A. Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on May 2, 2018 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Little presiding. Members Kelly, Vicari and Bartlett were present at the call of the roll. Freeholder Haines was not present.

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Welcome Mr. Administrator. And speaking of introductions, we have a lot of special people here today. We have someone I would like to introduce who is with us today, really a patriarch of Ocean County, someone who has been involved as a Mayor of one of our largest towns, Lacey Township, someone who has been involved in politics and is Chairman of our Ocean County Utilities Authority under Freeholder Bartlett. I would like all of you to recognize and thank John Parker from Lacey Township. (applause)

John is not usually here, so if he were here every month we wouldn't do that, but it's very special to see John and he's in good health and he's still active in Ocean County. We thank John for his long service in Ocean County. Thank you John.

With that, let's go to our presentations, Mrs. Vasil."

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder. Today we have the Winners of the annual Ocean County Fire Prevention & Protection Association Poster Contest. Freeholder Kelly will be giving them their awards. And if Assistant Chief Richard Orlando from Brick Township Bureau of Fire Safety would come forward please."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And the Director of the Board of Freeholders is going to join me in making these presentations."

BILL JAMM, PRESIDENT OF THE OCEAN COUNTY FIRE & PROTECTION ASSOCIATION: "Good afternoon. We do this every year. The State of New Jersey has a poster contest. We start at the local level and next step is the county level. Once they get past the county level, they take the next step, the state level for judging. So all these winners today will be going to the state level, so they'll be sending them up tomorrow and they'll be judged sometime after May 15th.

To get to this point, just to give it some statistics, is that our guys judged probably about 1000 posters from the schools. So you guys are the winners of that many kids. And you made it to this point, so you're good. We're going

to give you a \$50.00 gift card today. But the state gives you a laptop or a tablet if you win and also your poster goes on a calendar from Atlantic City Electric."

RICHARD ORLANDO: "Last year Brick Township had a winner that went all the way and it was a really nice calendar. It came out and it goes everywhere. The message is very important this year, 'Every Second Counts – Plan 2 Ways Out'. We would be remiss if we didn't mention a little fire prevention while we are here today.

Please, anywhere you go, wherever your travels may take you, always know a second way out, not necessarily the way you that you went in, no matter where you go. Also in the audience I see we have our art teacher from Brick Township, Linda Hammond. She is retiring this year and has been faithful to the Fire Safety Bureau." (applause)

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "We want to tell you how thrilled we are to have everybody again. And how I can tell that I'm getting older is because we do this once a year and once a year keeps going faster and faster. But, everybody in here and everybody that's a part of this year's contest is already a winner because you have learned something by teaching something. And really, this year's theme is fantastic. It tells you to look for a second way out and it tells you that every second counts. And just to think about those two parts of the lesson because hopefully none of us will ever have our home or our school or whatever on fire, but we have to be prepared in the event that it is. And that's what this contest is about and every one of you, I already, as you know, snuck a peek at a lot of the art and it's fantastic art, but it's even a better, better message and lesson. So thank you for taking part and now we'll move on the presentation."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "One more thing before we do that, we all have to say a little bit. I'd like to thank not only the students that are here, but also the families – the moms and dads and grandpas and grandmas and aunts and uncles – who are here supporting these kids. These kids are the future not only of Ocean County and your local towns, but of our nation, and they have a good head start. They're obviously good students and a lot of that is attributable to the parents and the family that is there to support them. So we thank all of you family members as well."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I just want to commend the Board of Freeholders for doing a great job as far as every year on the Budget, one of the first things is taking care of our senior citizens. We have over 170,000 senior citizens. Many of them are needy. Not 70 and 80, 90, 95 and 100 years old and, for example, home delivered meals are very important, the Southern Service Center. We have more programs in Ocean County than anyplace else in the United States including Florida. A lot of people don't realize that. And because we felt that it's very important to take care of the old, the elderly and disabled. Our next initiative taking place right now, Medicare, a big thing. Everyone is going to get a new card. We were one of the first to have a major program as far as educating people as far as the new Medicare programs. All the cards are going to change. Why? Fraud. The biggest problem that we have with our seniors today is the fraud that takes place. They will no longer have Social Security numbers on Medicare cards nor their gender, date of birth. Why? Because it's being used to rob billions in the United States.

With Medicare, over \$10-\$15 billion a year, because of scams. The scams, through the medical process, is being taken away and it's being taken away from needy senior citizens. So that's something we started several weeks ago. We asked the news media to cooperate with us. But, every single person will get a new card starting in Ocean County in June. It's very, very important to us. And what we've been working with the Prosecutor's Office and with Steve Scaturro, the Director of Consumer Affairs is with the fraud that is taking place. It's unbelievable!

Just recently, if you read in the newspaper several days ago, Ed McBride, one of our agents, is responsible and did a great job with the investigation. Ed arrested someone scamming eight different senior citizens between the age of 70 and 80 years old. And what we do, we convict them and we send them to prison and they'll be in prison between 8 and 10 years. And we don't feel sorry for them. Because they take from people who cannot defend themselves. It's a terrible, terrible thing. And one of things we do in Consumer Affairs, working with different agencies, is we try to inform the people before time, family and their caregivers, but when it does happen we will prosecute them and there is no plea-bargaining as we know. We take a very hard line. And I want to thank, again, Ed McBride for doing a good job. But Medicare is going to be our next initiative. But our group is small that works there. They're very, very good. The average person that comes in spends, with one of our specialists, a half hour to forty minutes. When you call up you get a person and we talk to the person. And they do an outstanding job. It's very, very complicated as time goes on, but we want our senior citizens to know that they will be protected and not only that, but we always listen for things that we know and things that we don't know and we always try to change it every year and that's why we have the very best department in the State of New Jersey. And we thank you and your department."

JACKIE ROHAN, DIRECTOR, SENIOR SERVICES: "Thank you. Just quickly, there are a number of people in this room who serve the seniors in our County. Ocean Ride, over 200,000 rides last year for the seniors and disabled. Certainly our Parks and Golf Courses. There are people who are healthy and well who are enjoying living in this County. I think the Board of Social Services, Human Services, the Libraries. There's so much. There are a lot of parties in this room that I think we should celebrate this month, but not only for seniors, but for those who serve them."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "How true. And this month we're going to start in the next several weeks besides Medicare programs, it contractors that scam our senior citizens. It's unbelievable! They go into the house and they overinflate the price and ask them for more money for service contracts. A lot times, unfortunately, the seniors are a little reticent. They have a lot of pride. They won't come forward. We want them to come forward. We want them to file a complaint. We want them to press charges. And that's the only way it's going to stop. So again, we thank everyone that is involved with that. And the rest of the Freeholders, especially Freeholder Kelly's departments as they are very active in making sure that we work together with law enforcement. So thank you very much."

JACKIE ROHAN: "Thank you very much."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Okay, one more thing I didn't say. Here's what happens to senior citizens. They get a card like this in the mail. If you look at it, you would think it was from a government agency. I'm not saying it's a scam, but what they say is 'Social Security Pitfalls and Scams' and everything else. I'm going to go to it and I'm going to see what is taking place. We never charge. By Federal Law, there has to be an advocate in each county, a Freeholder elected, that protects our senior citizens. So when I got this, at first, I looked at it three or four times and thought wait, what's going on over here? So you go there and you are getting a free lunch. There is no such thing as a free lunch. So we will be working on it with Steve Scaturro. We are going to register Steve and we are going to go to it, but I won't tell you the date until they see us in there. We are going to sit through it and I'll tell you about the free lunch and what takes place as far as what they are trying to sell."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Did they mail that to you?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "They mailed this I guess."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "To older Americans..." (laughter) I didn't get one!"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "It's Older Americans Month! No one else received it. Get outta here!" (laughter)

T. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:40 PM, Freeholder Director Little received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Okay, we will now move to Freeholder Comments and we'll begin this week with Freeholder Vicari."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Yes, thank you Mr. Director. I just have one report. Going back, as you know, I was Mayor of Toms River for five terms and I went to the Business Improvement District meeting tonight and the topic of conversation was the downtown Toms River that is slated for redevelopment, but they've been having a long and hard problem with developing over there because of a serious case of pollution. And I was listening and taking notes and they said it's been long enough. They've been trying to upgrade the property for 15 years. There is no sense of urgency and there is no progress. So, of course, what I said was that I would first ask the liaison with (Tourism) Business Development to do whatever is necessary to support that and then (inaudible).

I just want summarize some of the things that took place and I think it's not only in Toms River. I think it happens to a lot of Ocean County as far as different reports that we've gone over for the last several hours. It has to do specifically with New Jersey Resources which owns New Jersey Natural Gas, which it has and accepted the full responsibility, and rightfully so, to clean up a coal tar plant water off Water Street behind the Post Office and next to, of course, the MUA Plant in Toms River.

Going back to the 1980s, it was burning coal and coke to produce natural gas. Unfortunately, there was a substantial amount of pollution that was on the property. I became aware of it not only then, but we tried to build and use that land for a Vocational School – the M.A.T.E.S. school. And then we found out and they downplayed it, New Jersey Natural Gas, saying it wasn't really a problem. So, of course, we moved the school to Stafford Township where we were very successful.

So they're saying today, it should be complete by the year 2022. They were very upset with several things. One, the

timeline for cleaning it up. They want the area for redevelopment, for commercial property, which would be a nice ratable and for jobs. And they weren't happy with the cleanup date. So I'm looking for more information and I just want the Board to know that when I get that information, I will send a letter to the DEP supporting the governing body of Toms River and the Business Improvement District. And again, this goes back to probably the 1940s. It was closed in the 1980s. And what they did at that particular time instead of having gas lines, my understanding was that Toms River Coal manufacturing plant and the natural gas was there.

At that time, let me tell you some of the things that were said to put things in perspective, as a former teacher, as far as a coal/gas facility. They would give representation that the by-products over there came out as little chunks like wood or whatever, tar, and children would eat it. They would chew it like chewing gum. And they didn't see any real problem with that. And that goes to see how it was at the time, because I'm saying to myself, I don't think you can chew it or eat it, it was like chewing gum at that particular time. And instead of doing more extensive research and medical treatment and everything else, the officials at that time with New Jersey Natural Gas were really not that concerned. It wasn't an issue at that time. Fortunately for us, we have many leaders in the area like Linda Gillick that brought it to the forefront and in other areas. In one comment they kept on saying to me, and remember I believe I was still Mayor at the time, they said, 'You don't make any decisions for New Jersey Natural Gas.' Well, that's not true because we have an obligation to make sure that it's cleaned up in a timely fashion, to make sure that they listen to what is taking place by the governing body – I know the Board of Health is involved – and also listen to the Business Improvement District that's directly involved with their meetings.

And also they went on to say something that is very, very into the future for benefitting the downtown area for the future development, there is no business with that kind of pollution down there that can get a loan, get a grant, get anything until it's cleaned up. That's why what I'm saying is I can accept 2022. That's what they stated today, but New Jersey Resources which owns New Jersey Natural Gas, is a *Fortune 500* company. Their profits last year were \$150 million net. And the amount of profit for just New Jersey Natural Gas was over \$87 million, a \$12 million increase over the year before. So what I'm saying is that it is a high producer of income. They should, and we're going to look at it, and hold New Jersey Natural Gas responsible for the immediate cleanup and look at some of the health problems that took place in the past not only as far as development, but many of those in the environmental community are worried about the pollution of the water table, the river.

It's been going on for a long time and in some buildings it's spread. According to the maps that I have outside that I just received from the Business Improvement District, they will have to remove a building for example, the terminal, at the bus station. So it's major stuff. It's not just owned by the MUA, it's not just owned by New Jersey Transit. There are like a half-dozen different parcels and different areas there. So time is of the essence. I just wanted to bring it to your attention and after I review it I will support the Business District due to the fact that it has been going on for 20 years and we want a hard, definite timeline. And again, I'm not being critical, but I just want to bring it to everyone's awareness that more has to be done. When they make a profit it's not just for the stockholders and for the CEOs, it's for the people they serve with New Jersey Natural Gas. But we try to have a good relationship and we do it with Consumer Affairs and try to be fair, but when they ask me to support them, I will be a partner in their decision to do whatever is necessary to expedite the process that's taking place with the Business Improvement District in working with New Jersey Natural Gas. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Freeholder. Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Nothing else."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Freeholder Deputy Director John Bartlett."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. Today, the County very successfully celebrated Arbor Day in the planting of a Tulip Poplar tree on the Courthouse lawn. Freeholder Vicari and I were there to officiate the dedication. This tree is next to, as a dedication to the Centennial of the first World War which America was involved with between the 1917 and 1918. And it was recommended at the time, at the end of the war in 1919, that trees of commemoration be planted for our lost soldiers and for those who participated in the war.

So we thought we had a perfect spot at the Courthouse to plant a commemorative tree on the 100th Anniversary which we did today. It's also interesting to note, I remember between high school and my first year of college which would have been 1965, I believe, I worked for the County in Buildings and Grounds. I made \$10 a day. And by the way, Joe, yes I have the first \$10! And there was a great big tulip tree in front of the Courthouse at that time. So I thought, this is perfect because it replaces a tree that was for one that now has a historical meaning.

The County is also very fortunate that the American Legion Post, Toms River Post 129, has lent to us for a while, a unique cannon. It's a French 75 mm original World War I cannon, that was one of the most unique few pieces in the war on the Allied side. In fact, this particular type of weapon was one of those that was commanded by former President Harry Truman when he was an officer in Europe. And we are going to be able to have one on the Courthouse lawn for a while, thanks to the American Legion. So altogether it was a great day. Freeholder Vicari did a phenomenal job reading a poem on the beauty of trees. And I think we had a great day.

I want to thank our Parks Department and Buildings and Grounds Department who decorated the front of the Courthouse. On your way out, please look at that. It is beautiful. Our Cultural and Heritage Commission and the Shade Tree Commission, all of which had a part in bringing about this, I think, important historical moment for Ocean County and for the United States. As I kind of indicated before, we are living in an age, unfortunately, where many people want to discard our history. And in this County, and this Board of Chosen Freeholders is not about to discard the history of the country for any reason. And we applaud those who served, even though they are now all

gone, but they represent those who have come both before them and after them, including veterans today who through their sacrifice have allowed us to meet at a meeting like this, have allowed you to be at a meeting like this where you can voice your opinions, unafraid of what you may say or the consequences, because there are no consequences of those. That's what it means to live in a free country and it is only a free country because of those sacrifices and by God we have an obligation to honor that sacrifice and this Board is going to do that. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Freeholder Bartlett. And thank you, as always, for keeping alive our history and heritage here in Ocean County. And every report came in today that Freeholder Vicari read a great poem and it was eloquent and he is now a poet and did a great job. So, with that, we will open up our meeting for public comment."

WHEREAS, since the County of Ocean was founded in 1850, the Members of the Governing Body have been elected to the Office of the Board of Chosen Freeholders; and

WHEREAS, the term Freeholder dates back to 15th century English law, and at the time, the title referred to any landowner whose property was not encumbered by a mortgage or lien; and

WHEREAS, while New Jersey was still a British colony, the term "Chosen Freeholder" was used to identify a Freeholder who was elected or appointed from their town to represent the interests of the people of their town in county government; and

WHEREAS, after New Jersey declared itself an independent state from Great Britain in 1776, the State of New Jersey was unique in that all people, regardless of race or gender who met the other criteria could and did vote; and

WHEREAS, the development of a "Board of Chosen Freeholders" was a major step in the self-government of the people of New Jersey counties over the will of the king distributed to the subjects through magistrates or colonial officials; and

WHEREAS, in 1807, for reasons none other than party politics, the state's legislature ignored the constitution and took the vote away from women and people of color; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders strongly believes that this effort to abolish the term Freeholder is part of a larger, ongoing effort to purge from American history anything from our past considered offensive to the values of modern society; and

Freeholder Director Gerry P. Little opened the meeting at 4:03 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Little stated that since 1989, the County has held about eight events each year for the Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Program. The total collected in 2017 was 416,000 pounds of hazardous waste at a cost of \$184,000 for the safe disposal of the waste, protecting the environment and landfill by keeping hazardous waste out of the landfill. The Director announced the first three dates for this year, which are, April in Toms River; May in Manchester; and June in Stafford. The Director noted that subject to the budget, future dates will be scheduled, advising the County would like to hold eight days again this year. The Director advised that residents must preregister for the program. Director Little stated that this is a critical program for our environment. Freeholder Haines questioned how to dispose of oxygen containers. Mr.

Kuhlwein advised that oxygen containers must be returned to where they came from; they are not part of hazardous waste. Mr. Kuhlwein advised that a number of materials such as paint and waste oil can be brought to one of the County's Recycling Centers from Monday to Friday residents do not have to wait for the Household Hazardous Waste Program to properly dispose of those materials. Director Little stated it is important to keep these materials out of our groundwater. He also noted that over 2,500 residents participated in Household Hazardous Waste last year, which is a major accomplishment. Director Little thanked Mr. Kuhlwein and the Solid Waste staff for their work on this important program.

Director Bartlett reviewed Natural Lands Trust Fund (NLTF) acquisitions that have been recommended by the NLTF Advisory Committee. The Freeholder stated that the first acquisition is 137 acres located in Plumsted Township that adjoins property the County already owns. The Freeholder noted that once this is acquired, the County will own everything that is not developed in this area. The accepted purchase price for the property is \$400,000. The original asking price was \$1.8 million. The Freeholder advised that Dow Chemical is the owner of the site and requested that it be deed restricted, (not be developed) and with that restriction they would sell it to the County for a significantly reduced price. The Freeholder advised that this fit into the County's NLTF Program as property is not developed through the NLTF. Freeholder Bartlett noted that this property is a former Superfund Site (1997) that has been declared "clean." The Freeholder noted that approximately 2,200 acres have been preserved in this area, most of which are Farmland Preservation. Director Little stated that Plumsted Township is one of the most active municipalities in the County under the NLTF Program and he is very proud of all the farms that have been saved in this area.

Freeholder Bartlett stated the second parcel recommended for acquisition is 72 acres located in Jackson Township. The purchase price is \$260,000 and it is eligible for up to a 50 percent partnership from the Department of Defense. The Freeholder noted that this parcel is in the vicinity of the Base and has been identified as a high priority for acquisition. Over 3,000 acres have been preserved in this area, which is located near Patriots Park on Bowman Road.

Director Little stated that this Board is very proud of the NLTF Program and noted that over 60 percent of the County has been preserved through federal, State, County and local governments. This number increases every time we preserve land. Freeholder Bartlett stated that residents voted to tax themselves to preserve land, and the County has spent over \$100 million to purchase properties. Director Little noted that by preserving land, the County is preserving the quality of life for our residents. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the Plumsted Township area is located near the Kirkwood Aquifer.

Both of the recommendations will be listed for the Board meeting of March 21, 2018 for acquisition.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda, which included the recommended advertisement for the Reconstruction and Resurfacing of County Route 539 from the Parkway to Route 72 in Little Egg Harbor, Stafford and Barnegat Townships. Mr. Ernst advised that this is for milling and resurfacing of approximately 10 miles of Route 539 and will include rumble strips. Freeholder Kelly noted that the County tries to incorporate a safety component to all its projects. Freeholder Vicari stated that Ocean County was one of the first County's to use rumble strips. There were no other questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the March 28, 2018 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 28, 2018. Assistant County Administrator Fiure requested that a resolution be added to the Board agenda authorizing an agreement with the Lakewood Township Police Department for a Department of Justice 2017 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant. A resolution was not done in 2017. There were no other questions or comments.

Director Little asked the Administrator for comments during Open Session. The Administrator had no comments for Open Session.

Director Little asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Vicari reviewed with the members the State's Route 37 / Route 166 project. The Freeholder noted that as everyone should recall the State put all Transportation Trust Funds projects on hold, which moved the completion date from 2018 to 2019. The Freeholder stated that emergency vehicles and residents are cutting through the shopping centers because they cannot use the jug handles. Freeholder Vicari stated the State needs to be more aggressive in getting this project done. The Freeholder advised that he has sent several letters out on this and he wants to send a more aggressive letter. Freeholder Vicari stated this project not only affects our tourism, it also affects our residents, and it is the right thing to do, and the County needs to demand that the State needs to be more aggressive and get this project done. The Freeholder noted that the changes the State is making do not increase capacity and Ocean County cannot wait until 2019 for completion of the project. The Freeholder stated that a sign should be put up stating that this is a State project, not a County project, and listing the number at the State for the public to call and voice their complaints, the State needs to take responsibility for this.

Freeholder Vicari stated that there are also problems with the State's project for the Tunney Bridge, there needs to be visible improvement done by Memorial Day. Administrator Block advised that the completion date for this project was estimated to be November 2018; however, he has received notice from the contractor that he believes it will not be complete until 2019. Freeholder Kelly agreed that a sign should be put up stating that these are State projects.

Freeholder Director Little opened the meeting by welcoming Ocean County Clerk, Scott Colabella, and a special group of eight Ocean County parents called the Gold Star Mothers, who tragically lost their sons in active military duty.

Freeholder Director Little mentioned that the Gold Star Mothers program originally began in 1917 during World War I by a woman named Grace Darling Seibold whose son was killed in combat. The focus of the group is to offer comfort and support for veterans in hospitals, veterans in general, and the families who have lost their children in service to our country. Freeholder Little expressed his thanks to all of the families in attendance.

Ocean County Clerk, Scott Colabella expressed his thanks to the Board Members and their families for their time in the service. Mr. Colabella discussed the new law authorizing New Jersey County Clerks to implement the Gold Star Parent Program, and stated that Ocean County is proud to be the first county in the state to issue the cards allowing the parents or guardians of the fallen military members discounts to State Parks and beaches.

Freeholder Little expressed his pride in Ocean County's large veteran population. He stated that we have between 30,000 and 40,000 veterans residing here in Ocean County. In the Vietnam War, 58,220 lives were lost, 1,487 resided in New Jersey and 29 were from Ocean County. In the current war on terror 2,356 lives were lost in Afghanistan, and 4,497 in Iraq. Freeholder Director Little reminded us that there is a War Memorial outside our Planning Department which depicts the 13 names of Ocean County residents that have been lost thus far.

Freeholder Director Little proudly read the names of the Gold Star Parents in attendance.

Patricia Bye spoke of her son Jeffrey Svoboda, who was a helicopter fireman who joined the Coast Guard in 2003 and was stationed at Atlantic City, NJ and Air Station Cape Cod, MA. He served his country for seven years until his death in 2010.

Carol Koch's son Charles served as a Major in the Marines for 21 years when he tragically lost his life in 2013. He left behind a wife and two children.

Carol Vecchio's son Michael Vecchio was just 19 years old when he lost his life during a U.S. Navy training mission in 2017.

Eileen Daly's son, Ronald Alan Kubik was a U.S. Army Ranger, who was just 21 years old in 2010 when he was killed while saving the lives of 10 fellow soldiers, and 19 women and children during Operation Enduring Freedom. He led an assault team against enemy combatants and received the Silver Star in 2013.

Marion Zilinski is the proud mother of Lt. Dennis Zilinski. He was a 2004 graduate of the United States Military Academy at West Point and was assigned to the 101st

Airborne Division. He was a platoon leader and US Army Ranger. Zilinski was killed when an explosive device detonated near his Humvee in 2005.

Shirley Parrello's son Brian was a 19-year-old Lance Corporal in the United States Marine Corps. He enlisted in the Marines after 9/11 and was killed in action in 2005. He leaves behind two brothers who now serve in law enforcement.

The Gold Star Parents received an emotional standing ovation, and Freeholder Director Little humbly thanked each family for making the ultimate sacrifice.

Freeholder Vicari noted that the Ocean County Vo-Tech program has 5,500 students currently enrolled in the program at this time, and has received national recognition for having the largest apprenticeship in the state for plumbing, electrical, HVAC and machine trades. An anonymous donor gave \$1.25 million dollars to the vocational school system. They requested that it be used at the Toms River location for building upgrades and repairs. Freeholder Vicari stated that there are waiting lists in all programs of study because there are immediate employment opportunities upon completion.

Bill Hoey, the Director of Ocean County Vo-Tech gave us a status report on the school system. Mr. Hoey stated that MATES, which is the Marine Science Academy in Stafford Township is partnering with the University of Pennsylvania and the Army Corps of Engineers to research coastal storms and wind tunnels, and their effect on the Jersey Shore. OCVTS offers 6 accelerated Post-Secondary programs to provide adult students with various career options in Cosmetology, Certified Medical Assisting, Automotive Technology, Licensed Practical Nursing, New Home Construction, and the Ocean County Center for Culinary Arts. The LPN (Licensed Practical Nursing) program boasts an accelerated 10-month course that offers job placement making a livable wage in less than a year. The OCVTS program has agreements with colleges through Tech Prep programs that permit students to gain college credits while attending OCVTS.

Frank Frazee, the Business Administrator for OCVTS discussed some of the exciting programs, and future plans for the Vo-Tech community. The Performing Arts Academy (PAA) was named a National Blue Ribbon School by the US Department of Education in 2014. The school is currently located at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, but plans are underway to relocate the school to a state of the art complex on the OCC campus in Toms River. The new school, which is a 27 million dollar state of the art facility, will enable students to enroll in the OCC Jump Start Program and earn 60 college credits, while simultaneously earning their high school diploma. Funding for this new facility will be shared. Forty percent will be provided by the State, Ocean County will contribute thirty percent, and the final thirty percent will be provided by the Grunin Foundation.

Freeholder Vicari commended Bill Hoey, and Frank Frazee for their diligence in making the OCVTS program a continued success.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of April 4, 2018. There were no questions or comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Director Little, seconded by Freeholder Bartlett, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:40 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 4:50pm. There being no further business, on a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Director Little, the meeting adjourned at 4:51pm.






