DIRECTOR VICARI: "We have a short presentation by Freeholder John Bartlett and then we'll go with the resolution, vote, and then the Public Hearing."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. Very briefly, the 2017 County Budget is \$407.9 million, up just under 2% from last year, certainly within the cap from last year's roughly \$400 million Budget. We should note, I think it's important to note, that inflation at this point in time is running at 2-1/2 %. And we were able to come in at less than the rate of inflation.

The tax base – the equalized value tax base that the County raises its taxes from - has grown in the previous year by a modest 2.78%. That's both from increased values and the replacement construction and new construction that came about after Hurricane Sandy. The County's ratable base last year was \$94.5 billion, this year is at \$97.1 billion which is, again as I said, a 2.7% increase. I should note, and it's very important to note, that we are still down over \$12 billion in our tax base from where we were 2008. So we have not recovered, but we are on the road to recovery and we are recovering slowly, a minor amount every year.

The increase in values do have a great effect on the Budget because the Freeholders said when the tax base had gone down that we had to take the tax rate up a bit to account for the fact that we had lower values to tax on. Now that we have higher values, this year the Board has been able to reduce the County tax rate from last year by a very modest 1/10 of 1 cent amount. Last year the County tax rate on an equalized value basis, which is where we tax, was 35.3

cents and this year for 2017 it will be down ever so slightly to 35.2 cents. Now, we're not trying to beat ourselves in the chest for doing that, but it is a move in the right direction. It shows it is a down payment, in a sense, of what we said we would do when we were able to do it. Our tax base has not recovered to where was, but it is moving in the right direction which allows us, I think, to make this slight reduction.

As is always important with every County Budget - with EVERY County Budget - you do not write a Budget for one year, for 2017, because guess what? Next year there will have to be a 2018 Budget and there will be a 2019 Budget after that and so on and so on. So you have to do your budget work with the future in mind. And as the Director has always reminded us, 'We never want any surprises!' There is no reason for surprises if you adequately look at your revenues, look at your expenditures and make sure they stay in balance with one another. There will be minor variations from year to year, but there will not be major variations. And that's what we've aimed at.

The other thing I'd like to report is that the net amount that we're going to have in Surplus will be increased as a result of this Budget and our ratable base growth which, I believe, will ensure our AAA Bond Rating which is very important for the capital improvements that we make in the County (and) which gives us the best bond rating in the country - even better than the government of the United States of America – and allows us and puts us in a good position. And I think this is very, very important, that should we be faced with another disaster as we were faced with in Sandy, we are in the financial position to deal with it as we were the last time. It's taken us a while to recover. We have recovered because of the dedication of all five members this Board of Freeholders because we look at this in the same manner. You've got to know where your money is coming from, you've got to husband the money you have, because you can only spend it once.

And lastly before I stop, I want to again thank Julie Tarrant, the County CFO, who is of the same mindset that the Board is. We're all on the same page and that page is 'let's ensure the financial stability of the County Ocean'. That's our pledge we've done in the past. That's what we're doing in this Budget and that's what we will do in the future. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Freeholder Bartlett. Mrs. Vasil, how many resolutions do we have and do we have to vote on them separately?"

CLERK VASIL: "Just one resolution to be read."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, there's one resolution. Please read the resolution for the record."

Clerk Vasil reads the following 2017 Ocean County Budget resolution into the record:

"BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean that the budget herein before set forth is hereby adopted and shall constitute an appropriation for the purposes stated of the sums therein set forth as appropriations, and authorization of the amount of \$342,092,735.00 dollars for the county to be raised by taxation and certification to the County Board of Taxation of the following summary of general revenues and appropriations.

It is hereby certified that the within budget is a true copy of the budget finally adopted by resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders on the 5th day of April, 2017. DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay that is the resolution. I'm now going to open up to members of the public if they have any comments and then I'm going to turn it over to the Board of Freeholders if they have any comments and then a final vote.

And again, this is specifically on the Budget for 2017. Is there anyone who has any questions or comments on the Budget? Please come forward to the microphone, state your full name and address for the record please. Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK, LOUIS LANE, JACKSON: "Well, there you go again, a tax decrease, keeping it flat. As I've been saying almost every year now is you guys always say 'no surprises' and then go 'well only a slight variation from year to year'. Well, that's one hell of a surprise! Except for a couple of town here in Ocean County, you're the only ones doing that.

The Federal government is beyond a mess. I think you still have the counter there about how much the deficit has gone up since I started. The State, (inaudible) You did something really weird when you do a good budget you think about the next year. You're about the only government that does that. In fact, that's better than the Federal government ran for several years without a budget! It was like college kids with a credit card. Ours!

Everybody who gets elected, especially the local government, they ought to be forced to sit here and watch you guys. Okay, this is how it's done. And bear in mind, even with the economic downfall and Sandy when there was a slight increase, that still didn't go anywhere near the amount you decreased it the years before. So it's not really a tax increase. It was a reduction of the decrease."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "If I said that, Gary, they would have hung me. So I couldn't say that." (laughter)

GARY BLACK: "Well, I can do it. I have enough people trying to hang me. But, again, you're the only people doing this. And then when Sandy hit, you bailed out almost every town in Ocean County. We'd still be dealing with wreckage. A lot of towns didn't have the money. (inaudible) The town I work for they sent us out with garbage trucks. That was useless. There was no way in hell we could keep up with that. You guys came in, you bailed us out and almost every town in the County and then during this when you had to dump all this money out, your credit rating got better.

A lot of people, especially your opposition, say, 'Oh the AAA Bond Rating means nothing.' No, it means a hell of a lot. The amount you have in surplus is saving us money. Otherwise we'd be paying more in interest on loans for capital improvements because this County is always expanding which is one of the reasons I'm always for the Natural Lands Trust because that cuts down on a lot of increased expenditures. So not only do you take care of what you've got to do, in an emergency you took care of everybody else, still kept it together.

The State's a wreck again. Our colleges got another loan and they've got like a \$14 billion deficit. I forget whether it was Rutgers or the alphabet one, as I call it. They don't know what they're going to do. And they, of course, have to give money for puppies and all the other things they've got to do.

You guys are doing it like you're supposed to. You don't get in anybody's hair. You don't harass anybody. You keep costs down as much as possible. You help everybody you can without putting the rest of us out in the street. You're what government should be and you actually should be training for the State because they ought to be here watching you. Again, great job. I can't say no surprise because compared to everybody else this is one hell of a surprise. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'd just like to add that not only is our tax rate stable and we went down a little bit, but County agencies that work close with us like the Ocean County Board of Health and the Library, it's the same thing. So we realize the sensitivities with raising taxes and the cost (inaudible) on the average taxpayer. They cannot afford to pay any more in taxes. Thank you very much Mr. Black.

I'm sorry, we need your full name and mailing address. I know you work for the Internal Revenue Service from several years ago. We never forgot that. That's all know. (laughter) So, if you could identify yourself. We are not nervous! (laughter) The Internal Revenue Service, watch out now! Tax time is coming up."

BOB MARTINO, 54 WOODSTOCK DRIVE, BERKELEY: "You left your car open."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Is that right?"

BOB MARTINO: "That's not too smart."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "First of all, believe me, I'm not too smart. I admit that."

BOB MARTINO: "I started to lock it and then the security guard came by and I said, 'I'm going to mind my own business and get inside.':

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you for watching my car."

BOB MARTINO: "But, as you know, Mr. Director, I have......"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Can you give your full name and mailing address, so we have it."

BOB MARTINO: "I've been on Senior Services (Advisory Council) Board for approximately 18 years. Now, I looked over this Budget as fast as I could page by page and I really can't remember much of about it. But you and I

spoke at the beginning of the year about doing something with the Budget and you said you were going to try to keep it down to how much per hundred?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We spoke and you have a good memory. When I went into the Chamber of Commerce and commented that last year, in 2016, you have a good memory, we raised taxes for the total year, \$9.00. And I said, 'We're going to go up not more than \$4.00. This was going back many, many months ago and fortunately, we have a stable tax rate, a slight decrease, but \$4.00 is a lot of money in Ocean County.

You know what's amazing too, I just want to interrupt, people are putting gas in their cars and they don't have money, they don't have the \$7.00 or \$8.00 sometimes, and that's what they need for gasoline so they can get to work. And that's how you know the economy is not doing well. But we understand that, we are very sensitive to taxes and that's one of the reasons why we struggle to do what we have done. But, it's your turn to speak."

BOB MARTINO: "Now that reduces the taxes for everybody in the County, slightly, but it's a reduction. God bless. How does this affect your Senior Advisory Board in so far as everything that they produce for the seniors such as buses, food and so on. Have they been cut at all?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We are very, very sensitive and I've learned this not only for myself, but of course, when Freeholder Mancini was a Freeholder and was in charge, of course, of Senior Services and we always said – and we have several representatives here from Senior Services – and it's not just for myself speaking, but I think it is the entire members of the Board and past members of the Board - that we've always been very sensitive in Ocean County to the frail, to the elderly and to the disabled. And we've always said, it's nothing new and that's why sometimes the press release is not printed, and that is no matter what happens....and sometimes you turn on the TV and people get frightened - especially our senior citizens – that services are going to be cut.

When they cut home-delivered meals and they show all kinds of nasty things to terrify our seniors and if you go back to one campaign for President there was an elderly person in a wheelchair thrown off a cliff and they do all kinds of things, but we want you to know - and when you go back and you're one of the leaders in Berkeley Township - and home-delivered meals will be there. Out services will be there. We will continue to have the best, not only in New Jersey, but in the United States. And every time, EVERY time and this goes back several years ago, we were short because of the government cutbacks in the State and Federal government, \$250,000.00 and the money wasn't approved in the Budget, but this Board of Freeholders said, 'You know something? We will not have our senior citizens starving, going hungry, with anxiety.' And just as important, there was no waiting list. We did away with that. And I don't even have to ask the Board because our policy is that we will protective and preserve 165,000 senior citizens and focus in on those that are frail, the elderly and disabled. That's where our sensitivity is with this Board of Freeholders. And, you know, when we do.....and I know you're an active member in Berkeley Township...... the way you spend your money in this Budget tells us......what I'm saying is not only in detail not only for yourselves but because we have some high school students.....where your heart is. This is one that has sensitivity, goes to show where our heart is and we are not going to do like they do on TV where they cut Social Security, they cut Medicaid and they cut everything else, is that we will not cut services for senior citizens. We have several representatives here from Senior Services. That's why we have every department in here to reassure you that not only will there be no surprises, but stability is very important to us.

So we have Sue Kaiser in the back and Anthony Petrillo that's in the back that can reassure you there will be no cutbacks."

BOB MARTINO: "If I knew they were coming I would have stayed home."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No, we need you to speak at the public session. And you're from Berkeley Township and Carmen Amato has an outreach center, five days a week, that's very, very active to make it as easy as possible. And, of course, we have the Congregated Meals close by and the Home-Delivered Meals."

BOB MARTINO: "All right. You kept your promise."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will always keep my promise."

BOB MARTINO: "Well, I have a question on the Berkeley Park. Should I wait for that?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You can wait until the end. Yes. This part is specifically for the Budget. Thank you."

BOB MARTINO: "Okay. As you know, the Federal government has cut senior services' budget on and off for the past few years, especially after Sandy. So this sounds very, very good to me. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Martino. It's always a pleasure to deal with the Internal Revenue Service. (laughter) Yes sir, please come forward."

SAM FOSTER, 108 TEAKWOOD DRIVE, BRICK: "Speaking for myself as far as the pleasure to deal with IRS, I owed over \$10,000.00 one year and still suffer because of it. I have two good questions.

One is, I was noticing on the chart over here that we received aid – Federal and State aid. I was wondering if the Freeholders have any information about if we can anticipate an increase or decrease in aid from the Federal and State government? Since you are planning down the road, I was wondering if that is accounted for in this current Budget."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'm going to have to turn this over to Julie Tarrant. As you know, there is difference

between a fiscal year of the State of New Jersey and the Federal government. Julie, to the best of your knowledge, would you answer please?"

CFO JULIE TARRANT: "Well, all the grants included in this County Budget are already obligated by the State and Federal agencies."

SAM FOSTER: "And because of the cuts that are going on, especially at the Federal level right now, any......"

CFO JULIE TARRANT: "Until they change the laws, we don't know."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "If I could add to that, when we receive a grant during the year we amend the Budget, and we do this as a matter of course, to receive the money put it on the Revenue side of the Budget and then amend the Budget on the expenditure side to spend it. So that will be a normal process through the year. It is every year. By the way, we always compare, because we're honest, the Introduced Budget to the Introduced Budget, not the Budget as it ends up with all these grants that come in during the year. So no, we have no way of knowing what exactly grant funds will be arriving okay, but I can tell you this is an honest comparison of last year's Introduced Budget to this year's Introduced Budget. The Budget will never end up this way because money will come in, so on the Revenue side it will go up and the whole Budget goes up and, on the Expenditure side it will go up to meet that increased Revenue."

SAM FOSTER: "I live in Brick. They did the same thing with it, like snowfalls that were unusual certain years, and they amend the Budget to compensate."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "No, actually we're not talking about that. I'm talking about that. I'm talking about when someone gives us money, we have to get the money in the hand and then we amend the Budget to receive the money and then we amend the Budget to spend it. But this is not an Emergency Appropriation where, gee, we have a problem we didn't account for so we have to amend the Budget to meet this emergency. We've only done that in the whole time I've been here about three times, one was Hurricane Sandy. Otherwise, we don't do that."

SAM FOSTER: "Can I ask quick what that medal is on your left lapel?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "How about at the end. I don't mean to put you out, but at the end."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "At the end, after the Budget."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "It's a surprise. You'll be very surprised."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You will be surprised."

SAM FOSTER: "Okay. I'm sorry for spoiling your surprise. I apologize about that. I'm a spoil sport.

The second question I had was to deal with, as we all know, Ocean County is very touristy. Tourism is very important to Ocean County and I haven't researched this thoroughly so I do apologize if I don't have my facts straight on this. I'm not trying to spread any disinformation, but it's reported that the EPA will be having their funding cut and I want to know if there is anything the County can do because I know we have the Federal EPA, the State DEP, is there anything that the County can do as far as like compensating for things like testing or anything dealing with the quality of the water. I remember back in I think it was the 1980's when we had medical waste washing up on shores. Is there anything that the County can do or is that pretty much a State or Federal issue?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, first of all, anything with the tourism grants and whatever –it's \$4.7 billion a year and very important to us and it will stay the same, but that has to do with the definition of the Budget. But the Ocean County Board of Health safeguards our oceans and bays by doing testing. So at this time, I know it's a little bit off the Budget, there will be no change as far as making sure the water is safe for the bathers to go to 44 miles of oceanfront property and Barnegat Bay. It's taken care of by the County of Ocean Board of Health – which we're very very lucky. So I feel very confident in the programs that we have under the leadership of Freeholder Gerry Little and Dan Regenye that's over here. You can talk with him afterwards at the end if you want to and he can give you more specifics on that."

SAM FOSTER: "You know, like I said, I have complimented this Board in the past about the Parks and your support for them so I'm confident that we have leadership like you here. I was just mentioning that because I remember my uncle bought a condo down as an investment down south and then the medical waste started to wash up onshore. He was really upset because no one wanted to rent from him. You know, you Freeholders have all been around for a while."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And they were difficult times for us. A lot of those changes have been implemented by the Federal government. I cannot imagine anything being comprised because the health and safety of the residents not only in Ocean County, but the State of New Jersey. So that will not happen."

SAM FOSTER: "Yeah, like I said, I have a lot of confidence in all the Freeholders. You've done an excellent job for us over the years. Thank you.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Foster. Would anyone else like to comment? Only on the Budget and at the end of the meeting if you have a comment or want to ask question. Anyone else? Any of our students from our high schools? And again, comments can be made on the Budget before we finally adopt it. We gave many

copies. You can get a copy, of course, from the library. The mayors, we spoke several times on it. We gave it to the media and went to many different organizations throughout the County to encourage them to come and to ask questions or to make suggestions of what we can do. If there are no other comments or suggestions from members of the public, I move that the public hearing be closed on this part of the Budget."

CLERK VASIL: "We need a motion to adopt."

On motion duly made by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Bartlett, the 2017 Ocean County Budget and accompanying resolutions were adopted on final reading.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The Budget has been adopted for 2017. We thank everyone for their participation. We'll go on to the regular part of the meeting and there will be another public portion after the business portion at the end of the meeting. So if you have any more questions you can ask us them at the end. Okay, continuing please."

### T. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:29 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Starting on my right, Freeholder Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. I was asked earlier what my pin was, it is a.....not a replica, but it's a rendition, if you will, of the Victory Medal given to US soldiers at the conclusion of World War I, which is only World War I after World War II. So may I continue to say the "Great War". And tomorrow marks the 100th Anniversary of America entry into the Great War on April 6, 1917. So the County plans at noon tomorrow a commemoration of that event and if you will notice, you can't help but miss it if you ride by it, the front of the Courthouse has been decked out, I think, very beautifully. We worked on it in my office and I want to thank the Director who is in charge of Buildings and Grounds for agreeing to this decoration and his department put it up. But it's very, very stately (with) American flags and bunting and in the center is a pull-down, if you will, stars. They represent each service man who signed up or was drafted into the Great War from Ocean County and in the center is a yellow star, a gold star, with little stars in it which commemorates those who lost their lives in the Great War. So this County is paying tribute, if you will, to an event that took place 100 years ago.

This County was very important to the First World War. And to me, as a former history teacher and one who has a great interest in history, I think and the Board thinks it's only appropriate that we should always remember that what we have here today we didn't invent. That those who came before us sacrificed their time, their talent, and in many cases their lives to give us what we have. So on an important event like this, the 100th Anniversary, this County is putting this step forward.

I'm also happy to point out, the American Legion which was formed –this post at least - after the First World War has a World War I, 75-mm French cannon that was used extensively for in the war. President, he wasn't President then, but Captain Harry Truman commanded a Brigade of these weapons that flat trajectory 75-many, many cannons. And one of those, an original one, is on the front lawn of the Courthouse for this celebration tomorrow and will stay there for a while. So I think if you've got the chance to go by it you'll be very proud of what your County is commemorating in the past. And again, that is what this medal kind of signifies.

Tomorrow I will wear my grandfather's Victory Medal from the war, the real one."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Freeholder Bartlett. You know, when we first got elected, Freeholder Bartlett and I were very young and many, many years ago we had the great opportunity to meet with the veterans of World War I. And we often talk about it. They were very proud people, but very, very humble people. And they never bragged about anything. They were always proud to be an American. They never asked for anything. They were just proud to serve America and something that we really lost and should be continued. So we thank Freeholder Bartlett for taking a leadership role. If you pass by the County Courthouse on your way home today you'll be very proud to live in Ocean County.

And I have always felt, even before I became a Freeholder, that downtown Toms River because of the Administration Building and the Courthouse is something that you see only sometimes on pretty post cards. But it's history. We preserved it. We spent some money in the past to make sure we preserved it, but people say they're proud to live in Ocean County especially Toms River which is the crossroads of the County of Ocean. Freeholder Jack Kelly please."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Director. You know there's been much discussion recently because of some newspaper articles whether or not Ocean County is a sanctuary county. I want to make it clear again. I talked about this at our PreBoard and I wanted to do so at our regular meeting.

Ocean County works very closely and cooperatively with the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement Division of Homeland Security. We are not a sanctuary county nor has Ocean County ever had an interest in being a sanctuary county. We have been actively working to correct this record and have our name removed from whatever lists are out there calling us a sanctuary county.

We have a very good relationship with ICE. And, in fact, ICE has taken steps to memorialize this information by removing Ocean County's name from its declined detainer outcome report list of sanctuary counties. Again, that is they have removed us from that list which is what would designate a county as a sanctuary county.

I just want to say that we cooperate completely with ICE and, in fact, we have worked with them to have the assignment of an ICE Officer to the Ocean County Corrections Department to review all new commitments for possible ICE enforcement action. Our detainer procedures went through changes and that's because ICE - it wasn't as much that the old policies from 2014 and 2013 under Warden Hutler – the policy has not really been changed, the wording of the policy has. And that was as a result of our communication with ICE. And now they have taken us off of that list. It is now official. ICE has removed us from that list and taken us off the list that would designate this County as a sanctuary county. So now officially we're off that list. We are not sanctuary county, we have not been a sanctuary county, we have never desired to be a sanctuary county.

So I hope this puts it to bed. We thought it was put to bed in 2015, but through some bureaucratic snafu the County was still on ICE's list. We've done nothing to change that except for a phone call to ICE saying, 'Hey! How come we're still on your list?' They looked it over and said, 'You're right. You're not supposed to be. We're going to take care of that.' And within 24 hours they did. And we are off that list and I just wanted to report that, again publicly, to the County at large. And again, to this Board of Freeholders so they know that the Corrections Department works very closely with ICE to make sure that we do enforce all the laws of the land. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Kelly for that important presentation. I know (inaudible) and those who have called the County to clarify. Freeholder Ginny Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Director. Just one thing, I know I had mentioned at PreBoard last week, but I had the great pleasure to attend the South Jersey Junior Science Symposium. This symposium has been around for about 58 years. It was always held at Monmouth University. They decided they didn't want to do it anymore, so in speaking with Dr. Larson at Ocean County College, they decided to take it on. So they had the first symposium at Ocean County College last Thursday,

These are science students from around the State of New Jersey. There were schools from Ocean County that participated – Manchester Township, Toms River North, Toms River South and Toms River East. But I just want to read you, just (from) one person who received a lot of accolades and awards last week was Rachel Staino. She goes to the Marine Academy of Technology and Environmental Science or the M.A.T.E.S. Program. But I just want to read you some of what they worked on: the effect of an Electromagnetic Levitation Stabilization Apparatus on the Stability of a Model Statue, a Model for the Transitory Light Curve of a Theoretical Tidally Locked Extraterrestrial Megastructure, and those are just some of them. This is the booklet. These are just some of the topics that these individuals made presentations on. So it is just amazing. I was floored listening to these students that talked about their projects they worked on. So I feel, honestly, that our society is in good hands when we have individuals like this for our future and I just wanted to bring it to the attention of the people here that we have this now. And it will be held next year again in Ocean County, probably around the same time in March. It's called the South Jersey Junior Science Symposium. It was quite exciting to see and very nice. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Haines. Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. I want to take a moment to kind of address a couple of the very important questions that Mr. Foster raised during his conversation about the Budget.

And, one of those was about water testing and it's important because we have a lot of students here and I want you also to understand. Our Ocean County Board of Health conducts a very comprehensive water testing program all summer long from Memorial Day to Labor Day. We spend about \$100,000.00 on that program, Mr. Foster, Sam if I may. And we actually hire summer interns from various college students that apply and they actually go into the water at every public bathing beach in Ocean County. I think we test 99 or 95, something like that, right Dan? And then they take their those water samples and they're analyzed at the Ocean County Utilities Authority for fecal coliform and the other fancy terms they use that are pollutants in the water and would cause disease. Those tests are conducted at our own OCUA, Ocean County Utilities Authority, under Freeholder Bartlett's leadership there.

We've been doing that for years and years and years. I don't even know if Dan knows, but at least 20 years or so."

DANIEL REGENYE, PUBLIC HEALTH COORDINATOR: "I believe it's 23 years now."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Yes, okay, 23 years. And all the results are posted on the Website so that tourism, again Sam questioned, anybody in the entire world really, but it is of course people that may be interested in coming to Ocean County to go to the beach. They can check the Website to see if the beach is open and the water is clean. Now, we do that very well.

But Mr. Foster also raised a question about especially in 1980's, which a lot of you young folks were in grade school or no, not even born yet. We had wash-ups of medical waste and syringes and it's happened occasionally throughout the 90's and even in this century also, a couple of times. And it important for all of our students to understand this is really, unless you think about it, it's something that doesn't occur to most people. You know what storm drains are on the street. You see the grate. Storm water, rainwater goes in the grate and it goes out to Barnegat Bay. So in our storm drains in Ocean County, only water from runoff goes in there. But in North Jersey, north of the Raritan River, along the Hudson and the New York Harbor, there are about 250 which they call 'combined sewer storm water outfalls'.

Now, for you students and for many adults – most adults don't understand this either – what does that mean? That means, I forgot (to tell you), our storm system with the grates is just storm water. When you flush your commode it goes into a separate pipe. They're not combined. In North Jersey their infrastructure is so old that the storm water and the water that you flush down your toilets and your kitchen sink or your washing machine or whatever goes into a single pipe – combined sewer/storm water outfall. And the pipes, the infrastructure for the most part, can handle the flow except when it rains. Then they have storm water going to their grates, the pipes flood and they have outfalls. They have about 250 in all the towns of North Jersey."

### FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Without treatment."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Without treatment. So when it rains over half an inch, everything that you flush down your toilet or your washing machines or anything else, is combined with the rainwater and it flows outfall line, it flows right into the bay raw! It's not treated because the pipes can't handle it. Their sewage plants keep working, but they don't get all the flow. As soon as the pipes get too full, it goes out to the bay. Now that's where the medical waste, Sam, comes from. That's where the needles come from once in a while.

That doesn't happen here in Ocean County. Well, how does it get down here? Well, it goes into New York Harbor and the natural drift and every time we get a nor'easter – the other day we had a severe rain and flooding in Newark – well, you can bet your bottom dollar that all that sewage from Newark is out in New York Harbor. Not because the Mayor and the people in Newark or the Freeholders or whatever, it's because that's the way the system was designed. It would cost billions to fix. So that's where that comes from. And it's a disgrace! We object to it many, many times. Too many of our media totally ignore the problem until there is a real crisis like on the Memorial Day we had five or seven years ago when we had a wash up and a lot of beaches were closed. Then everybody starts pointing fingers and there are a few editorials and then it goes away.

So it's important for our kids to understand your sewage or your flow from your house goes to the Ocean County Utilities Authority. It is treated to 99%. Is that what it is? It's treated. It's the highest standard of treatment. Storm water goes out. That does contain fertilizer and things like that from your grass and gardens or whatever anybody plants. Animal waste – that's a big one. Droppings from dogs and other things that people don't pick up, it mixes with the water and goes out the storm drain, but not your household sewage. So that's important.

Another issue, Mr. Foster, I'll try to be as quick as I can, raised with Federal funding. Now at the end of this month, Congress is now talking about another shutdown. This time it will be because a different party's going to shut it. They always blame this on the Republicans. Now it's going to be the other side. And a lot of that is because they're going to cut some different forms of funding. But I want you to understand and I lost a golden opportunity for everybody who comes here because there is usually a computer that sits here and I keep on there the national debt. And the national debt is now...... we started with this computer about five or so.....no it was what when President Obama was in his first year and it was \$10 trillion. Last month it surpassed \$20 trillion. And your United States government which deals with Federal funding, so whatever Federal funding we're talking about whether it's veterans funding, senior funding, Meals on Wheels, road funding, you name it, cleaning the EPA funding your talking about or different things. Your government is borrowing \$.42 of every dollar they spend - 42 cents. So every grant we get, of course we like that, it's good, but the Federal government is borrowing \$.42 of every one dollar of that grant. And who pays that? We do!

So we need to always understand that Federal funding isn't just something that comes out of magic from the air. It's paid for by, but they're not taxing us enough across the country to pay for all that Federal funding, whatever it's for, because they're borrowing \$.42 for every dollar they spend whether it's for an aircraft carrier or for any other program or service that they spend on. So I just wanted to mention that to you.

And our State's not much farther ahead, in fact, they're probably as bad. So I was going to hold it up, but I said to Freeholder Haines, 'Where's my computer?' I can't show them.' So now we are over \$20 trillion. Yeah, \$20 trillion. All right, so I didn't get a chance during the Budget conversation so I thought I'd add that in. But you ask very pointed questions and very good questions. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little. We appreciate the comments. I'm sure Mr. Foster is satisfied with that and it was explained very well. Before I open it up I have a message for our students that are here today. Listen well and study hard because your debt right now today for everyone that's here, because everything is free.

This is free and that's free. You are in debt as of 3 days ago, which there was an article, \$65,000 to the Federal government. You owe \$65,000 per person, PER PERSON. So all my students over here today and all our students in Ocean County, in the State of New Jersey I was told, and the townships and everything else, it's \$20,000.00. So I'm sure at dinner tonight when you talk to your mom and dad tell them you're in debt for \$85,000.00. Each, not your mom and dad now, every single student. So when you hear on TV tonight when you watch it and this is free and that's free and that's free, free for them! But you're going to have to pay for it. So your only in debt \$85,000.00 so, it could be \$100,000.00.

But, I mean, this is really a serious problem. I'm not making light of it. But you should get more involved in what's taking place and that's why I appreciate you coming here to see how we spend the taxpayer's money, which is your money."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Mr. Director, could I elaborate? Very good comments. And it's important for the students. This, the Budget that you just sat through and we discussed and have now adopted, for all the money that we're spending and it is significant, we're taxing everybody to pay for that. It's not a deficit budget. Whatever we're spending, we're taxing for or we're getting funds from fees or whatever the case may be. It's not a deficit budget. Your Federal government, the one down in Washington, and to a lot of extent the one in the State, they pass a budget for trillions. Three, four trillion dollars a year. TRILLION! But they don't tax enough for the \$3-\$4 trillion to pass the budget, so they borrow the money. So they say, 'Well, we'll pay it back.' We have more debt than any other nation in the world - \$20 trillion. So if we had to pay for all the programs and services that Congress has given, everybody would pull their hair out — what's left of it.

Then they say we can't do that. We can't afford that. But they just keep borrowing. They say, 'Well, we're going to make college free.' Well, somebody's going to pay for it, but it won't be Congress because they'll borrow the money. They won't tax people for it. All right, thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Thank you Freeholder Little. And again, I think it's important for our students to know. I'm focusing on them. You will have to pay our debts, our children, our grandchildren. In the United States it's 126% above the gross domestic product. 126%! And it's going up continuously. I think Freeholder Little made a good point. Where does the money come from, even with this Budget? You tax it, you can borrow it into the future or you can print it like the United States government. We can't print money so we can borrow it and then we will not have AAA bond rating. And where does it come from? What we just did today was a great experience for you. So that concludes the comments from the members of the Board of Freeholders."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5)** minutes per speaker.

At 4:52 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public, as follows:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would like to open up to members of the public. Mr. Foster please."

SAM FOSTER, 108 TEAKWOOD DRIVE, BRICK: "Freeholder Little, you know I'm a Obama supporter so do you want me to wear my Obama hat and shirt to the next Freeholder meeting? I'm just going to make this quick because I'm not going to kid around because this is a serious subject.

First off, Freeholder Bartlett, what are the plans if it rains tomorrow? For the event? Will it be moved inside?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes, in fact, the event will be held and we checked with the assignment judge, it will be held in historic Courtroom One. So, in any event, rain or shine we will be in Courtroom One. And the front doors of the Courthouse will be open thanks to the Sheriff who is going to put the security mechanisms in place so that.....very rarely do we open the front doors of the Courthouse. So you will be able to go up the beautiful staircase into the beautifully redone historic Courtroom One."

SAM FOSTER: "Will photography be allowed inside?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes, of course."

SAM FOSTER: "Good because I am photo bug."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You paid for it, it's beautiful, of course you can take pictures."

SAM FOSTER: "I was in Atlantic City, I was delivering legal documents to a court house in Atlantic City and I told them, there's free parking there, I said, 'I'm not used to free parking. I live in Ocean County. I'm sorry. I'm sorry I know this is Ocean County, but I'm just saying. I'm sorry.

Anyway, that was one question I had. But on the subject of the medical waste, I did a quick look up on online and it said there's an article out there that said that the source was traced to Fresh Kills Landfill in Staten Island. It was being dumped there and washed up on our shores.

But I did have a question and I don't mean to pick a fight or argue. I've gotten in enough arguments over the years, especially in Brick Township. But I just want to point out that am I correct in saying that the water testing standards are set by either the State or are those under the Federal EPA? Am I correct on that?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "With your permission, Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes, go ahead."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Dan, can you answer that question?"

DANIEL REGENYE, PUBLIC HEALTH COORDINATOR: "Those standards are set by regulation, yes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "By the State or the Federal government?"

DANIEL REGENYE: "The State."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The State of New Jersey mandates."

SAM FOSTER: "Does the Federal EPA have authority over the states and dictate to them or is it......?

DANIEL REGENYE: "I believe the State can designate their own through the regulation."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The State standards, from what I was told, are stricter than the Federal government's. So we have information on that and it goes back many years ago when I did some research with it, we are stricter than the Federal government with what we do with it today. That is my understanding."

SAM FOSTER: "When I was arguing with my politicians in Brick about the Brick Landfill, I researched about how it's leaching out – the glutens and the EPA has standards as far as parts per million or billion of the toxins and the State and I got in a big fight with them. But I don't want to raise the blood pressure anymore with this.

So I just did want to clarify that about the event because I do want to go there tomorrow. I'm off work so I'm going to be able to be there. And like I said, my concern was that and I mentioned the EPA since Freeholder Little mentioned it. My concern is that the cutting of the budget......you understand."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "The Executive Order."

SAM FOSTER: "Well, I was concerned it would affect the regulations as far as the loosening of regulations. I know that the EPA now is talking about it, and the budget hasn't even passed yet, but there's talk about lowering miles per gallon standards for vehicles and things of that nature. I'm just very worried about how it will affect Ocean County. I understand that the Health Department does test because I do pay attention to those readings that they give. And they've done good, the water is very clean here in Ocean County. Everyone has been doing a very good job as far as not just standards, but their set (of standards). But also about the people that go out there and do the hard part of actually testing. So I just wanted to comment on that. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Mr. Martino, I know you have some questions about Berkeley Island Park."

BOB MARTINO, 54 WOODSTOCK DRIVE, BERKELEY: "Yes, thank you. Mr. Bartlett I think is in charge of what I'm going to speak on."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The Berkeley Island Park, I know your (inaudible)"

BOB MARTINO: "Yes, Berkeley Park. I went down there a couple of weeks ago. I took a ride. And they have I started working. So now I would like to have a possible finishing date because I've been using that place since I'm 11 years old!"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "It was a long time ago."

BOB MARTINO: "You better believe it! I feel that too."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I can't give you a direct finishing date. There is a lot of work to be done there. As you know, the place was completely devastated. It will be will be better than it was when we first did it and that's when I first got here, Joe, so that's like 35 years ago. It was getting kind of tired, so really and I'm happy we are able to rebuild it. It's costing us a great deal of money to rebuild it. But, it will not be done for the summer, unfortunately, it just won't be. And although many have asked, 'Well can you partially open it?' The answer that is no. There's just too much construction, too much opportunity for someone to get hurt. Some members of Council we greatly respect asked us last year could we partially open it. We tried and someone did get hurt and we got sued, so we're not going to do that again.

But the work is in progress. You're going to like it when it's done. It's just a matter of doing it right. We're going to do it right."

BOB MARTINO: "I hope I'm still here when it's done."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We'll be here."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You better be! Joe, will you make sure that he gets a special invitation for the grand opening?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You will get a special invitation Mr. Martino."

BOB MARTINO: "Good! That sounds good to me. Do you think it will be some time in the Spring?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Spring of next year, of 2018. I would expect so, yes. Now, don't hold me to that, but I expect so. Yes, I expect for the season 2018."

BOB MARTINO: "That sounds encouraging."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You can hang your hat......no, I shouldn't say that. They will hang me if it's not."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You will get an invitation."

BOB MARTINO: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Martino. And Mr. Black, you had your hand up also. Anyone else at the end? No? Okay, Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK, LOUIS LANE, JACKSON: "One thing on the surprise, I'd just like to let the kids know as far as how much that debt has gone up, the Federal deficit has gone up more than this (points to County Budget) in the time we've been here today."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's correct."

GARY BLACK: "I think I can safely say that."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "\$1 billion a day."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "How much?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "\$1 billion a day."

GARY BLACK: "That's insane. Okay, it's almost hard to follow that one up, but again, you do it like you are supposed do it. (inaudible) Here's the Budget, you keep our taxes down and you pay for everything, unlike the Federal and State. I know we (inaudible) pensions in the State, maybe. But anyway, enough on that.

I want to go also with the Sexual Assault Awareness Month. As you know, this is something that bothers me a lot because I know a lot of people who have gone through it. One of the biggest problems in the State of New Jersey is that it's a practically special protections State. What these predators get as 'so-called' punishments is a joke. And then they get Megan's Law protections after that. I have a cool idea to straighten out the (inaudible) thing is how about if you rape you're in for life? You don't get out. It's better than Megan's Law. It's called 'never again'.

Based on some studies I've seen, less than 10% of women report rape. And that a guesstimate because there's no way to tell exactly how many people don't report because they don't report. It's not rocket science. And in a lot of aspects, I can't blame them. You're not getting a monster off the street. You're getting rid of a little problem for a little while and then there are special protections in this state. So I really don't blame women who don't want to report and I never will. It's their right and they (inaudible) a hell of a lot more than the perpetrator will anyway. But based on even that figure, 10% reporting, 3 out of 5 women have been sexually assaulted one way or another and I out of 5 of them raped. Now do the math and look around. We all know somebody who's been attacked.

Then you get women who, it's still going on in this state even though this Governor has actually started a pilot program for foster children who do get pregnant, whether it's a rape or not, they can actually keep their children. There's a small faith-based program that's been started up to do that. Those are the lucky ones. The other ones are actually forced to have an abortion. And the right-to-life groups don't even want to talk about that. I'm pro-life, but I don't believe in outlawing abortion because number one, before you get into the arguments of moral or anything else, it will work. And abortion is the ultimate rape. If we make men accountable for children and get serious about sexual assault that will do far more to prevent unwanted pregnancies than trying to outlaw abortion. That would put abortion out of business probably. If men really had to pay for their children and know that they have to commit before the ends up. That would put the brakes on a lot of it.

But, things are getting worse for women. The rape-shield law is gone. They were run through the mill when it gets to this. And this is something we've got to seriously sit down and fix. We've got to get to our Legislators. Frankly it is primarily the Democratic Party. They're just protecting them. There is no nice way to put it. That's one of the reasons I love to give credit. For those of you who don't know I used to be one. I'm much better now, thank you.

And just things like, Brian Rumpf, our 9th District Assemblyman, worked a lot on trying to get restrictions for sexual predators to prevent them from living around schools, playgrounds, things like that, couldn't even get it out of committee because we're the naughty party. Neither the Senate version as well that (Senator) Connors did, couldn't get it out of committee. Granted, we invented Megan's Law. But ours now is the embarrassment of the country. You've got states where if they do get out they have to put up signs in front of their houses and things like that. We can't. It's actually illegal to tell children about one. I had Jackson cops ready to arrest me for telling my godchildren to watch out for a neighbor that was a Tier 2 because I was violating his rights. Did you know that sex offenders are the only criminals that you can't say what they did? That's insane. We've got to fix this. We can do it and saying this a lot more for the younger people because they're going to be going through it more than anybody as time goes on

and let them know what's happening and why. Why do you have to be afraid every time you go out? The reason is because we're letting it happen. Our generation really blew it on trying to fix it. Maybe you guys can do something because you're the ones heading into it, you're living it every day and some you probably already have. This is real, this is not a political stance or anything like that. This is something that's real. So we have an 'Awareness Month'. Frankly, as just like people have gone through this, family goes through it too. We're aware of it every damn day. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Black. Anyone else who would like to make a statement or ask a question? Seeing none, I move that the public portion of this meeting be closed. Is there a motion to adjourn?"







WHEREAS, P.L. 2015, c.249 requires a county entity to submit a budget request to the county governing body that is comprised of two parts: the amount to be raised by property taxation, and the amount to be funded wholly through federal or State funds, fees raised by the county entity, or other sources; and

WHEREAS, the term "county entity" means a county board of taxation, office of the county superintendent of election, office of the county board of election, office of the county register of deeds and mortgages, office of the county clerk, office of the county surrogate, office of the county prosecutor, and county sheriff's department; and

WHEREAS, P.L. 2015, c.249 limits the increase in the portion of a county entity budget request funded by property taxation to no more than two percent (2%) of the previous year's budget request, subject to certain limited exceptions; and

WHEREAS, the portion of the budget request submitted by the office of the county prosecutor that is funded by property taxation does not exceed the cap imposed by P.L. 2015, c.249; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the budget request submitted by the office of the county prosecutor, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean finds it advisable and necessary for purposes of health, safety and welfare to authorize the office of the county prosecutor to increase its appropriations beyond the maximum permitted by the budget request cap set forth in P.L. 2015, c.249 in order to meet the requirements of state mandated Criminal Justice Reform; and



Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:05 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Vicari congratulated Freeholder Bartlett for an outstanding job on the 2017 Budget and for the cooperation from all of the County's departments. Freeholder Bartlett started his comments by giving a brief explanation of the budget process, noting that all of the Freeholders are involved in the process. The Freeholder stated that this is the 38th budget that he is presenting to this Board, noting that the County builds the budget by determining what resources are available and what the County has to spend. Freeholder Bartlett noted that he meets with each of the Freeholders to discuss the budget. The Freeholder noted that after the County determines what its resources are, the County has the perimeters that the budget must fit into. Freeholder Bartlett stated that once the County has

the perimeters, those perimeters are given to the department heads to submit a budget for consideration that fits within the County's ability.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the 2017 Budget is \$407.9 million which is up 2 percent from last year's \$400 million, noting that inflation is running at 2 ½ percent. The Freeholder noted that the tax base total valuation of the County has grown by 2.78 percent from last year from increased values, replacement construction from Superstorm Sandy and new construction. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the total tax base is still down \$12 billion or 11 percent from nine years ago. The increase from last year to this year in County revenues is 2.5 percent. The Freeholder noted that a welcome surprise is that the County is able this year to reduce the tax rate by a very modest one tenth of one cent from last year, 35.3 percent to 35.2 percent per \$100 of equalized values. Freeholder Bartlett stated that this is not a big amount, however, it is moving in the right direction. The Freeholder stated that this is good news as this is the start of the reduction as the tax rate begins to recover.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that at the start of 2016 the surplus was at \$43.5 million. The surplus used in 2016 was \$16.5 million, leaving \$27 million. The Freeholder noted that at the start of 2017 the surplus will be \$51.7 million and the County will be using in 2017 \$20.2 million which is a \$3.7 million increase from last year and leaving a balance of \$31.5 million. Freeholder Bartlett stated in his opinion that this guarantees the County's Triple A bonding rating. The Freeholder stated that the budget supports \$2 million to be earmarked as cash capital for heavy equipment. Freeholder Bartlett noted that County deferred replacing equipment when the budget was stressed. The process to replace some vehicles began last year again and the County expects to replace some more this year.

Freeholder Bartlett noted the challenge this year is in the Prosecutor's Office, stating that bail reform and the drug epidemic has necessitated a 3.2 percent increase which is more than the 2 percent CAP level. The Prosecutor's budget requires \$500,000 in additional funding. Freeholder Bartlett stated that despite this, the County budget is under the 2 percent CAP level, which is a model budget providing for services the residents of Ocean County expect while preserving the County's Triple A bond rating. Freeholder Bartlett commended the rest of the Freeholders for their stable management and the County to live within its means. Freeholder Bartlett advised the Board that is a great budget and thanked the Director for the opportunity to present the budget.

Director Vicari thanked Freeholder Bartlett and County staff for the budget noting that they have been working on the budget for the last 4 to 5 months which preserves core services and continues to give our students in our County opportunities by providing \$18 million this year to the County's VOTECH school and \$15 million to Ocean County College. The Director stated that this budget provides core services including an additional \$250,000 to Senior Services. The Director stated that the County's Triple A bond rating is important to our seniors and residents and that the County budget has no surprises and maintains services to our residents. The Director again thanked Freeholder Bartlett for preserving the core services in Ocean County through this budget. Director Vicari noted that the good news this year is that small businesses are doing well and they are off to an excellent start for

tourism. The population expands to 1.3 million people in the summer and Ocean County continues to provide services during the summer months.

Freeholder Haines congratulated Freeholder Bartlett and Julie Tarrant for putting this budget together and for going one tenth of one cent down while maintaining our surplus and bond rating. The Freeholder stated that there is no other County in New Jersey like Ocean County, reducing the budget while providing all its services.

Freeholder Little advised that this budget demonstrates that this Board maintains its fiscal responsibility, stating that this Board knows how much it can spend and coordinates this with our departments. Freeholder Little noted that Ocean County does not spend more than it takes in; it does not over spend its surplus; maintains it Triple A bond rating; and has no surprises. The Freeholder stated this is a team effort that reflects on this Board and its staff.

Freeholder Kelly noted that this Board made a commitment to downsize after Superstorm Sandy and has cut the size of County government and has seen the results of The Freeholder also noted that the County has still been able to do that some years later. this and have a budget that allows us to provide services to our residents. The Freeholder discussed the new bail reform law passed by the State that requires much more time and effort by the Sheriff and Prosecutor's Office. The Prosecutor when he started this process needed \$700,000 which is not available under the new CAP law. This law requires the Sheriff, Clerk and Prosecutor each to be under the 2 percent CAP law. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County works with the New Jersey Association of Counties for State mandate Freeholder Kelly stated that the Prosecutor worked with his / State pay for bail reform. Department and the Administrator and has found \$400,000 in reductions in this year's budget to use towards the new bail reform required by the State. The Freeholder noted that the County will provide \$200,000 and advised that the County and the Prosecutor are working together on this. The Freeholder stated that he was proud of what the Prosecutor was able to do and stated that the County is going to provide the services to the residents of the County. The Freeholder also commended Freeholder Bartlett for coming up with the budget and the small reduction, noting that it is not just this Board, it is also the people that Freeholder Kelly advised that Engineering gave up 17 work for us that make this happen. people and the Department is now looking at major projects in the northern section of the County and will need to fill some of those positions. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County was able to meet the needs of the residents of Ocean County with this budget, stating that the County is going in the right direction.

Director Vicari stated that in 2009 the County did not lay off employees, the Board asked for cutbacks and didn't replace employees when they retired. The Director noted that the State of New Jersey lost its rating 10 times over the last several years and advised that Ocean County has maintained its rating. Homes and building is back since Superstorm Sandy, but the Director reminded everyone that it will take another 3 to 4 years for a full recovery.

Administrator Block advised that the Ocean County Library tax rate is flat as well as the Board of Health.

Director Vicari stated that the 2017 Budget will be introduced next Wednesday at the March 1, 2017 Board meeting with final adoption of the 2017 Budget on April 5, 2017.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the advertisement for the construction of traffic signal upgrades, Phase B, Group 1 on Long Beach Boulevard in Long Beach Township and the recommended award of Phase A, Group 3 on Long Beach Boulevard to Edward H. Cray in the amount of \$438,778.40. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the March 1, 2017 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 1, 2017. There were no questions or comments.
