The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on October 21, 2015 at 4:03 PM, Room 119, Ocean County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Bartlett presiding. Members Vicari, Kelly, Lacey and Little were present at the call of the roll

#### E. PROCLAMATION

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Welcome to the regular Freeholder Meeting of October 21, 2015. This, as you know, is the regular business meeting of the Board where official action will be taken on items on the agenda. These items have been previously discussed at the Board's bi-weekly PreBoard Meetings. So we will move through this agenda relatively quickly.

At the conclusion of the business section of the meeting, we will open it up for public comment and I would be more than happy to recognize people at that time. Betty, would you please take the agenda for now?"

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder. We have two proclamations today that we're going to do simultaneously. One is proclaiming October 21, 2015 as "Pretty in Pink Day" in Ocean County and the second is October 2015 as "Women's Health Month" in Ocean County. I'm going to read both proclamations. If the following people would come forward. On behalf of the Advisory Commission on the Status of Women, we have Barbara Florimont and Barbara Lehman, Christine Lemond and Dana Ann O'Connor. And from the Board of Health, if Leslie Terjesen would come forward and Dan Regenye and anybody else you'd like to bring forward?"

Clerk Vasil reads both proclamations.

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Thank you. I want to start out with, when you saw us all together up here we were all kind of laughing and chuckling, that's because we know each other. But, these are two very serious issues and the laughing stops and the smiling stops. What we need to talk about is women's health and breast cancer.

Breast Cancer has probably touched everyone in this room either through a loved one or someone they know. If it hasn't, it will someday because it is a scourge. In respect to women's health, I talk about it every year and I've been talking about it for over 20 years, women are so busy taking care of everybody else they forget about themselves. I see it in my own family.

I wasn't a believer, but I'm believer now, because as my family ages I see what the women do for other people and I sometimes cannot believe what they do. So I'm a believer and I know what women do. I know they need to pay attention to themselves. So just because we're chuckling doesn't mean that we don't take it seriously. This Board is very aware of what Women's Health Month is and Breast Cancer Awareness and that's why we do this every year. Because we think that education is the key to success in everything you do. It helps you get through things. It helps

you design things. It helps you plan things. Education is a good, powerful tool and so that's why we do this.

And we're glad that our friends and our employees and our fellow workers are volunteers because without them, we couldn't get this out. It's hard to get it out. So we do this every year and we're going to continue to do it, even when this Board changes, because it's important. That's all I have to say."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Freeholder Lacey. And, on behalf of the Board, we thank the Commissioners on the Status of Women. We thank our Health Department who is represented here for the work they do all year-round to emphasize the importance of women's health, to remind us, as Freeholder Lacey said, that it's important for women and for men, quite frankly, to see their health care providers and to get the necessary tests because early detection, whether it's breast cancer or other forms of health problems, that makes treatment much more effective.

As I've said before when we talked about breast cancer, my mother had breast cancer and so did Freeholder Lacey's and three up here? Four? Five? So five of us represented standing here, our mothers had breast cancer. That shows you the frequency of that unfortunate health problem.

I thank the Board of Health - I am the liaison. Freeholder Lacey is liaison to the Women's Commission. I'm liaison to the Board of Health and all year round, our Board of Health raises these types of issues. They were the founders of "Pretty of Pink". Leslie does all that work here in Ocean County. It was kind of her spark, if you will, and her enthusiasm to bring these things to the forefront and we thank them.

Each year we do this, as Freeholder Lacey said, and it's our intention to continue it and to do the best that we can to show that we care about the ladies in our lives. We all have ladies, whether they're our wives or sisters or friends or girlfriends or whatever. It's important that we show this and that we care. So thank you, ladies, very much, and Dan our Director of the Board of Health. Thank you.

Leslie wants to say something on behalf of the Health Department."

LESLIE TERJESEN, OC HEALTH DEPARTMENT: "I'd like to, first of all, thank Susan Quinn and the Ocean County Library System because they have displays out in their libraries on breast cancer – books, pamphlets and publications. So thank you Susan for all that you do for us.

This is our thirteenth year of "Pretty in Pink". We're not celebrating a day. We're celebrating the lives of people touched by breast cancer and other types of cancers. If one person sees your pink and I'll tell you, I drove through town today and all of High School South was in pink. I was at the Southern Resource Center today where people should be getting their flu shots.....so if you haven't had your flu shot, there's still time to do that......but everyone was in pink.

If staying pink reminds somebody to go get their mammogram or a check-up or if you remind your wife or your girlfriend or your neighbor, your friend, your daughter, your mother or whoever, then we've made a difference. And the reason we wear pink is just for that. But remember, as they say, if you see something, say something. If you feel something, say something. If you think you have something, say something. If you're just concerned about having something, say something. Remember, your health is the most important thing that you have – address it and take care of it. Thank you very much."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Would anyone of you like to say something?"

BARBARA LEHMAN, CHAIRPERSON, WOMEN'S COMMISSION: "As the Chair, we support one hundred percent, "Pretty in Pink". Once again, next Wednesday at SOCH, Southern Ocean County Hospital, we're having the Women's Health Fair. Go in on Monday – get your free lipid screening between 7:00 and 9:00 in the morning. There's a twelve hour fast. But it is provided freely and there are going to be doctors there with a variety of screenings: hearing, balance, cholesterol, blood pressure, bone density, everything. So come on down to SOCH. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Okay, Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Freeholders. Thank you for that presentation. It's a very important issue for everyone in Ocean County."

Clerk Vasil read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "There are two of them on the agenda and I'm going to explain both because they are both very small and then we will have the Public Hearing on each of them individually as is required by law.

But, these are two small parcels. The first is a 1.12 acre site on Route 9 in Stafford Township and the accepted offer on that is \$89,000.00 and I'll explain this in just a second. The second is a 1-1/2 acre site, again on Route 9 in the same area, for \$117,000.00.

Now, the reason for these is on a small map here - this is Southern Regional High School and as you can see, all across the street, in green and back here in green, is preserved land. This has been preserved by the Forsythe Federal Reserve in some instances, by the County's Natural Lands Trust where we are augmenting the other ones, and these are the two areas in sight. They are Route 9 frontage properties. And again, they add to this entire greenway corridor and, as you can see on the other side of Southern Regional and the Parkway, there is also preserved land by the County.

If you take a larger view and I think this is important, you can see this is Route 9 and this is the Garden State Parkway, and everything in green, moving all the way out here toward Barnegat Bay, is now preserved by either the Federal Government, the State Government, the County of Ocean, and the County of Ocean in some instances in conjunction with Stafford Township. So it is a tremendous - I don't know if we have the total acreage in this area - but, this is a tremendous testament to the future, really, that we have been able to preserve all of this land in southern Ocean County. What that means, 'to be preserved' is that the way it looks now, is the way it will look hundreds of years from now, because it cannot be developed.

Again, this program is 1.2 cents per hundred dollars of equalized value tax rate that was approved by the public in every municipality about 12 years ago. And we have slowly, as the years roll by and pieces come in when they are nominated by their owner or by the town, our Natural Lands Trust Advisory Council reviews those to see if they fit the program; and again, being contiguous with other property we own and puts pieces together as we have done over the last 12 years. All of this money is cash. We are not borrowing money to operate this program. We are only dealing with willing sellers. We do two appraisals on the larger pieces. We never pay more than the appraisal. If someone wants to do business with us, that's fine and if they don't want to do business with us, that's fine too.

We have accumulated, I think Gerry probably has the total acreage. This only adds about 3 acres. But, all together in this program we have preserved in the order of.....and the Farmland Preservation, probably nearing 15,000 acres."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "More than that."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "More than that then. So that's a brief explanation of both. Betty could you read the first....."

CLERK VASIL: "On the first one, you just need to open the Public Hearing."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Okay, we will open the Public Hearing on Block 269, Lot 3.03 in Stafford. Again, the amount is not to exceed \$89,000.00. The Public Hearing on this proposed acquisition is now open. Does anyone wish to address the Board on this acquisition?

Seeing none. The Public Hearing is closed and a motion is in order."

No comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "The Public Hearing is now open on this proposed acquisition. Are there any comments from the public? Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "As I've gotten up before, who knows how many times now, again, this is a fantastic program. Again, you have the environmental positives in this. This is a given. I've talked a lot about the financial positives in this program. That with every piece of property that's not being developed saves us money. Whatever it costs us will save us more than whatever we paid for it down the road, because the services don't have to be provided.

But, today I'm going to come up with a new twist. Yes, I finally thought of one. Homelessness prevention. When you get an area built up, you get more costs, you get more kids going to school, and costs go up. They never go down. They go up with more development. It goes down. Everybody knows ratables, ratables, ratables. But in housing, you don't really get the ratables to match up with the costs. That doesn't happen until you get commercial or mainly industrial properties will you get any kind of a balance there.

So by keeping these costs down by not developing property and raising these taxes on infrastructures, schools and as I say schools, schools and schools. Your municipal, your garbage, your sanitation, all those costs are going to go up because in time we're going to have to ship that out. And all that savings, that keeps the tax rate down and keeps people in their houses and makes it more affordable and doesn't put people out on the street, increasing the homelessness problem. So again, this is another thing that hasn't been thought about, another positive to this program. This is saving homes. This is keeping people in their homes and saving dollars.

So again, not only is there the environmental benefit, the voluntary benefit, the cost benefit in keeping homes affordable, keeping people in their homes and help prevent homelessness. There is no negative to this. I'm sure there's political people that always make up something, but I call them 'one-handed typers' on the Internet and they're always going to come up with something. But there's no negative to this. This is nothing but positive. I'm proud of the fact I live in the county that this concept was invented in. Thank you again."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Mr. Black, thank you very much. Does anyone else wish to address the Board on this? Seeing none, the Public Hearing is closed and a motion is in order."

#### T. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:27 PM, Freeholder Director Bartlett received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Now we'd like to open the meeting to public comment from the members of the Board of Directors. I'd like to call on Deputy Director Little first. Gerry?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. I would just like to briefly add to your comments about Freeholder Vicari being honored tomorrow night by the Chamber of Commerce. One thing that he has also been active in is promoting his new, several years ago, his Department of Business Development and Tourism here in Ocean County. He has been a tireless advocate for that and the importance of tourism here in the County is three point something billion dollars. Almost \$4 billion I think now and 70,000 jobs. So we do appreciate his leadership in that and, of course, he's a retired educator, for his career, and we thank him for that.

On a more serious note, we have some folks here from the Board of Social Services today who are new. We have some students, I think, here and we thank them. One of the traditions that we recognize here at this Board for the last couple of years is that we have recognized the remains of our fallen soldiers who are brought home. There is whole Defense Department POW/MIA Accounting Office, that's the Federal Government, and their sole responsibility is to go around the world and recover and identify the remains of our soldiers who have been lost, for instance, in Vietnam or Korea - even World War II veterans still - and bring them home. Many of them have been lost in the jungles. Many of them have been lost in Korea in various....their bodies were frozen. Some of them have been lost in POW camps and their remains are slowly being turned over by the governments of some of those nations that were our enemies decades ago.

In any event, we just list their names and briefly recognize them for their service. Since our last report, we have learned of the remains of, I believe, four:

United States Marine Corps Cpl. Roger Nielson from Adams, CO, who was killed on Tarawa in the Pacific Islands, a Marine, on November 20, 1943. He will be buried with full military honors on a date and location yet to be identified.

Army Cpl. Grant H. Ewing who was 28 at the time. He was recently buried on October 19th in his hometown of Fort Lupton, CO. He was with the 38th Field Artillery Battalion of the 2nd Infantry Division and he was killed in action by the Chinese in Kunu-ri, North Korea on November 25, 1950. We are bringing his remains home now.

Army Cpl. George H. Mason who was 19. He will be buried on October 20th which has now passed. So he was just buried in Byhalia, MS. Cpl. Mason was with the 2nd Reconnaissance Company of the 2nd Infantry Division and he was deployed near Chuam-ni, South Korea and his defensive line was attacked by the Chinese and they were forced to withdraw. He was reported Missing in Action on February 14, 1951. His body has been recovered.

Thirdly, Army Cpl. Robert Witt, who was 20 years old at the time, of Bellflower, CA. He was buried on October 24th. He was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 32nd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division and he was part of Task Force Faith. He was deployed at the infamous Chosin Reservoir in North Korea where we literally lost thousands of troops. He was reported Missing in Action on December 2, 1950 and he was captured by the North Koreans and he died in a North Korean POW Camp on January 31, 1951.

And lastly, Army Cpl. Robert E. Meyers, who was 21, of Greencastle, PA, right across the Delaware (River). He will be buried on October 26th in Arlington National Cemetery. He was with Company A, 2nd Engineer Combat Battalion, 2nd Infantry Division. He was declared missing on December 1, 1950 after his unit was involved in direct combat with North Korean forces at Sonchu, North Korea. His remains were found, but they have just been identified because of the new technology that we have today.

So that's kind of a tradition that we do here for our new visitors. And, speaking of the military, lastly Mr. Director, a President has never vetoed the Defense Spending Authorization Bill. The United States Senate and the United States House of Representatives have passed with both Republican and Democrat support. The \$612 billion Defense Authorization Bill has been widely reported that President Obama intends to veto that Authorization Bill. In my view, that sends a terrible message. The Bill includes, by the way, a loss of reimbursement. Freeholder Lacey and I have sons in the military so we are impacted. This will result in a loss of reimbursement for the housing. This is what is proposed - a loss in housing reimbursement for our troops. They will be paying more for their medical care. And it does include, like we are in the State, they are getting cuts and it will include a 1.3% increase in the military salary

which is below what, virtually, all of our public employees have received here. So just as a point of information, their increase is 1.3%, but it is going to be vetoed by the President. There are not enough votes in either House to override the Presidential veto. But this will be the first time that a President has vetoed, or at least if he fulfills his pledge to veto this. His reasoning is he wants to increase domestic spending. He's linking the two. But this is a separate Defense Authorization Bill. So I thought it was important to recognize this and whatever we can do here to encourage our President to sign this Defense Spending Bill because it sends the wrong message to the men and women who are protecting us. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Freeholder. Freeholder Lacey?"

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Nothing to add today."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Freeholder Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "No further comments."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Freeholder Vicari?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Yes, Mr. Director, if I may. This may take a few minutes. I have good news. As you know, we try to have economic development in Ocean County as you mentioned before. Two things are very important as far as jobs and of course, ratables in towns and helping the local economies.

In this room on Monday at 6pm at the Tourism and Business Development meeting there was a presentation made and the presentation was very good. As you know, we believe in 'home rule'. We have 33 towns in Ocean County. It's only for information, there is no business plan, but the family that owns a huge parcel of land in Little Egg Harbor on Routes 9 and 539, right near – to give you perspective where – the new Walmart is being constructed right next to it, is now talking to a company which is called 'Great Wolf Lodge'. Everyone knows it. It's a major destination point similar to, for example, Great Adventure. They're talking about an investment of about \$150 million, 400 rooms, and these are full-time jobs. Twelve months a year it's open.

One thing that attracted them to that particular area....one is, first of all, the people, the family who owns the property for many years and it is close to Atlantic City and Philadelphia and New York City and there's a population around 30 million people that will be potential customers. Not just young people, but old people. Four hundred rooms and they're talking about a convention center and they'll have something for everything.

I remember going to a meeting with the Mayor of Atlantic City and he said, 'You know? In Atlantic City you're not going to have people there seven or eight days a week.' So what they're looking for, for example, here's how it would help Atlantic City - you spend two days in Atlantic City, then perhaps there is Great Wolf Lodge or perhaps there is Long Beach Island and different other areas.

So again, it's only in preliminary stages. They want to know, first of all, if they have community support. They looked at the County Park System. They looked at the golf course. The Eagles Nest, of course, is an airport relatively close by. It's by two exits of the Garden State Parkway. So again, it's only at special stages. We spoke about the importance, of course, as to jobs. That's our main concern right now. And job training that we can do with the Workforce Investment Board. We could also do it, of course, with the Vocational School. And, of course, there's a high rate of foreclosures in that particular area which will help not only property values, but all people that are looking for jobs whether unemployed or under-employed.

So again, I'll keep the Board informed. And again, this is the first we really heard about it in discussion on Monday at a presentation that was given. So again, I have Dave McKeon, Director of Planning, that's looking to see if there are any incentives from the State of New Jersey. But we want everyone to know what we know so you know right now as of this particular time. I think, and it would be my opinion only, I think it would be a major plus for us in Ocean County. And it's not only that one that they're looking at, there are several other areas, of having some major franchise come into Ocean County, especially in that one particular area, which I was surprised by. But if you look at the geographical location and you look at the towns and workforce – that was something else that they mentioned – which is very, very important. And the location because it's right in the middle of where we have a lot of Natural Lands there and we have a lot of great potential in Ocean County.

So again, right now in Ocean County, our Tourism is \$4.3 billion. My goal is to someday have that at \$5 billion. Just in Ocean County. Right now, today, there are about 70,000 people that have been employed in the tourist industry. After the Superstorm, it's coming back each and every year, stronger than before. We're number three in the State of New Jersey. First, of course, is Atlantic City. Then Cape May and, of course, it's Ocean County. So again, whenever I know, it's only preliminary. It's a great vision they have. We are very thankful that people think there's still a lot of opportunities that can be had in Ocean County. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Freeholder."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5) minutes** per speaker.

At 4:40 PM, Freeholder Director Bartlett received the following comments from members of the public:

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "I would like to now open the meeting to public comment, general comment, anything you may wish to say or ask or whatever, the Board of Freeholders. I would ask you to confine yourself to five minutes and I am now looking for hands. Mr. Brigham. You've been a guest here before and we welcome you back."

MINISTER STEVEN BRIGHAM, CITIZEN OF AMERICA: "It was April 19th, 1775, that a rider rode into the farm of Capt. Edmund Brigham in Westboro about 30 miles outside of Cambridge or outside of Concorde and Lexington. The rider said that the British had fired upon the men of Lexington and Concorde and that men had been killed.

Capt. Edmund Brigham is a direct forefather of mine. He mustered his 30-plus Minutemen under his charge and marched all night long in pursuit of the British back to Boston. He was part of the siege in Boston thereafter. And in the next six assuming years of the Revolutionary War, 117 Brighams fought on the side of the Patriots, fighting against the British until they surrendered at Yorketown. In fact, Paul Brigham fought right here at the Battle of Monmouth. He was part of the artillery group fighting against the British there on that very hot day. So, needless to say, I've got a lot of pride in America and what our Founding Fathers did to set a better Constitution than the world has ever seen before.

The reason or the way I came to this area is my father. I was born in Grand Rapids, Michigan. My father was transferred from Grand Rapids, Michigan to New York City for his job. And he was looking along the shore here and they decided to settle in Lakewood. After a little while, they asked if I wanted to go to a private school and I said, 'No. I like the diversity of the Lakewood School system. I would like to stay in the public schools.' And I did. And I graduated from Lakewood High School.

From what I've seen over the years.....just this morning I got a text from one of the homeless people. They said, 'Minister Steve, the police came down into our little camp, our little hideaway camp, and they gave us a ticket and they said we've got to be out by the morning.' Well, of course, we know the cold weather is coming upon us and homelessness has been outlawed in Lakewood, New Jersey. I know the County spends a lot of money on social programs and projects and, of course, money doesn't always equate to quality or efficiency.

But, somebody went to New York City the other day and they said, 'We've got homeless people lining the streets in New York City.' In fact, they took 50 bag lunches up to New York City. They could only cover one half of one block with 50 bags in the lower east side I believe it was. So what's happening is we've got counties, we've got townships, that are making laws against homelessness and trying to ostracize and marginalize our homeless citizens and they are being forced to the cities, to the urban centers and they're being overburdened. Over packed. I don't see an equal distribution of the responsibilities of taking care of the poor within our society. We want to be this nice suburban utopia here, here in Ocean County, which is nice. You know you've got a nice place to go and to live by the ocean, by the beach, by the shore.

But again, everybody, is part of our society. Every society is going to have a cross-section of people with mental illness, with addictions, that's just society. And so every society must take a responsibility for caring for those people in our society. And so I think since Atlantic City Rescue Mission doesn't take anybody from outside of Atlantic County any more, somebody from Ocean County cannot go to the Atlantic City Rescue Mission tonight and get a room. They have to go to the Board of Atlantic County Social Services to get into the Mission. And if you don't live in Atlantic County, you cannot get into the Atlantic City Rescue Mission. That option has been closed for the homeless of Ocean County.

The options for the homeless of this County are becoming fewer and fewer. And again, these are people that are going into another winter. They're going to be suffering. They're real people like you and me that feel pain that suffer. And we really need to do something. We need to bear our portion of the burden a little bit better instead of forcing everybody to the urban centers. And again, in Lakewood, I've seen the changes. And of course, this Board receiving CDBG monies, HUD monies, has a responsibility to affirmatively further their housing. You're to see that housing is fair in this County because you receive HUD money, you receive Federal money. It's a responsibility of this Board to make sure.

There's over 200, over 200, segregated developments in Lakewood, New Jersey. The white population in Lakewood has grown over the last 10 years by over 40,000 people. The white population. The African American population has decreased by thousands. We've got a gentrification in Lakewood being funded by tax dollars. It's not right, it's unethical, it's un-American, it's unconstitutional, it's illegal, and this Board has a responsibility to the population of Lakewood to ensure that fair housing is being properly implemented. It's the responsibility of this Board. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Brigham. Does anyone else wish to talk on this issue since Mr. Brigham has raised it? Yes sir. If you would please give us your name and address we'd like to hear from you."

ABRAHAM ABDULLAH, HOMELESS IN LAKEWOOD: "I have seen my city become decimated by desegregation, segregation and racism in my city. And there's a problem and an epidemic. There's a homeless problem that has been developed and it's increasing in my city. Very few people, that I see as my people, we have

been displaced and moved out of our town for certain special interests. That is not right and that's not fair. Our representatives here have a responsibility to oversee what is going on in our cities. What's happening in Lakewood is a travesty. It has been decimated, desecrated by the certain special interests. So, therefore, we are going to keep on screaming. We're going to keep on coming until something gets done. Thank you for your time."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you sir. Does anyone else wish to address this particular issue that has been raised. Freeholder Little has indicated that he is our liaison to the Board of Social Services and I think has a few comments on this."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Well, you have made a lot of allegations. We are not going to address what happens in municipalities. We are here to serve the County. On any given night the people that we fund through the Board of Social Services, the folks at your back behind you, and all the private agencies that we fund which I will read in a minute, we are sheltering 3,155 individuals and their families every night. We have, just for the record, St. Stephens, Samaritan House, Harbor House, Interfaith Hospitality Network, Family Promise, House of Hope, King of Kings, Salvation Army, Vetwork and Providence House that all provide shelter to the homeless in one fashion or another. And, by the way, we are funding all of those to some degree.

On any given night, in addition to the 3,150 or so - it changes, of course - we have 89,587 (the last number I have) Medicaid recipients. We have 64,000 Food Stamp recipients. About 3200 TANF recipients. And almost 1000 on General Assistance. And with those programs, in and of itself, the taxpayers of this County and the United States of America are funding roughly \$750 million for those programs alone through that Board of Social Services, through the hard work that they do.

This Board is spending approximately \$18,386,507.00, to be exact, on services to prevent homelessness or assist those person who are homeless. That's in addition to what the Board of Social Services provide. \$10,115,000.00 on the prevention and for permanent housing services including temporary rental assistance, rent subsidies, back rent, back mortgage and security deposits for those folks who need an apartment to rent. The taxpayers are funding those. And we also spent \$7.9 million on temporary shelter.

So to indicate that this County or other counties do not provide funding, I think we do a yeoman's job in providing funding for those who need help here in Ocean County, to the best of our ability. I would compare that with the efforts of any other county in the state. And we're very proud of our Board of Social Services. We are proud of the nonprofit agencies that we work with including many others that I didn't even mention. Dottie's House, Valentine House, the Foodbank of Ocean & Monmouth County. This Board provides hundreds of thousands of dollars in funding for them. We have a Code Blue Emergency System. We're funding Samaritan House. The church of King of Kings, St. Francis Center, you name it. The Stafford Interfaith Health Agency, House of Hope, Vetwork, Homes for All, Ocean Hunger Relief. We just approved funding for O.C.E.A.N., Inc. to begin their process of an innovative program. So we are funding all of those programs. While we appreciate your concerns and we thank you, those are our programs, and we believe they are among the finest in the State. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Freeholder for that report. I know you have stayed on top of this issue, which is a troubling issue, but I think you made a very good presentation on what the County is doing and the amount of funds being expended in those areas. Would anyone else wish to address the Board? Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "First of all what I do is, it's turning into a tradition, I try to catch the last meeting before the election to say thank you. The work you've done in this County is second to none. You are the model of what government should be. And I don't get anything from it. The only thing I've ever gotten is things that are part of the job. Recently you.....actually, it's been about a year or so now, you prevented me from being homeless by helping to get water restored in my community. Thank you very much. I know that was you guys. You know other people tried to take credit for it, but I know it was you and thank you again.

By keeping costs down and providing the services that you have to provide at the most efficient method possible and balancing the cost of services to the amount of services, people can run to government for solutions to every little thing, but what will happen is you will no longer have a government you can afford. People are being driven out of their homes every day by taxes. You have kept expenditures down. Look at Sandy. Even though it's a few years back, I would have been out of a job probably because the community I work for.....and you all know I work for a municipality, would have gone under because there is no way in hell my town could have come up with the money to start with the cleanup until the FEMA money finally, I guess, clip-clopped back into the area. And that's because of your financial policies. You were able to have the capital available to lay out to save the very existence of these towns. You even helped the town I live in, yeah, it's in Jackson and it's the middle of the woods, we didn't have too much ocean flooding... I think one of the reasons I moved to Jackson is I did grow up in a shore community. I'd seen the ocean and yeah, Jackson looked a little better.

Frankly, the people running against you always said the same thing. You know, 'You're keeping too much in surplus. Spend on this. Spend on that. Give this back.' Well, if that happened, all of Ocean County would be under and we would have been like the situation in '62 where we went through most of the decade of the '60's cleaning up after it. Look how far the cleanup is from Sandy. You guys deserve the credit for that because the towns didn't have the money to deal with it. They freaked. They didn't know what to do. You did and you saved us. And that's something I'll never forget and nobody in this town should forget.

I want to touch on a couple of other things real quick. I'm going to sound a little bit like a auctioneer because I'm

going to shove a lot into 5 minutes. A news organization I generally don't like.....no not him, relax.......the other one, the Patch who I have attacked here. They've incited me. But they did something good to my shock and amazement, but they did something good. They took the Megan's Law list and combined it with one of the Mapquest things, whatever it was called, and they printed a thing in several towns spotting where sex offenders live. Especially coming up to Halloween where kids are going to be going door to door. The only thing I heard against it was on News 12 they had a convicted sex offender, a tier two, who by the way only got a few months for raping somebody, and I couldn't help noticing that his house was decorated for Halloween. I guess to attract prey. That might be what he was doing. But he said, 'Actually you're harassing me.' Well, good, your ass shouldn't be out in the first place. You should still be in.

One thing more quick that also got brought up a little bit tonight, and again I'm sounding like an auctioneer, living in Jackson and I hope I didn't hear what I thought I heard tonight because if I did I am extremely aggravated. In my town there has been an extreme racism issue, not racism, more religious hatred of the Jewish people and pointing at Lakewood a lot and saying, 'Well if they move in our town, our town will look like Lakewood.' Well, being born and raised in Ocean County, there's been Hasidic Jews in Lakewood ever since I've been born. The situation in Lakewood has deteriorated in comparably recent times. I believe that has a lot to do with people that have been put into office of a certain party recently and comparably recent times. Again, I'm saying it's (inaudible) to make sense. If one group is saying, 'Well one race is getting pushed out between another.' Well that's racism. Racism is racism. Hate is hate. I don't give a rats ass who it is. It's wrong. Okay. Again, that was a little too fast and almost not makes sense, but I think you followed it and that's all that's important right now. Thank you."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Black. Does anyone else wish to address the Board? Yes ma'am. If you would, give us your name and address."

ELLEN DUVALL, LACEY TOWNSHIP: "I just have a question for the Freeholder Board. I know your meeting times and locations have been set for years. Has there been any recent talk as to possibly moving the time so that they are later so that more of the public that is at work can come hear the issues, comment on the issues, and so that these meetings are open more to the public that elect you to these positions? Because I think there are a lot of issues that more people would like to have the opportunity to speak to you on."

DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "That's a very interesting question that we have wrestled with for as long as I've been here and that's somewhat over 30 years. If we were to hold a meeting at night, which we have at various times in the past, we get complaints that we are conflicting with some other towns' meetings and that those people, therefore, can't attend ours. We then tried moving our meetings around the County to say, 'Well, let's go out on a, if you will, road show.' And I distinctly remember someone saying when we were in Eagleswood......well, I won't repeat it completely.....but 'Where the heck?' and she didn't say heck, 'is Eagleswood?' They thought we were trying to hide the meeting so the public couldn't show up.

There is no perfect time to, and the second part about evening meetings is, that many of the seniors in Ocean County will not drive at night. And so, we have decided that the best place for the County Board of Freeholders to hold the meeting is in this room where everyone knows where it's at who wishes to attend. When there is an important issue, people are here. We understand that some people cannot make it at this time, but there are times that any time you might hold it, there are people who cannot make it. It is a gordian knot. Is that the right word? There is no good solution to the issue. But as it stands now, we do not conflict with any other town, with any other Board of Adjustment, with any other Planning Board, with any other School Board....I forgot that....okay. And we are unique at this time. It may be inconvenient for some people. It may be convenient for others. There is just no perfect solution and we have tried different ones. I hope that answers at least our rationale for why that meeting is held at this time.

Would anyone else like to address the Board? Going once, going twice.....a motion is in order to adjourn."

There being no additional comments received, Freeholder Director Bartlett adjourned the meeting at 5:01 PM.

#### **ORDINANCE #2015-27**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS AND OTHER RELATED EXPENSES IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF OCEAN AND APPROPRIATING \$750,000 THEREFOR, AND **PROVIDING** FOR ISSUANCE OF \$750,000 IN GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS OR NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond Section 1. ordinance are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "County") as general improvements. No down payment is required in connection with the authorization of bonds and notes pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c) as this bond ordinance involves a project funded by the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust.

In order to finance the cost of the improvements or purposes provided for Section 2. hereunder, negotiable bonds or notes are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$750,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds or notes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which Section 3. (a) the bonds or notes are to be issued is to install a new manufactured treatment device (MTD) to be located immediately upstream of various outfalls along the north side of the Toms River and Barnegat Bay for the purpose of removing total suspended solids, floatables, and other pollutant loadings from stormwater runoff prior to entering the nearby lagoons, the installation of which will involve new piping to redirect and combine outfalls (Project No. S344080-04), and including all work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto.
- The maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvement or (b) purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes is equal to the amount of the (c) appropriation herein made therefor.

All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as Section 4. may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than

one year from its date, or such longer period as may be permitted under N.J.S.A. 58-11B-9.e.

The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by

the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection

with notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon

the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder

may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1 and N.J.S.A.

58-11B-9.e. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from

time to time, at not less than par and accrued interest, at public or private sale and to deliver them

to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest

from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in

writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery

of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the

description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and

the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget (or temporary capital budget as applicable) of the

County is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of

any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the

resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the

amended capital budget (or amended temporary capital budget as applicable) and capital

program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file

with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited

and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are

not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as

general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on

property specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations

of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of bonds

authorized by this bond ordinance, is 30 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly

prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, and a complete

executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such

statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased

by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$750,000, and the

obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$250,000 for items of expense listed in and

permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the

improvement or purpose.

(e) The County reasonably expects to commence the acquisition and/or construction

of the improvements or purpose described in Section 3 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of

the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such

costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from

the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not

to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is

intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.

Section 7. Any grant moneys received for the purposes described in Section 3 hereof

shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the

obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized

hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the County is hereby pledged to the punctual

payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance.

The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be

obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the

payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 9. After passage upon first reading of this bond ordinance, the Clerk of the

Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the bond ordinance,

together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING BOND

ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a

newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public

hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after

introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed

to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the

provision of copies of this bond ordinance.

WHEREAS, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Chosen Freeholders to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Chosen Freeholders; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the property identified as Block 296, Lot 3.03, totaling approximately 1.17 acres located on Route 9 in Stafford Township; and

WHEREAS, the property is located adjacent to approximately 153 acres of County Natural Lands Trust Fund property and within the Route 9 corridor of Stafford Township which has been targeted for preservation by the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee in order to buffer the adjacent US Fish & Wildlife Service, Edwin B. Forsythe Refuge from the development of Route 9; and

WHEREAS, a professional appraisal has been completed to establish the fair market value of the property; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean would acquire the property for an amount not to exceed \$89,000; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed acquisition was conducted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders on October 21, 2015 as required by PL 1997, c24.
