryan."

TIM RYAN, 1408 ISABELLA COURT, TOMS RIVER: "I'd like to say that this Sunday published a shocking front page story that illustrated the wasteful County government and other things in the paper and read by over 136,000 readers and it has become under the leadership of Freeholder Vicari and other members of this adminstration. We all learned how County government functions as a little more than a vehicle to reward friends with powerful political politicians like Mr. Vicari and to punish anyone who dares to stand up to him. We learned in this article that Mr. Vicari's close personal friend, Joe Veni, has been harassing female County workers for quite some time and County Administrator, Carl Block, had been aware of this behavior for at least two years. And that Mr. Veni had been paid over a million dollars by the Ocean County taxpayers for the past few years for his projects. We also learned that Mr. Veni's vile and disgusting behavior was so egregious that his supervisor, William Santos, had to move his office to another location to protect female employees from his unwanted advances. And we learned that specifically the \$150,000.00 awarded to Mr. Veni's company were deliberately tailored so that he could have virtually no competition in seeking this contract. We learned that the specifications prepared by the County government required a company seeking this contract to have one single employee with four specific certifications. Let me be clear, I think that states that obviously there is no doubt in anyone's mind that these specifications were purposely written to accomplish one person to make sure that Freeholder Vicari's good friend Mr. Veni who he has declared has not been his friend, but has been reported in the paper was, was the only one who could get this lucrative contract.

There's no doubt in my mind that this contract represents a serious crime has been committed. Therefore, today I have sent letters to the United States Attorney, Mr. Fishman and to the New Jersey Attorney General, Mr. Hoffman asking them to open an immediate investigation into how these specifications were prepared and by whom, why Mr. Veni was given a free County office and a free County support staff, materials if any, were really as an independent contractor. Why did these specifications that stated clearly, said that all the potential bidders could have been aware of the significant financial savings by those offerings? In closing, I want to commend Mr. Santos for coming forward and doing the right thing, for blowing the whistle on the corruption and abuse of the County employees. And I want to call on other County employees who have been harassed or intimidated to come forward and tell us their stories. I want to assure then that every employee will no longer have to fear that their jobs will be in jeopardy because of Mr. Vicari. Mr. Vicari has his own legal troubles now and now it's the time for everyone he has hurt to step forward and speak out.

I also want to clear up one thing. When a Freeholder is absent or not here is he counted absent or excused? I notice you did neither today."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "He's not here."

TIM RYAN: "So is he absent or excused?"

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Well he's obviously absent."

TIM RYAN: "But I didn't hear that on the record."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "You don't have to hear that on the record. We took a roll call and"

TIM RYAN: "I don't know. When I was a Councilman we always put that on the record and we were told who was here and who wasn't and they were either absent or excused from the meeting."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Whatever your point is....."

TIM RYAN: "But that's another story. Thank you so much."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Thank you sir. Would anyone else like to....? Mr. Gumper."

WILLIAM GUMPER, 10 WILLEMSTAD ST., BERKELEY: "First, I've always enjoyed giving compliments because one of the requisites of good business and good diplomacy in business and throughout the world is praise publicly and criticize privately and I think that's a very accurate thing to do. I want to thank Freeholder Lacey for the very fast response when I brought up the fact that the Berkeley bridge road that goes behind the Ocean County College was in bad shape. I see now he's gotten the Public Works unit to start on reconstructing that and paving that roadway. The roadway's about, I guess about a mile, maybe a mile and a half. It's not a big roadway.

At the end of the meeting I should like to speak to the Deputy Freeholder Director privately about another matter. Thank you very much for your time fellas."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Gumper. Does anyone else wish to address the Board. Yes sir. Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "Just to cover quick things and following up. It was funny when somebody comes up here and says they're surprised where they learned about something in Asbury Park Press. That's almost funny in itself. But it's kind of funny to learn something when the last two Board Meetings I've been hearing the same speech. Boy is that new and boy, again, the Press following everything a certain party covers almost word for word all the time. Wow is that news. Maybe that's why they're in such financial shape that they're in.

But you guys know how to run a government. Look at the financial shape we're in. Some of the very towns who come up here and criticize needed to get bailed out by you from Superstorm Sandy. They constantly say that we have....there's too much surplus in the County. They're stealing from the people. We've got to give it back. No. That surplus saves us money. That saves us money in bonding. We are a growth community and as things grow, one of the things I harp about all time, and I do praise Natural Lands Trust. We have to build new roads, bridges, expand things. We have to bond to do this. This surplus that you have built up over the years through good business operations have made it so that when we do have to do these improvements the interest is less, therefore, the cost to the taxpayers is less. So the savings account is saving us money. It'sactually would be costing a lot more if we didn't have that to do what we have to do or we'd look like look what the State's done to our highways which has been virtually nothing and why we have the problems we have there.

Every year I keep hearing the phony scandals my tax dollars have to get wasted to investigate and spend money for something that never amounts to anything. We hear it every year. We heard it with Ashbritt. It was a State contract by the Corzine administration. We're hearing of some special contract again, however, one of the directors of the Corzine administration put in the paper that there was nothing illegal about that. I've done some looking into mold remediation because of the school my kids went to. And a lot of people that know mold remediation are engineers so it's not unusual. You've got to know if there's a mold problem, what started it and where it came from. It's not really rocket science. So it's not so unusual. For all the times these people come up here and criticize our County, our people, our government, when they had a crisis, did they have the money? No. They had to come to you."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Well we offered to"

GARY BLACK: "Yea, but they did come crying to you because they couldn't do it."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "No. We offered our help. I can't characterize this."

GARY BLACK: "All right. Well they would have done similar."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "We've been repaid."

GARY BLACK: "My town would have been screwed if we didn't have it. We wouldn't.....there's no way we'd have the money and because they're still paying off some of people who are standing in the room. I just get tired of year after year, you guys run government the way it's supposed to be run and people who can't and don't and repeatedly fail keep coming up here and all they know to do is to waste money attacking the town and coming up with things and we have to spend money to turn over records and it's not what was said. I'm getting tired of it. I'm tired of paying for it. And I'm getting tired of the room here that I'm paying for as a taxpayer being used for that and not the business of the County. Thank you."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Black. Does anyone else wish to address the Board? Yes sir."

MARK SPEAKER, 111 BROWN AVENUE, LAVALLETTE: "I am the President of the Lavallette Business Association. I'm here today to represent approximately 85 businesses there in the greater Lavallette area. We are having a great deal of issue since the, well obviously, since Sandy. Fortunately our town was able to, through good government, was able to be the model of how you recover from the storm such as that. Unfortunately we have not been able to recover from the DOT and the New Jersey Gas Company. I'm just here today really just to try to bring to light to you gentlemen that we have a lot of financial difficulties this year because many of you know the summer season, the tourism season, is approximately ten weeks long. We, myself, worked with the DOT Outreach Team. They have a very good Outreach Team. They are very good at communicating information that they receive. They get it to us. They bring it to me and I give it, of course, to all of my members out there. However, we have a lot of difficulties since the reconstruction of Route 35 with, I'll just say, not accurate information. That lack of accuracy led to many of our businesses being put in the hole. In 2011, we had Hurricane Irene which a lot of people forget about. We lost a couple of weeks on the end of the season. Obviously 2012, we had Sandy. 2013 we had a media blitz that pretty much buried us with the bad publicity over the shore that we had to dig out of. 2014 was shaping up pretty good and I'll be honest with you, you come over into my town there and it looks almost like business as usual except for obviously a lot of construction going on. But, what we have is the gas company for probably the past three weeks has significantly hurt the season by putting in lane closures on Highway 35 North to the point where we have milelong traffic backlogs on Route 35 North into Lavallette through the upper Ocean Beach, Normandy Beach areas.

You can only guess that when a tourist or resident comes and wants to go north to their favorite store, whatever it may be and they walk out the door and literally get half way up the town and the traffic is backed up because of this road construction that they turn around and go back to their houses and obviously our store owners lose that business. That's really just the point I want to bring to you gentlemen today is.....actually I'm meeting with the Governor's aides out there on-site because I do have businesses that will fail this year. There is simply no way. We lost three weeks of the season when they told us that Memorial Day all DOT construction would stop. I'll be very specific because that's how it was presented to us. All DOT contractors would be off the road for Memorial Day. That didn't happen and actually we were actually told the weekend of Memorial Day that yes, Commissioner Simpson came down and he said, 'Yes we're going to stop it right here and now.' That sounded really great. Then the next day we got a retraction of that comment and June 27th construction of DOT contractors finally stopped. Again, three weeks into our season.

Given approximately two to three weeks ago, the gas company they were now with their back against to the wall.....DOT contractors and the gas company are two different entities. The gas company pretty much had carte blanche to do as they will and that has significantly impacted travel through the town. We realize it's work that needs to be done. We realize and it's work that we want done, but it also became a situation where people and businesses became second thought. And again, we tried to keep an open line of communication because I try to deliver accurate information, not hearsay, not what I read here or there. It's what I get, basically, from the horse's mouth. So I just wanted to again, put you on notice that we have some significant difficulties over there financially with our businesses and as time goes on if you see information, if you see situations that you can have some input, we would greatly appreciate it. Thank you gentlemen."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you. If you don't mind Mr. Director... I appreciate that you came here today. We had someone from a motel come, from the Starlight Motel, to the last meeting. We did meet with him and I think we've been somewhat successful in helping him with the problem he had. What I would offer you, if you would like, is to meet with myself and the Engineer in my office. The County Engineer. Understanding this is not a County project, which you do. You mentioned DOT several times. However, we do have a good working relationship with the DOT and that conversation in my office and if you would bring kind of a list with you of maybe what needs to be addressed. Because I'm going to now talk with Frank about is perhaps naming someone in his office to serve as a liaison, even though it's not a County project, to help those kinds of issues where you say you're getting different information from different people. Perhaps by the County Engineer looking at what your exact questions are, we can try to make sure we get detailed answers that will be as accurate as possible. I'll do everything I can to help with that. Again, as I always give myself a little bit of an out here, this is not our project so we are not in control of it. But, in saying that, I just want to reiterate that we do have a good working relationship with the DOT and they've been very responsive to our requests up to this point and I believe they will be in the future. Though, I can't go backwards to the two different dates from Memorial Day to June 27th and I'm kind of aware of what you're talking about. They made some decisions. Their problem is trying to reach a deadline. What they are trying to accomplish is so that by next summer you don't have interference anywhere on that island with this project. They admit that they're already behind that time schedule, but they feel that they may be able to accelerate the project and that's why several of the timelines in the beginning were extended and those types of things because they're trying not to impact two summers negatively. And that's all well and good unless you put somebody out of business in the first summer and that's what you're talking about. So we'll do what we can to assist and I just ask you to understand again, not my

project so I can't guarantee the results. I can guarantee that we will be an advocate for you."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Thank you sir. Any other comments? No other comments. Mr. O'Malley you spoke before. Our policy is you speak once, however, Freeholder Little will be happy to speak with you right after the meeting."

TOM O'MALLEY: "My comments have to do with your comments."

DEPUTY BARTLETT: "Well, we don't run the meeting that way, but I'll be happy to speak with you after the meeting sir. Are there any other comments for the good and welfare of the County? If not, is there a motion to adjourn?"

R. ADJOURNMENT

There being no additional comments received, Freeholder Deputy Director Bartlett called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 5:14 PM.

ORDINANCE #2014-24

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF CENTERLINE RUMBLE STRIPS AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$1,250,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,250,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as a general improvement, the construction of centerline rumble strips at various locations, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

ESTIMATED MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST **GRANTS IN AID** AMOUNT OF **IMPROVEMENT** AND AND BONDS OR OR PURPOSE **APPROPRIATION** OTHER FUNDS **NOTES AUTHORIZED**

Construction of Centerline Rumble Strips at Various Locations, all in The County of Ocean, State of New Jersey

TOTALS \$1,250,000 \$1,250,000 \$1,250,000

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,250,000 for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. No down payment is required as this bond ordinance involves projects funded by State grants and other similar programs, within the meaning of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c).

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$1,250,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$1,250,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond

anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the August 20, 2014

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued

pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence

as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes

from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of

payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County

Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include

the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and

the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the

improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof,

prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further

reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this

bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2

hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation

Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, other

than the grant described in section 2 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the

improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of

obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which

may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and

inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of

\$1,250,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the

provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such

inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full

detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for

public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current

expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by

this Ordinance are to be issued is ten (10) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the

Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading,

and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the

Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of

New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in

N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$1,250,000 and the obligations authorized by this

Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said

purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this

Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of

the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said

bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County

hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing

in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be

obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the

obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of

Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set

forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and

corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the

date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after

introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply

with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this

Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the

Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally

adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE"

(with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under

N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19.

SECTION 15. The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County hereby covenants on behalf of the

County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.



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RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN'S GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SERIES 2014 AUTHORIZED BY BOND ORDINANCES HERETOFORE ADOPTED TO FINANCE VARIOUS GENERAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, AND PROVIDING FOR THE FORM, MATURITY DATES AND OTHER DETAILS OF SAID BONDS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "County") has adopted various bond ordinances described in Section 1 of this Resolution (collectively, the "Ordinances"), authorizing bonds and bond anticipation notes to finance a portion of the cost of the construction and reconstruction of various capital improvements and the acquisition of property in said County (collectively, the "Project"); and

Authorization of Bonds. In accordance with the Act, and for the purpose of raising funds Section 2. to finance the purposes set forth in the Ordinances, there shall be issued bonds of the County in the aggregate principal amount of \$42,707,000, unless adjusted pursuant to Section 12 hereof, pursuant to the Ordinances. All of said bonds shall constitute a single issue for purposes of the Local Bond Law and shall be designated "General Improvement Bonds, Series 2014".

Details of Bonds. The bonds will be issued in the form of one certificate for the Section 3. aggregate principal amount of bonds maturing in each year and will be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America. Each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of The Depository Trust Company ("DTC"), which will act as securities depository. The certificates will be on deposit with DTC. DTC will be responsible for maintaining a book entry system for recording the interests among its participants. The participants will be responsible for maintaining records regarding the beneficial ownership interests in the bonds on behalf of individual purchasers. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$1,000 or more through book entries made on the books and records of The DTC and its participants. The bonds will bear interest payable semiannually at a rate or rates per annum, expressed in a multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1%, as proposed by the successful bidder in accordance with the Notice of Sale authorized herein. The bonds shall be substantially in the form as provided in this Resolution, with such omissions, insertions and variations as are properly required. Section 4. Certificated Bonds; Successor Securities Depository. In the event the County determines that it is in the best interests of the beneficial owners of the bonds (the actual purchasers of the bonds) that they be able to obtain certificated bonds, the County may notify DTC of the availability of bond certificates. In such event, the County will appoint a paying agent and the County will issue, transfer and exchange bond certificates as required by DTC and others in appropriate amounts. DTC may determine to discontinue providing its services with respect to the bonds at any time by giving a reasonable amount of notice in writing to the County and discharging its responsibilities with respect thereto. In the event of such determination, if the County fails to identify another qualified securities depository as successor to DTC, the County will appoint a paying agent and the County will issue and deliver replacement bonds in the form of fully registered certificates. Whenever DTC requests the County to do so, the County will cooperate with DTC in taking appropriate action (a) to make available one or more separate certificates evidencing the bonds to any participant of DTC having bonds credited to its DTC account or (b) to arrange for another securities depository to maintain custody of certificates evidencing the bonds.

SECTION 5. Redemption. (A) The bonds maturing prior to October 1, 2025 are not subject to redemption prior to maturity.

Upon return of its Deposit, each such unsuccessful bidder shall acknowledge same by signing and returning a receipt to such effect provided by the County. If a wire transfer is used, such transfer must be completed and confirmed received by the County prior to the opening of the bids.

If a financial surety bond is used, it must be provided by an insurance company or other guarantor that is licensed and authorized to do business in New Jersey and approved by the Director. At present, the Director has approved the use of Sure-Bid, a service of Assured Guaranty Municipal Corp. Use of any other financial surety bond must be approved by the Director prior to the bid and will not be accepted by the County unless evidence of such approval is provided prior to the bid. The Deposit of the winning bidder will be applied to the purchase price of the Bonds. In the event the winning bidder fails to comply with the terms of its accepted bid, the Deposit will be retained by the County as liquidated damages. The winning bidder shall not be entitled to any interest earnings in respect of the County.

The Bonds are to be issued in book-entry only form and all bidders for the Bonds must be participants of The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, or affiliated with its participants. The Bonds will be issued in the form of one certificate for the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds maturing in each year and will be

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payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America. Each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co. as nominee of The Depository Trust Company (collectively, "DTC"). The certificates will be on deposit with DTC. DTC will be responsible for maintaining a book entry system for recording the interests of its participants or the transfer of the interests among its participants. The participants will be responsible for maintaining records regarding the beneficial ownership interests in the Bonds on behalf of the individual purchasers. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$1,000 or more through book entries made on the books and records of DTC and its participants.

The Bonds will be dated the date of delivery and will bear interest at the rate or rates of interest per annum specified by the successful bidder therefor in accordance herewith, payable on April 1, 2015 and semiannually thereafter on the first days of October and April in each year until maturity by payment to DTC.

The Bonds maturing on or after October 1, 2025 are subject to redemption, at the option of the County prior to maturity and upon notice as set forth in the Resolution, at any time on or after October 1, 2024, in whole or in part from such maturities as the County shall determine and by lot within a single maturity, at the respective redemption price of 100% of the principal amount to be redeemed together with unpaid interest accrued to the redemption date.

A bidder may aggregate consecutive principal maturities of the Bonds, for which such bidder bids the same interest rate, into term bonds. Each such term bond shall mature on the final maturity date of such consecutive maturities in an aggregate principal amount equal to the sum of the principal amounts of such consecutive maturities. The Bonds are general obligations of the County and unless paid from other sources the County is authorized and required by law to levy ad valorem taxes upon all real property taxable by the County for the payment of the Bonds and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

Each proposal submitted must name the rate or rates of interest per annum to be borne by the Bonds and the rate or rates named must be multiples of one-eighth or one-twentieth of one per centum. Not more than one rate may be named for the Bonds of the same maturity. There is no limitation on the number of rates that may be named. The difference between the lowest and the highest rates named in the proposal shall not exceed four per centum (4%). Each proposal submitted must be for all of the Bonds and the purchase price specified in the proposal must equal or exceed \$42,707,000, with a maximum bid price of \$46,977,700. - Section 16. Pledge of County. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean in the State of New Jersey is hereby pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and said bonds shall be general obligations of the County payable as to principal and interest from ad valorem taxes which may be assessed on the taxable property within said County without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 17. Determination of Average Period of Usefulness. It is hereby determined and stated that the average period of usefulness of the several purposes for which bonds are to be issued under the Ordinances described in Section 1 above, according to their respective lives, as determined in said Ordinances, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds to be issued for said several purposes, is a period of 21.71 years, computed from the date of said bonds.
- Section 18. Investment of Proceeds of Bonds. Section 19. Tax Covenants. In order to maintain the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of interest on the bonds, and for no other purpose, the County covenants to comply with each applicable requirement of the Code, applicable to the bonds,, and the County covenants not to take any action or fail to take any action which would cause the interest on the bonds to lose the exclusion from gross income for federal income taxation purposes under Section 103 of the Code. In furtherance of the covenant contained in the preceding sentence, the County agrees to comply with the Arbitrage Certificate and Letter of Instructions (the "Letter of Instructions") as to the Code delivered by Bond Counsel on the date of initial issuance and delivery of the bonds, as such letter may be amended from time to time, as a source of guidance for achieving compliance with the Code.

The County covenants and agrees with the holders of the bonds that the County shall not take any action or omit to take any action, which action or omission, if reasonably expected on the date of initial issuance and delivery of the bonds, would cause the bonds to be "private activity bonds" or "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Sections 141(a) and 148, respectively, of the Code, or any successor provision.

Section 20. <u>Bonds Not Federally Guaranteed</u>. The County covenants that it will take no action which would cause the bonds to be federally guaranteed (within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code).

Section 21. Continuing Disclosure. A Continuing Disclosure Certificate in substantially the following form is hereby approved, and the County Comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver a Continuing Disclosure Certificate on behalf of the County in substantially such form, with such insertions and changes therein as the County Comptroller may approve, such approval to be evidenced by his/her execution thereof:

CONTINUING DISCLOSURE CERTIFICATE

This Continuing Disclosure Certificate (the "Disclosure Certificate") is executed and delivered by the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Issuer") in connection with the issuance by the Issuer of \$_______ principal amount of its General Improvement Bonds, Series 2014 (the "Bonds"). The Bonds are being issued pursuant to Bond Ordinances (the "Ordinances") duly adopted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the Issuer (the "Board") on various dates, and a resolution duly adopted by the Board on August 20, 2014 (the "Resolution"). The Bonds are dated October 9, 2014 and shall mature on October 1 in the years 2015 through 20___, inclusive. The Issuer covenants and agrees as follows:

Section 1. Purpose of the Disclosure Certificate. This Disclosure Certificate is being executed and delivered by the Issuer for the benefit of the Bondholders and Beneficial Owners of the Bonds and in order to assist the Participating Underwriter in complying with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as the same may be amended from time to time ("Exchange Act").

Section 2. <u>Definitions.</u> In addition to the definitions set forth in the Resolution, which apply to any capitalized term used in this Disclosure Certificate unless otherwise defined in this Section, the following capitalized terms shall have the following meanings:

"Annual Report" shall mean any Annual Report provided by the Issuer pursuant to, and described in, Sections 3 and 4 of this Disclosure Agreement.

"Beneficial Owner" shall mean any person which (a) has the power, directly or indirectly, to vote or consent with respect to, or to dispose of ownership of, any Bonds (including persons holding Bonds through

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nominees, depositories or other intermediaries), or (b) is treated as the owner of any Bonds for federal income tax purposes.

"Bondholder" shall mean any person who is the registered owner of any Bond, including holders of beneficial interests in the Bonds.

"Continuing Disclosure Information" shall mean: (i) the Annual Report; (ii) any notice required to be filed with the MSRB pursuant to Section 5 hereof; and (iii) any notice of an event required to be filed with the MSRB pursuant to Section 3(c) hereof.

"Dissemination Agent" shall mean the Issuer, or any successor Dissemination Agent designated in writing by the Issuer and which has filed with the Issuer a written acceptance of such designation.

"Listed Events" shall mean any of the events listed in Section 5(a) of this Disclosure Certificate.

"MSRB" shall mean the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board established pursuant to Section 15B(b)(1) of the Exchange Act.

"Participating Underwriter" shall mean any of the original underwriters of the Bonds required to comply with the Rule in connection with offering of the Bonds.

"Rule" shall mean Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) adopted by the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as the same may be amended from time to time.

"State" shall mean the State of New Jersey.

Section 3. Provision of Annual Reports.

- (a) The Issuer shall, or shall cause the Dissemination Agent to, not later than nine (9) months after the end of its fiscal year, commencing with the report for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2014, provide to the MSRB in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB, an Annual Report which is consistent with the requirements of Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate. The Annual Report may be submitted as a single document or as separate documents comprising a package, and may cross-reference other information as provided in Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate; provided that the audited financial statements of the Issuer may be submitted separately from the balance of the Annual Report and later than the date required above for the filing of the Annual Report if they are not available by that date. If the Issuer's fiscal year changes, it shall give notice of such change to MSRB. Any and all items that must be included in the Annual Report may be incorporated by reference from other information that is available to the public on the MSRB's Internet Web site, or that has been filed with the SEC.
- (b) Not later than fifteen (15) Business Days prior to the date specified in subsection (a) for making available or providing the Annual Report, the Issuer shall provide the Annual Report to the Dissemination Agent (if other than the Issuer). If the Issuer is unable to provide to the MSRB an Annual Report by the date required in subsection (a), the Issuer shall, in a timely manner, send a notice to the MSRB in substantially the form attached as Exhibit A, in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB. All documents provided to the MSRB shall be accompanied by identifying information as prescribed by the MSRB.
- (c) The Dissemination Agent shall file a report with the Issuer certifying that the Annual Report has been provided to the MSRB pursuant to this Disclosure Agreement, stating the date it was provided.

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Section 4. <u>Content of Annual Reports.</u> The Issuer's Annual Report shall contain or include by reference the following:

- 1. The audited financial statements of the Issuer for the prior fiscal year, prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards (GAAS) as from time to time in effect, and as prescribed by the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State pursuant to Chapter 5 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes. If the Issuer's audited financial statements are not available by the time the Annual Report is required to be filed pursuant to Section 3(a), the Annual Report shall contain unaudited financial statements and the audited financial statements shall be filed in the same manner as the Annual Report when they become available.
- 2. The financial information and operating data set forth in the Official Statement (including Appendix A thereto) dated _______, 2014 prepared in connection with the sale of the Bonds, under the captions: "Tax Information", "Ocean County Leading Tax Ratables 2014", "County of Ocean Statement of Statutory Debt Condition _______, 2014", "List of Authorized Debt as of _______, 2014", "Debt Ratios" and "County of Ocean Schedule of Bond and Note Maturities Outstanding as of December 31, 2013".

Section 5. Reporting of Significant Events.

- (a) Pursuant to the provisions of this Section 5, the Issuer shall give, or cause to be given, notice of the occurrence of any of the following events with respect to the Bonds:
 - 1. principal and interest payment delinquencies;
 - 2. non-payment related defaults, if material;
 - 3. unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;
 - 4. unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties;
 - 5. substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
 - 6. adverse tax opinions, the issuance by the Internal Revenue Service of proposed or final determinations of taxability. Notices of Proposed Issue (IRS Form 5701-TEB) or other material notices or determinations with respect to the tax status of the security, or other material events affecting the tax status of the Bonds;
 - 7. modifications to rights of Bondholders, if material;
 - 8. Bond Calls, if material and tender offers;
 - 9. defeasances;
 - 10. release, substitution, or sale of property securing repayment of the Bonds, if material;
 - 11. rating changes.

 - The amendment or waiver does not, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, materially impair the interests of the Bondholders or Beneficial Owners of the Bonds.

In addition, if the amendment relates to the accounting principles to be followed in preparing financial statements, (i) notice of such change shall be given in the same manner as for a Listed Event under Section 5(c), and (ii) the Annual Report for the year in which the change is made should present a comparison (in narrative form and also, if feasible, in quantitative form) between the financial statements as prepared on the basis of the new accounting principles and those prepared on the basis of the former accounting principles.

Section 9. Additional Information. Nothing in this Disclosure Certificate shall be deemed to prevent the Issuer from disseminating any other information, using the means of dissemination set forth in this Disclosure Certificate or any other means of communication, or including any other information in any notice of occurrence of a Listed Event, in addition to that which is required by this Disclosure Certificate. If the Issuer chooses to include any information in any Annual Report or notice of occurrence of a Listed Event in addition to that which is specifically required by this Disclosure Certificate, the Issuer shall have no obligation under this Disclosure Certificate to update such information or include it in any future Annual Report or notice of occurrence of a Listed Event.

Section 10. <u>Default</u>. In the event of a failure of the Issuer to comply with any provision of this Disclosure Certificate any Bondholder or Beneficial Owner of the Bonds may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking mandamus or specific performance by court order, to cause the Issuer to comply with its obligations under this Disclosure Certificate. A default under this Disclosure Certificate shall not be deemed an Event of Default on the Bonds, and the sole remedy under this Disclosure Certificate in the event of any failure of the Issuer to comply with this Disclosure Certificate shall be an action to compel performance.

Section 11. <u>Duties, Immunities and Liabilities of Dissemination Agent.</u> The Dissemination Agent shall have only such duties as are specifically set forth in this Disclosure Certificate, and the Issuer agrees to indemnify and save the Dissemination Agent, its officers, directors, employees and agents, harmless against any loss, expense and liabilities which it may incur arising out of or in the exercise or performance of its powers and duties hereunder, including the costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) of defending against any claim of liability, but excluding liabilities due to the Dissemination Agent's gross negligence or wilful misconduct. The obligations of the Issuer under this Section 11 shall survive resignation or removal of the Dissemination Agent and payment of the Bonds.

Section 12. <u>Beneficiaries</u>. This Disclosure Certificate shall inure solely to the benefit of the Issuer, the Dissemination Agent, the Participating Underwriters and the Bondholders and Beneficial Owners from time to time of the Bonds, and shall create no rights in any other person or entity.

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Section 22. Defeasance. (A) If the County shall pay or shall cause to be paid or if there shall be paid otherwise to the owner of all bonds the principal and the redemption premium, if applicable, and the interest due or to become due thereon at the times and in the manner stipulated therein and in this Resolution, then, at the option of the County, the pledge of the County contained herein and all covenants, agreements and other obligations of the County to the owners of the bonds thereupon shall cease, shall terminate, shall become void and shall be discharged and satisfied. Each boat is confined to the Barnegat Bay and covers a different area of the Bay. Director Vicari stated that Ocean County's program is the best in the State and the Captains do an excellent job.

Freeholder Lacey noted that one of the things this Board discusses often is visitors to the County and Ocean County wants to make sure the visitors do the right thing when it comes to recycling. The numbers for recycling grow during the summer months due to all the visitors to the County. Freeholder Lacey stated that last summer more than 23,000 tons of material was collected, saving municipalities more than \$1.6 million. The Freeholder advised that the County encourages visitors to recycle bottles and cans in the recycling igloos before they leave. Freeholder Lacey stated that since the County opened the recycling center in Lakewood in 1991, the County has recycled more than 1,324,000 tons of material, resulting in a savings in tipping fees of over \$96 million. Freeholder Lacey also noted that the County is running the Household Hazardous Waste Program during the summer which also encourages owners of vacation homes in Ocean County to dispose of hazardous materials properly. Freeholder Lacey stated that the County is working on a program for dyeing woodchips for use around County facilities. All these programs save landfill space.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the July 2, 2014 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of July 2, 2014. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that he was at the Ocean County VoTech today for the MATES graduation. The Freeholder noted that Director Vicari did a marvelous job on this building. The Freeholder stated that the students in the MATES Program had the highest SAT scores in the County, noting that these are some of the best and brightest students. Director Vicari stated that the projects these students work on are second to none.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Lacey, seconded by Freeholder Kelly, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:32 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.
