On behalf of the entire Board of Freeholders and especially Freeholder Jack Kelly who is liaison to our Department of Law and Public Safety, we thought it would be fitting today to invite our law enforcement leadership to lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance. This Board of Freeholders supports our law enforcement and local police across Ocean County who protect our families and keep our communities safe.

So now if everyone would rise we'd like to Post the Colors first. (The Color Guard enters the room.)

CLERK VASIL: "Our first order of business today is our Statement of Determination. This is for the 2017 General Election held on November 7, 2017. This is from Ocean County Clerk, Scott M. Colabella and George R. Gilmore, Chairman of the Board of County Canvassers. If you would come forward please."

SCOTT COLABELLA, OCEAN COUNTY CLERK: "Good afternoon, a warm afternoon, it's the warmest day of the week so far. Good sign Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Just wait until tonight!"

COUNTY CLERK COLABELLA: "I see Freeholder Vicari has passed on the blizzards to the new Director."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I've always been known that whenever I am Director, the last 11 years, we have major snowstorms. I got by. Thank you. And now it's up to our new Director, whoever that may be in a few more minutes, when Gerry P. Little is in charge. And the name tag is there for the new Director."

COUNTY CLERK COLABELLA: "So it is an honor and pleasure to make this official, Freeholder Vicari. On behalf of the Board of County Canvassers of the County of Ocean. We do determine that an election held in the said County on the seventh day of November, in the year of our Lord, 2017, Joe Vicari was duly elected Freeholder to a three-year term. In Witness Whereof, I hereunto set my hand, this Thirteenth day of November 2017. Congratulations!"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "This makes it official now. Thank you very much. I appreciate it."

F. COMMENTS FROM FREEHOLDER VICARI

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I would just like to say a few words and I will be brief. You know I'm not here by myself. I am here basically because of the strength of my family and also the strength of those who supported me during the campaign. I'm very thankful to the Republican Organization under the leadership of George Gilmore and especially another friend of mine who I spoke to and went to his office 37 years ago, it's Joe Buckelew who helped me become a Freeholder. He gave me some good advice to work hard as the Mayor of Toms River at that time. And one thing was the golden rule - always put the people first. And that's what the important thing is. That's why all five of us are up here today.

I was very fortunate during the campaign that we stayed within certain high standards. We set the agenda for 2017, working with the members of the Board in consensus. We made some tremendous progress as far as continuing not only what we were doing, but some changes we did and some important programs. And that's what really is so important to us when we govern the greatest County in the State of New Jersey.

But today I am here to say thank you for what you have given me, especially the County employees that have worked so hard day after day that really make Ocean County what it is today. A lot of them are not here. Sometimes you don't say thank you, but you know, Ocean County never closes down. When you talk about a hurricane or a storm or whatever may take place as far as national disasters, we work 24/7, 365 days a year. We never close.

And also the most important thing that we're here today and my good friend, Rabbi Schenkolewski, is always saying this during the benediction, it's family. Family is very, very important to us. Not only our own family, but our extended family. And that's what government is all about. That's what America is all about. It's taking care of not only our family, but the next generation. What we do in County government - we build not just for today, but for the future of our children for our grandchildren. So again, I thank you for the great privilege that the people of Ocean County have given me. I realize I didn't do it by myself. It's a very humbling experience to be here today and say thank you very much and God Bless all of you for 2018."

CLERK VASIL: "At this time it is proper to call for nominations for the Director of the Board for the year 2018."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I would like to recommend Gerry P. Little as Director of the Board of Chosen Freeholders for 2018."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I'll second that move."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I move to close nominations."

CLERK VASIL: "The nominations are hereby closed. Roll call vote."

On motion duly made by Freeholder Vicari, seconded by Freeholder Kelly, Freeholder Little was nominated to the position of Freeholder Director for the year 2018.

CLERK VASIL: "Congratulations Director. I turn the meeting over to you."

I. NOMINATIONS AND ELECTION OF DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF THE BOARD FOR 2018

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Betty. Now it is our pleasure to ask for nominations for the Deputy Director of the Board of Freeholders. I was Deputy Director last year, but I will defer this to someone else."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I will nominate Freeholder John Bartlett as Deputy Director."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I'll second that."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Roll call please."

On motion duly made by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Haines, Freeholder Bartlett was nominated to the position of Freeholder Deputy Director for the year 2018.

CLERK VASIL: "Congratulations."

J. COMMENTS FROM THE FREEHOLDER DIRECTOR

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "And now if you look at your agenda, you have the pleasure of listening to my 2 hour speech. (laughter) So I will begin and try to move this along and you are welcome to applaud at any time you like. (laughter) Feel free.

Good afternoon. On behalf of the entire Board of Freeholders, we wish everyone here and all of the people of Ocean County a blessed and healthy 2018.

While the New Year gives us all the opportunity to reflect on the future, it is also a time to give thanks to those who are with us today and to everyone here who works all year 'round to assure that Ocean County is a great place to work, raise a family and retire.

First, as Freeholder Vicari indicated, the Board would like to thank Pastor Occhipinti, Rabbi Schenkolewski and Father Rossell for being with us today to share God's blessings for all of us for the year ahead. You are with us, Rabbi and Pastor and Father, in times of joy and celebration, as well as in troubled times of sorrow and loss.

The members of this Board of Freeholders are individuals of faith. We thank you each for your continuing prayers and we know that you inspire us to serve faithfully the people of Ocean County. And on behalf of the Board, we would like all three of you to stand and would everyone again, welcome our Pastor, our Rabbi and our Father. (applause) Thank you gentlemen, you mean a lot to all of us.

I know also that my colleagues – John, Joe, Jack and Ginny, and I want to give special thanks to Carl. You do a great job as our Administrator. I know that my colleagues also want to give thanks to...we all have special ladies in our lives, but there are five special ladies – Debbie, Cyndy, Debbie, Gail and Carol for all they do to help us keep on the straight and narrow. These talented professionals manage our offices, make sure that we know where we are supposed to be and that's where we are, and they sometimes try to talk us out of a crazy ideas. So, once in a while, they have to do that. So would our five office managers please stand and would everyone welcome them? (applause) Debbie and Cyndy and Debbie and Gail and Carol.

This Board is composed of five individuals who often agree and sometimes disagree. But, our overriding commitment is to try our very best to reach a consensus approach to our policy decisions. Most often, the individuals responsible to help build a consensus are our County Administrator, Carl Block and Assistant Administrator, Mike Fiure.

Our County is truly blessed to have Carl as our Administrator and Mike as his backup. We thank them for all they do to help this Board develop and implement the best-possible services for Ocean County. Mike and Carl. (applause)

With us today, there are many department directors who have the hands-on responsibility of making sure our parks and open spaces under Deputy Director Bartlett preserve our quality of life; our senior services and consumer services under Freeholder Vicari protect our elderly; our law enforcement training, public safety and engineering under Freeholder Kelly keep our communities safe; our social services, human services and planning under Freeholder Haines help our needy and vulnerable citizens here in Ocean County; and that our veterans, road and vehicle services and recycling continue their work to patch the potholes, keep the snowplows running tonight and tomorrow and make sure that our veterans get the help they have earned by serving our nation.

Our IT Department keeps our communication systems online, our Public Information under Ms. Donna Flynn. Sometimes Donna has to make lemonade out of lemons, quite often I would say. And our Finance department works with the Board to maintain our fiscal stability and fiscal restraints so the people of Ocean County may continue to enjoy a AAA bond rating, saving our taxpayers millions of dollars over the years.

All of us would like to thank Deputy Director John Bartlett and our Finance Director, Julie Tarrant, for their leadership in helping Ocean County maintain fiscal stability for our taxpayers. John and Julie. (applause)

Our Clerk of the Board and County Counsel are essential and we rely on them to make this Board cross every "T" and dot every "I". Our Health Department, Board of Social Services, Library Commission and our Ocean County Utilities Authority – and our Chairman is here, we thank him – provide outstanding services for our citizens and cooperate fully with this Board of Freeholders in keeping costs as low as possible for our citizens.

All of us would also like to thank the many local officials who are with us today and we will try to introduce some of you in a few minutes as well as our Constitutional Officers, Sheriff Mike Mastronardy, Surrogate and former 9th

District Assemblyman and a disabled Coast Guard Veteran from Vietnam, Jeff Moran and our County Clerk Scott Colabella, a great guy. They stand shoulder-to-shoulder with this Board in serving the people of Ocean County.

We must also recognize the political process that has re-elected Freeholder Vicari and each of us in past years. None of us would be here today without the support of the Ocean County Republican Organization, which is acknowledged statewide as the strongest in New Jersey and one of the strongest in the entire country.

Now I don't know if our Chairman, George Gilmore, made it. I was looking here. He called me on the phone and said he was trying to be here, but our current County Chairman, we thank George Gilmore. He's been the Chairman for the last 20 years and George has never lost a State or a County seat and that is a record unparalleled in the State of New Jersey for the Republican Party. So we thank George.

And then, most importantly, we would also like to introduce a former Ocean County Freeholder, a Lakewood Mayor and our Chairman Emeritus, Joseph P. Buckelew. You know, Joe's name is on that board over there of all the Freeholders who have served in the history of Ocean County and we thank Joe for the example he sets for all of us.

So, what can our taxpayers expect for 2018? And, who are these Freeholders, my colleagues?

Well, I have some secrets I want to tell you. One of these Freeholders is at the gym by 5:30 each morning and is no doubt in better shape than her colleagues. We have another Freeholder who is a fanatic Phillies fan."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "But I'm not at the gym!" (laughter)

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "We have the 'Energizer Bunny' Freeholder 2.0. That's Freeholder Vicari. We have a Freeholder who has read over 100 World War I books last year alone, John Bartlett. And we have a Freeholder who hangs upside down 49 minutes a week. I want to repeat that. We have one Freeholder, I won't tell you who it is, hangs upside down 49 minutes a week and we're not going to reveal that.

Some of us are technically challenged. Now, I want to explain. Today I brought along what is called a FitBit. This was a Christmas present from my son and daughter. My son was home. He has now returned to his base, but he was home on leave at Christmas. So I brought this along because I can't make it work and I understand Freeholder Haines has one and it's broken, but she is going to try to help me make it work."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "But you need to wear it Gerry. And I know, he says, 'But I know how far I go. Why do I need to wear the FitBit?' Because it will tell you all day long what you're doing."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "See I knew she could tell me.

And then another technological advancement is my state-of-the-art flip phone. This is my flip phone, state-of-the-art. So we're not exactly, at our age, technologically advanced here, but we try.

But what we do have in common is, and I think this is very important, all five of us share similar childhoods that shaped our lives and how we manage the peoples' business and the peoples' tax dollars.

We are all Baby Boomers, actually early Boomers who came along just a couple of years after our fathers returned home from World War II. We were old enough to watch our Dads march in Memorial Day parades in the 1950s. We Freeholders are the children of American patriots and like our fathers before us, we are patriots. We support our veterans. We support our police and our first-responders. We support the Constitution of the United States. And as we did a few moments ago, we stand and cross our hearts when we say the Pledge of Allegiance.

Like most of the people of Ocean County we are proud of the United States of America and we are proud to be Americans.

All five of us came from humble beginnings, from working class families who struggled to make ends meet.

Our parents grew up in the Great Depression and we grew up listening to our parents and grandparents tell stories about the hardships of the Great Depression. We learned the value of hard work and the sacrifices our parents and grandparents made for their families.

That's why this Board supports the American work ethic over welfare dependency. We support job creation over more government bureaucracy. We believe personal responsibility is fundamental for America's future, not more government regulation.

From our earliest days at the dinner table we heard our families discussing everyday choices about what we could afford and what we could not afford. We learned the value of money and learned that it took hard work to earn it.

That is why this Board considers the fiscal management of our tax dollars from the people of Ocean County as our highest priority.

Unlike Washington or Trenton, this Board will produce a balanced budget that pays our bills and maintains our core services for veterans, seniors, working families and the needy. Our budget will improve county roads, bridges and facilities. Our budget will help fund our County College, our Vo-Tech Schools and provide a helping hand to the poor and needy. Our budget will include an adequate surplus to keep Ocean County's AAA bond rating, something that Freeholder Bartlett I'm sure will speak about and something that we are very proud of.

Under Freeholder Deputy Director John Bartlett's leadership our Budget will continue fiscal stability, and as we so fond of saying every year, 'There will be no surprises in our Budget.'

Lastly, I would like to underscore that this Board of Freeholders is ONE TEAM. We may focus our attentions on different issues throughout the year, but when it counts, we all strive to do what is best for the people of Ocean County, to serve them faithfully and to speak as a united voice as their advocates.

Our 33 municipalities are also ONE TEAM and our Mayors and local officials are dedicated to their communities to maintain their quality of life.

So as we move into the New Year with many challenges and opportunities ahead, our common commitment is to continue to work to keep Ocean County a great place to live, work and retire.

I thank all of you for being here. May God bless the United States of America and may God Bless Ocean County. Thank you."

K. COMMENTS FROM THE FREEHOLDER DEPUTY DIRECTOR

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "We will now be very happy to hear from our Deputy Director and, if I may, I should have said this before, you talk about being blessed, here we have Freeholder Kelly who has now been a Freeholder for how long? 27, 28 years? Something like that?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "This is my 26th year."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "26 years. I've been here 15 years. Freeholder Haines is the newcomer. She is the newcomer with the wonderful smile. But, beside me here, we have the second longest-serving Freeholder in the State of New Jersey with how many years, 35?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I am starting my 37th year."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Sorry, 37. And the longest-serving Freeholder in the State of New Jersey is Freeholder Bartlett. Not the oldest! We always say that. The longest-serving and 38 years?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "I am starting my 39th year."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "39, so talk about being blessed in the experience that we have in serving the people of Ocean County. So Freeholder Deputy Director John Bartlett."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, thank you very much. I don't prepare comments for a simple reason. If you prepare them then you have to read them and when you read them you sometimes lose your place and then people say he can't even read his own statement. So I always do this off the top of my head.

Gerry's statement, I believe, hit it right on the mark because we are a group of people who grew up under very similar circumstances from families who worked hard, who understood the value of a dollar, the value of hard work, the value that you got what you worked for. I must say that my recently deceased father used to say of me that I squeezed the nickel so hard the Indian ended up riding the buffalo. (laughter) But that wasn't exactly true. I do drive my car, my 20-year-old Lincoln, to this meeting because I do feel I have to get my money's worth out of that car and I haven't quite done that yet.

But, Gerry was entirely correct. There will be no surprises in the 2018 County Budget. There are always difficulties that lie ahead. We don't know what those difficulties will be, but I believe that one of the reasons this is the most experienced Freeholder Board in the State of New Jersey is because we understand the needs, the wishes and the aspirations of the people who live in Ocean County. And one of the most important of those is the fact that no one wants to be surprised. No one wants to hear the local government bodies say, 'Gee, we have a problem and guess what? You're going to have to pay for it.' That ain't going to happen here. We know where we've come from. We know where we're going. And we know how we're going to get there.

And it has been certainly, on my part and I want to finish quickly, a tremendous pleasure, on my part, to have served here for so long. I never thought in my wildest dreams growing up in Pine Beach, a small town near the side of the (Toms) river, I remember when I was I guess 12 years old and received my Boy Scout pin. It was a first-class pin and the Mayor then, Ben Mabie, said, 'This young man is going to go a long way on his smile.' Well, I went a long way. I went all the way from Pine Beach to Toms River! (laughter) But the smile didn't change, even when I was very sick. But I am here not because of myself, but because of the people in this audience. All of us are here because of people in this audience. The people who have had faith in us, and especially in my case, with Joe Buckelew.

Thirty-nine years ago when Joe Buckelew was Chairman of our Party, and by the way, I never use the name of the Party, but when he was Chairman of our Party he started something he called a 'youth movement'. Well, something happened to that 'youth movement' over the years. (laughter) I don't know exactly what, but two of us are still here. Are we still youths, Joe?

But, in any event, he started it and it has been our pleasure and, certainly my pleasure, to be able to serve this County. We've made mistakes. We will continue to make mistakes. But, we have foremost in front of us the fact that fiscal stability is the most important thing that you can ever put forward to the public. And beyond that, is doing the job. Those roads tomorrow, in this storm, thanks to the Director, are going to be plowed. This County always does the job, but it does it within its means.

And I want to close, again, with two things, the Director mentioned our office managers and I must say that Debbie Gries, my office manager, is very skillful at eliminating my best phrases in my letters. And I say, 'That's my best one. What are you taking that out for?' But they come out and that probably makes them better letters or at least ones that I can read on the front page of the newspaper which, on occasion in the past, has not been the most enjoyable feature of my career here. But, this is a great office, it's a great place to serve, and you know why? Because you can get something done. I have great responsibilities on the Open Space, the Parks, and the nice thing about it – you don't' have to convince the world to build a park. You, number one, just have to have the money. Well, I talk to Julie in Finance to find the money and then you just have to convince four other people that we really should do that park and we've been able to do it. And, in all that time, we're coming close to goals that we've set.

I've spoken too long. I thoroughly enjoy working with my colleagues. We work very well together. We will continue to work well together. And I thank you for the privilege that you have given us to sit here. Thank you ladies and gentlemen."

L. COMMENTS FROM THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Now we will call on Freeholder Virginia Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. First, I'd like to congratulate Freeholder Vicari again on his re-election. It was a pleasure working with you this past year, Joe. And I know that working with our new Director, Gerry Little, and Deputy Director, John Bartlett, is going to be just as good in 2018.

I will be very brief also. I just want to thank Father and Rabbi and Pastor for being here. And also my mentor, Joe Buckelew. Originally I was from Lakewood and, of course, I've known Joe my entire life, so any time that I had any questions or things that were bothering me that I wanted to talk about politically I always went to Joe. And I've been fortunate to serve the County of Ocean as a Legislator. I was on the Township Council in Toms River. And now as your Freeholder.

I can't tell you the pleasure it is for me to be able to serve the people of Ocean County, especially the departments that I have – the Board of Social Services and Human Services and Planning and IT and Clerk of the Board with Betty. They are all exceptional. I feel they are exceptional boards and I just feel very fortunate to have them and also to work with my fellow members. They have been an outstanding group of individuals to work with. I look forward to working with them in the future. And I can't thank all the employees that work for the County of Ocean because without you we would not look so good because you are the ones that are there talking to the people daily. They're the ones on the front line a lot of times that make us look good. We can take the credit because we're sitting up here and we vote on the different issues and things such as that, but we have to thank you for what you do for us. And especially my assistant, Gail, who, as the rest of the Freeholders, she sort of holds me down on things. Things that she will say, 'I don't think that is a very good idea for you to do that.' So I just want to thank you Gail for that. And then just again, thank all of you again for allowing me to serve you and may God bless each and every one of you and make God bless our men and women that are serving in the military here and abroad. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you. Freeholder Jack Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Well, you all may be wondering why I get to go last. Well, I'll tell you there is a very good reason. Freeholder Bartlett I guess it was just talked about the youth movement. I am the youngest on the Board of Chosen Freeholders! (laughter) So I am still part of the youth movement. I will be 67 this year, but I'm still the youngest on this governing body.

Also, I guess it was Freeholder Bartlett also that thanked Gerry Little who is the head of our Road Department for plowing the roads tomorrow after the blizzard and keeping them open. Well, my driveway at home is 450 feet long, from the road to my house. I want to thank my wife for shoveling so I can get my car out for coffee at Wawa which I also send her to get. (laughter) I don't like going out when it's that cold.

Anyway, it really is a pleasure to serve with this Board and serve so many of you out there. I look at John Parker who has been a member of the political scene in Ocean County his entire life and his father before him. He is now the Chairman of our OCUA and does a great job there. John, we thank you. You've been here a long while and have always done a great job.

Today I am putting myself on record as opposing all of it. There are no words to express my disgust and outrage at what's been going on. I know I've talked privately to some of you about this, but it is an outrage. It needs to stop. There is no room for hatred anywhere in Ocean County or the United States.

Joe, congratulations, again, for winning re-election. This is well earned. As I say on every Budget, you guys keep saying 'no surprises', but then you come up with a big surprise! No major tax increase. Sometimes it's actually decreased. You've got it together. You're doing everything that government is supposed to be doing. Well, with what goes on a lot of times in government, that's one hell of a surprise!

We're starting to see it now in Washington, at least in the administration. But, the State government? Fasten your seatbelts we're going for a ride. Especially with who is taking office very shortly. I guess it will be the counterpart to what you are doing.

Again, congratulations. This is something you've earned. As I've told everybody, I work with a lot of people running for office the first time and I tell all of them, 'You need to come here and watch you people.' This is what government should do. And I don't just say it because I don't get anything for saying this. I do it because I do. I'm a total lightning rod, totally unleashed. And not being elected I get to say things that you guys couldn't. But, again, thank you. And everything that has happened here you've earned. Thank you."



INTRODUCTION

The New Jersey "Local Fiscal Affairs Law", specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14, as amended by P.L. 1997, c.148 on June 30, 1997, requires that every local unit shall adopt a "Cash Management Plan." This plan lists the GUDPA approved depository banks, any broker/dealers, and the approved investment instruments selected by the local unit's governing body.

In addition, the cash management plan is to be adopted by resolution, usually at the reorganization meeting, or the first meeting of the year and will guide the investment of a local unit's idle cash during periods that it is not needed to meet obligations.

The County of Ocean has a formal Cash Management Plan which was initially adopted on July 6, 1983 and revised on February 4, 1998.

The purpose of the current revision is to modify the procedures currently followed under the current Cash Management Plan to comply with the provisions of P.L. 1997, c.148 as enacted on June 30, 1997.

This new act revises and expands the responsibility of the governing body and the role of the Chief Financial Officer in cash management as well as expanding the range of the allowed investment vehicles used by a local unit to invest its idle cash.

I. **GENERAL AUTHORITY**

The Board of Chosen Freeholders for the County of Ocean authorizes the Chief Financial Officer of the County of Ocean to administer the Cash Management Plan in order to deposit and invest the County of Ocean's idle cash pursuant to the stipulations contained in the Cash Management Plan.

ELIGIBLE DEPOSITORIES FOR PUBLIC FUNDS II.

Eligible depositories for County funds are New Jersey banks or savings and loans specifically approved by the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance under the Government Unit Depository Protection Act (GUDPA) and maintain a banking presence in the County of Ocean. Deposits of County funds in institutions other than those covered by GUDPA are prohibited by law.

As part of the County's Cash Management Plan, annually The Board of Chosen Freeholders shall adopt a list of the approved depositories for the County (ATTACHMENT A).

RFP – Request for Proposal

While P.L. 1997, c.148 formally exempts banking services and investment purchases from the bidding provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11, all investment and banking services for the County of Ocean will be selected through a Request For Proposal (RFP) process.

When the need for banking and investment services exists, the County Chief Financial Officer may solicit RFP's from the eligible banking and investment institutions.

Upon receipt of the RFP's, the County Chief Financial Officer will then review each proposal. After the review, the County Chief Financial Officer will make recommendations to the Board of Chosen Freeholders. If necessary, the County Auditor may be asked to aid in the review process.

Once an investment or banking institution has been selected, the County's Cash Management Plan will be revised and adopted by resolution by the Board of Chosen Freeholders for the County of Ocean.

III. **CASH MANAGEMENT POLICY**

It shall be the policy of the Board of Chosen Freeholders for the County of Ocean to adopt the Cash Management Plan by resolution at the annual reorganization meeting or during the year as deemed necessary to reflect changes in laws, depositories, investments or funds.

The Chief Financial Officer for the County of Ocean is directed to invest and deposit funds pursuant to the cash management plan as adopted by resolution of The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean.

It is the objective of the Cash Management Policy to maximize the investment and interest income earned on idle County funds while providing adequate liquidity to meet the obligations of the County.

Timely Deposit of all County Funds:

As required by N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15, all monies collected or received from any source by or on behalf of the County or any board or Department thereof shall be paid to the "Treasurer, County of Ocean", who shall deposit all such funds within 48 hours after receipt, to the credit of the County of Ocean in one of the designated legal depositories.

All deposits forwarded to the Chief Financial Officer of the County of Ocean shall be accompanied by a revenue transmittal form listing cash and individual checks and will include a revenue account to which funds will be credited upon deposit.

Deposits to Interest Bearing Accounts:

It is the explicit policy of the County of Ocean that all funds be deposited into interest bearing accounts except as noted below.

All Departments and/or agencies of the County who collect monies for the County in the normal course of its activities must deposit said monies in an interest bearing account until such time as these monies are turned over to the County Treasurer or designee.

Exceptions to Interest Bearing Account Requirements:

The following types of funds are not required to be placed in Interest Bearing Accounts:

- 1. Petty Cash and Change Funds under \$5,000.00
- Cash drawn from a Federal agency under a letter of credit, which cash is 2. to be paid out within 5 working days to a vendor.
- Amounts derived from the sale of bonds or notes, only to the extent that a 3. specific written opinion of counsel states that the earning of (full) interest would result in the bonds or notes being classified as an arbitrage (not federally tax-exempt) issue pursuant to Federal regulations. To the extent that some interest is allowable, it shall be deposited at such a rate if such a rate is obtainable.

Treasurer's Report:

It shall be the responsibility of the County Treasurer to provide to the Board of Chosen Freeholders a Treasurer's Report on a monthly basis which shall detail the following information as required by N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14.e. as amended by P.L. 1997, c.148 on June 30, 1997:

- 1. All investments made or redeemed over the past month;
- 2. Each financial institution holding local unit funds;
- The amount of securities purchased or sold, class or type of securities 3. purchased, book value, earned income, fees incurred, and market value of all investments as of the report date and;
- 4. Other information that may be required by the Board of Chosen Freeholders or deemed appropriate by the Chief Financial Officer.

Cash Flow Analysis:

An important part of establishing the County investment program includes detailed study of "cash flow" – when money comes in, when it goes out, and how much cash lies available for how long. Such an analysis provides the information needed to plan a viable investment procedure, including the projected length of time that funds can be invested in order to take full advantage of maturity periods with the highest yields.

Analysis of cash flow will alert the Treasurer to possible rescheduling of payments that will result in extending the life of short term investments. The Treasurer's calendar, compiled by the Division of Local Government Services and the Division of Taxation is an excellent source of specific dates regarding the above information. (1)

Reconciliation of Cash Deposits:

On a monthly basis, the Chief Financial Officer or designee shall forward revenue reports to all departments and agencies of the County of Ocean who collect monies for the County detailing cash deposits made to their revenue accounts.

The individual departments and agencies are required to then reconcile the County's reports to the records maintained by the departments.

A form provided by the Chief Financial Officer will be returned by the department or agency either agreeing with the County's records, or listing any discrepancies to be researched by the Chief Financial Officer or designee.

Bank Reconciliations:

It is the policy of the County of Ocean that all bank statements be reconciled to the County's records when received or within a reasonable time thereafter.

IV. INVESTMENT POLICY

The investment objectives of the County of Ocean, listed in order of importance from greatest to least, are as follows:

- The ability of the investment instrument to provide for the security and safety of 1. County funds.
- Liquidity of the investment instrument necessary to provide for County operations 2. and obligations.
- Yield or return on the investment instrument (only after the first two 3. considerations are met).
- Investments requiring the payment of a premium should not be purchased without 4. the written consent of the Chief Financial Officer.

Therefore, with these objectives in mind and in compliance with the allowable investments detailed in N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14 as modified by P.L. 1997, c.148, the County Chief Financial Officer will decide on the investment vehicles to be included as approved in the County's Cash Management Plan adopted by resolution by the Board of Chosen Freeholders for the County of Ocean and reflected in ATTACHMENT B.

Additionally, the County Chief Financial Officer will select approved investment vehicles to achieve the maximum rate of return while minimizing costs and fees and providing for investment portfolio diversification by spreading idle County funds among a number of these approved investments as listed in ATTACHMENT B.

Approved Investment Vehicles

Any investment instruments in which the security is not physically held by the County of Ocean shall be covered by a third party custodial agreement which shall provide for the designation of such investment in the name of the County of Ocean and prevent unauthorized use of such investments.

Any investment not purchased and redeemed directly from the issuer, government money market mutual fund, local government investment fund, or the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund, shall be purchased and redeemed through the use of a national or State bank located within the State of New Jersey or through a broker dealer, which, at the time of purchase or redemption, has been registered continuously for a period of at least two years pursuant to section 9 of P.L. 1967, c.93 (C.49:3-5) and has at least \$25 million in capital stock (or equivalent capitalization if not a corporation), surplus reserves for contingencies and undivided profits, or through a securities dealer who makes primary markets in U.S. Government securities and reports daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York its position in and borrowing on such U.S. Government securities.

Securities which may be purchased by the County include:

- 1. Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America. This includes instruments such as Treasury bills, notes and bonds.
- 2. Any federal agency or instrumentality obligation authorized by Congress that matures within 397 days from the date of purchase, and has a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or external factors.
- 3. Bonds or other obligations of the County or school districts of which the County is a part.
- Any other bonds or obligations with maturities not exceeding 397 days, as 4. permitted by the Division of Investments. This includes Certificates of Deposit.
- 5. Local government investment pools, such as New Jersey CLASS, and the New Jersey Asset and Rebate Management Program.
