A. Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on September 21, 2016 at 4:01 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Kelly presiding. Members Vicari, Haines and Little were present at the call of the roll. Freeholder Bartlett entered the meeting at 4:02 PM.

John P. Kelly, Freeholder Director, read the following statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Jim Hyres, our County Architect for very many years passed away this week. In lieu of the prayer that we usually do at this time, I ask everyone for just one moment of silence in reflection of Jim Hyres life. Thank you."

F. Comments from the Director

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We're going to open up today's meeting, instead of going right to the formal agenda, with a discussion about Saturday morning. As we all know, on Saturday morning, a bright and sunny day, hundreds of people into the thousands gathered in Seaside Park to participate in an enjoyable 5k charity run. At that time, few would have thought the event would be disrupted by an explosive device in a garbage pail which discharged about 9:35 a.m. in the area of Ocean Avenue.

The device was timed to go off while the runners were going by this garbage pail, but that was disrupted, fortunately, as the run had been delayed. So no one was hurt and there were no casualties which we are happy about that. But, this explosion – the first of several incidents across New Jersey and New York - showed that no one is immune from acts of terrorism or from the threat of terrorism.

We are lucky in Ocean County. Our Ocean County law enforcement agencies quickly mobilized to provide whatever assistance was necessary to Seaside Park and to the residents of Ocean County. The borough received our immediate support.

Following the discharge of this explosive device, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Arson Unit immediately responded to the scene that was headed by the Sheriff's Department CSI, K-9s and mobile command unit. The priority was keeping everyone in that area safe.

The officers worked side by side with Federal, State and local authorities to first and foremost insure public safety. Everyone, especially our citizens, benefit from this kind of cooperation and partnership.

I'm going to turn this discussion over to the Sheriff very quickly, but I want to extend my appreciation and, in fact, the appreciation of the entire Board of Freeholders to every law enforcement organization and emergency responder who was at the scene that day and to all those who provide assistance and help 24 hours a day/7 days a week to our residents and visitors. I want to especially thank our Sheriff, Mike Mastronardy and his staff

and Prosecutor Joe Coronato and his staff for their prompt and professional response to this event.

It's these types of situations that heighten the importance of each of us becoming more vigilant of our surroundings and to follow the words 'if you see something suspicious say something to authorities'.

I want to emphasize that Ocean County is and will continue to be a safe county. We cannot and should not let the threat of violence, the threat of terrorism, discourage us from enjoying all the great attributes of this County. It is the finest county in the State of New Jersey.

And while in today's environment of growing threats nothing is guaranteed 100 percent, this Board of Freeholders, with our law enforcement personnel, will continue to do everything to keep our residents and visitors safe and secure.

I'm going to ask for comments right now from the Sheriff, then I'm going to ask comments from the Board and then if there is a question or two, we'll take it from the audience. So Sheriff, if you would."

SHERIFF MICHAEL MASTRONARDY: "Thank you Freeholder. The events that transpired over the weekend – I happened to be in the courthouse signing, actually, Sheriff Sales and when I looked over at the CAD System (Computer Aided Dispatch) and saw 'bomb call' I didn't quite comprehend what was going to transcend after that. But at that point, I called the 911 Center and they said, 'Yes, they just had an explosive device go off.'

We did have four officers assigned to assist Seaside Park at the time. One, Sergeant Groesch was a block away. He relates that he thought it was the cannon going off for the start of the run initially and then realized suddenly that it was some type of device placed in the trash can.

In responding to the scene, we already mobilized our Mobile Command, our EMS Coordinators, and our Fire Coordinators. I actually was stuck on the Seaside Heights bridge because it was not a good time when the bridge went up. So you're sitting there with your lights activated with no place to go to get over, so it was a little frustrating, but I still was able to respond over there within 12 minutes of the initial explosion.

On scene I met with Chief Larkin. His Detective Bonner did an excellent job in shutting down the race immediately in the interest of public safety. I can't give him enough accolades for his response. Our Mobile Command was the command post. And then there's the investigation, the robust investigation. As it progressed we had the State Police Bomb Squad, then the ATF and then actually the FBI. We assisted them in the initial part and our initial phase was response to Seaside Park. We had 20 officers on scene within the first hour which assisted them in the evacuations that had to be encountered. And, I will say, that we have made a lot of inroads in the transformation of the Sheriff's Office and we're better prepared. And as we met with Freeholders the other day, I think we continue to have the equipment, the resources and the training to handle any type of event in this County.

And I assure the residents, working with the Police Chiefs and obviously we monitor every event. We have a couple coming up this week. We have a couple next week. We will be there in each community throughout, whether it be the Duck & Decoy Show or the Greek Festival this weekend, but I have so many running through my mind. We're about a month out. All the Chiefs are calling up, 'Do you have a bomb dog?' So we will be out there. I just met with Lieutenant Adams in charge of the canines. He does a phenomenal job with these canines. They are an asset to us. We belong to the 'Safe and Render Program' with the State Police.

But, I just think the cooperation of not only of all the EMS workers, the fire responders and also the law enforcement officers that all came together over the weekend, I think really we have a lot of cooperation from the public. So I thank them the most because that's our goal at the end of day, to make everybody safe."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Sheriff. We have ongoing training exercises throughout the County, throughout the year to coordinate with all the municipalities and even the State agencies above us and those types of things. We're now using Saturday's event as a training exercise. We're reviewing what happened that day, what happened very positively and where we need to buffer what we do. One of the things we've talked about, and the Sheriff just talked about, the K-9 unit is adding some dogs to the Sheriff's K-9 unit as well as we're looking at manpower needs within the Sheriff's Department and it looks like it's time that we're going to add Sheriff's Officers for these special duties outside of the statutory responsibility to secure the courts. There are so many other needs today and the Sheriff has been doing an outstanding job in doing these other duties. You know, we're talking right now about Saturday and I don't want to go too far off, but the other major thing that we're looking at in this County is fighting the drug epidemic. And the Sheriff has been involved with the Prosecutor and others make sure that we continue that fight to secure our County also from that scourge.

But, very importantly, what I want to say is we're looking at what happened on Saturday, looking at what we can now do even better so that we're making something positive out of a very negative situation. I will accept any comments right now from the Board of Freeholders before I open it up for any questions from the public. Freeholders? Anyone?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Yes, Mr. Director, if I may. As you know, I live close to the area and I'm involved with many people in the area, especially there's citizens that go there in the tourist industry. We have a population of 580,000 people in the winter and sometimes, with different activities, 1.3 million. So it's a big increase. And the message has to go loud and clear that we will not be threatened by terrorists. We want people to enjoy the quality of life. We want people to go there if they want a job or they want to take a bicycle ride or take a walk on the beach, even want to walk with their grandchildren. We're not going to be intimidated.

But, I attended the Mayors' Association meeting on Monday and I want to commend the Mayors for the participation. They mentioned this many, many times and most of the Mayors were there and they spoke about not only cooperation with different police departments and sharing their resources, but having a lead agency. In many areas you have sometimes jurisdictional disputes. 'Well, this is my territory. This is your territory.' We all realized that there was only one thing to do and that was with the Federal agencies because the resources they have not only just in Seaside Park and Ocean County, throughout the State of New Jersey and the United States. And the Mayors realized at that time that the Federal agencies were those that were really conducting. They were the lead agency in this entire thing. And it proved to be true because of where it took place not only in Linden, but besides that.

So going over what we said, tourism is not just ten weeks, it is twelve months a year and there are many different activities that are going to be taking place – parades – the Halloween Parade, the Columbus Day Parade and different activities, but we have hundreds of thousands of people that will come to Ocean County over the next several weeks and we want everyone to feel that don't be threatened by terrorism. Don't stay home. They will win. And they're not going to win in Ocean County because of what the Director just said and also what the Sheriff just said, and working with the Prosecutor, it's because we are extremely well trained, we have the resources. They're prepared. They're very professional. And they know, with their training, what has to be done. But I think the most important thing right now is that citizens have to be vigilant, they have to be prepared, and I think (inaudible) from New York City that happened – if you see something, say something and just pick up the phone and 911 they're there. They're prepared at the Communications Center. Everyone knows what has to be done.

And even the students that are here today, you're going to be growing up in a society that is totally different, I was talking to several Freeholders before the meeting, than we grew up in. And it's different. It's changed. And you're going to be part of the process in preparing for what has to be done in the United States.

The situation we have, and I digress a little bit, in the United States, in my opinion Americans are very good people. They're friendly people, they're compassionate people and different cultures sometimes may take advantage of us. When I grew up, fortunately for me and many of the Freeholders up here, it's a different paradigm right now, different standards. And the high school students, you know, when you go back and talk about it, but as you go through college and different schools you're going to see because you're going to have to be dealing with it. There's no question about it. It's here. Everyone is involved and we're all on the same page. It's not politics or anything else. How do we protect the American people? How do we protect our lifestyle? But, I think the most important thing is how do we protect the freedoms that we have right now in our democracy? And that's why we're talking together today and why we're all talking on the same page is that they younger people today, especially the high school students that are here today, are going to be involved in one of the most important processes in your lifetime. Probably more important than when I grew up - I was one of the 'baby boomers' at that time after World War II - is that it's global what's taking place today. And we're going to have to address it. There's nothing more important than the safety of our people and your families and that's what this Board is bound to do is to make sure we do everything necessary to protect the safety and our lifestyle. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Freeholder. Any other Freeholders going to comment?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, the day of the event I was fortunate enough to be able to talk to you on the phone and I think it's important for the public to know that the financial resources of the County will certainly be available to meet whatever threats the Sheriff and you, as Director of Law and Public Safety, think we need to do it. The most important job of government is to protect its citizens and I just want everyone to understand that we have the financial capacity, without a doubt, and the will, without a doubt, to put the resources that are necessary in place when they are determined to be needed to do that job.

I think it's a fantastic communications system that you have built over the years, Mr. Director. Again, when you get into an emergency like this that emergency communications system is all important and you have that in place with towers throughout the County without dead spots. But, where we need more assets I just want to tell you from the finance viewpoint they certainly can be and will be available as far as I'm concerned. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Freeholder and I did appreciate that phone call. We're only five days away from when the incident happened and we've already had some meetings regarding what is necessary, where it should be investments should be made, what will be the strongest investment to protect this County community and we will do that. Freeholder Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. I just want to personally thank the law enforcement community, especially our Sheriff and local law enforcement and most importantly also the Federal agents and everyone that were there because as you can see, because of the tools that they have working with all the different departments they were able to apprehend the suspect that went and did the bombing up in northern New Jersey and in New York.

So I think we're very grateful in the United States to have the people that we have running our law enforcement agencies that we as Americans, we are not going to let these terrorists go and try to stop our lives, to make us that we're going to be afraid. As we've always said 'when you see something, you say something'. I have done this actually when I was in Cleveland. It was a backpack that was left someplace in one of the parks in Cleveland, not knowing and watching to see if anyone was going to it. They didn't. I spoke to police officers. I went and told them. I have no idea if it was anything or not, but as citizens it is necessary for us to take that precaution whenever we see something. It is very important because you never know if it's going to be something. Because the individuals in New York that saw that backpack or in Elizabeth or Linden, I think it was, that they were going and really looking for the

items that were inside of it and it turned out that it was the bomb so that they were able then to report that. So that was one thing that was stopped.

But, it's important, as all of us have said, for each one of us to be very cautious out there. When you see something, do something, but also to remember that we are a strong nation. We are a strong people and that we will always be coming out on top because we are Americans. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "In this very incident, 'see something, say something' became very important in north Jersey where somebody saw this guy sleeping inside of a little alcove by one of the stores and did let the police know and that happened to be the suspect in this case and they arrested him andeverybody has been watching the same news I am, so I won't go further than that. Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. One of the most important things for me is to thank our Sheriff and all of our first responders. We kind of.....the media is full of articles and news that diminishes our law enforcement community – tries to tear them down. Not here in Ocean County. We are very proud of our law enforcement community, we are proud of our first responders, our Sheriff's Department, and all of our local departments. And when people need help they are they are the men and the women who run to the sound of the call for help. They're the ones that respond to this danger and protect us. And I heard some very interesting anecdotes about our folks responding over there and they all came. They all responded when we needed help.

I also want to thank our Administrator and all our staff – everybody was kind of on duty, if you will, and ready to respond if we needed including our Health Department. We have our medical reserve team for emergency response. They were all on call if they were needed. Thank goodness they weren't. Everybody was on call. So it's a team effort here. It's what we all strive for. It's something that the Sheriff, our Emergency Management Department, and a lot of it under Freeholder Kelly. All year round they train for these types of things and they're ready to respond. So, thankfully it turned out without any injuries or, most importantly, without any deaths or injuries.

But, our first responders and it's the same way with our military – they're out there. Most of us don't think about them until there is an incident like this and we thank all of them who lay their lives on the line every single day to protect our families and all of us here in Ocean County and across our nation. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Sheriff, do you mind talking a little bit about the Seaside Park Officer who called this incident in so professionally?"

SHERIFF MICHAEL MASTRONARDY: "Yes. We only received one 911 call because we were on scene. Our Sergeant called in and it was Detective Bonner who really, as I said before, we all should be proud of him and I told the Mayor that in Seaside Park and his Chief. He really took control and canceled the run, got everybody to safety and out of the way. So he really deserves our praise.

We actually sat down with the Chief and our immediate staff and reviewed the incident to see what we could improve upon and, quite frankly, I think everybody was quite comfortable with our response from the County level. Remember, we were not part of the investigative process, only to assist the Federal partners which we did and we continue to do so. However, I will say that our initial response which is to stabilize the situation, conduct evacuation, traffic control – all those were done professionally and in a timely fashion."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. Freeholder Bartlett just reminded me of the conference call I had with the Mayor of Seaside Park to make sure he realized that we are there to do anything we can to assist as we go through this investigation and that the County is a partner with Seaside Park. They're not in this by themselves. But, one thing we are instructed today is to not talk about the investigation as the Prosecutor was telling me all the stuff that we're not allowed to release. I said, 'Well that's all interesting, but don't you ever watch the news? Because everything you just told me is no secret to me. All you have to do is watch CNN or Fox News or whoever you watch at night, any of the cable, they're all over this story.' And everything that I've been told I've already been told by Bill O'Reilly. So it's an interesting thing.

Now we're going to do something we don't generally do right here in the middle of the meeting. I will accept any questions while I do have the Sheriff here. If anyone has a question that we can answer, and there may be a number of questions that we just have to say we're not allowed to talk about that, but any questions at all? Seeing none, Sheriff, you're welcome to stay as long as you want but you're also welcome to go to work."

SHERIFF MASTRONARDY: "I'll return to my normal seat. And I will just make one comment. While I was sitting on the bridge, when the bridge was up, was when the primary phone call from the Chief in Seaside Park was to our Administrator who kept informed and kept updating, and we were in contact all day long. So thank you Administrator."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. I was also instructed by our Clerk of the Board that my attempt to start the comments on the incident I forgot to read the Statement of Compliance. So I'm going to read that."

Director Kelly reads the Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We will now move on to a Special Presentation."

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Director. We do have a Special Presentation today that's not on the agenda and this will be presented by Freeholder Haines and I will turn it over to you, Freeholder."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you. We are very, very fortunate that our Ocean County Transportation Department got an award. They received it from the New Jersey Council on Special Transportation. It's the '2016 Outstanding Transportation System of the Year' presented to the Ocean County Department of Transportation by the New Jersey Council on Special Transportation in grateful appreciation for exceptional performance.

We last won this award in 2007. And the Transportation Department was selected by a third-party, independent transportation professionals. They reviewed all of the nominees and they selected Ocean County Department of Transportation, which of course all of us on the Freeholder Board are extremely proud of and I can't thank Dave Fitzgerald who is the Director of it, but most importantly besides Dave, the employees. The drivers who really interact with probably more than 500 County residents on a daily basis, more than any other department might interact with during the course of any day. And it's the drivers that interact with all of these individuals that made it possible that our Department of Transportation received this award. So Dave if you'd like to just come up and we'll present this a second time to you.

I just happened to be at their conference last Friday when they got the award and we had our pictures taken then, but I did want the Freeholder Board to be here. So I don't know if Freeholder Kelly would like to come up.

As has been said by the Director, we are the premier County in the State of New Jersey and this just continues to solidify how great Ocean County is not only in tourism, transportation, the Sheriff's Department, but all departments."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Congratulations on winning."

DAVID FITZGERALD, DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION: "None of this is possible without unparalleled support of this Board. They just make it all possible and we are the envy of the other 20 counties out there. So thank you."

K. BID AWARDS

CLERK VASIL: "We have Bid Awards, Items K-1, 2 and 3."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Before we move on to the vote, I have asked the Administrator to discuss and I 'd like to, especially because our students are here, is how do we do the process for motions, J-2, and then under Bid Awards, awarding all the contracts that are there. So if you'll talk a little bit about the process that we use."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "Yes Freeholder, in general, the term you hear a lot is 'competitive process'. There's a competitive process for all of our items – goods and services – that are used. They come in different forms.

The Motions on J-2 are either RFQ's, RFP's or Competitive Contracts – Request For Proposal or Request For Qualifications. The Freeholders have made it clear that they want to make sure that everything is done through a competitive process. There's an internal committee chaired by myself and we hear each Department Head request first before it goes out for a service or goods, a project, and we go over the way it will meet all the legal qualifications and (decide) which will be best – an RFQ, an RFP, the timing of it – there are a lot of restrictions on the process. I don't want to bore anyone too much on that. And those projects show up here as a Motion to allow them to go out.

There is then a second portion when they come back. They are competitively rated and then a summary and the Department Head then comes back to the committee and submits their recommendation. If the committee agrees with it, we'll go over it to make sure there were no errors in its view, and then we'll make a recommendation to the Board.

The award of the RFP, RFQ or Competitive Contract can only be voted on and given by the Board of Freeholders, but they are not part of the process of selecting them. So there is a bit of separation granted because then therefore whatever they're voting on is a recommendation that's come both from the department, its scoring committee and its review committee.

The Bids are slightly different. Again, the projects are permitted by the Board by funding a project or funding a budget appropriation, whichever the case may be, but there's a more formal process that goes out. We have a Bid Portal run by our Procurement (Purchasing) Department. Anybody can bid on a project. They are set by State guidelines. They're received in this very room usually about 11:00 am on Tuesday or Wednesday. They then are opened and again, reviewed, and come directly here.

Each process is outlined in State law and we must certify thusly. There is a protest period as well. If a bidder disagrees they have the right to object, a formal process. Obviously most of them are pretty cut and dry. The process has been in place for at least the entire six years I've been Administrator and I know it started even before that. The staff, especially, is very aware of the responsibility that's being given to give these recommendations and they pay particular attention to make sure that every care is given to make sure it's fair, it's open and it is the best that can be done for the County and for the taxpayers of the County."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Now if you guys can explain all of that in a report, I can guarantee you'll get an A. Okay, we'll move forward."

On the T-shirts it listed the different people that supported it and it said 'Ocean County Employees' on the T-shirts 'support Hope Sheds Light' which is a very, very worthwhile walk and cause because it is something that has been established to try and fight and to raise the awareness of people of all ages, not just young people, with regards to the drug problem that we have.

It was a very warm day and we had three great speakers that spoke that morning. But it was really, really nice to see the County employees that did show up and of course, the Sheriff's Officers were there also - not walking, but they were there to make sure things ran smoothly and there were no problems. I just want to thank all of the employees

and walkers that walked with the Ocean County Employee group. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Freeholder. Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. Especially for our young people here, one of the traditions that we've kind of embarked upon here in recent years because Ocean County is the home of the largest number of veterans anywhere in the State of New Jersey, we recognize our veterans and we do everything we can to provide the best possible services for them and programs through our Veterans Service Bureau. And as part of that recognition, the United States, your country, is actively involved in traveling all around the world and recovering the remains of our Soldiers and Sailors and Airmen and Marines who have been lost in battle, in combat, in former POW camps around the world and bringing them home for burial.

There is a Federal agency called the POW/MIA Accounting Agency within the Department of Defense who is responsible for doing this. So periodically I receive a report on recent remains that have been returned home to the United States and we read them into the record to memorialize their memory and to remember these Soldiers. And it's important. Last week, most of us don't think about it, but last week was National POW/MIA Recognition Day. And we still have, believe it or not, 83,000 Americans are still lost on the battlefields around the world and have yet to be returned home. They estimate there are still 83,000 Americans who were lost in wars and we still don't have their bodies at home. So this week we have:

Marine Pvt. Emmett Kines, who was 24. He was buried on September 19th in his hometown of Grafton, West Virginia. In 1943, he was with the 2nd Marine Division that landed against stiff Japanese resistance on the small island Betio in Tarawa (Atoll) in the Gilbert Islands. After several days of intense fighting, approximately 1,000 Marines were killed in action and more than 2,000 were wounded, but the Japanese on Tarawa were totally annihilated by the American Marines. He was killed on the first day of the battle, November 20, 1943 and he was brought home last week.

Army Cpl. Wayne Minard of Sedgwick Kansas who was 20 at the time. He was with the Company C, 1st Battalion, 2nd Infantry Division of the United States Army fighting action in Kunu-ri, North Korea. Of course, this was the Korean War. He was reported missing on November 26, 1950 and his body was found and recovered and brought home this week.

Army Cpl. David Nordin, Jr. who was 21, of Los Angeles, was with the 3rd Battalion, 25th Infantry Division and he was in Unsan, North Korea. He was reported missing on November 28, 1950 and he was captured by the North Koreans and died in a North Korean POW camp. His body was buried in a mass grave at the POW camp and he was returned in September.

Army Sgt. 1st Class Louis Baxter who was 25, was a member of the 31st Regimental Combat Team, 7th Infantry Division at the Chosin Reservoir which was one of the most brutal and vicious battles of the Korean War. His unit was in a fighting withdrawal southward. He was declared missing in action on December 6, 1950 and he was returned last month as well.

Army Cpl. Joseph Trepasso who was 20 years old at the time, of Fulton, New York. He was with the 7th Infantry Division also at the Chosin Reservoir. He was declared missing on December 12, 1950 and his remains were returned last week.

Army Pfc. Kenneth Miller who was 20 at the time, was with the 24th Infantry Division in North Korea. He was reported missing on April 23, 1951 and his remains are home now finally.

We remember all of those great Soldiers and thank them and their families for their service and we offer our prayers to them. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. And I just want to point out that so often when the Freeholder talks we think in terms of numbers, but what we have to realize is what he's talking about is somebody's father or mother, brother or sister, whatever it might be. These are somebody's family who now has some peace by getting their family member home and to give them a proper burial. So we're happy that you keep reminding us of this. But, I'm just saying to everybody, don't think of it in terms of numbers, these are real people with real lives. Okay. Freeholder Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. I have some very good news to report to the Board. Usually at this time of year we have concluded our General Obligation Bond Sales. This year the County sold \$31,100,000.00 in General Obligation Bonds. The successful bidder, and in this case it's the person who bids the lowest interest rate obviously, was Mesirow Financial, Inc. And the interest rate bid on this, the true interest costs, is 2.28%. So that the County will be paying a very minimal 2.28% to borrow these funds for Capital Improvements in the County of Ocean.

Now, I suppose I should explain. Capital Improvements mean brick and mortar, asphalt, buildings, not operating expenses. You cannot, in New Jersey.....it's one of the good things about New Jersey, you cannot borrow for operating expenses and you wouldn't anyway. But, these are for projects that will have a long term usefulness in the County. And again, this is I believe, the lowest interest rate that we have ever experienced certainly in my time of 36 years as a Freeholder. Just for comparatives sake, last year the low bidder interest rates were slightly higher, was at 2.63% and the year before, 2.61%, the year before that 2.67%. So this figure this year is substantially, in interest

rate terms, lower than in the past.

Now, one of the reasons for this very good interest rate we experienced here is the fact that the County has a AAA Bond Rating. Now I know that people probably get tired of me saying that, but I can assure you, I will never tire of saying that because we worked so long and so hard to obtain it. Let me just read a few things that Moody's Financial Services report to investors about the County of Ocean which again, resulted in these low interest rates, of what the financial markets say about the job, if you will, that this Board of Freeholders and its professional staff do. Because without that you wouldn't have the best bond rating in the world.

According to Moody's and I'm reading what they're saying, not what John Bartlett is saying. 'The County's financial position should remain strong in the medium term as management continues to budget conservatively. Current Fund balance (surplus) increased in 2015 to \$43.5 million, or 10.2% of Current Fund revenues.' As you all know, this has been our goal over the past 4 or 5 or 6 years to get to that 10% level and we have now obtained it.

Now, let me go on a little further on this. New Jersey requires its local governments to do their accounting on a New Jersey basis which is not capped which is the General Accounting basis. So Moody's readjusts the County's fund balance and according to their readjustment it really stands at \$59.9 million, or 14% of revenues. Again, it puts us in a strong position to do what? To pay the bills."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Can you talk about how important that was during (Superstorm) Sandy?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well, I'm going to get there right here because when we get to liquidity it says, 'the County's liquidity (that means the cash on hand, the ability to pay bills) is extremely strong. In addition, the County maintains considerable liquidity in its trust funds. Notably, the County's liquidity remains strong even during the worst of Hurricane Sandy recovery. In fact, despite massive bills and lending funds to its constituent communities, the County did not need to issue notes, but rather, relied on its internal liquidity.'

So, in other words, what they are saying is that we had the financial stability and financial ability within the County to lend out to the municipalities to pay for the massive cleanup during (Superstorm) Sandy of what amounted to over \$100 million all told. Those funds were recoverable through FEMA and most, practically all have been recovered and the town's 10% share of that when we got the Federal money in and we sent them the bill and we got that money back too. We said to the rating agencies, and I hate to say this, but if it happened again we're ready and prepared. All of our trust funds have been repaid. All of the money, essentially all of the money has been repaid, and its this liquidity which means the ability to tap cash is one of the reasons for our AAA Bond Rating."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Can I say something?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Sure, please."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We so often talk about how that saved money for the municipalities in the County, but what we don't talk about is how it let us start the recovery process so much quicker to put our County back together again. It's almost like Humpty Dumpty when he fell off the wall and then we were able to put that back together. We were able to do that so much quicker because we had the cash on hand to make sure that the projects that needed to be done were funded and started almost immediately."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "There was a second advantage to that too, and it's probably not nice to say, but the quicker we recovered in that way, the quicker the tax base recovers and money flows in. Although I'm probably the one to kind of mention that. That was important to me. The quicker you rebuild, the quicker you rebuild your tax base and that's important. And they have a chart in here, by the way, showing that.

Let me move forward to what is beyond, but very similar, to what the Fitch ratings are - the other rating agency we use. Again, which graded the County AAA with a stable outlook. It says, 'the AAA General Obligation ratings reflect the County's exceptionally strong gap-closing capacity', meaning our ability to pay off these inter-fund loans, 'solid revenue base and sound operating performance. The County's strong financial profile reflects a wealthy property tax bas, manageable expenditure growth demands and a demonstrated ability to control expenditures during economic downturns.' What it means is we only spend money when we have to and we know where it's coming from and you we know where it's going and that is reflected, again, by these rating agencies.

I need not read more because it is much of the same, but you get the picture. We've got the best credit in the world and we have that best credit, as I've said a number of times, because all of us are of the same mindset and if your finances are in good shape then you can do the good things that need to be done and not overburden the taxpayers. And, by the way, these reports also reflect that. I think that concludes my comments. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Freeholder Vicari."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Yes, Mr. Director, thank you for the opportunity to speak. I just want give a little summary of what took place. First of all, I just want to thank Freeholder Virginia Haines for attending, and we were there, she had a leadership role in 'HOPE Sheds Light'. It has to do basically with dealing with over 1200 people and a lot of them were family members who lost someone in their family, someone at risk, and the pain that was seen at that event on the Seaside Heights boardwalk was unbelievable. It was very impressive. As you know, three of us on this particular Board are former teachers and we worked with children every single day, young people, and realize

that they are the backbone of the United States as a strong country, and substance abuse is a major threat to what's taking place. It was in the same area, a week later, as far as what took place as far as in Seaside Park as far as where the bomb exploded. It's hard to explain it sometimes when people change what's important to them when they see substance abuse and terrorism - it's a threat to the United States.

And I also want to commend Freeholder John Bartlett for what he said about the AAA Bond Rating. Now, you heard some things like terroristic attacks. You heard some things like substance abuse. But, you know in this County, one of the strongest bond ratings not only in the State of New Jersey, but our bond rating is stronger than the United States government. It's stronger than the State of New Jersey. And one of the reasons is because of our fiscal responsibility and debt service. We can go out and borrow today \$150 million with no problem, but you know what happens? I can do it. We can all do it. You're going to have to pay it back - your children. We're not going to think like that.

Freeholder Little has a computer going all the time with the United States government debt and it's almost \$19 trillion. You know sometimes you can see a few thousand or a few million, but when we get to the billions and trillions sometimes.....it's......"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "It's \$19.5 trillion."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "\$19.5 trillion! You're going to have to pay it back.....right over there (points to students). So again, when it's big financial....."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Not all at once."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "In your lifetime. The second thing is, again, it's still Ocean County and we have it in the back of the room (magazine cover framed on wall), 'the best place to live, to work and to retire'. So it's all positive things when you talk about this in school tomorrow. We're proud of that.

And also, you're going to see later on and I consider it a very open process, we talk to people. We have a very transparent type of government. At the end of the meeting we open it up to anyone that has comments. So you don't see people complaining. There are some people here today and I'm interested to see what people are going to say. We have 580,000 people in Ocean County and our meetings are at 4:00 pm continuously so it's easy for people to get here. It's easy for senior citizens. It's in the middle of the week on a Wednesday. So we're willing to listen to any comments from any of our citizens. So it's not all doom and gloom.

But, I think the most important thing of what I've said today, it's still an opportunity out here. You can get an education at a reasonable cost. We have outstanding schools. We have a great environment to live in. So Ocean County is still a good place. So I don't want you to go home depressed or anything else like that. But what we need is young people to get involved in government, in leadership, to make those decisions and strengthen what we have today. So again, we appreciate you being here, appreciate your teacher. And we go there (school) every year to talk to you. Bring more of your friends here. I look forward to seeing if you have any questions today. So again, Mr. Director, thank you for the opportunity to speak and I'll turn it back over to you and open it up to members of the public."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. And just now as the Freeholder talked about, we are going to go to our public session."

T. PUBLIC COMMENTS - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker.

At 4:53 PM, Freeholder Director Kelly opened the meeting to receive the following comments from members of the public:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "The public session is open to anyone to ask any question or make any comment regarding County business that you would like to. We ask only that you abide by our 5-minute rule, meaning everyone gets 5 minutes to either question or comment. And identify yourself by name and address. What I would like to do is open it first to the students because you're here because what you have to understand is your teacher told me you get extra credit if you come up and either make comment or ask a question regarding County government. And we're very friendly and we're not intimidating, so please feel free to come up with any question or comment that you may have. Come on, you have to have something. They're trying to talk him into it."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I think the gentleman in the middle."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "See, I knew you had a question. Come right up. Just give us your name and instead of your address......"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "When I was a teacher I would never do that to a student!"

JOSHUA CHANLEY, TOMS RIVER HIGH SCHOOL NORTH: "Well, I don't have much of a question, but I really do appreciate coming here and learning about the whole process and everything. And I was never really

involved in more of the local government, more of the national government, and I aspire to be a lawyer when I am older and learning about politics on a local level is, so far, even as this is my first meeting ever today, is a phenomenal experience and I really appreciate everything. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Josh, here's what I want to tell you before you sit down, besides these public meetings, all of our offices are open all the time and if you want to come in and talk to one of the Freeholders.....this is for all of you really......and ask any questions of us individually, please feel free to do that. It's a very relaxed atmosphere when you do that. So anything that you want to come and question or comment on, any recommendations you may have, and maybe you would feel more comfortable not in a public setting, but sitting with us individually. We'll be happy to do that."

JOSHUA CHANLEY: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Do you still have the thing where you invite the Freeholder to your class?"

TEACHER: "The letter is in the mail."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "The letter is in the mail. So we'll do that and then you're in charge. That's when we get nervous. Thank you. I appreciate you coming up. They all get extra credit since one of them did. Okay. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Mr. Gumper."

WILLIAM GUMPER, HOLIDAY CITY, BERKELEY: "I would like to have 5 minutes or maybe 3 minutes to talk to Freeholder Bartlett about something, but I don't want to do it publicly."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. Sure."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "After the meeting is over."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I'm sure he'll be happy to do that. Can I say that for you?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Gumper, I will try. As you know, I've been undergoing some medical treatments and I've driven an 8-cylinder car since I've been driving so I speak in those terms. I'm hitting on about 5-cylinders right now and it's missing badly. But I'll be happy to try to talk to you after the meeting."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Would anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Yes please. Could you please come up to the microphone? I'll tell you why. That mic is set up to our recorder and then that way if we need to get back to you we can. So if you could just give me your name and address to start."

GINA D'AMBROSIA HAAS, 1024 TILLER AVENUE, BEACHWOOD: "Good afternoon. I just have a quick question. I was wondering if the Board had ideas on the homeless population in our area and in hopes of possibly putting together a shelter. I look at the FoodTown building and I thought that would be an awesome spot, but any thoughts?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Yes. I can tell you that we have a different program than building a shelter to have everyone come to. The program is mostly through our Board of Social Services which is supported in part by money from the Board of Freeholders, which is money from you. In that program we have a number of different programs of how we shelter people. Some are in regular apartments, others in a rental home, others sometimes in a real emergent time are in a motel. So there is a program that houses everyone.

The program also consists of helping those people in other ways, usually they are interviewed by Social Services and maybe they need help with food stamps or any number of programs. So we think we have a very good program in place rather than building a shelter. So at this point, there is no will on the part of County government to build a shelter, instead we shelter people all through Ocean County in the 33 different municipalities. One reason we do that - say I build it (shelter) in Beachwood, that's very inconvenient to somebody who really has their children going to school in Jackson or whatever it might be. I'm just using different towns. So what we try to do is find sheltering for people in their hometown so that they can remain people that take part in the local community. It seems to be effective and working.

There are some people who really don't want government interference in their life at all because once you get help from the government there are also other things that government looks into (in) your life and some people just don't want that scrutiny. So it's really a very complicated whole mechanism sheltering someone. And I'm going to let you now comment on your comments and I'm sure that you may have a different perspective, but I at least want you to understand our perspective."

GINA D'AMBROSIA HAAS: "I appreciate that. There is something that is called Housing First and it's been around since the mid-1990's. It's currently in effect in New York, Philadelphia and Washington. What they offer is wrap around services so it's a simple solution. I mean, we've always viewed it as, 'Oh get the mental health situation under way and then we'll give these people housing.' But they co-exist. I mean we all go to bed at night and sleep on a pillow in a nice warm house, but if we're sleep-deprived our thought processing is off. I mean it's just crazy. I met

with 14 individuals today that were homeless and that was just, honestly, in this area.

So the numbers. We have 33 boroughs and we don't have a shelter. They're told to go to Atlantic City. Atlantic City doesn't want them. Or go to Newark - well, how are you going to afford \$33.00 for a bus ticket up there?

I was of the mindset that these people don't even have friends, if you think about it, because I was ignorant prior to this. I mean I didn't dare like really make eye contact with a street person or homeless person, so to speak. But I did meet a couple of people who were lucid, funny, nice and wow! There but for the grace of God. Something happened to this woman and I see. And who am I to say? If we lose that, what are we? I mean we're here to help each other. Correct? I mean I'm not trying to reinvent the wheel. This has worked and I have actual documentation and I was going to and I still will email all of you with this because I really feel that we have an obligation as citizens, as Americans. The statues are nice, but we have people that are starving. I mean, for people to get McDonald's, you would think they were like kids in a candy store. Honestly. It broke my heart.

And then, I don't know what we're doing with Huddy Park. That was fine. But, I don't know..... So I just really think and it wouldn't be that expensive. If you look at Community (Hospital), all the people that go into there from overdoses. I was in the Library and almost physically got sick because two people overdosed. I can't even believe it. I've lived here 23 years and I've never seen the things that I've seen. Thank God my children are older now. It's sad."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I just want you to understand something because I'll tell you why we hesitate to build a shelter. We actually shelter thousands of people, THOUSANDS, every single night. There's no facility that we could build big enough to house all of what we consider homeless people in this county. And people who are homeless right now must not qualify for the Federal.......I don't know anything about this and I don't want you to give me any names publicly. We shouldn't do that. But, there must be a reason that the Board of Social Services couldn't help them. If we build a shelter it would be built under Social Services. They'd still have to comply with everything they already have to comply with. And I don't know where they might have been and I don't want to really"

GINA D'AMBROSIA HAAS: "Right. Do you mean the individuals themselves?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "The individuals themselves. No one should be homeless because we have the funds available to help anyone on a basis of time. So I'm not sure what all is there, but we do have representatives of the Board of Social Services here and you're welcome to talk to them and they can go through all the programs they have. And just understand, I don't remember......do you remember how many we house every single night? I know it was in the thousands. Can you tell me? How many do we house every night?"

LINDA MURTHAGH, DIRECTOR, OC BOARD OF SOCIAL SERVICES: "Well housing is..... besides sheltering, we also help people prevent homelessness through back rent."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "But how many every night do we have?"

LINDA MURTAGH: "I'd say probably close to 2000 people. Besides the Board of Social Services, there's an array of other providers."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "And there's other....yeah, I know, but just every night......the very lowest number. I know there are many other programs that stop people from needing the immediate shelter. But, it's that many every single night."

GINA D'AMBROSIA HAAS: "Where is this? This is not a designated place though. This could be just one place."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "No. We try to keep people as much as possible in their home community. I'll give you an example that I'm going to talk about without a name. In my own family I found out that my nephew was living in a campground in a tent in November with his three children, one of which wasn't yet two years old. So how did I temporarily shelter them? In my living room in my house. So there are all different types of homelessness. And this is not a kid that shouldn't be able to go out — he's healthy and everything else....

So you're right there is every gamut. There are people you are almost scared to deal with because of drugs or whatever, they have the mental health issues and everybody is a little worried about them. And then there are other people who, just like you said, they're out of work for a while. You know, we're all a paycheck away from being homeless. That's the old saying. So I understand that.

I just want you to know that we are empathetic to that, but we also have real money invested in the homeless of this County. So without knowing the exact details of the people that you brought up, if we couldn't help them there's a reason that we couldn't and I don't know what that reason is and I don't want to go into anything of what it could be, but there are a number of reasons that people don't get the help from the County. But there's a reason for it because the money is commingled between County and Federal monies and there are laws that we have to comply with and there's a whole host of what we can do. And that wouldn't change if we built a shelter or if we do it the way we're doing it. So if there are people that told you they are homeless and can't get help, there's some reason they couldn't get help. I'm not aware of what that reason is."

GINA D'AMBROSIA HAAS: "I'm sorry; could you repeat that last part? You said that if you were to have a facility......what was that? If we were to build a facility......"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "They would still have to comply with all the statutory requirements."

GINA D'AMBROSIA HAAS: "Oh absolutely!"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I'm only getting to the people that said they told you they're homeless and I guess said they couldn't get help from the County. If they couldn't get help from the"

GINA D'AMBROSIA HAAS: "Well, I also took this from numbers for the point in time (census). I used to work at the Ocean County Children's Shelter. So those numbers that compiled from 2013 up til now. And then the Ocean County Children's Shelter which is actually no longer there. So I'm not even talking about children, I'm talking about adults. And now there are more middle-aged people, 45 to 50 and over, that are homeless. I think that's another of my concerns."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Yeah, we run the gamut. We really do. And there are people here that you are welcome to talk to from the Board of Social Services."

GINA D'AMBROSIA HAAS: "Okay. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you for your comments. Anyone else like to talk to the Freeholders at this time? I thank you very much. We'll close the public session and ask for a motion to adjourn."

U. ADJOURNMENT

There being no additional comments received, Freeholder Director Kelly called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 5:06 PM.

Freeholder Director John P. Kelly opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Fiure, Assistant County Administrator Keith J. Goetting, Director of Human Resources Julie N. Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO Mark Jenke, Engineering Department Christine Wioland, Deputy Clerk of the Board Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Mr. Jenke reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the July 20, 2016 Board meeting.

Director Kelly questioned how many projects in Ocean County have been stopped because of Governor Christie's stoppage of transportation projects? Mark Jenke advised that the projects include Interchange 91 in Brick Township; Jackson Mills Culvert; Cooks Bridge Road Culvert; Route 571, in Jackson Township. Freeholder Kelly stated that these projects are all on hold because the Governor put a stoppage on all transportation projects funded through the Transportation Trust Fund until funding is secured.

Director Kelly stated that the NJTPA held a meeting this week and is doing a resolution to ask the Legislature to make this funding a priority. The Director noted that Ocean County has been impacted just as are all counties in the State. The Director noted that Ocean County does not want to see a \$.23 increase in tax for gasoline. A proposal for a resolution came up last week before our Board meeting. All of the Freeholder oppose the gas tax increase. However, it was too late to put a resolution on the agenda; the Director stated that since that time the bill failed. The Director stated that the Transportation Trust Fund has to be funded, noting that the question is how our legislators do that. The Director stated that an increase in the gas tax would hurt Ocean County more than other counties because of the volume of commuters from Ocean County. Director Kelly stated that NJAC is meeting with legislators to come up with another solution, noting that Ocean County is a member of NJAC.

Freeholder Bartlett advised that NJ Transit built a new train station and the cost of the train station was a half a billion dollars, stating that the public looks at some of these NJ Transit projects as wasteful. Freeholder Bartlett noted then when the State tells us that it is too expensive to upgrade a 90 year old Route 9, how do you spend a half billion dollars on a train station; and stated that Ocean County residents need guarantees that Route 9 will be fixed. Director Kelly stated that the County will wait to see what new proposals would be before this Board takes a position.

Administrator Block reported that Interchange 91 is actually under construction and it was shut down by the Governor. Mr. Fiure also noted that one of the overlay projects is an active project with only one day remaining on the project. The Administrator stated that the Brick MUA has been doing work as well and had to shut down the project.

Director Kelly reported that there is an impact on Ocean County and the County needs to discuss what is best for Ocean County. Freeholder Little stated most of our legislators voted against the \$.23 gas tax.

Freeholder Little stated that the State has siphoned 100's of millions of dollars from the Transportation Trust Fund to use for other State financing. The Freeholder stated that by doing this, the State then does not have to put the dollars in the State budget to balance the budget; doing this all the time, using the money for purposes for which the public never intended the money to be used. Freeholder Little emphasized that this is disingenuous to do and the people of the State will not accept this practice anymore. The Freeholder stated that the people of Ocean County commute the most distances with no bus or train transportation available to them. The Freeholder noted that the commuters from Ocean County have the longest commutes and pay the most tolls and gasoline taxes.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed with the Board an old subdivision located in Manchester Township known as Roosevelt City - Krupnick property that has been recommended by the Natural Lands Trust Fund (NLTF) Advisory Committee for acquisition. The Freeholder noted that the property surrounds Harry Wright Lake and the County has already purchased land in this area (Structural Management). Freeholder Bartlett stated that these are scattered lots that are adjacent to or surround property already owned by the County. David McKeon, Introplanting Direction bewas 2016 attendance and advised that the total of the scattered lots is Adopted on: September 21, 2016 Official Resolution#: 2016001091

approximately 70 acres and noted that appraisals were done. The appraisal of all of the parcels was \$1 million; however, Mr. McKeon noted that the County offered \$873,878 and the owner accepted. Mr. McKeon further noted that the properties have buildable lots and are located along the Blue Comet Rail Line. There is a possible Department of Defense reimbursement but no commitment has been received. Freeholder Bartlett stated that this acquisition will be listed for Board action at the July 20, 2016 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of July 20, 2016. Freeholder Bartlett stated that amendments to the budget are done when grant money comes in and the budget has to accept these as items of revenue, which inflates the budget. It is money in, money out. Freeholder Little stated that Item No. 3 is federal dollars that the County will be amending the budget to accept it and include it in spending. There were no questions or other comments.

Director Kelly asked the Board members for comments.

There were no comments.

Director Kelly asked the Administrator for his report.

The Administrator advised he did not have anything for today's public session.

Director Kelly advised that he received notice today from the Police Chiefs' Association regarding a ceremony at 7:00PM tomorrow, July 14, 2016 for the Dallas Police Officers. The event will be held at Ocean County Park in Lakewood.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Bartlett, seconded by Freeholder Little, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:30 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Director Kelly advised that at the conclusion of the Closed Session, the Board will return to Open Session to close the meeting, noting that no action will be taken when the meeting returns to Open Session.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 5:21 PM. There being no further business, on a motion by Freeholder Little, seconded by Freeholder Bartlett, the meeting adjourned at 5:22 PM.
