#### U. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:10 PM, Director Quinn received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Okay, moving on, Item U: Commissioner Comments. Commissioner Little."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. And we have on our COVID report today - a lot of sad news. We have 263 new cases today in Ocean County which is a very, very high number. 71,762 total cases. 2,063 deaths that are related to COVID and that is an increase of 2. Let's see, we have 1,425 so-called breakthrough confirmed cases. For anyone who may not be familiar with that, that is someone who is fully vaccinated for a period of at least 2 weeks and then contracts COVID. So we have 1,425. Eight of those people have been confirmed hospitalizations and they have underlying medical conditions. And no one has been confirmed lost in a breakthrough case so far. So we're hopeful for that.

We do have some very positive news as well, Mr. Director and members of the Board. As the Board is aware, the state identified approximately three months ago I believe, Dan? In that ballpark? Three, four months, of five different towns that were below the state target of 70% vaccinations. Those towns were and are Jackson, Brick, Toms River,

Lacey and Lakewood. We are very pleased that two of those towns – Jackson and Brick – have now been vaccinated according to the state standard of 70% and Toms River has 69.5% so they're right behind and we expect that by the next week or so that they will be over the 70% figure. And we want to thank our Health Department. Lacey is not too far behind, Mr. Director. Lakewood is a little bit behind. But our Health Department is working very hard, along with our state efforts that are there to assist us, to get these towns up to the 70% figure which is the guideline used by the state. Hopefully in all the counties that will have 70% effective vaccination rates.

Also I think it's important to mention for the record, Mr. Director and members of the Board, that when we began the vaccinations last year under President Trump the vaccinations began, the same vaccines we are using now, we requested here in Ocean County the location of a state mega-site. Commissioner Quinn and I are members and representing the entire Board on our planning committee for the COVID response along with our Health Department, our Sheriff, and our support staff, the Administrator and Deputy Administrator, Donna Flynn and Julie are part of that and we appreciate that. We requested a state mega-site. The state did not provide that site for Ocean County. They had 6 mega-sites spread out across the northern part of the state and Atlantic City. And the state now is in the process of planning or deciding whether to have mega-sites for this round of so-called booster shots and we have made a similar request. Our Health Director, Dan Regenye, made the request the other day. I followed up along with Commissioner Quinn for this Board, requesting the state to locate a state mega-site here for the booster shots. So we will see whether or not that is granted, but we wanted to put that out there for the record to know that we are trying to do everything we can to make sure that Ocean County residents have access and full support of the State of New Jersey for our vaccination program. So we are awaiting any decision on this, but we will keep you updated. And our planning committee and our Health Department are working on our county-based vaccination plans which we will be talking about in the next few weeks. So that is my report, Mr. Director, unless anyone has a question. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Commissioner Vicari."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "I just would like to acknowledge one department. I see Steve Scaturro here, the Superintendent of Consumer Affairs. We have a very active department. We lead not only the state, but even combined we probably do more than if you add up all the other 20 counties, of over 5,400 complaints investigated by our department just in 8 months and collected over \$600,000.00. Our main concern, of course, is working with our senior citizens. A lot of complaints have been helping veterans, but also with a lot of contractors with deceiving people and also with home repairs, cars, car repairs. So I want to commend Steve. It's the same number of people year after year. We have not increased the department. And I remember at one time in Ocean County when I first got elected when I was Mayor of Toms River we had our own department of Consumer Affairs. So instead of Ocean County having 33 departments of consumer affairs, we have one which is more effective, more efficient. And the last time I was with the Attorney General he not only acknowledged Ocean County for being the leader in the State of New Jersey, but of course being the teacher of the other counties. When we have a seminar or a gathering or a forum, Ocean County not only takes the leadership role but has been a policy maker for the entire State of New Jersey. So I just want to acknowledge Steve and his department for coming through and showing the rest of the State of New Jersey on how to do it in protecting all of our residents in consumer protection. So we thank you. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Commissioner Little?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Mr. Director, thank you for indulging me. I've neglected something that I've been waiting for the opportunity to discuss with many of our Directors that are here today. As many of you know our Director of Veterans Affairs retired on I think July 1st or the end of July. And we, meaning this Board, and our administrative staff had a number of discussions and I would like to acknowledge Eddie McBride. Eddie came forward and stepped right into the issue and has led that Veterans Bureau and we haven't missed a beat. He's done a great job. He's a Marine. His wife, I believe, works for the Prosecutor. His son is in the military. And Steve Scaturro is a military guy himself, an Army guy. And Steve cooperated along with Commissioner Vicari and said yes, we can use Ed. So he's doing it on an interim basis and this Board is very fortunate to have Ed there and I wanted to thank you. So thank you Ed and all your fellow Directors. (applause) Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Your welcome. Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I just want to say that I'm very happy that we granted Mike Mangum another three-year term as Director of our Parks and Recreation. As you well know, Ocean County has the largest park system in the State of New Jersey. Right now we have 27, with 28 in the planning which will be in Manchester. And he and, of course, Mary Jane Bavais our Deputy Director who is here, I can't thank them enough for the great job that they do at the Parks Department because between the Carousel of Music which I have been able to attend a couple of times and just all the other programs that we have for the people of Ocean County, it's just very well received. We constantly get people calling all the time and going to all the programs whether it's learning how to do different things like golfing and different things that they have for the people, people of all ages. And of course, all of our parks that we have. Our one that's very popular, of course, Ocean County Park is my favorite. But John C. Bartlett Park at Berkeley Island is good because it's our first spray park which is very, very popular. We get a lot of people. But I just can't thank them enough and, of course, look forward to working with Mike and Mary Jane and all the members of the Parks Department for the great job that they do. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you. Commissioner Kelly."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "I just also want to mention Mike because when I started my career in county government it was not in 1992 when I was elected to this Board, but in fact in 1982 when I went to work for the Parks

Department and Mike was a naturalist then. He and I spent some time at Tip Seaman Park with a guy that probably many of you don't know – Joe Smith – who was down there. I know Mary Jane that you know him well. Joe taught me a lot of things, but one thing that Joe taught me was to have candy in my office and I still have candy in my office to this day. Joe always had that for the kids coming in. But Mike works very hard as a Director, but I will tell you first-hand that going back all those years when he was just a young guy, he was as hard a worker then as he is now. He's worked hard his whole life. And certainly we are in good hands to have a Parks Department headed by Mike. So thank you for all your service to the County. Mary Jane thank you too."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Mr. Director, just one thing I meant to say, besides being very involved with Parks and everything, Mike is also a member of the Sons of the Revolution. And I happen to be a part of the Daughters of the American Revolution. And of course, he works very hard to remember all the history of things that have happened since the Revolution. And it was my honor to be at something at the historic Tuckerton Park, Tuckerton Cemetery, that we went to in honor of Ebenezer Tucker. We went down there. So it's not just Parks things that he does, but his children are also very involved in Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts. So it's something that we can all be very proud of that we have that in one of our directors. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "And Mike, I still consider you a young guy. But Mike, Mary Jane, Steve, everybody, I just want to acknowledge really all the directors that we have in the room here because this county – we say it over and over again – would not be as successful if we didn't have each and every one of you doing what you do running each of your departments and making us all look good sitting up here. So from the bottom of my heart we thank each and every one of you for all the hard work and effort you put in for the residents of Ocean County.

The only other thing I just want to touch on is with the tragic events that we've seen occur in the national news this week. I just ask everyone please remember the thirteen men and women that passed in the unfortunate situation that happened at the Afghanistan Airport. Keep their families and their loved ones in your prayers because it's certainly something that we never expected nor should have ever happened and it's a very difficult time right now for a lot of people. So just please keep your thoughts and prayers with those people.

And just the back tail end of that, I just want to let everyone know that next week we're going to be having the 20th Anniversary of 9/11 - probably one of the nicest ceremonies you're going to see throughout the entire State of New Jersey. So I'd like to invite everyone to come out next Friday. It's going to be on the 10th which is the day before 9/11 itself. We're going to be having it out here by the Engineering building over by the parking garage and it's going to consist of a lot of different events that Donna has put together – some beautiful music. We're having a local band that I know Ginny was involved in setting it all up with one of the patriotic bands here in Ocean County. So it's hard to believe that 20 years have passed, but again it was such a tragic day for each and every one of us as Americans. And it's so important that we never forget and we do everything we can to take and really celebrate the lives of the people that were lost on that very difficult day."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "It's at 11 o'clock."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Oh it's 11 o'clock?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "11:00 am it starts."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Okay, 11:00 am. And Donna probably told me that earlier, but I'm just back from vacation and not really on the same planet right now. But that's really all the comments I have. So with that..."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Can I just say one more thing?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Sure."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Because we're talking and Commissioner Little talked about lives lost with Coronavirus. The brother of two of our employees at the County Clerk's Office passed away this week from Coronavirus. But also an employee in Berkeley Township only 19 years old lost his life. He was a lifeguard in Seaside Park. So let's also keep them in our thoughts and prayers. Thank you sir."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you for bringing that up. Thank you. Okay, at this point I'll open the floor to public comment."

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker.

At 4:24 PM, Director Quinn opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public, as follows:

DIRECTOR QUINN: "If you'd like to say anything just raise your hand. Yes ma'am. And when you come up to the microphone, just give your name and address please."

RHIANNON MINDAS, 1771 WOODSIDE ROAD, FORKED RIVER: "I hate to change the tone of the celebrations and solemnness of some of the things that are being spoken of, but Lacey Township had their (School) Board Meeting on Monday and passed the mask mandate into their policy. And while I'm hearing that the state has done a lot to support people getting vaccinated that want to get vaccinated, I am asking you today to stand up for the people that want to hold on to their choice and their medical freedoms. And I can't find anybody that I can speak to that can't say

'it's out of my hands'. I understand people have the limitations and that people going against the Executive Order have consequences, but that school board meeting was packed and every single parent got up there and spoke about the want for choice. And many got up and said that they would be pulling their students to home school.

I teach in Lacey and I have four kids, one that has graduated. We had a doctor speak at the meeting. We don't have long-term effects of masking kids for 7 hours a day. We do know at our last Board Meeting there was a school...not a school psychologist, but a person who practices that has seen the suicide rates of children. She had had more children with plans than in her entire practice over the past year. Parental choice is important. It's a freedom that should be upheld. It should not be up to Governor Murphy. It should be up to the parents.

And my next thing is vaccines. While there is a number that you want to push, there is a risk. There is a serious risk. And there are also breakthrough cases. So if the mandate is that we are supposed to get tested if we do not want to get vaccinated, it should be even across the board since we are having these breakthroughs. And the testing – the swab tests contain ethylene oxide which when you look at the EPA is a carcinogen. While it might be fine once in a while if you are sick and they test you, repeated exposure has not been studied. So as you make your decisions with the County Superintendent (of Schools) to impose this on all of these state workers and teachers and firefighters, I hope that they will push for a saliva test. And I hope that you'll think of the consistency of the safety because if that is what it is really about, it should be for everyone because it doesn't seem like the vaccines are holding up their end. And the vaccine passports are not going to be a two and done, they are now going to be pushed to expire and need six-month boosters. That's what is coming down the pike.

I've been a resident of Lacey Township for 37 of my 43 years and I've been teaching in Lacey for 17 years. I was 'Teacher of the Year' last year. But I'm at a point with all of this that we had a realtor to our house. We're making repairs. And if it comes down to me walking away from my career I will move to a state that supports my freedoms. I'm hearing as we're talking about 9/11 that Murphy invited in, and I am all for humanitarian efforts, that we are housing 15,000 refugees and 120,000 people that we evacuated – only 6,000 of them were Americans – and there are people left behind. I'm seeing safety problems all over between the testing, between what's happening with everything in the Middle East. I'm prepared to lose my career. I'm prepared to leave and I don't want to.

I know somebody came to the last public meeting, Mr. Butow, and asked if you'd be joining the lawsuit against the mask mandate. I don't know where you stood with that or if you made any decisions. I don't know if there are any efforts, but I'm asking as a county if we ban together with other counties that want to support our freedoms – we need numbers and we need the people that we elected to represent us to stand up for these freedoms. And waiting until November is too late. It's getting pushed. Hoboken schools already put a policy in place that it's mandatory for children 12 and up to be vaccinated. The parents don't have a choice. They'll be exposed to that same testing. In West Deptford they tried to pass that if the student refuses to wear the mask twice they call Child Protective Services on them. These are the things that we're putting into place. And now I'm getting word through Blue Cross/Blue Shield that the doctors are not allowed to write exemptions except for in extreme cases and they are getting bonuses if they get a certain percentage of their practice vaccinated. So there's a lot of questions here and I really am just imploring you to stand up for our choices. That's all I have. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Ms. Mindas, the gentleman who was here, what was his name? Jeffrey?"

RHIANNON MINDAS: "Jason."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Jason, yes, he lives out in Bamber. We pretty much explained to him the day he came in unfortunately there is a misconception when people talk about the County Superintendent of Schools. The County Superintendent of Schools is not somebody under the umbrella of Ocean County. He is an appointed official into that position by the Governor of the State of New Jersey. So although he operates out of a building right around the corner here which the County owns, we don't deal with him. We don't get involved with him. He deals directly with the Superintendents of Schools throughout all 33 municipalities in the county itself.

We had told the gentleman and I think another young lady, Jessica was here also that day talking exactly about the same thing you are about freedoms being taken away which I don't think there is anyone really that doesn't agree with that. But as the elected officials we have a very fine line we have to really be careful not to cross because of the fact that we could put the people in this county in jeopardy of having..."

RHIANNON MINDAS: "We're in jeopardy."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "I understand that, but we're elected to make decisions not put them into a situation where the county is going to get sued and we're going to end up in a situation where we have to take and fight that fight with dollars that belong to the taxpayers. We had said that day we would be happy to send a letter to Governor Murphy if the school wants to send us up a resolution and the town sends us up a resolution. I did talk to the officials down in Lacey because I used to be on the Committee there and they're supposedly going to put a resolution on their agenda and send it up to us. So we just have to get something from the school asking the government to take and rethink this thing and really look at the whole picture here because I, outside of being an elected official, I totally agree with you. I am 100% against it. My wife teaches in Lacey. My little grandson is going to be starting school next week and the mask thing is going to be very, very impossible for people to deal with now going to school until 3 o'clock in the afternoon. Last year with virtual one day you were there, you weren't there the next day. You were only there until 12 o'clock. So there are so many different things you're looking at this year that you have to deal with which I don't know why the Board – I know two of the members of the Board voted one way and the rest of the Board voted the

other way – I don't know why the Board took and went down that road that they went down. But again, they're elected at that level and us at the county level, if we take and infringe on 'home rule' when it comes to school boards or local officials, they kind of give pushback to us. And we have to cool down which we don't want to create a battle going back and forth because we do work together on a lot of good things. But if we can get something – that you could push them to give us a resolution."

RHIANNON MINDAS: "They did."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Oh, they did a resolution?"

RHIANNON MINDAS: "Yeah and I think Jay handed you the list of resolutions last time he was here."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "No, no, the School Board doing a resolution asking not to enforce the mask mandate. We haven't gotten that from anybody yet. We're still waiting on that. The town I know is going to be sending it up."

RHIANNON MINDAS: "I've seen them released. But I will look into it."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Yea, just ask Jay to get it up to us and we'll be happy to do that. With regards to the other issue, you know the vaccine itself – we're not pushing anybody to get the vaccine. And we don't feel as government officials that it's our job to tell you that you have to get that vaccine. That's a personal decision that every parent has to make or every individual has to make whether or not they feel it's the right thing or the wrong thing to do in their lives. Is Trenton going to do that? I don't know. We don't know the answer to that. But we've lived under the same umbrella as you're living under in different ways over the last 19 months. You know we would be told 'you have to do this', 'you have to do this'. We didn't agree with it, but unfortunately we had no choice to do it otherwise we'd be violating the law ourselves. So we're within certain confines where we can act and not act. But if you can get us something from the schools and I'll make sure that the town sends something up, we'll be happy to participate at that level and send a letter out to Trenton asking for some help out there because that's really the only involvement we could have.

We have our own schools. We have the County College which is ours. We have the Vocational Schools which different Commissioners oversee. And in those situations we have a little more flexibility. But when it comes to local schools they fall under the Ocean County Superintendent who is an appointed official of Governor Murphy."

RHIANNON MINDAS: "The reason they're voting yes is for the same fear that you're saying – that there will be consequences, that they'll lose funding, and that's the answer that is given everywhere. So he can mandate anything..."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Hey I'm sorry...They could lose the funding every year. Ocean County schools have not been blessed in any way whatsoever when it comes to funding from the state."

RHIANNON MINDAS: "And it's about to get worse because there are a lot of parents pulling for home schooling. They're forming home school pods all over the place."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "I know how this issue is so important to you, but don't throw in the towel and walk away because I know you're a very good teacher. I know your record. And I don't think that it's something that is going to, in the long run, be good for a lot of people because you can still have an impact to make a change."

RHIANNON MINDAS: "Thank you. I appreciate that. It just might not be here."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "I understand."

RHIANNON MINDAS: "And I will continue to fight and I will join PAT groups and hold events, but I'm just very disheartened. Thank you for listening."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thanks for coming in. Dr. Phil. Just your name and address doctor."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO, SEASIDE PARK: "Good afternoon Commissioners. On August 28th, the Associated Press released another report on Dominion election machines so I wish to make this statement and have it placed in the record. Last meeting, the Board of Commissioners, pardon my tremors, ignored the recommendation of the Board of Elections staff and voted to award a contract for new voting machines to Dominion Voting Systems. I strongly objected. The Board accepted approximately \$100,000.00 in donations from an agent of Dominion Voting Systems and those donations represent a serious conflict of interest. The Board members should have followed the recommendations of the non-partisan Board of Elections staff. And according to the meeting minutes every senior member who spoke recommended against Dominion voting machines. The assertion that Dominion's competitor does not provide a paper trail is false. The paper trail is shown to the voter and preserved recounts and audits.

Regarding this August 28th article in the Associated Press, they brought up additional concerns about Dominion Election Systems. According to the press article, copies of the Dominion Voting System software were distributed by the 'My Pillow' CEO, Michael Lindell who has been a persistent critic of Dominion. The Associated Press reports that efforts questioning the outcome of the 2020 Presidential Election has led to voting system breaches that election security experts say pose a heightened risk to future elections. And one of former President Trump's top election

officials, a Matt Masterson, warned about the future security problems caused by the security and I quote this from the Associated Press article and I have it here if you want to look at it. 'It's a game changer in that in the environment we talked about existing is now a reality.' I believe your actions last month have created serious concerns about the integrity of future elections and illustrate the danger of making important decisions based on politics and pay to play. And I believe your actions are unacceptable and not representative of Ocean County residents and I respectfully submit this. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Dr. Phil. And I know there's going to be a few comments from the Board starting with our liaison to the Board of Elections who would like to say a few words first and then our Administrator before I follow up."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. First, I would like to say Dominion has never, ever donated a dime to the Republican Party of Ocean County. We have gone back and checked every ELEC report. It is not Dominion. It was the printing company which is not affiliated with Dominion. That is factual. That is not something that I made up or anybody else made up. Apparently the reporter with the Press did make this up. But again, Dominion did not donate anything. It was the printing company which I do not know the individual from the printing company, but they did not do it.

With regards to our last year's election, as you are aware there were 445,000 ballots that were mailed which took three weeks, 21 days, 2 shifts per day, for them to be stuffed and mailed and it was a mail-in ballot. The only people that were allowed to go to the polling places – which they used the Sequoia machines which have been in effect since 1997 and the company that had built the Sequoia went bankrupt and Dominion bought it. It was not a Dominion original product – the machines that were used last year. And we have not, since 1997, we have used Sequoia machines. We have never had a problem whatsoever. But just talking about last year with the machines, it was only those that were handicapped that were allowed to go to the polling places to vote. Everyone else, if they went there and they had not mailed in their ballot, it was necessary for them to do a provisional ballot. And everyone else did a mail-in ballot. That's exactly how it was done last year.

And with this year, the new machines will be used only in the early voting. But on the November 2nd ballot, when everyone goes to vote, they will be using the Sequoia machines which as I said before and I'm repeating myself in case you didn't understand me – it was not an original Dominion product. It was another company that went bankrupt.

And again, no money was ever sent by Dominion to the county organization of the Republican Party as a donation. Just so that we're clear on that. And that is all I have to say right now."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Carl, do you want to say anything?"

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "Yes, actually a couple of items if I could Mr. Director. Number one is there were a couple of articles out. Some of the articles seem to perpetuate when one thing is mentioned, next there's some big stuff, all of the sudden it's fact. So I know there is an article that says that this printer is an agent for Dominion, but he is not. And if you would do some independent research – not very difficult to do – go through the ELEC reports which are online and can be searched. You will probably find that out. I know I wanted to make sure I mentioned that because in the article I was mentioned as receiving money from Dominion which I have not either. Nobody has, either individually or as the organization.

Next, you again for like the third time now have repeated that you've gone to the Board of Elections and that the staff came in and recommended it at the meeting of June 21st. However, you keep saying that the Board supported that. Well at the meeting of June 29th that you continue to ignore, the Board did actually vote on the record and there was a 2-2 tie. The motion was made for Dominion, 2 voted for it, 2 voted against it. That's not a recommendation to me. That's a tie. And it was advisory only by statute. And both sides acknowledged it was an advisory. And you never mentioned the meeting of the 29th (of June) where both the County Clerk and myself, former County Clerk, election officials, spoke as well putting some more things on the record.

The other thing is the whole reason that we're even buying election machines – there was no intention by this Board to buy any machines this year, but frankly I don't know of any other county of the 21 in New Jersey that were. But the Governor and the Legislature decided we had to have early voting and we had to have it this year. So many counties around the state found themselves in the same position we did. We did not have enough machines because in early voting when we set up our 10 polling places and man them according to the state's guidelines and follow the state law to have the state-mandated early voting, we'll have to buy a state-certified only machine which will then have to be sequestered after 6:00 pm of the Sunday preceding the election and locked away and cannot be opened or counted until Election Night which that makes sense. But you then have to buy more machines because of the new law, because of the directive. All circling back to the state. The state is actually who created this cascading effect. We are also being mandated to use electronic poll books this election which, by the way, the state is going to reimburse all of the counties because it was a state mandate. And when the state volunteers to give you money because they admit it was a mandate, usually you have to fight them, sue them and take them to court, take them to the Council of Mandates. But no, they're voluntarily saying 'oh you're right, we're mandating it, we'll pay for it'.

And to the point of the selection, you have four systems that are certified in the state. You can go to the State Division of Elections website and it will tell you there are four only. Avante which has not really made a play in New Jersey. Hart, ES&S and Dominion. Hart is more of a tablet type that you paginate through. I think most seniors would find it

difficult as well as some other people that are a little computer untrusting, if you will. That only leaves two - ES&S and Dominion that are certified.

First thing with ES&S, it is an electronic machine, very nice. I won't knock it from that standpoint. But it is then fed with this paper trail. It's a piece of paper that comes in, you view it in a window, you say okay 'Carl Block for Dog Catcher', I got it, go ahead and vote it. Then it goes into the machine's counter but not by the words 'Carl Block for Dog Catcher', but rather a barcode that is on there which you can't read the barcode. So how do you ever verify that the barcode is really saying that's 'Carl Block for Dog Catcher'? I don't know. But in certain parts of the state it could be used and there are people using it. As a matter of fact, in the State of New Jersey there are 21 counties – 9 of them use Dominion and 12 of them use ES&S. Of the 9 that are Dominion, six are Democrat, three are Republican. Of the ES&S 12 (machines) – eight are Democrat, four are Republican. So it doesn't seem to be a Democrat or Republican issue. It seems to be a choice of the county.

Back to the most important part which is the machine itself, this Dominion name – they have, over the years, sold a variety of machines. The DREs record electronically. There are other variations of the machine. Most importantly, I think the Board was concerned about getting back to basics. They wanted to make sure that the machines that were purchased which will only be, as Commissioner just stated, for the early voting only which is only mandated by the state. It's a paper ballot based system. The ultimate paper trail. It will have a paper ballot to print on demand at the polls. The person can choose to print the ballot which will, plain as day, look just like a vote by mail ballot. You can take it over to the corner and fill it in yourself with a marker and put it in the machine. You can choose that the machine do it as a ballot marker, as they call it. But it will be a readable by human eye paper trail from the beginning. That seems to be what most people are most comfortable with rather than it being in the computer in the machine. Anyway, that was thought, to go back to basics.

Again, you don't seem to mention that either in any of your comments. So I'm not quite sure other than trying to smear a bunch of people's names about money that didn't happen. Let's talk about the facts of the voting system. The facts of what are allowed to be done. Unfortunately, like the lady that spoke earlier about masks, the state exerts an enormous amount of control and in this case as well – the election date, time, rules, machines – all set by the state. We follow the state direction on all of it to the best of our ability of course.

I would go on a little further but I don't want to monopolize everyone's time. And I'll also say that looking at the minutes from the Board of Elections, I have asked for a copy of the recording which I do have. And I do have my secretary transcribing it. Because it seems the minutes that were produced were a bit scant. So I think we're going to suggest some amendments because I know certainly in my comments as well as the (County) Clerk's and emphasizing the Board because at the time when the Board voted, the Chairman asked the Vice Chairman 'would you like to make a motion?' And the Vice Chairman answered at that time 'no, this is advisory only and I decline to make a motion'. So this whole idea that the Board was fully in favor of it and it was really (inaudible) was really not true. And I know that not because of the minutes, but because I was sitting there. I was sitting right across the table. So Mr. Director, a few of those comments from the paper that I have and my personal experience and I could go on further, but I think you've heard more than enough."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you very much. Just adding a brief comment to that. Just so it's understood, when the 2-2 vote took place at the Board of Elections that was not, like the Administrator said, that was not a recommendation to go the way you're talking about it and having to go. But the bottom line is, after that was done there were still demonstrations put on for the Commissioners to take and go see these machines. And like I said at the last meeting when we spoke, I took the time and I know other Commissioners took the time to go sit down, watch the demonstrations of these three people that answered the RFP and had the opportunity to see what they were doing and to see what was the best machine for our residents here in Ocean County. Considering the fact that we probably have the largest senior population in the entire state, that the machine that we chose is by all means much easier to operate. I mean the other machine was confusing to me and I think it would have been very difficult to take and have our population that runs our elections be able to handle all the issues that came up during the day if we had chosen to go in that direction. So I think that was probably really the straw that broke the camel's back in my situation because I felt that this was going to be the best way to go.

But the only other thing I want to point out, this whole thing started with an article on a social media site which when you get involved in any kind of elected office or any kind of public thing even as a teacher, stuff is thrown out there all the time. The facts are never true. The story is made up the way that the writer of that story wants to make it up. And unfortunately, a lot of times it grows legs and it takes and goes forward which is exactly where this thing came from. The money – there was never any donations made to – I know for a fact that my campaign...this is my second election that I'm coming into this year and I know we checked all of the ELEC reports on everybody sitting up here and there was never any donations made by Dominion which we can certainly tell you to go check it out the same way because that's all public information that's available to anybody that chooses to take and look it up. But at the end of the day I just want to make one last comment because in that social media article, and I know it was brought up before I think by yourself, there was a comment made that it was a \$10 million purchase we were making. The machines themselves are only \$988,000.00. And not that that's not a lot of money, that is a tremendous amount of money, but again as my fellow Commissioners and the Administrator said, we wouldn't be spending this money if it wasn't a mandate coming out of Governor Murphy's office saying that we had to do it. But there's a big difference between when you read an article in the paper saying \$10 million is being wasted by the Board of Commissioners versus \$998,000.00. Is it a waste? I'm not going to say yes or no to that because it's, again, the Governor telling us you have to do that and we're moving forward doing what we're told to do. We'll see come 10 days prior to Election Day what it looks like, how people like it. I know just like when we're talking about the social media post that it all

started here in Ocean County. There were a lot of postings throughout the last Presidential Election throughout the entire country Dominion all of the sudden exploded, but we have never had a problem. Our machines are Sequoia. This is a new machine to us that we're going to take and see how it works out. But again, it's on the state's dime. If it's not the proper machine and we have to go out and purchase new machines, we'll do it at our expense. We'll do what we have to do moving forward. Yes, I'll give you 2 minutes doc."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO, SEASIDE PARK: "Yea, I'll be quick. Just two quick points. You need to look into Mr. Perna's affiliation with Dominion. Please do that.

Second point was the senior staff here recommended ES&S over Dominion. If you look at a few counties that have decided to go with ES&S, they did a test, I was researching this myself. They did a test in the field with voters and they found that ES&S was easier to use for voters, particularly, and again I don't want to...I need a direct quote from this, but they found it to be an easier use for the voter, an easier machine to train staff on. So you can't ignore the fact that some of these counties echoed some of the same recommendations that our own senior staff made. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "That's an opinion by whoever wrote that article. Our senior staff did not recommend ES&S. It was a 2-2 vote coming out of the Board of Elections and the final vote comes from this Board of five Commissioners sitting up here after we do our due diligence and make our decision."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO: "But the minutes..."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "But again, there is a split in the state being 9-12 means 9 of them think this one is good, 12 think that's good. I'm not going to throw stones at any of them. But it does mean there's no consensus which I've heard that word used a lot lately, there was no consensus on what it should be just like I like Ford and you like Chevy. Chevy is a good car. I buy a Ford. That's the way it goes."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thanks doc. Anyone else?"

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Anyone else want to make a comment on this topic? After I would like to make a comment."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Just your name and address please."

ANN REISER, SOUTH SEASIDE PARK: "From what I can see on the minutes because I haven't been here, it sounds as though public notice was given so does that mean 20 days to sign the contract or what does that mean?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Which one are you referring to?"

ANN REISER: "The Dominion whatever. It says 'Public Notice is given..."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "The resolution was on our last meeting and it was an authorization to sign the...which I left out, I'm sorry, to sign the outcome. We did an RFP (Request for Proposal). On top of everything else, we did a competitive RFP. We received them. And it was an authorization to sign the contract pursuant to the RFP."

ANN REISER: "So it's signed now. Is that what you're saying?"

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Well, the lawyers have it."

ANN REISER: "Alright, well, let me start with this. No cyber electronic voting companies provide election vote integrity. They are plagued with problems due to computers, proprietary software and many other vulnerabilities. Both Dominion and ES&S are ripe for corruption. In England, excuse me, in Ireland, France, the Netherlands and Germany they have all gone back to paper ballots. You were talking before about the Daughters and the Sons of the Revolution – they would be turning over in their grave! Our votes are being tampered with! Tampered with! And this is why we have what's going on in Washington now!

Next, Canada, France, Germany and even Russia do not use e-voting for national elections. Why do we need voting machines that report fractions of votes? There's absolutely no such thing as a fraction of a vote. Your vote is a one vote. You're not .3% of a vote! Why do we need voting machines that can reportedly be accessed or modified in real-time by USB drives/internet – they're elaborate algorithms changed in mid-vote count. Why do we need machines with proprietary source codes that cannot be analyzed by independent auditors to see after the count if vote switching occurred? Why do we need voting machines that spit out ballots that it doesn't like and are forced to adjudication by biased poll workers then it leads to votes being switched or nullified. There are numerous reports of problems with the 2020 election in terms of outcome, manipulation and ease of post-election integrity review. Many questionable voting practices took place presumably because of COVID-19. Many states violated the Constitution by employing voting schemes not authorized by the State Legislature. The Governor, Judicial, blah, blah, blah...not allowed to make the decisions – only State Legislatures. At the heart of the questionable voting practices is use of computerized voting machines of which Dominion machines were reported and most frequently mentioned.

Now, I am not pushing for either one of these machines. As far as I'm concerned they are all horrible. Americans must have confidence in their voting. They must be assured that their vote counts for the candidate that they choose.

The real votes of the election must be honest, accurate and easily reviewable. Without this our Constitutional Republic will not exist. The heart of the republic survives on fairness and trust in elections. Election integrity depends on secure machines and absolutely no outside access or manipulation of votes which is what occurred in 2020. And also for the authority of the analysis by independent auditors to assess anything computer operators may have done to these votes. Dominion has blocked access to its programs and their algorithms claiming they are proprietary which is a major problem for viewing or guaranteeing election integrity. The county cannot buy machines from a company that blocks access to anything. We must know exactly what happens to every vote at every point in the election process. If we do not have election integrity, we have an illegitimate government installed to thwart the will of the people. Now you say 'get back to basics' – let's get back to basics. What about paper? What about paper? P A P E R! What about paper? This is disgusting what happened in 2020 in the election! Why do you think 13 military soldiers...I am a mother of a Marine...they were murdered! Murdered! And you know what? They had notice that that was going to happen, that they were going to be targeted. And this is all because of what happened in this election. This is disgraceful!"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you very much ma'am."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Mr. Director if I could just reaffirm that the machines that we're buying are paper ballot machines."

ANN REISER: "It doesn't matter. They're attached to the computer."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "You said you wanted paper."

ANN REISER: "It doesn't matter. They're attached to the computer and they can change at any time along the way."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "First of all, the machines at no time are connected to our server."

ANN REISER: "They are! We've seen it."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "I can't speak for any other county or state, but in New Jersey and in Ocean County they are not because, as a matter of fact, the IT Director is sitting right down at the end of the bench. We have participated in every Homeland Security drill, every New Jersey State drill to make sure that the machines and the software are totally apart. They are not connected at any point to the Internet, number one. And number two, when you use a paper ballot system the whole point is, can you verify it? And by having paper ballots you can. Because if you think there is something wrong with that machine count, all you do is take the paper ballots that were put through it and count them – site verify. You can read them."

ANN REISER: "Then they don't need to have anything to do with the computer then. Why is the computer involved at all?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "There is no computer."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "What computer?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Why don't you, if you want, you guys just get together after the meeting for a minute because I think you'll understand a little bit more."

ANN REISER: "No, I don't want to hear anymore. I've heard enough. That's why we have our elections stolen."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you. Anyone else? Seeing none, I'd like to close the floor. Can I have a motion?"



WHEREAS, among the activities to be performed by the Ocean County Board of Health under the Solid Waste Program are inspections of the sanitary landfills and recycling facilities situated within the County and investigations of potentially illegal solid waste and recycling violations; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the Ocean County Board of Health will enter into an Agreement of Understanding; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 13:1E-9, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated N.J.A.C. 7:26-4.10(b) setting forth allowable fees to be charged by the County Health Departments; and

WHEREAS, the said fee schedule must be established and fixed by Resolution of this Board; and

WHEREAS, the Public Health Coordinator of the Ocean County Health Department recommends that said fee schedule be effective immediately.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, that pursuant to N.J.A.C.7:26-4(b).1, this County of Ocean does hereby establish the following 2022 fee schedule for solid waste enforcement and monitoring activities by the Ocean County Health Department pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-21 et.seq.;

- 1. The fees to be collected from the owner/operator of any sanitary Landfill facility within Ocean County are as follows:
  - a. \$0.40 per ton of solid waste accepted for disposal at said facility.
  - b. In the event that any solid waste is measured, upon acceptance for disposal by other than per ton, the fee shall be assessed on the equivalents utilized pursuant to the Sanitary Landfill Closure and Contingency Funds Act, P.L. 1981, c. 306 and the Recycling Act, P.L. 1981, c. 278.
  - c. Fees shall be assessed and collected by the Ocean County Health Department each month in a manner provided for in this schedule.

- d. Except as otherwise provided for herein, the owner or operator of every landfill facility shall submit to the Ocean County Health Department on or before the 20th day of each month, a fee equal to \$0.40 per ton of solid waste accepted for disposal during the preceding month, together with a completed copy of Department Form NO. SFA-001, which is submitted for that month to the Department in accordance with the escrow account reporting requirements pursuant to the Sanitary Landfill Facility Closure and Contingency Fund Act, P.L. 1981, c.306.
- 2. Subject to the approval of the Department, a higher fee may be assessed in the event that the Ocean County Health Department documents the need for a greater amount in the succeeding year's program.
- 3. The fees and funds provided for in this Resolution shall be utilized exclusively to fund County solid waste monitoring and enforcement activities as identified in the Ocean County Health Department's work program.
