DIRECTOR KELLY: "We're going to start with a couple of proclamations and then go on to the business portion of the meeting. Betty?"

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder. The first proclamation we have today is "American Red Cross Month" in Ocean County and if Freeholder Haines would be so kind, we have with us to accept this Kathleen Dotoli who is a Board Member and Michelle Boca, President of the Red Cross Club at Toms River High School North."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "It's definitely my honor to present this proclamation to the American Red Cross and I think the one line down at the bottom says it so well. It says 'the dedication of volunteers' and we all know that wouldn't be able to live our everyday lives if we didn't have the volunteers that go out in every capacity that we have and that give so much of themselves to advance the noble humanitarian mission of the organization.

It's so true. The American Red Cross has been around for so long and it is always there to help many, many people across the country and around the world that they go to help. Wherever there is an emergency, they've always been there. So on behalf of the Board of Chosen Freeholders it is my pleasure to present this proclamation to you."

KATHLEEN DOTOLI: "Thank you very much. Many thanks."

CLERK VASIL: "Next, Director, we have a proclamation proclaiming March 2016 as "Women Veterans Month" in

Ocean County and this will be presented by Bill Palme, who is the American Legion County Commander for Ocean County. If he would come forward and all of those women who are veterans, if they would come forward also."

Clerk Vasil reads the Women Veterans Month proclamation.

CLERK VASIL: "Freeholder Haines and Freeholder Vicari, if you would please?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "If I may, Mr. Director. Freeholder Gerry Little, liaison with Veterans and myself were contacted by Kerri Long who is a member of the New Jersey Veterans Council. She's a six-year active duty member. She was in the United States Air Force and a member of the New Jersey Veterans Service Council. When she contacted us we wanted to not only honor you, but we wanted to make it public. Kerri worked with me closely with the Vietnam Veterans when they came to Ocean County. And Kerri, we honored all of them when they came to the American Legion. Also, she acts as the Council liaison to the Commission on Women Veterans. The Lieutenant Governor personally handed this proclamation to her and this was given to the County of Ocean. She's a staunch supporter of all veterans. She served in various offices. She's very active with the Past Commander of the American Legion in Brick Memorial Post 348. And again, she has served Ocean County well as Vice-Commander and before we give the proclamation, I'm sure the Commander would want to acknowledge some of the other veterans that are here today."

BILL PALME, OCEAN COUNTY AMERICAN LEGION COMMANDER: "Good afternoon. It's so nice to be able to come here today and accept this proclamation for all of our women here in Ocean County and especially the 8000 veterans we have. Today we have Chairman of our Veterans here today. I think I have all the names and I'd like to read them all off. Freeholder Vicari already mentioned Kerri Long who is an Ex-Vice Commander of our Ocean County Executive Committee.

And we also have Bonnie Bealeu, Mary Janish, Dot Holtzman, Ann Petronaci, Barbara-Kin Hageman, Patrice Stankowski, Pam Racioppi and oh boy, I'll call her Penny, Penny (Phenelipha) Cray. And last but not least, we have a World War II woman veteran here today, Mary Karpowich."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Now you can see why we asked you to read the names!" (laughter)

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "If I may, I would like to call up John Dorrity who is our Director of the 'best in the State of New Jersey' as far as veterans. We have 68,000 veterans and every day we call up and say, 'Are the veterans happy in Ocean County?' And the answer is....."

JOHN DORRITY, DIRECTOR, OC VETERANS BUREAU: "Everybody is fine!"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "And again, Ed McBride, who helped organize and brought everyone in as part of the picture. He is the Past Commander of the Ocean County American Legion. He is very, very active and organizes many different events and I believe there will be another event which I will attend at the American Legion when I think we do this again with more women veterans. John, you have the floor."

JOHN DORRITY: "Just a few million words...... When I was in the service, less than 3% were comprised of females. Today, one in five on active duty are female and the ranks have been expanded. And I'm really happy to see everybody - grandparents with grandbabies and everything.

From Iraq to World War II, these ladies performed a great job. You know, we tend to think of them only in administrative and nursing roles and that's not actually the case. Today they're in the combat arms too. And they make some of the best chopper pilots and I know because I know some of the best chopper pilots going. I think it's the little fingers on the collective and cycling stick, but I'm not sure. But in any event, I'm very proud of Ocean County. We have the largest number of females veterans in the State of New Jersey. And I thank you Freeholders."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you all."

DOROTHY HOLTZMAN: "May I say a few words?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Sure."

DOROTHY HOLTZMAN: "I was in the Air Force for 7 years in active duty and then the Reserves 16 years. So I served 23 all together. I'm a retired Master Sergeant. I can't stay for the whole meeting, but when we step outside with the other female vets, who I didn't get your names and phone numbers, would you mind coming out to the hallway because sometimes we have get-togethers and meetings so I would like your names and phone numbers as to how to contact you. That's all. Thank you."

JOHN DORRITY: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. We'll give anybody a chance if they want to leave our meeting, you are welcome and we'll move on with the next proclamation in just a second."

This is the Annual Budget of the County of Ocean for the Fiscal Year 2016.

Be it Resolved, that the following statements of revenue and appropriations shall constitute the County Budget for the year 2016;

Be it further Resolved, that said Budget be published in the Asbury Park Press in the issue of March 25, 2016.

The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean does hereby approve the following as the Budget for the year 2016:

Total Appropriations: \$399,984,596.00 Less: Anticipated Revenues: \$66,189,772.00

Amount to be Raised by Taxation - County Purpose Tax: \$333,794,824.00

CLERK VASIL: "And, if you want to move forward."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. We'll make the comments at this point. Freeholder John Bartlett is our Chairman of our Budget Committee and did outline this budget in great detail at our PreBoard Meeting a week ago. John can't be with us today because he has an important doctor's appointment that he had to make and asked me to just give a brief overview of the Budget here today at our public meeting.

The 2016 Budget appropriates close to \$400 million in spending that will continue the core services of County government to our residents. There is a slight tax increase of .03 per \$100. What does that equate to? On a home valued at \$300,000.00 that would be an increase of about \$9.00 a year or, since we pay our taxes quarterly, about \$2.25 a quarter. So it is a relatively flat Budget, but it does anticipate important monies to the County.

Our Ocean County College and our Vo-Tech Schools will receive \$14.9 million for the County College and \$17.9 million for our Vo-Tech Schools. That includes an additional \$500,000.00 in appropriations this year. It's the first

increase for the County College in 3 or 4 years, correct?"

JULIE TARRANT, COMPTROLLER/CFO: "Almost 10 years."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Almost 10 years. That's why I have the Comptroller here. She's smarter than me.

We also look out for the needy in our County. We think that's a very important part of any County Budget. This Budget includes \$23 million for Social Services and an additional \$4.4 million for patients in State Mental Health Institutions.

We have all heard about Criminal Justice Reform the New Jersey Governor, Chris Christie, and the President of the State Senate have both talked about this Criminal Justice Reform, but with that comes a cost. So this Budget does increase staffing for our Sheriff and Prosecutor Offices in order to implement this new reform.

Funding is also provided for very important Capital Projects such as traffic signal upgrades and road reconstruction, bridge replacement and upgrades to various County Library, Vo-Tech School and College buildings.

All of this is part of this Budget. That doesn't go into talking about our County Parks system, one of the best in the State of New Jersey and continuance of funding for it. It means that all of our employee contracts will be honored by the Board of Chosen Freeholders as it should be. And we will continue to provide, as I opened with, the core services of County government.

There are no extraordinary services being increased because we are still in an economic downturn across the United States and in this State and in our own County. We are still rebounding from the effects of the Sandy hurricane just a couple of years ago and there are many people still in need. So all of that is taken into consideration. It's a very conservative budget and yet meets the needs of the all the residents of the County.

Now, I will certainly accept comments from members of the Board at this time."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Yes, Mr. Director, if I may. Just briefly, I want to thank again, Freeholder John Bartlett and the professional staff that are working so hard and diligently on this Budget. And again, several things are very, very important to us and one is controlling the debt and debt service. It's very important to any budget. And again, we could have a 5 cent tax decrease if we started to borrow money and paid for other items that we pay for cash, but again, we have stabilized our debt service. We have cut back the number of employees and that saves us money.

I think the most important thing is that we still maintain core services for our growing community. Our population goes from 565,000 in winter to 1.3 million in the summer and we still maintain core services for all of the residents of Ocean County.

Going back several years ago, the State did a report and we were number 3. The third lowest of all taxes. I'm talking about County taxes, School taxes, Local taxes, everything, we're the third lowest tax rate in the State of New Jersey. The new numbers didn't come out yet, but I'm sure we're going to be still one of the lowest tax rates and still have one of the finest quality of services and quality of life in the State of New Jersey. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Freeholder Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. I would also like to commend the staff that worked on the Budget and Freeholder Bartlett. Every year he does an outstanding job. Even though I'm new to the Freeholder Board, I know the work that John puts into it, working with everyone to make sure that we have a Budget that is going to give what is necessary for the departments and for the people of Ocean County and to keep the tax rate as low as possible. And I also thank the Department Heads for working within their budget and making sure that they stay within in and that, fortunately, nothing comes out that is unexpected.

I just also wanted to say that I think Ocean County College, I mean, it's good that we're giving something to the College. I happen to be Chairperson of the Ocean County College Foundation Board and I always say that Ocean County College is one of the best county colleges in the State along with the Parks Department, along with the Library System and everything else that we have here. It is a premier county. People don't come here because they just pick us just for no reason, they come here for specific reasons. It is a great county. It's a great place to live and to raise your children and to retire here. So I think the County and everyone does an excellent job in this particular Budget every single year and I just, again, want to thank the staff for the great job that they do. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you for your comments. And one more piece of......."

CLERK VASIL: "At this point, Freeholder, we should call for a motion and a vote."

On motion duly made by Freeholder Vicari, seconded by Freeholder Haines, the 2016 Ocean County Budget and Accompanying Resolutions were Introduced on the first reading.

CLERK VASIL: "And finally, Notice is hereby given that the Budget and Tax Resolution was approved by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean on March 16, 2016.

A Hearing on the Budge and Tax Resolution will be held at the Ocean County Administration Building, Room #119, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, New Jersey on April 6, 2016 at 4:00 PM at which time and place objections to said Budget and Tax Resolution for the year 2016 may be presented by taxpayers or other interested persons."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. And just so there is no misunderstanding, what we did today was simply Introduce the Budget. There will be a Public Hearing on this Budget. That Public Hearing will be on April 6th, which is my daughter's birthday, and we will hear any comments either positive or negative that you may have on the Budget and take appropriate action thereafter.

### T. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:24 PM, Freeholder Director Kelly received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We will now move on to comments from the Board. Do we have any comments? Freeholder Vicari."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Just one brief comment if I may, Mr. Director. Good news as far as tourism. As we know, we're one of the leaders now in the State of New Jersey. Our weekend was outstanding as far as the Saint Patrick's Day Parade. Approximately 75,000 people attended. The business industry was very, very happy with what took place as far as people spending money. It gives us a good name and a good image. And they were very happy also with the State improvements on Route 35 and the Parkway. Many people attend, of course, they come once a year. So again, we hope they come back. Our rentals for the summer are strong. The people that come into Ocean County really enjoy coming to Ocean County. So again, it's all good news.

And there have been a number of different job fairs. So our students that are here today, not only do we welcome you to attend, but there's a lot of opportunity in the tourist industry. And again, a lot of people count on the tourist industry for working here. Age 15 to age 86, there's always a job and there is full employment if you want to work in the tourist industry. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Freeholder Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Yes. On the agenda you may have noticed the First Time Homebuyers program. This program was started in 1994 and O.C.E.A.N., Inc. will be the administrator of this particular program and we will be hitting the over 500 mark for homes within Ocean County this year. It is anticipated there will be 16 applicants to be served under this program. And since, as I said, since 1994 there are 497 families that have received homes and also we're going to be hitting over the 500 as I said, but with a real estate value of over \$92 million. And we have had a total of \$4,197,540.00 in HOME Investment Partnership funding which has been allocated to the First Time Homebuyers program in Ocean County. This is a very successful program and it's giving an opportunity to people that have not had that chance to get their first home, to have their first home in Ocean County. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. I just want to welcome our students, again, to this public meeting. And I just want you to know that there are five Wednesdays in March which means next week we will not have a PreBoard Meeting. That will be on March 30th. So instead of our regular being two weeks from today, it will be three weeks from today. That's why the presentation on the Budget and the Public Hearing will be on April 6th rather than March 30th. So that you know next week is an off-week. So if you bring those papers next week I can't sign them for you. You have to wait two weeks. But, I wanted you to know that.

And the other thing, we always like to remind the students, is you get extra points if you come up and talk to us at the microphone. So are there any students who would like any public comments today? She's pointing at you."

STUDENT IN AUDIENCE: "I know!"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Are you sure you don't want to say something?"

STUDENT IN AUDIENCE: "No. I'm good. No sacrificial lamb today."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "No sacrificial lamb! We are really nice people to talk to. It's not a sacrifice."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5)** minutes per speaker.

At 4:27 PM, Freeholder Director Kelly opened the meeting to receive comments from the public as follows:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Would anyone else like to address the governing body at this point? Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "A couple of things real quick. For the young people today, as you can see now, they don't bite. You can still go up if you want. They're pretty good. Actually this is the highest powered government you can actually go up and walk up to without getting shot at. They're pretty good. It's not a problem.

Also, today we thank our female veterans. I'm glad to see that. You know, when it's under fire it doesn't matter if it's male or female, you are fighting like anybody else. It shouldn't be considered any less and I'm glad to see it. And when the bullets are flying and your survival is happening it doesn't matter. Whoever has to pick up a gun and survive will. Now, you have women in regular combat and I kind of do have mixed feelings on that......I'm a little old-fashioned. I'm chivalric. Not chauvinist. I believe that a man is supposed to protect the women. But, I understand it. A girl I dated for many years actually started off with the Bureau and wound up with the Secret Service. So I used to joke around that if she carried more fire power than an Apache helicopter, but very carefully.

And briefly on the Budget, this year you didn't say 'no surprises'. So there goes one of my lines. But, it's funny you are one part of government that doesn't blame anybody. Mainly because your Budget comes in the way it's supposed to. You set up. You have long distance planning - something no other governing body does. One thing, I think it was Joe that mentioned that we could have a tax decrease if we just borrowed more and more. Well, I live in Jackson Township and they tried that stunt in the first decade of this century and we're still paying it off. Yea. There was an artificial 3-cent tax decrease which they raved about. 'We cut your taxes. We cut your taxes.' Then the bill came and they kept buying, buying, buying. I kept saying, 'Look, your debt is going through the roof. Your growth situation is going to die. Gas prices are going to go up. (inaudible) going to come to an end and building is going to stop. Then what are you going to do?'

Well, the answer was an 18-cent tax increase. Actually, they started off with a 20-cent tax increase which the Republicans brought it down to 18 to try to fix their mess and we're still paying off their mess. So there's no free ride.

And the bond rating, which a lot of times they try to blow off, the Bond Rating saves us money. It's less money we're paying in interest and in a growth community like we are, you need that, because you do have to do some borrowing. You can't go totally pay as you grow. We're growing too fast so occasionally you do have to borrow and less interest is better. Interest is money that you really don't get anything back on."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We remember, just three years ago after the Sandy storm, when there were many needs in the County. We had surplus available to let us use to offset what happened with Sandy and to be able to help municipalities while they were awaiting reimbursement from the Federal government which they then paid back to the County government. And, for the most part, that's been paid back. I guess at 99% anyway. And we got that money back. But the way that we could make things better, quicker, was to make available the surplus dollars in the County. So the surplus is very important because it's for that unanticipated costs that can hit any local government any time. So we were able to offset the problems for many municipalities as well as for the County by making adequate use of that surplus. So it's very important. It's important as you say to the bond rating that we do have. It's something we're very proud of and worked very long and hard for.

Freeholder Bartlett and Julie Tarrant our Comptroller and the County Administrator have been working for years to develop this very stable budget. And as you mentioned, we often....and I left that for Joe to say and he forgot this year.....that there will be no surprises in this year's Budget. You usually then follow that up with the surprise is that the Budget has again come in at what is basically a flat budget. So, in this County, we look at the budget process with a long-term vision, not a year to year vision."

GARY BLACK: "And as you pointed out there have been some changes in the criminal justice system with more costs. And every once in a while you hear every few years, Trenton has what I call a comedy skit. They call it State Mandate, State Pay. They always pass it, but it never seems to happen as we've learned again. And we are able to take it because you plan ahead. There's money there. You not only have a rainy day fund, we have a washed off the face of the earth fund. The towns would have been bankrupt - both the town I live in and the town I work for - would have been flat broke and screwed. It would have been just like the storm of '62 which we were cleaning up into the '70's. This cleanup has been a miracle and happened in Ocean County because of you, not because of the State, not because of the Feds, it happened because it's you. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you for your comments. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Seeing no further comments, I'll close the public session and ask for a motion to adjourn."

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2016 budget year, any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years, and that the CY 2016 County budget for the County of Ocean be approved and adopted in accordance with this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of adoption.



Freeholder Director John C. Bartlett opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Bartlett officially welcomed Freeholder Haines to the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders. The Director noted that Freeholder Haines is no stranger to Ocean County and he was very excited she has joined the Board. Freeholder Vicari stated that this is a good thing for the Board, noting that it makes this a balanced Board whose goal is to serve the people of Ocean County. Freeholder Little noted that Freeholder Haines has worked with the State Legislature for a long time and was the highest ranking member of the Assembly. Freeholder Little wished Freeholder Haines well stating that she is a wonderful addition to this Board. Freeholder Kelly also stated that he is happy to have Freeholder

Haines join the Board of Chosen Freeholders, noting also that she has experience. Freeholder Kelly advised that she will have a great staff to work with and welcomed her aboard.

Freeholder Haines stated that she is very happy to be here and is looking forward to serving on the Board of Chosen Freeholders and to continuing at this post for a long time, working with the people of Ocean County.

Director Bartlett stated that the County suffered a huge snowstorm with coastal flooding this week, noting that it was a very heavy snow to remove. The Director stated it was a tremendous snow to remove, with considerable wear and tear on trucks and equipment. Freeholder Little stated that it is most important to thank all the County staff that was on duty for the snowstorm which included the Road Department, Vehicle Services, Buildings and Grounds as well as the Sheriff and Emergency Management. The Freeholder advised that he was on the phone the entire weekend with Tom Curcio, Road Supervisor who advised that over 200 employees were on duty with 300 trucks in use. Freeholder Little stated that approximately \$425,000 was spent by the Road Department for plowing, salt, calcium, diesel fuel and overtime. Major drifting was an issue in Plumsted and Whiting. Freeholder Little stated that the Mantoloking Bridge flag pole blew over and ended up in the Bay during the storm which closed the bridge for a short period of time. Freeholder Little thanked the Road Department and Emergency Services for a great job, stating that it is a team effort in Ocean County.

Mr. Curcio stated that this storm is still a work in progress; the Road Department is still pushing back shoulders. The Road Department is receiving some complaints regarding closing driveways up. Mr. Curcio advised that the equipment has held up well, noting that the new dump trucks made a big difference and Vehicle Services was working with the Road Department during the entire storm, keeping all vehicles going. Mr. Curcio noted that the older trucks could not take the pounding. Freeholder Little stated that brine was applied prior to the storm to help reduce icing on the roads. Mr. Curcio noted that there was some hard pack with the storm; brine was put down on the hard pack and it penetrated a little for snow removal. Freeholder Kelly stated that we received a little break with the weather after the storm with warmer temperatures and melting snow. Freeholder Haines stated that she was receiving compliments driving from Burlington County into Ocean County. Those compliments noted that Ocean County's roads were absolutely clear and wonderful.

Freeholder Vicari provided a report on activities of Buildings and Grounds (B&G) during the snowstorm, noting that B&G maintains 135 buildings with a focus on emergency facilities during the snowstorm. The Freeholder stated that the Director of B&G, Joseph Meyers did a great job clearing all 135 buildings, advising that the cost to B&G for work during the storm was approximately \$40,000. Freeholder Vicari noted that approximately 126,000 homes lost electric during the storm and JCP&L has brought everyone back online. The Freeholder also noted that Verizon customers had no TV or phones for a time during the storm. Freeholder Vicari advised that he wrote a letter to the Board of Public Utilities stating that customers should get credit when power, phone and cable is out. This should automatically be given to customers.

Director Bartlett reviewed with the Board Natural Lands Trust Fund nominations recommended by the NLTF Advisory Committee for acquisition. The first is a 25 acre parcel located in Jackson Township known as the Dove Mill Branch. The Director stated that this parcel has approval for 24 single family homes and is located in the flight path of Navy Lakehurst. Director Bartlett noted that the County received a letter from the Navy Deputy Commanding Officer at the Base suggesting that the County proceed with preserving the acquisition. The Director advised that the parcel could be eligible for reimbursement from the Department of Defense (DOD) when money becomes available. Director Bartlett also noted that this parcel is recommended in the Trust for Public Lands *Century Plan* as a significant contributor to the Barnegat Bay Watershed. The Director advised that the appraised value for the property is \$1.2 million.

Director Bartlett stated that the second parcel recommended for acquisition by the NLTF Advisory Committee is 2 acres that adjoin Cloverdale Park in Barnegat Township. The purchase price after appraisals is \$55,000. The property owner has accepted the \$55,000. David McKeon, Planning Director, was in attendance and advised that this is a buildable parcel; however, the street would have to be improved. Freeholder Vicari stated that he is meeting at the Joint Base tomorrow at 4:00. The Freeholder noted that buildings can not infringe on Base operations. The Freeholder requested a larger copy of the map of Dove Mill Branch. Mr. McKeon will provide the Freeholder. Director Bartlett stated that the more that is preserved near the Base, the less likely there will be complaints.

Both parcels will be listed for acquisition at the Board meeting of February 3, 2016.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the advertisement for the construction of traffic signal upgrades on Long Beach Boulevard in Long Beach Township. Freeholder Kelly stated that Long Beach Township is participating in the project costs, noting that the project includes intersections of Township and County roads. The upgrades are being done to allow for safe passage across the street during busy times of the year. The Freeholder noted that this project has been in the works for two years. Freeholder Vicari stated that the municipality pays for the electric for the traffic lights and the County maintains the lights. Administrator Block advised that LED signals are used which reduces the electric costs. Mr. Ernst advised that 23 signals in total will be upgraded, 9 of which will be completed by Memorial Day, and the total cost this year will be \$2.1 million for the 9 signals. The County's share is \$1.6 million. There were no questions or additional comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the February 3, 2016 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of February 3, 2016. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly asked the Board members for comments.

Administrator Block advised that the County's general email box, received correspondence that mentioned the Board of Health and the banning of puppy and kitten mills. The Administrator advised that he met with representatives of the group and the group is looking for this Board to show its support by passing a resolution banning puppy mills. Mr. Block stated that Ocean County has no direct jurisdiction. Steve Scaturro, Director of Consumer Affairs, also attended the meeting. Freeholder Little stated that he would like a resolution added to the agenda. Director Bartlett thanked Gerry Little for bringing this to the Board; however, he felt it should be clear in the resolution that the County has no jurisdiction over this, but supports their efforts to ban puppy mills. A resolution will be added to the agenda of February 3, 2016 at the request of Freeholder Little, urging the regulation of puppy mills and noting that the County does not have direct jurisdiction.

There were no other comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

Director Bartlett advised that at the conclusion of the Closed Session, the Board will return to Open Session to close the meeting, noting that no action will be taken when the meeting returns to Open Session.
