C. PRESENTATION

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Director. The first item on today's agenda is Presentation and this is to the winners of the Ocean County Fire Prevention and Protection Association Poster Contest Winners. These will be given out by the Freeholder Director and with us we have Robert Yaiser from Ocean County Fire Prevention Protection.

As they're coming in Freeholder, we also have a proclamation and that's for May 22nd and that's the "32nd Anniversary of the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program. That will be given out at another location.

As we stated, we have the winners of the Ocean County Fire Prevention and Protection Association Poster Contest and if Bob Yaiser would come forward Freeholder Kelly will make these presentations."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Actually I'm going to do it with the Freeholder Director. Bob, we do this every year. Can you just tell everybody just a little bit about the contest."

ROBERT YAISER, OC FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION ASSOCIATION: "Good afternoon. As he said, I am Bob Yaiser from the Ocean County Fire Protection Association and the Coordinator for the New Jersey Division of Fire Safety Poster Contest. Each year, the State of New Jersey hosts a fire safety poster contest. The theme this year was to 'prevent kitchen fires' and how we arrived at that theme is the number one cause of fire in residential homes is cooking. So we put that out as the theme and then the 566 municipalities throughout the State participated in the poster contest.

We judged them at the local level and at the local level we selected those that then advanced up to the County level, which we have today. We have the County level winners with us. Now, before I continue any further, I want to thank a few people here for their efforts. First of all the Freeholders sponsor and support our programs each and every year. This year, in addition to the Freeholders sponsoring us, the Ocean County Artist Guild did the judging for the County level. So we had our posters judged by professionals. It wasn't just the fire house judging. These were artists and here today we have the winners.

So I want to thank not only the Freeholders, but the Artists Guild, the parents and all the teachers that helped in making this what it is. Why we're here today is, instead of.....normally what happens is we bring the posters for the children to hold up. And, the Division of Fire Safety wanted to hold their judging, the State judging, which we have a winner by the way in the County."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. I'd just like to comment briefly on number seven which is the execution of a grant application for Social Services for the Homeless Grant for 7/1/2014 through 6/30/2015. This is part of our annual funding from the State with regard to our funding to the Board of Social Services, through our Department of Human Services to the Board of Social Services to care for the poor and the needy here in Ocean County. And, this is just a portion of the funding, but with this one component, \$764,000.00. Last year with this funding we assisted 2,065 individuals and families for emergency shelter. 2,065 individuals and families through this funding component for emergency shelter. About....well not about, 1,024 individuals and families with back rent, to keep them from being homeless. Back rent, back mortgage, back utility payments and security deposits for rental, affordable housing rentals. And that was 1,024 individuals and families and 2,820 families for emergency food and that's just from this one component of funding. So I just wanted to explain that Mr. Director and thank you."

Q. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:25 PM, Deputy Director Bartlett received the following comments from the Board.

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Mr. Director, I just want to say that I know that we're going to be heading to the official start of summer this weekend and I know businesses and a lot of people are still putting their houses back together. I'm looking forward to some good weather and wishing everybody luck on their endeavor with their businesses or their homes and putting them back together. It's going to be a long project, but it's another summer in front of us and I think that each summer will get better. I'm looking forward to a better summer than we saw last summer. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. This is our final meeting before Memorial Day weekend and as we always do, we encourage the citizens of Ocean County to participate in Memorial Day ceremonies. Most towns and all American Legions and Vietnam Veterans' Posts and VFW Posts have a Memorial Day ceremony and so we would urge everyone to take time out to spend moments to remember those who have served our nation and made the ultimate sacrifice. Ocean County has lost thirteen soldiers in the War on Terror and that's something we should all remember. We will.....our Veterans Service Bureau is responsible and we will have completed the placement of about 15,000 American flags on the graves of all veterans who are buried throughout Ocean County. We have many organizations that assist John Dorrity and our Veterans Bureau in placing these flags, including scouts and Toms River North I think was involved and the Honor Society there and many veterans organizations. So John Dorrity makes sure that those are distributed and placed and I even have a picture here to prove it. Freeholder Vicari and I were out placing flags. See that? This was a grave site from someone who died in 1844.

We appreciate very much the veterans who serve and those who have made the ultimate sacrifice. There's a pretty dramatic picture as we've talked here before, Freeholder Lacey's son is in the Navy and my son is now, so I subscribe to the *Navy Times* and this is quite a remarkable picture. These are the soldiers that we have lost since last Memorial Day. You already saw it? These are American soldiers that we have lost in the War on Terror since last Memorial Day. 107. Four are women and eight officers and the rest are enlisted - throughout Afghanistan, mostly in Afghanistan obviously. So we remember them and their brave service. And, we certainly would also like to demand, if you will, that President Obama and both the Republicans and the Democrats in the United States Senate and the

United States Congress clean up the mess that the VA has become. And, the fact that we can't get our veterans their healthcare. We've had allegedly forty veterans who have died before they've even had an appointment at a VA Hospital. That's just something that I think is a disgrace for our country and we need to get that cleaned up. And, when President Obama took office the budget for the VA was about \$80 billion. It is now \$154 billion. Not millions, billions. And yes, we have many more veterans that have come back from Iraq and Afghanistan so certainly the VA is overwhelmed with veterans that they have to serve, but we need to instill some changes that make it more efficient and that perhaps as some of our Legislators, our State Legislators have recommended that instead of the one system, the VA, that our veterans should be able to get their healthcare at a hospital facility and have the VA take care of it if they can't get an appointment in a timely fashion. So we need to do something about it. It's not a political, partisan, political issue, but we owe the men and women who serve our country, we owe them, we have pledged to them that we will provide for their medical care. And it's just a disgrace what is happening with the VA. So let's hope in the next year we can straighten some of that out. Thank you Mr. Director."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "I have just one happy announcement. Since the last time we met we have received an additional \$5.2 million from FEMA reimbursement. This is for the Shared Services Agreement that we've had with the municipalities. So, again, I want to thank the Administrator and the County's Chief Financial Officer, Julie Tarrant, who have worked diligently to make sure that we got our or are getting our 90% reimbursement. To date, we have received from FEMA for this municipal cost share, \$75 million. We are still owed about \$12 million from FEMA. So this is moving along now rather rapidly in the right direction. The municipal share which is now 10%, totals \$9,333,000.00. We've received \$809,000.00 and the star winner of that goes to Long Beach Township for being the first to reimburse the County for their share. So the municipal share is due on July 1st which totals \$8,500,000.00. So, we are now out.....the municipal share obviously will be in July. We are working diligently on the FEMA share which is now down to \$12 million. There were many nay-sayers when we did this program that we weren't doing it.....that we shouldn't have done it....that we did it with the wrong people......that we'll never get reimbursed. Well, we've been reimbursed to the tune of \$75 million so far with more forthcoming.

So the project was an eminent success. The funds are now coming in which makes all of us very, very happy. So again, I thank the diligence of basically our two professionals who have stayed on this constantly, obviously because we were owed money and we were going to get that money."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Can I add to that?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Yes. Please."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "You were so kind to compliment our professionals which of course they certainly deserve that merit, but also you, Mr. Director, you have ridden herd, if I can use the western term, on this, throughout this entire process and really were the leader in recommending that we take on this challenge and this project in the first place. If it weren't for the fact of your leadership with the fiscal responsibility with the County, that we had the surplus available we would not have been able to do that before. And, as you mentioned, we had a lot of nay-sayers in the beginning when we did this, but we always have the nay-sayers year after year we get criticized because we have a surplus and manage the County's finances in a responsible way. And had that not been the case, we would not have been able to help the municipalities. And so, again, that reflects well on your leadership of our budget department and we thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Well thank you Mr. Director, but it is really a joint effort of the entire Board of Freeholders because if we all weren't marching in the same direction it wouldn't work. And again, we were able to come up with by raiding every trust fund the County had, and I've said this many times, but the rating agencies were astounded that we were able to fund \$100 million worth of checks going out while the checks coming in from FEMA at first were very slow and made me somewhat nervous. But again, it's well on track. But if we weren 't able to do that and by the way we didn't have to borrow one dime to do it, that's what amazed the rating agencies, but if we had left the municipalities cover their own responsibilities, they all would have had to go out to bond. They would have had to pass bonds. They would have had to go to the bond market. They would have had to borrow money. That would have slowed up the whole debris removal process. It's bad enough to lose your home and your possessions, it must be even worse to see them sitting on the curb and to have to see them sit there month after month. We short-circuited that whole process. I think we were the only place in the nation, the only county in the nation that has ever done that, but we all as a Board thought this was the right thing to do. We had the financial capacity to do it and we did it and we're getting the reimbursements now. That concludes the remarks from the Freeholders. I would now like to open the meeting to public comment."

R. PUBLIC COMMENTS - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a time limit of **five** (5) minutes per speaker.

At 4:35 PM, Deputy Director Bartlett opened the meeting to receive the following comments from the public.

SAM FOSTER, BRICK: "I just want to say.....first I want to compliment Freeholder Little for your comments about the VA. It has become a mess. It's become a joke. I watch Comedy Central, Colbert Reports making jokes - that's really sad. Our vets have served us so honorably, they deserve now that they're out of the service, it's time for us to take care of them. They were taking care of us in service when they were in uniform and this really is a disgrace.

I want thank you also Mr. Freeholder. I don't know if the proper term is Mr. or Freeholder. I'm not used to speaking."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Freeholder."

SAM FOSTER: "Freeholder Little. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "You can say 'hey you' if you want." (laughter)

SAM FOSTER: "I'm sorry?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "You can say 'hey you' if you want." (laughter)

SAM FOSTER: "Oh, don't encourage me. (laughter) You know I talk to the Brick Council President about..... I've spoken to him sometimes. No. You people are nice. I'm not going to do that to you here. But anyway, I also want to compliment you Freeholder Little because you've said that to the point of being nonpartisan, saying Democrats and Republicans, that's very nice of you because I go to Toms River Council meetings, Brick Council meetings, Board of Ed. meetings and a lot of different political meetings and it's very important that we focus on, important that the politicians focus on caring about the public and speaking in support and doing anything to support the public and not try to be partisan. So that's why I think all of you, I'm seeing this as a Democrat, and that's one reason why I say that all of you are re-elected year after year, it's because people see the professionalism and respect that you show to the public and I think we reciprocate by sending you back up there year after year. And, I mean that very sincerely. I've voted for all of you in the past. I'm not going to say what years because I don't want to get my party mad at me. (laughter) Believe me! I'm trying something new to keep my nose clean here.

So, another question I had was, I live in Brick Township and on Chambersbridge Road there's construction right now on the overpass. I haven't been able to meet them to go to Freeholder Meetings because I started a new job and they have orientation and training on Wednesdays, so I'm going to have to rush out of here. So I apologize if this has been addressed in the past, but the overpass is being worked on. Is that widening or replacing the current overpass."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Can we call on the County Engineer.....he's right next to you. There's the man that has all the answers."

FRANK SCARANTINO, COUNTY ENGINEER: "It's both. It's being replaced as a longer and wider structure. The longer part of that is what our cost sharing was for, so that we could widen Chambersbridge Road under the bridge."

SAM FOSTER: "Okay. I want to thank you for the widening project because I'll tell you, Brick Township, that section, Brick going into Lakewood is a mess sometimes, the traffic, especially on Memorial Day with the holiday traffic that gets backed up way past. So that's a great project to have (inaudible) because in Brick we got a problem with the roads. I don't know how many times in the past I hit a pothole and then R&S Strauss when they were around, or Goodyear, would make hundreds of dollars realigning my front end and replacing the tire and a rim. So thank you very much. I thank you and my car thanks you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Foster. Are there any others who would like to address the Board? Yes. Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "First, again, this is the meeting closest to Memorial Day. I usually like to say something. It's hard to thank people of the past or honor I think is a better word, those who have died who don't know me, did me and all of us the right to do what we do. Without them, none of this be here and what's going on in the VA not only an outrage, I'll go so far as to say treason. When you hurt our own troops you are giving aid and comfort to the enemy. I want to throw up an idea that I've been tossing around actually since high school where the VA problems have come up time and time again, is replace the existing VA system with a VA card that every medical facility, every doctor, anything, would have to accept or go to jail. Again, without these people we wouldn't be here. We may not make as much money helping them, but again, without them you wouldn't have the other practice in the first place. It might be something to look into because right now, the system, it looks like it's collapsed. Even our healthcare system is on the verge of collapsing. This may be a view to what's coming up in store for all of us.

Secondly, since they've given me the right, I'm going to do a quick rant. The Pinelands Commission recently decided not to approve a gas line that's going to....the gas burner is going to replace the nuclear power plant in Little Egg Harbor. We need power plants in New Jersey, of course, because we need to run the lights. How are the environmentalists going to get online and complain about everything if there isn't power to run them? I was.....I've had a longtime argument with Laverne and some of his people on the internet and some of the things I said is 'go around the Pinelands'. 'Tell the folks - buy a map'. Normally I don't like encroachment into natural areas. You've known me for years. You know where I am on that. But, when you're dealing with some kind of gas line that big, taking it out of the way of the public would really be a good idea. These people who claim to have some kind of environmental victory by trying to cancel the thing where it's run in an area where there is populace is brain-dead. It's dangerous. People could get killed. I remember in Elizabeth a whole apartment complex blew up. The pines, even though there's less chance of an accident, it could also survive it because the whole ecosystem of the Pinelands is based on fire recovery. Again, I've been reading this lately and I've been working on it as far as even last night I was seeing this in total disbelief, just brain-dead. This is insane. I don't know where you guys are on this. I haven't gotten to talk to any of you about this, but I just had to rant because this is unbelievable. We need the power plant. We need power. We can't meet our needs now. And it seems the environmentalists either they want their solutions or even make-believe or something they oppose in the first place. They talk about renewable energy yet talk about, say

about a solar farm on already open ground they scream. They talk about 'we need wind energy', talk about a wind farm. 'Oh it's going to cut up the birds', even though that's not happening in Europe where they've had them for years. I'm talking about Holland. Again, it's insane. We need.....if we're going to live the lifestyle we live and not go back to caveman where you have 'iceman' was what? 30? Well there's going to be some risks and we're going to have to learn to balance them. These people who call themselves environmentalists are nuts. They're not environmentalists. All they are is political nay-sayers for whatever comes across. They have no concern for the environment and no concern for people. And as far as saving the planet, at best, the human species is nothing but a bad case of fleas. The earth is....we don't know how old the earth is and never will. The human species is barely a blink of an eye. So we're not talking about saving the planet, we're talking about saving us. And killing us to save us is again, brain dead. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Black. Mr. Gumper."

WILLIAM GUMPER, BERKELEY TOWNSHIP: "Good afternoon Freeholders. A few years ago there was a public question on the voting machines as to whether the voters should vote yes or no to allow Ocean County to put a small required payment to be used to buy wild real estate property and prevent development. It was a good concept. The public responded well, gave the Freeholders authority to do this. It was accomplished and the program is working very well.

Now, in reference to veterans, I think and I've been led to believe there is a veterans home or facility in Vineland, but I don't think there is another one. Now could this same...."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "It's a nursing home."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Oh, it's a nursing home. Well it's a facility for them. Yes."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "But not for somebody that needs medical care."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Yes. Oh, well, the subject of veterans is a very hot issue and well spoken by most people today. Could not the same procedure be accomplished putting a public question on the voting booth as to whether Ocean County could put a small, permission to put a small attachment onto something where it will collect money to build either a home or an additional medical facility for veterans? I think this would show great leadership being as I haven't heard anything about this from other counties and it's been done successfully to prevent some wild lands from being developed. Could we do that? Is it within the power of the Freeholders to do this or how would it be done?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Mr. Gumper you raised a very interesting question of course. The State has a couple of nursing homes for veterans who are very elderly and are not able to live on their own anymore. The VA system is Federal. So the Federal controls the healthcare delivery system for veterans if they want to participate in that system. If they have their own healthcare like Blue Cross or something for themselves or from their jobs when they became civilians, that's there. But, veterans that use VA system generally have no healthcare of their own. Health insurance I should say, like my father. My father uses the VA. It takes him four to six months to get an appointment, even for a heart issue or anything else. Now he's 90 years old. So he has to wait. He goes to Memphis. He has to drive 90 miles to the VA hospital.

A couple of years ago, Senator Connors and Senator Van Drew from Cape May County were appointed as the chairpeople of a State Legislative Commission to go around the State and hold public hearings on how we could improve healthcare for veterans. And, because now our veterans have to go to north Jersey or they have to go to Philadelphia or they have to go to Delaware."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "And wait and wait."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Yes. And if they don't drive, many of course are elderly, older veterans in many cases, they don't drive. So we provide buses for them and so forth, but they have to wait until everybody else is done. I mean, you know it's difficult as you know."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Yes. I know."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "So in any event, the conclusion of that was.....first of all the Veterans Administration is very reluctant about establishing any new hospital facilities anywhere, let alone New Jersey."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Well let me address something different then."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "What do you want me to answer?"

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I'm sorry."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "So they're reluctant to do that. So the question then becomes what can we do? And the recommendation of Senator Connors' commission and Senator Van Drew, they were co-chairpeople, again, bipartisan, Senator Connors being Republican and Senator Van Drew a Democrat, their recommendation was that the Veterans.....in lieu of a new hospital facility, that veterans be allowed to use their Tri-Care Card or their veterans benefits at a hospital, i.e. they could go to Community Medical Center which is a little bit what Mr. Black was

saying. They could go to Community. They could go to Brick. They could go to Southern Ocean County. They could go to Deborah or anywhere else and those hospitals would then accept payment through the VA system. Okay. So that's the recommendation. It's out there. It has not been accomplished yet, but these types of incidences that we're seeing happening with the VA which has now really become a major scandal because they've covered up these delays and tried.....because they have to have a certain quota so they have not released this information. It's coming out slow, but over forty veterans around the country have now been determined to have died before they were even allowed into the hospital to get treatment. So the families are outraged. Congress is outraged. And the President, to be fair. He was on TV this morning with a press conference talking about it.

But, the system is overwhelmed and there will be changes that are made, but quite truthfully, it needs to be done by the Federal government because they're veterans and their healthcare comes through the Federal government. So they could make a policy change. The VA could make a policy change and just say 'well we accept a veteran and make payment to Community Medical Center' or wherever else a veteran might live near a hospital which would be more convenient. So that's....."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "That was the second point. Is it possible to have a veterans housing project?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "We have housing for veterans. Some time with John Dorrity.....he's not here today, but we can take care of veterans housing."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Okay. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Gumper. Thank you Freeholder Little, I know the veterans are your specialty and we're very fortunate to have your expertise on that. Other comments? Yes sir."

TOM O'MALLEY, FOUR SEASONS, BRICK: "First I'd like to congratulate all the Freeholders, especially in reference to the budget. I think you did a great job and I'm proud as a taxpayer to say that you did a great job. I especially want to congratulate Gerry, Freeholder Little, because you set up some increase in emergency housing. Am I correct?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Yes."

TOM O'MALLEY: "Well congratulations on that because that is one area that was really needed. If you don't mind I would like to make a recommendation that you may want to take maybe one or two percent of that and set it aside for micro-housing because even though the emergency housing is a great thing and it really helps people at the immediate time, but the few days that they spend at hotels, they come out and the problem starts all over again. If we had micro-housing in this area we could put them in there and you wouldn't have to worry about a time frame, but that's another issue.

But, the reason why I'm here as well is that I think I distributed some literature to all you people and I hope you had an opportunity to read it. I think maybe we didn't articulate or do a very good job because I think there's some questions that kind of surfaced and I'm here today to explain it to you. Basically, the rules and regulations that we set as the group I represent, Catholics and Friends with a Heart for the Homeless, we handled this list of requirements for residency in these micro-homes and believe it or not I thought we were on good grounds because we took it the 1967 Housing Act set up by Congress. Basically, if you don't mind, it's just a couple of sentences of what we read or what we thought we were on the right ground, it said, and this is a quote 'when an applicant is determined to be eligible for these units and stability as a tenant, people can be denied admission if their habits and practices may be expected to have a detrimental effect on the tenants and on the property and environment itself. So, maybe we didn't read it correctly. We thought we did, but if there's anything in those rules that we need you people, that you want to amend and rewrite, be my guest. I mean we're here to....we need you. You need us. We should be working together. So, I respectfully request that if there's anything there that you find that is unacceptable, please let us know and we could sit down and try to get something a little more on common grounds. Because the homeless issue in this town and all years we keep getting more and more and more. And, I think Mr. Vicari at our March 5th meeting said that the problem is getting so serious in Ocean County that it's probably time that we built a shelter. I believe in those kind of words if I'm not misquoting, but I think that's a pretty good quote. And if indeed if that scenario is up and running and has some merit and is being(inaudible). A group like ours, we're right here to do that. We have all the qualifications. We have all the professional people with all the means to help you administer that. Keep it in mind that would be refunded by HUD. I think its a perfect thing because micro-homes... if you go.... they're springing up all over. Every day I get a call, I get a letter, I get some people, we just had our own representative come back from Washington. He was there for two weeks. By the way he sent me 26 emails. I'm still trying to read them.

But anyway, the thing is that it really is the future, trust me on this. And, there's nothing wrong with trying to get a bigger group always.....you know with a bigger group, there's a lot of problems. Micro-homes brings independence. It brings a stability to a person. It's a psychological one as well which is very important in these things. I mean they're not stamping each other. They're accusing each other whose shoes they're wearing. It's something that's going to happen and if we had these things as part of a program over down at the County whereas Gerry says that seven percent increase, the only thing that's wrong is at the end year, then it's gone. Other than these people having a comfortable three days or whatever it is that time in the hotel, but if we had these homes.....they're there. They're there forever. They withstand 165 mile per hour winds. They're fireproof. They have all the accommodations of all the standard homes. And believe it or not, it may be a micro-home, but it's a big thing when you're living in the

woods for three years. So I really respect and request that you give this some more serious thought and anything we can do as a group, we'd be only too glad to share with this because we do have a lot of knowledge and we do have a lot of professional people. And we do have people on board that really administer these and we're going to have a paid person onboard as well. But anyway, the thing that I'm trying to say is that going out, what we're doing, it's a losing.....as much as I congratulate all you're doing, you're doing a fantastic job. We're losing the battle. This here will put that battle I think will kind of put it......it won't put an end to housing, but it's certainly going to put a big dent.

I appreciate all of you and I hope that.....does anybody have questions on that? Because I don't want to leave here thinking that you still have some questions on it or I can explain to you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Mr. O'Malley, first of all, speaking on behalf of the Board, we thank you for coming here to try to clear up what was in your letter to us. But I think we need to read that letter and you guys have to rethink very carefully of what you proposed because this would help no one in tent city. Because your prospective residents, reading from what you sent, 'a prospective resident will be fully screened through a strict background check and interviewed via the Executive Board for acceptance into the community'. So they're not open to everyone. 'Potential residents will not be accepted for the following reasons: 1) felons - that is a recent history of violence and theft; 2) persons who falsify the initial application; 3) convicted sex offenders; 4) persons presently addicted to drugs and alcohol'. That is a huge problem in tent city. It is THE problem in tent city. '5) those who demonstrate a hostile attitude and emotional instability'. Again, that is a serious issue with many who are homeless. 6 - which is illegal, 'physically handicapped applicants'. That's not legally done. And '7) this facility is not prepared to be of assistance to those who have serious handicaps or addictions'. So when we talk about what is not being done for the homeless in tent city, obviously this proposal doesn't do anything for them either."

TOM O'MALLEY: "Mr. Bartlett, I have been going to tent city for fourteen years. I am probably the most visited simply because of where I live. I am the biggest advocate. I will tell you right here and now that 98% of the people in tent city would not qualify anywhere in homes because these people have unbelievable addictions. They cannot function in society without getting professional help. And maybe we didn't.....you know, believe it or not, we're not talking here about people who have rheumatoid arthritis or in a wheelchair.....and there again, we did a poor job evidently. But what I'm trying to say is that we're not equipped for people who need assistance, their assistance. They need an aide. They need machines. What I'm trying to say is that that's what we were referring to. Maybe we did a poor job of doing that, but certainly....."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "We all make mistakes."

TOM O'MALLEY: "Hey listen, I have more disabilities than half the people. I'd probably qualify myself. But, what I'm saying is that yes, you're right, we did a poor job. I admit that. But certainly we're not so exclusive that we think we're going to have a (inaudible) problem there. And that's right. Rewrite it. rewrite it to fit what you're comfortable with and we'll agree with it. All we want to do is be part of the problem because believe it or not, you and I have known each other and why I say why you need to trust us because.....and I don't have to make reference to Monmouth County. They're getting what? Ten times more money than we're getting here. And the other reason why they're getting it is because they have many more organizations like the one that I represent, Catholics and Friends, who work. Don't forget, all those (inaudible) refunded. You know? So what is wrong with us working with you or you working with us.....and even if you don't want to work with us. Okay. The idea is that don't discount this modular, this micro-home. It is...trust me when I tell you, we did an unbelievable amount of research on this. We had professionals look at it. It is the thing of the future and the reason why it's so economically sound.....we met with Habitat for Humanity....you can build these things. They say \$10,000.00. We can build them for \$7,000.00. But thing is...what I'm saying is that if we had....if you can just envision that having them all way from here down to the end of the County line. People would not have to travel 40-50 miles for emergency shelter. They could stay in that area. And not only that, it's a regular, repeating. I mean if you had 50 units in Manchester, 50 in Berkeley....these people could stay there. And not only that, they don't have to be out in three days. I mean certainly it's not a residence, but at the same token they can be re-evaluated and if you just took two or three percent every year for the next five years. Well here look, you already spent \$25 million on emergency shelter last five years probably in that area? \$25 million. Where is it?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "It housed about 2000 a night......"

TOM O'MALLEY: "I get....that's a given, but and that is great. Don't get me wrong. I'm not discouraging that or downgrading it. I'm saying that our plan, our plan, it's there forever so to speak. In other words, these people would not be out in three days. That's all I'm saying. But if there's any......I apologize for doing a poor job on this, but, and I think that I'm going to blame Congress for this by the way because they're the ones that said that we can exempt people. All right? Thank you very much."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. O'Malley. Are there any more comments to come before the Board? Seeing none, can I have a motion to adjourn it?"

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENTS OF THE OCEAN COUNTY COLLEGE FACILITIES IN AND BY THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$2,950,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,950,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees (the "Board of Trustees") of the Ocean County College (the "College") has determined by resolution duly adopted on March 8, 2013 to apply to the State of New Jersey (the "State") for a grant from the State's Building Our Future Bond Act Program for the financing of a project consisting of improvements to and the renovation of the existing College Instructional Building as described in Section 3 hereof (the "Project") at an estimated cost of \$11,400,000, and has delivered a statement to that effect to each member of the Board of School Estimate; and

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2013, the Secretary of Higher Education advised the Board of Trustees that it would be awarded a grant of \$8,550,000 from the Building Our Future Bond Act Program to apply toward financing the costs of the Project, subject to the Board of Trustees providing a matching amount of not less than 25% of the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, The Board of School Estimate has determined by resolution duly adopted on March 26, 2014 that no less than \$2,850,000 is necessary for the matching amount for the Project which is to be raised by the County of Ocean and a certificate to that effect has been delivered to the Board of Trustees and the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance (the "Improvements") are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "County") as general improvements. For the said Improvements there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,950,000. No down payment is required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-19(2)(b).

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the Improvements, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$2,950,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law and Title 18A, Education, of the New Jersey Statutes (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said Improvements, negotiable bond May 21, 2014

Introduced on: Adopted on: Official Resolution exceeding \$2,950,000 pursuant to the provisions and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law (the "Bond Anticipation Notes" or "Notes").

- The Improvements hereby authorized and the purpose for which Section 3. (a) the Bonds are to be issued are improvements of Ocean County College, consisting of the renovation of the Instructional Building (the "Building") including, but not limited to (i) ADA compliance throughout the Building including lavatories; (ii) complete renovation of the existing academic space with minimal CMU wall demolition work; (iii) complete renovation of the existing Building laboratories, classrooms and office space; (iv) creation of a new main mall area entrance; (v) creation of wet laboratory space from existing classroom space; (vi) replacement of fan coil/unit ventilators; (vii) replacement of HVAC piping throughout the Building; (viii) removal of unused piping, conduits, wiring; (ix) possible replacement of electrical service; (x) study of the Building envelope, façade, roof, masonry, windows, caulking; (xi) replacement of hot water boilers, hot and chilled water pumps; and (xii) upgrades to HVAC, electrical, audio, video, voice and data, windows, glass storefronts, carpeting, painting, ceilings, and including all work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto. The additional funding for these Improvements will be received from the State of New Jersey pursuant to the Building Our Future Bond Act.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes to be issued for the purpose of financing a portion of the cost of the Improvements is \$2,950,000.
- The estimated cost of the Improvements is not less than \$11,400,000 and the County's share of the Improvements is \$2,950,000, which amount represents the appropriation made by the County.
- All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times Section 4. as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date. The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time, at not less than par and accrued interest, at public or private

stand to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price May 21, 2014 2014000596

plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is

directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such

report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the

Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget (or temporary capital budget as applicable) of the

County is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of

any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the

resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the

amended capital budget (or amended temporary capital budget as applicable) and capital

program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file

with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited

and stated:

(a) The Improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current

expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general

improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property

specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes within the limitations

of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the

bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 15 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly

prepared and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, and a complete

executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such

statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased

by the authorization of the Bonds and Notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$2,950,000 and

the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$100,000 for items of expense listed in and

permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the

Improvements.

Section 7. Any funds received from time to time by the County as contributions in

aid of financing the purposes described in Section 3 hereof shall be used for financing said

Improvements by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvements

or to payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the County authorized

therefor by this bond ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received

which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvements shall, be held and

applied by the County as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the County

authorized hereunder.

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-19, the Board of Trustees of Ocean Section 8.

County College has duly prepared and delivered to the Board of School Estimate a statement of

the money necessary for the Improvements described in Section 3(a) hereof. The Board of

School Estimate has duly prepared a certificate of such amount and the certificate has been duly

filed with the Board of Trustees and the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean.

The full faith and credit of the County is hereby pledged to the punctual Section 9.

payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance.

The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be

obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the

payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

The County hereby covenants to take any action necessary or refrain from Section 10.

taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized

hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and

the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with

regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as

may be required thereunder.

Section 11. The County reasonably expects to commence the acquisition and/or

construction of the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, and to

advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes

hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to

reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond

ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in

Section 2 hereof.

To the extent that any previous ordinance or resolution is inconsistent Section 12 herewith or contradictory hereto, said ordinance or resolution is hereby repealed or amended to the extent necessary to make it consistent herewith.

This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication Section 13. thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.





Freeholder Bartlett introduced John Pirozek and noted that Mr. Pirozek took over many of the duties Michael Fiure was responsible for in the Parks and Recreation Department. Freeholder Bartlett noted concerns over the years with the progress of Berkeley Island County Park, stating that it is located way out into the Bay. The park was in need of some overhauling before Superstorm Sandy and Superstorm Sandy did considerable damage to the Park. Freeholder Bartlett stated that during Superstorm Sandy, as the Barnegat Bay over washed the park, gullies cut through when water came rushing in and rushed back out; a significant amount of frontage into the park

was lost including the parking area and the road was undermined as well as the way into the park was seriously damaged. The Freeholder noted that the buildings at the park were already in need of repair, and they were basically ruined by Superstorm Sandy.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the first thing that the County needed to do was to stabilize the shoreline; a demonstration project by the Stevens Institute of Technology was undertaken and the County applied for a NJDEP grant for \$200,000 to design a living shoreline. The Freeholder stated that the County intends to use the dredged material that was dumped on the park from the Bay during Superstorm Sandy, which has been piled up at the park, to extend the shoreline out to the point it was at prior to the storm. The County can then rebuild the parking lots. Freeholder Bartlett noted that a Request for Proposals was prepared for the design and permitting for the Shoreline Protection and Redevelopment of Berkeley Island Park. The Freeholder advised that the award for the contract will be to T&M Associates, who was ranked first, will be listed on the agenda. The Freeholder stated that the Bridge Department will rebuild the fishing pier when the weather breaks in the spring and then the Parks Department will fence off an area to create a walkway to the pier this summer. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the gazebo needs to be torn down and the bathrooms facilities need to be rebuilt. Freeholder Kelly stated that a sign should be put up that it is under design so that residents know that the County is working on this and not ignoring the Park. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the capital budget includes dollars to rebuild the Park which may be able to start in the fall. The Freeholder stated that the NJDEP has been very helpful to Ocean County and they are putting a lot of effort into this demonstration project. Freeholder Kelly stated that this is a well-used park as well as the fishing pier. Director Vicari asked if there were any grant funds or FMEA dollars available for this project. Administrator Block advised that the County has an application for FEMA money, but was unsure if the County would be receiving any money. Freeholder Bartlett stated that \$8 million is in the budget for potential costs for this; Freeholder Kelly however, the County does not expect to spend \$8 million on this. noted that this park opened in 1983 at which time he worked in the park.

Freeholder Bartlett provided a map for the Board members depicting the 1,760 acre Structural Management property in Lacey and Manchester Townships. This has been recommended by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee for acquisition. The Freeholder noted that these are individual lots in the old Roosevelt City Area. Manchester Township has committed \$500,000 to purchase approximately 100 acres of the site and advised that they would apply for additional funding of \$513,000 through the NJDEP Green Acres. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the negotiated price for this parcel is \$5,750,000. This acquisition will be the largest acquisition to-date. The Freeholder noted that the appraised value of the property is \$6,343,000; however the land owners will sell it to the County for \$5,750,000. With Manchester Township's contribution of \$500,000, the net cost to the County is \$5.2 million. Freeholder Bartlett stated that if and when funding may become available from the Joint Base, the County would be in line for additional money for this acquisition. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the County has the cash in hand through the Natural Land Trust Fund for this Introduced on:

acquisition. Director Vicari noted that almost 60 percent of land in the County is in public ownership.

Freeholder Kelly noted that the Mosquito Commission does flyovers at Natural Land Trust Fund properties and the Security Department regularly checks the sites. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the Planning Department physically inspects Natural Lands Trust Fund properties to see if there is squatting or illegal activities taking place on the properties. The Freeholder also stated that woodchips are placed at the entrances to keep four wheel drives vehicles off these properties. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County is very vigilant with the assistance of the Planning Board, Security Department and the Mosquito Commission in keeping an eye on these properties. This will be listed for the Board agenda of April 2, 2014.

Freeholder Lacey reviewed with the Board the Recycling Grant Program 2014. The Freeholder distributed a booklet describing the program and soliciting applications from municipalities. This program helps our municipalities improve their recycling efforts. Freeholder Lacey noted that the County will distribute a total of \$100,000 in grants and that the maximum amount of funding for a municipality will not exceed \$5,000 and the maximum amount for improvements for drop off centers cannot exceed \$35,000. Municipalities must provide a 50 percent match for this grant program. Freeholder Lacey stated that the grant application deadline is April 25, 2014. Grant applications will be reviewed by the Solid Waste Advisory Council and grants will be awarded sometime in June.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommended advertisement for the improvements to Garden State Parkway Interchange 91 in Brick Township.

Freeholder Kelly stated that a lot of the design for the Interchange 91 project came from input from Brick Township. The Freeholder requested that Mr. Scarantino reviewed the project with the new Mayor and Counsel of Brick so that they are aware of the improvements the County is making which incorporated the Townships comments. Mr. Scarantino stated that this project is estimated at \$22 million and it will be funded by the State, noting that the cost to the County is approximately \$500,000. Scarantino stated that this project is over nine years old. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County worked with the Township and its residents to incorporate their comments and suggestions. Freeholder Kelly advised that these are significant improvements to the interchange and it has taken a very, very long time to get to this point. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the County and Turnpike Authority did a marvelous job with increased traffic flow at the Route 571 / Lomel Road interchange, noting that the County is changing traffic patterns to meet the demands of the 600,000 population in Ocean County. Freeholder Kelly stated that the goals of the Turnpike Authority are to take traffic off Route 9 and relocate local traffic more to local roads, which is why they are funding these types of projects.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of April 2, 2014. Freeholder Little noted that a proclamation will be added to the agenda for National Nutrition Month. There were no questions or other comments.

Director Vicari advised that he attended the Mayor's meeting this week and he advised that Congressman Saxton would like to come to an upcoming PreBoard meeting in June to continue the support of this Board. Director Vicari stated that Congressman Saxton gave a great presentation at the Mayor's meeting regarding the missions of the Joint Base. Freeholder Kelly stated that this is very important; the County needs to be very vigilant and add to the buffer zone around the Base, open space is vital to the buffer zone and the County continues to purchased open space through the Natural Lands Trust Fund Program. Freeholder Kelly advised that the County continues to meet with Emil Kaunitz and continues to work together. The Freeholder noted that in 1995 the County worked very closely with Congressman Smith putting together a presentation to the BRAC on our Base and we were successful in saving the Base from BRAC closings working together with Burlington County.

Director Vicari discussed the fire in Point Pleasant Beach noting that more information is on the Prosecutor's website. The Director noted that the Ocean County Library has eBooks available. The Director stated that it is unbelievable how fast one can get information, the digital age is here.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

There were no comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Lacey, seconded by Freeholder Kelly, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:55 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.
