T. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:20 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I just have one comment. You know it's very essential that we give home-delivered meals. Jim Sigurdson of Community Services is doing an outstanding job. When I went there you could not go in, but the information is that seniors are doing very well as far as contact every day. But also I said, 'What are their needs? What can we do to make their lives a little bit easier?' As you know, they live in isolation which is unfortunate for many of them. And I was told that they need certain items. He said toilet paper, paper towels, tissues, disinfectant, hand wipes, soap and things of that nature. This was on Saturday or Sunday. I took it over to our professional staff and they had a discussion. And working with Public Information, Donna Flynn, by today we do have a policy. What we are going to do – we had two car dealerships, fortunately, that will be collection sites. And they will be, of course, Causeway Ford which is owned by Dave Wintrode on Route 72 – a great guy. He's been very generous with that agency. He gave us a check for ten thousand dollars going back in the summer with Freeholder Haines. And also, Adam Kraushaar from Lester Glenn will have a vehicle on their property. That's two collection sites. If anyone wants to volunteer, of course, we will do so. But I think the important thing is that the home-delivered meals will collect it from those sites without any participation from the County. It shows the generosity of many of the County residents who will bring them to the Southern Service Center. They will unload two vans, bring it inside, sanitize it and wait several days so when they deliver the food to those on home-delivered meals, they will get what they need which is essential. But it will have to be in the original wrap from the manufacturer. So it can't be anything that is loose. So anything else that falls into that spectrum we will collect. There is a need.

And again, we will make adjustments to make sure that we serve not only our seniors whatever is necessary, but an issue that does arise. So we hope by Monday or Tuesday that our seniors will be attended to. So it's not just the cost, but what we found out was the hours for them to go shopping (inaudible) in many cases. Their caregivers have not gone into their houses, have not been doing their shopping that is so necessary. But they will have a good meal every day. We will have any products such as toiletries and everything else that we can provide. And again, we thank our staff for thinking outside the box and being very creative. I know the generosity of the residents of Ocean County will come to the top as they always have and that will solve another problem. That concludes my report. I'll turn it over to Freeholder Gary Quinn, if he has anything to add."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Director. Just to reiterate what we said, everyone is doing such a fantastic job. I want to recognize the Sheriff who is here today because you haven't made it to a lot of these meetings in the past because I know your schedule hasn't allowed it. But certainly on behalf of myself and I know Freeholder

Kelly is probably going to say a few words, we want to thank you and your department because I know you are out there on the front lines whether it be with your department, the local police departments, the EMTs. And I know that you are working 24 hours a day so I certainly can't thank you enough for all that you've done for the residents of Ocean County keeping us safe and trying to keep a handle on people that are just not abiding by the social distancing and different things throughout, from the south to the north and throughout the entire county. But you are doing a great job.

To the rest of the staff, we go week by week right now waiting for change to see what is going to change. Hopefully in the next couple of weeks we will see more positive changes. But like everyone has said, from the President on down, it's going to be a difficult couple of weeks ahead of us with the numbers spiking the way they will be now that the testing is moving forward. But everyone has done a great job in dedicating. You know we have hard workers in the people of this county, certainly led by Freeholder Vicari as our Director and the rest of the Freeholder Board and everyone else.

So better times ahead. I never thought I'd join this Board and see ourselves sitting in this room with just ten people spreading ourselves out all over the place to protect everybody. You are all doing a great job. Erik, thank you for coming today and getting the word out there for us. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Quinn. We have a suggestion from Freeholder Kelly that we have the Sheriff speak next so he can get back to work. We know he is busy. So what I would like to do, going back last I had a discussion with the Sheriff and again, the reinforcement of what is taking place not only in one town, but all the towns throughout Ocean County is very important. We always tell people to be calm, get the facts, just be objective and treat everyone equally. So in talking to the Sheriff and also members of our staff and also our Prosecutor, the Sheriff is just going to give an overview of what is taking place throughout all 33 towns. Also what is being done with enforcement. And again, we appreciate the work. We know you have a special relationship with Lakewood. They listen to you. And you do an outstanding job. We just want to make it part of the public record and to let everyone in Ocean County know that you are working hard – above and beyond. You have a very unique situation. So if you would give a presentation today, I would appreciate it."

SHERIFF MICHAEL MASTRONARDY: "Sure, I'll be very brief. I just made up a packet for each Freeholder and just to let you know, it started back on February 12th in Emergency Management, the Sheriff's Office, when we got it from the State. I asked questions at the 911 Center. They wanted to ask questions about have you traveled or whatever and we implemented it back on February 12th. So we have been at this for a long time, you can see, prior to everything else.

Then we called Dan Regenye at the Health Department. We had a meeting there on the 2nd of March. We asked Jack Sahradnik questions about what we can do when people don't quarantine. So we wanted to be ahead of the game and know what restrictions we had and what we could implement. We then got updated EMD questions such as 'Do you have a fever?' So every 911 call is answered the same throughout the County and everybody is treated the same. At that point we brought in Doug and Rick to do a report to get the word out, a press release, so the public knew that we were going to be asking additional questions about it and it would take a little bit longer. And we have added to that as time has gone on. We are actually asking, 'Have you tested positive?' So right now if you call 911 they are going to ask you that question.

We arranged for buildings to be cleaned. We started to prepare a contingency plan. We had an OEM (Office of Emergency Management) meeting at that time which we have quarterly. We asked the hospitals how many respirators they have. We had a number and we will hopefully get that number approved because some were concerned about that at the hospital level as you well know.

Our CERT people, I can't say enough about them – the CERT volunteers. A lot of them from Lacey in Pheasant Run and (inaudible). They have gone in there made phone calls to all the registered-ready, these are people with special needs and all the nursing homes prior to any declaration or anything happening. So we were prepared in that regard.

Then the County declaration came and we had the Police Academy close as a result of an instructor in Essex County testing positive. So we closed the Academy. We are looking at now probably doing some virtual classes. We are in contact with the students to see if we can do that. We restricted the 911 Center and OEM. Nobody is allowed, including myself, in the 911 Center. You have to have your temperature taken, you have to sign in and you have to wash your hands. So you people, unfortunately, even though you spend the money there and control it, just respect our wishes and you are not allowed in at this time."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Even if we wash our hands?"

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "Even if you wash your hands, Freeholder, but thank you. Thank you for your support. So we did that at OEM. I have to, unfortunately, go to OEM. So I'm between my house and OEM and my office. I will thank the Freeholders because over the last couple of years we did get equipment such as cameras and those cameras right now are so valuable to us and to the residents of Ocean County. We have those installed at various locations at the test center, at LBI, we are working with the Long Beach Island Police Department. We have implemented the security. So we have security at the test site at the college. We have cameras that are at the disinfection site for the cars that we implemented so we can see what is happening.

So if I go back there will be a picture in your...I gave you some pictures because I thought it would be easier to look at."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And just for one second for the Board, the Sheriff today asked for approval for three additional cameras which will cost us about \$30,000.00."

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "I'm sorry, that's \$30,000.00 a piece, sir."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "\$30,000.00 a piece. But, they are not only important for today, we have use for them in the future. This is not going to last forever as bad as the coronavirus is, but these help us with security in a number of instances and I told him, yes there is money available for that and we will purchase those. But I wanted to talk to the Board today so that everyone knows that because I'm going to make sure that Mike and Julie get that approved so you can get those cameras as quickly as possible for today's need and for the future. But the Sheriff, I let him know today that yes that request is approved."

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "Well, thank you very much Freeholder. Not only thank you, but thank all the Board for their support. Mike Fiure has been excellent to us in getting what we need.

We are already prepared for the next one. I may not be here. I mean not be here, be here, but we're prepared. We're getting ready for the next viral infection. You know we looked at Bill Gates who predicted this from five years ago, and now I see the tape. I wish I watched it before because we realize that some of the things we thought were in place, they are not in place, and they better be in place for next time. We should learn from this and we are already looking down the road. But now is not the time to look at that, let's just get you updated.

So we have the cameras in there. We have pictures of Planning working with the Health Department – excellent cooperation working as a team. And the hospitals get things done – you can see there. You see that we have social distancing at our OEM. I did include on the last two pages, so you could see last week to this week, what the increase has been. Unfortunately, we do have probably about 20 deaths right now in Ocean County and we anticipate more. The first responders – we had to assign two people who assist because ambulances are running out, the Hatzolah is running out. There are people that are actually going to Philadelphia because our hospitals are full right now. They're going up to Philadelphia..."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Can we stay on the 20 deaths for one second?"

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "Yes sir."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And again, just in general, are these older? Younger? I mean, where are the deaths coming from and not town by town, but just overall what is the demographics?"

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "The majority are 75 and above and have underlying conditions. But we have seen, today, someone about 40 years old. So we are seeing some younger people unfortunately."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "But, the overwhelming majority are elderly people with underlying conditions?"

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "That's correct."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And I just wanted to make sure that when we talk about these numbers, we talk about what is inside the numbers."

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "Yes, you're right. And correct, just like you are hearing, that there are a lot of people that have health issues that make them more susceptible to this. So we'll see.

We currently have two employees that tested positive. And we have one that we're looking at who is being treated for pneumonia right now."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And we had a few that did come back negative."

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "And we had some come back negative. We get them back. We tested more at the Health Department. We have two being tested tomorrow.

Other than that, we put out the signboards throughout the County. They are being positioned throughout. And with Mike Fiure's assistance and Engineering, we used Engineering boards too to get the word out on what to do, what is open, what is closed.

And I think we were the first ones to do a Compliance Unit. So Captain Johnson has a Compliance Unit that is going throughout the County. They are in Little Egg today. And they go throughout the County. Today we had seven officers assigned to make sure people are in compliance – businesses are in compliance, people are practicing social distancing. And they go throughout the County, every community. And I am happy to report that we are very blessed in this County that our residents are listening. The residents are paying attention. The residents in all 33 municipalities understand the severity of this, understand that it is a life and death issue, and are taking it very seriously and are compliant. Even though you hear rumors and speculation, the reality is I deal with facts. In law enforcement we deal with facts and so in dealing with the facts, the compliance is almost 100%. It's not perfect. And when it's not perfect, we'll take action to make it perfect. How's that?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Okay and you said it, but I just want to reiterate that even though you started a little late today, we are doing this county-wide."

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "Every day. We're in every town, every day."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And we are going to make sure that this County is compliant and I agree with you, we fine them so that the County is compliant, that people are listening to the orders of the Governor and of our own responsibility here in the County.

So I know that you were invited here today by myself and Freeholder Vicari to give this report and I want to not only thank you for that, but for all the work of not only yourself but your whole department. They have been just outstanding, Sheriff. I think you weren't here at the last meeting when I talked about it, but they have been doing just an outstanding job and we really, all of us not just myself, really appreciate the hard work of yourself, your Undersheriffs, your administrative team and all the officers. Give them a pat on the back from all of us."

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "Well, I can't touch them."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Oh yeah. Don't touch them!" (laughter)

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "But I do take that as a compliment to the whole team and you're right, I can remember going to Dispatch and saying, 'Hey listen, we're going to cut you guys off. You can only come to work if I change some of your schedules to 12 hour days to have people in here answering the phones.' And not one, not one complained. And the same thing with the officers. We adjusted schedules. We're not getting a lot of crime at this time, so we moved the CSI Unit to day shift so they can do the compliance. So we are doing things to be efficient, effective, and make sure everybody is safe in the County with your support and your blessing. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "We really appreciate it. Thank you, Sheriff. Thanks for coming here today."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And again, we thank you for not only your forward thinking, but your outstanding job at Ocean County College organizing the test site. It worked out very, very well. And I think it's a model for not only Ocean County, but for the rest of the State of New Jersey. So we'll let you get back to work and thank you very much."

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "Alright. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Mr. Director, before you leave Mr. Sheriff. As you know, our Sheriff's Department, our Health Department, are kind of taking the lead with the drive-through test site and I would like to thank you on behalf of the Board of Health. I received excellent reports for the work of your Sheriff's Department with our Health Department. So thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Sheriff."

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "Thank you again."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The next commenter is Freeholder Gerry Little. Gerry and I have been talking before each meeting with the Governor at 11:30 each day and working with the public health officers. They're doing a great job. And the State of New Jersey took some of the suggestions from Gerry Little verbatim with the many mayors (inaudible) and mentioned some of the things that (inaudible) not only with the Board of Health, but also the knowledge of the government process."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "So you want to move to that subject now after the Freeholder Comments?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The Freeholder Comments."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "The Sheriff mentioned a couple of things. You asked a question about some statistics. I have some information for the Board and for the public and I would like to start with, first of all we were talking about the testing facility. And like we said last week, every member of this Board and all of your departments, everyone in the County is cooperating with this. And we thank our Health Department for kind of taking a lead and the Sheriff's Department. Those two departments have kind of been the key of this along with everyone else and all of your departments cooperating with it. As we said last week, it is a team effort here in Ocean County from the beginning of this with the Director and all the members of the Board participating.

So our testing facility has now operated for four days. We administered 40 tests the first day, 126 the second day, 147 the third day and today, Wednesday, the fourth day, 135 tests. So we've got a total of 448. We only have results for the first day. And on the first day, of the 40 tests, 3 were positive and the rest were negative.

We don't have the results yet for the other days. But we are seeing overall in Ocean County, we now have, as of 4:00 pm this afternoon, we have 1,256 confirmed COVID-19 cases. We had 148 new cases today. We have been averaging, our Director of the Health Department is here now, we have been averaging roughly around 150 – rounded off – for the last four or five days in the County, county-wide. We have not seen today a significant increase. It stayed right around 150 for the last four or five days. So I don't know what that implies, but we have not seen a significant spike at this point. It has kind of stayed steady.

It has not gone down. One day we had 155. One day 148. One day 151. Okay. So it's right around 150, 151. Now, of the 148 new cases overnight, we had 12 in Lakewood which is kind of low at that point for Lakewood. Lakewood now has a total of 450 confirmed cases – the most increase that we saw overnight was in Toms River. Toms River actually had 48 new cases overnight. And Toms River is now at 204 in the entire town. And the rest are kind of split up between Brick and Jackson, Berkeley, and so forth. But the two highest municipalities are Lakewood

and Toms River.

It is also important, to give it a little bit more reflection, our Health Department – we have volunteers by the way from the hospitals - they donated volunteers to help administer these tests at our testing site at the College. So we want to thank them. And we certainly want to thank our Board of Health for the enormous effort that they're making.

The Sheriff mentioned about 20 deaths. We now have 28. That's about a little over 2% of all the positive cases that resulted in death here in Ocean County so far. A little over 2%, a fraction over 2%. We have roughly, of all those who were tested, about 4% need hospitalization. And that's a rough number. The Health Department is sorting all that information out. But about 4% of all those positive cases need hospitalization here in Ocean County. Now I'm not sure how that, again, compares to the rest of the nation, but it's about 4%.

There is some surprising information in who is actually testing positive. We have an infant only a couple of months old. Right Dan?"

DAN REGENYE, PUBLIC HEALTH COORDINATOR: "A couple of days old."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "A couple of days old. So we go from that and I think the oldest was 96, 99?"

DAN REGENYE: "96.7."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "96.7. So we have from age, from birth to age 18, we have 86 confirmed cases. So when the young people say they cannot or they won't contract this virus, it's just not proving out. About 86 or almost 7% of the positive cases are young people, very young, up to age 18.

From age 19 to 44, a really surprising number, 517 confirmed COVID cases here in Ocean County. That's 41.5%. 41.5% of our positive that we know of, positive confirmed cases, are between the ages of 19 and 44.

And between the ages of 45 and 64 are another 400 cases for 32.2%. So if you add them together, between age 19 and age 64, that's 73, almost 74% or three quarters. So again, right in the prime of everyone's life, middle age, here, at least in Ocean County, we see about 73% to 74% of the positive cases are in that age group.

And 65 and above, 239. 65 and above, or 19%. Now there are a lot of statistics, but it looks like the bell curve. Those who are right in the middle of life, in the prime of their life, they are contracting this virus.

And yes, we have seniors and so forth, but again, of the 28 deaths – we don't have a total breakdown yet of the ages of those deaths, but they all, every one of them, have underlying health issues or I guess Dan would like me to refer to it as they conform with the CDC as the vulnerable or high-risk category. Meaning, they are either elderly or they were smokers or they have heart disease or COPD or diabetes.

So one of those 28 is being categorized as COVID positive, but it was a young man, age 27, that died from an overdose and they swabbed him at death and it turned out positive. So those are some of the statistics.

Interestingly enough, female and male, you have all heard that it seems to affect males more than females. Well it does. Females -485 - which is about 39% and males are about 56%, a little over 600. But I am not adding because we don't have breakdown, so it doesn't include Long Beach Island. But 694 or 56%. So it is proving to be true what we hear nationally, that more men seem to be contracting this than women.

And don't ask me why, but we have 63 unknown. So I can't answer. I have to ask Dan to figure that one out for me. But in any event, again, it's a major effort by our Health Department, by our Sheriff's Department, and by everyone here in the County who are working together on this. So we have not seen a peak yet, but there seems to be a plateau, at least for the last five or six days right around 150, 155 cases. I don't know if anyone would like to ask Dan anything or would you like to add to that?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes. Dan Regenye is doing an excellent job. We work together will all the calls to the Governor's office. You have been doing a great job. If you just want to answer any questions related to what Freeholder Little said or anything else, please do so."

DAN REGENYE, PUBLIC HEALTH COORDINATOR: "I think just one is the irony of this whole thing is this week is "Public Health Week". So this is where we celebrate all the activities of public health throughout the country and we are rewarded with this.

I think they're doing a great job on everything, even with the testing site, all the collaboration with all the different stakeholders. I had the opportunity to walk along it and talk to some of the folks that are coming for testing, certainly from a distance from the cars. They are just very grateful. They are very humble I think and very appreciative of the work that is getting done. Just speaking to some of them, you can see that there is some fear, but I think they are relieved at the same time that they are getting testing. A lot of them did not have access to some of that testing previously, so I think there is a lot of appreciation from the residents and really thanking the County and Health Department between the Sheriff's Department and also the hospitals within the County.

One of the main things that we are getting a lot of questions, and we just put a (press) release out today, we're getting a lot of calls and questions and emails related to reporting issues of non-compliance related to social gatherings and businesses operating and food establishments, things like that. So we are directing them to the local police

department for the enforcement capacity for that and we're trying to link up all those individuals. But overall, I would say that it's going very well, as well as can be expected, with what is going on.

I think we have a lot of great mitigation factors in place. We are in a weekly conversation with long-term care assisted living. As you know, that is some of our most highly at-risk population of individuals. We do have a number of individuals in those types of establishments that are positive and we continue to work with them. Through a stockpile of PPE that we've been able to acquire over the years, we've distributed over 20,000 pieces of N-95 to the first responders in the municipalities, to the healthcare systems, all four hospitals, to the two federally qualified health centers as well as the long-term care facilities and assisted living centers that needed that as well. And they are very appreciative of that.

So I just thank all of the Freeholders for the support over the years. I was on a phone call today with the *New York Times* and she was asking, 'How are you able to do all this?' When she speaks to some of the other counterparts in the northern part of the state. And it is very different. Even though there are other counties that have higher numbers, they also have a lot of other health departments. We are probably the single health department with the most cases that we are dealing with throughout the state. Even though Bergen County has 2200 or 2300, they have ten or eleven health departments, I believe, in that county to handle that."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "And, Mr. Director, we've talked about this...I don't know, maybe two meetings ago. Ocean County has a very well-established Health Department that represents 27 of our 33 towns. And we happen to talk about other counties and the actual number of health departments in the state, the number is 94. There are 94 either county or municipal health departments across the state. So you can see it is a mosaic out there and they all deal with it differently. So we are very fortunate that this Board, over many years, we have supported our Health Department and the people of Ocean County have supported our Health Department and with that they've assembled a lot of talent, a lot of ability and a lot of knowledge. And, of course, it starts with our Director and we are certainly very proud of your efforts, Dan, we really are."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I just want to make sure that your Board of Health is aware of what the Sheriff just talked to us about that he now has a Compliance Division so that you can rely on them, not just police, because he has taken a leadership role, working with the municipal police departments. But that might help you to have one person to go to that can get word to anybody you need."

DAN REGENYE: "We've had a lot of communication. I can reach out to him and do that."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "He just announced it to us - it's a newer division within the department that he has started to deal with this because we are getting the same complaints you are about non-compliance. I'm sorry, Gerry."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "That's okay. And, Mr. Director, I just wanted to point out, of the 21 counties that comprise New Jersey – Bergen is the highest, then we have Essex, Hudson, Union, Passaic, Middlesex, Monmouth and Ocean. So we are number eight of the highest, that have the largest number of cases. Of course, Bergen is way ahead of everyone, unfortunately, just 3500 as of today. And Salem is the lowest with 19 people."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know the reason being, of course, as you get close to the New York metropolitan area, the numbers go up. The population there is roughly about 60 million people. Then, of course, because of the closeness of the people and where they work and most of them work, of course, in Manhattan and that's why it falls over into especially Bergen County. I really feel sorry for Bergen County and the Executive is doing a great job. We hear the numbers every day.

And I think I just want to expand on what Freeholder Kelly just mentioned. It's two parts of it and people complain, 'Well you are not enforcing it.' And we hear that continuously. Well I think the next comment should be, 'Well, is there compliance?' There is a compliance section of it. And what Sheriff Mastronardy did was he has a very well-organized unit and very specific as far as he will enforce anything that does not comply with the Executive Order of the Governor of the State of New Jersey and the Attorney General's Office which is extremely important to us. Anything else?"

DAN REGENYE: "That is all I have unless there are questions?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Dan."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Little, anything else before I move on to Freeholder Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "No, thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Okay, Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "No further comments."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. The only thing I want to say is that everyone realize that in speaking with all of my fellow Freeholders that we made the decision to close our County Parks and I felt that it was

important. Last week we had closed two County Parks because it was just becoming overcrowded in the parking lots and we are now in April, the weather is going to start to get warm with Easter coming up, Passover coming up, I felt more and more people are going to want to go outside, they're going to want to congregate. And I was really afraid with our numbers going up, we're over 1200 people that have tested positive and I just felt that it was important when I talked to each and every one of you about the decision that I was making with regard to that. That is why I felt it was important that we close the parks. It's more for the safety and the health factor with regards to the 600,000 residents that we have living here in Ocean County. That is our priority. Yes, many people are upset that we closed the parks, but I felt that we made the right decision in doing it because we want to make sure that the people of Ocean County stay safe. Our young children, because you heard the numbers from Gerry showing that it is a lot of young people that are getting this virus, and we just want to make sure everyone is protected.

And we are also following what the President and our Governor have said. They want people to stay home. So this I feel is an important measure that we had to take with regards to our County Parks. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Haines. One of the comments that I made today in talking to the Governor's Office was a suggestion from Freeholder Haines was that we close all of our 27 parks. What's happening is, there are two State Parks – Island Beach State Park and Double Trouble State Park. And the fact is, of course, everyone is going to go to those two State Parks. So what I mentioned to them is that more and more people are coming down that are permanent residents that are 'snow birds'. So over the next several days because they come for Easter, there are going to be more senior citizens that live here most of the time – for 8 or 9 months at a time – and that should be addressed. And the State said, 'Well, send us some guidelines.' But there is nothing definite as far as what is going to take place with the two State Parks. Unfortunately, they are both in the same town – Berkeley Township. So the enforcement will fall on the local police department which is the Berkeley Township Police Department. It's a small police department so it's going to be very, very difficult.

Many times people ask me, 'Well, you are the Director of the Board, what are you doing personally?' They ask that all the time. So I shared that today with the Governor's Office and all 21 counties and I said, 'As Director of the Board, I follow the same model I did when I was an educator. We had a professional development plan. I have a personal protection plan for my family and for myself personally.' What does that mean? Well, as you know, my wife is a nurse and she is in the nursing profession. So if one of us did get sick, we would section off the house – one would take one section and one would take the other so it wouldn't spread. The next thing is we have a plan in place for when we go shopping, we pick up the food, we pick up the mail – what we do in those cases. When I get home as far as where do your clothes go. So there is a plan that's in place. I think one of the most important things – even like last week at the end of the meeting – many times, and you know people come to my house, people knock on my door all the time to come in. I now have a park bench outside by my doorway and I measured if off, so if anyone comes to talk to me...for some reason, some of the people do not want to talk on the telephone, so they sit on the park bench and I will sit 8 feet away on the step and then we have a conversation because they are there anyway. So what I have to do is protect myself and protect the other people. So I do have a plan in place. I think I am going to share it with other people from the state if they want it. But I think everyone should have that personal protection plan which is extremely important. And how did that come out today? It came up with other discussions with the other counties because each county has to come up with things and nothing is really written down. But I thought of what I have done as a Superintendent, as a Principal and a Supervisor, there was always an action plan. But in an action plan there has to be something else, there has to be a sense of responsibility so each one has a responsibility also to protect themselves and so it doesn't spread to other people.

So if there are no other comments from members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, I will open up to members of the public. If not, I will call for a motion to adjourn. Erik, thank you for coming today representing the Asbury Park Press. Do you have any questions at this time?"

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:55 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive the following comments from members of the public.

ERIK LARSEN, ASBURY PARK PRESS: "You said how many employees, Mr. Director, are currently sick?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The number is, the Administrator will tell you at the end."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Four are confirmed."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Four are confirmed."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "I think he is talking about two from the Sheriff's Department. We have two previous which you knew last week. Remember? Last week you asked. We have no further...Carl?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The total number of confirmed as of today that are positive."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "Four."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Four. So the number that we know of right now is four. Many are being tested. Fortunately for us, most come back negative."

ERIK LARSEN: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, thank you very much. If there are no other comments, I will close the public portion. Is there a motion to adjourn?"

ORDINANCE #2020-7

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE RECONSTRUCTION AND RESURFACING OF VARIOUS ROADS ALL LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$12,772,128 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$12,772,128 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements: the reconstruction and resurfacing of various County roads, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment, and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$12,772,128, including the \$12,772,128 County Aid grant awarded by the New Jersey Department of Transportation to the County by letter dated July 26, 2019, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. No down payment is required as this bond ordinance involves projects funded by State grants and other similar programs, within the meaning of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c).

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$12,772,128 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1

hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an

aggregate principal amount of \$12,772,128. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature

at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature

later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates

and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller

shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County

Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All

notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-

8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at

public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the

purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County

Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next

succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such

report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes

sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or

construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the

costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are

advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of

the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the

amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a

declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any additional grant monies received for the purposes described in Section

1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the

obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not

issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance

which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting,

engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20

shall not exceed the sum of \$0.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform

with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any

such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance

Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the

Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of

Chosen Freeholders and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not

current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general

improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property

benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations

authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is ten (10) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in

the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on

first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in

the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of

Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the

gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by

\$12,772,128 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations

prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for

said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for

in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the

Freeholder Kelly introduced the 2020 budget. He said that the property tax rate is going down because the tax base continues to rebound since Super Storm Sandy. The County has a healthy surplus, and has maintained a AAA bond rating. Freeholder Kelly's budget presentation is attached. The formal introduction of the budget will take place at the February 19, 2020 Board meeting.

Freeholder Director Vicari thanked the Board for their support in moving the Performing Arts Academy from the original site at Lakehurst Naval Base to the new site at Ocean County College, while staying below the 2% cap.

Freeholder Haines said that many parks were destroyed during Super Storm Sandy, and many have been completely remodeled. The Information Technology Department keeps each department's computers and phone systems running smoothly. The Freeholder also told the Board that New Jersey Institute of Technology will be partnering with Ocean County College in the near future.

Freeholder Little said Ocean County has the largest library and park system in the State. The County's Road Department successfully maintains 618 miles of County roads, 1600 vehicles, and \$75 million in road and bridge maintenance and construction projects.

Freeholder Quinn thanked the Board for meeting with Department Heads and addressing issues they may have. He said that Freeholder Bartlett would be very proud of the 2020 fiscally sound budget. Freeholder Quinn also thanked John Ernst and Tony Agliata for keeping up with the growth in Ocean County and the escalating recycling issues facing the County. The Freeholder also commended Human Services for their efforts with the Code Blue Program that cares for homeless residents on cold nights, and the Transportation Department for safely transporting residents through Ocean Ride.

Freeholder Kelly said there are some new positions in the budget. The Sheriff's Department needs 6-10 new officers, and of the 15-20 new hires, many of them are allocated to the Sheriff's Department. The County budgets \$75 million to keep our residents safe through Law and Public Safety.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for Stormwater Management Contract 2020A, which will address drainage issues in 4 different locations in 3 towns. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the February 19, 2020 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of February 19, 2020. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Cilento read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Haines, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:44pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Director Vicari notified the Board that he received a letter of commendation from the State indicating an excellent performance by our Consumer Affairs Department, and the department Director Stephen Scaturro.

Stephen Scaturro said the department started in 2006 after the Consumer Fraud Act made violations a fourth degree punishable crime. Consumer Affairs works with the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, and was responsible for 65 indictments in 2019, which recouped \$390,000 for the residents of Ocean County.

Mr. Agliata told the Board that he has been involved with many meetings regarding the 2020 Census. Mr. Agliata expressed the importance of being counted. The Planning department has been preparing for the Census for many months already, and will continue to promote the importance of it through the schools in hopes of the children encouraging their parents to participate. Informational flyers will be sent through the mail. The 2020 Census will run from April 1 through the end of the summer.

Freeholder Haines discussed the Hurricane Branch in Manchester which is a property recommended for acquisition by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee. This is a 251.98-acre property located on Route 539 and Route 70 adjacent to the Joint Base. The landowner accepted a negotiated offer of \$405,000.

The Ocean County Agricultural Development Board and the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee have recommended the acquisition of a development easement on the 9.12-acre Hankins Farm located on Brookside Drive in Toms River. The landowner accepted an easement value of \$146,000 per acre, or an estimated \$1,331,520, pending survey verification of acreage.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. The Engineering Department will be conducting a review of the electrical agreements for traffic signals in Brick Township and Lakewood. Battery backups and generator backups will be added as an optional item for municipalities through Schedule C. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the March 4, 2020 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 4, 2020. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Quinn discussed the success of the Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Program. Spring 2020 collection dates have been announced in Lakewood, Stafford, and Toms River. Ocean County residents can dispose of up to 200 pounds of waste. Over 410,000 pounds were collected in 2019.

Freeholder Director Vicari attended the ribbon cutting for the new Performing Arts Academy at Ocean County College with Freeholders Haines, and Quinn. In addition to partnering with Kean University, OCC will be partnering with William Patterson, and NJIT,
