Clerk Cilento reads the Proclamation into the record.

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you. Freeholder Vicari."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "You know that this is very, very important to us on the Board of Freeholders, especially myself as an educator for 40 years. Freeholder Director Haines is going to help me present this today. These are the parents of those children who have autism. And the reason why it's extremely important to us is because...what we work for is for our children...1 out of 37 to reach their full potential. And how do we do it? By early detection – very, very important. And usually, a child by the age of two or three, correct me if I'm wrong later on if they detect it, we give them special educational programs throughout all our 29 school districts.

I've been very fortunate when I was working with the Brick Township School District for 48 years and their representatives are here... that the programs were so good they came from all over...not just in New Jersey, all over the United States. And sometimes we had, not one, but two from certain families. But we did what we had to do. It was a model program. And the rest of us, of course, carried those programs on.

But one has to realize with special- ed programs, that it costs an average of \$60,000.00 a year. And we know from personal experience, that we can help them, not only reach their full potential, but also fit into society which is extremely important in certain cases. But 1 out of 37 in the State of New Jersey is just unbelievably uncalled for.

A tremendous amount of money working with Congressman Chris Smith. This Board supports every single Resolution for the last 25 years for autism to get more and more funding. Unfortunately sometimes, those with autism are bullied in school. We have special programs with Law Enforcement, our Sheriff's Department and Michael Mastronardy, that if someone is autistic and they find, whether it be in a car or if it's someplace else, they recognize it so they're treating it in the proper way. I was very fortunate that when I was Superintendent of Schools in Berkeley, I went back and I donated my salary. I gave \$70,000.00 of my salary to autism and special-ed programs – very, very important. And it's my way of giving back to society and to be very, very grateful that we have healthy children.

But Gary, who's very, very supportive with the parents and especially in Ocean County. And Freeholder Haines has personal experience with it and she would like to present this to Gary, who represents the President of the State Organization."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "No it is definitely my pleasure. I happen to have a nephew...of course he's not...he works. He has children and he has a home and things like that. But my sister was a teacher. They live in Vermont. And she really let him express himself which helped him tremendously. I mean she had to fight with school and things like that...I think with a lot of...you know the parents have to, to make sure that they're going to get schooling that they properly need. But I mean I know when I was in the Legislature, Senator Ciesla and myself - Assemblyman Wolfe, we had done Legislation for autism and I remember that...because it is so important to try and do what we can to help individuals with autism.

But it is my pleasure, along with Freeholder Vicari, to present this to you. Thank you for all that you do."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "And Susan Quinn from the library is here. On April the 7th we're having a special seminar on Sunday for the entire day – working with the parents and different people throughout not only in Ocean County, but in the State of New Jersey, to raise (awareness of) early detection and treatment and the importance of informing school districts like the two school districts that are here today with their special needs program and their autistic program. Gary."

GARY WEITZEN: "Thank you. I'm the Executive Director of POAC Autism Services. My son Christopher is in the front row. He turned 25 this week – graduated from Bricktown from the autism program that you're talking about. When he was born the rate of autism was 1 in 10,000. Today, nationwide, 1 in 68, 1 in 34 in New Jersey. Boys, 1 out of 22 boys born in New Jersey today have autism.

A little about POAC, a little 60 second commercial. We're the largest provider of all things autism in the state. If you have a loved one with autism, this year alone, we had 324 days' worth of free stuff. The school year is 180 days, we have 324. Toms River alone, we've trained every single police officer. All the bus drivers. All the aides in the classroom. We've trained over 67,000 first responders for free across the State of New Jersey. We ask for money but they don't give it to us.

We're credited with 117 lives that we know of. That's 117 times a police chief has called us up and said, 'This child with autism would have been dead if not for POAC.'

Year-long, I'm in charge of Ocean/Monmouth County Challenger Needs – Middle School and High School levels. If you think of it, we do it. I urge everybody in the audience, go on the website, POAC.net, and just see the hundreds and hundreds of free things. I'm also a member of the Ocean County Crisis Intervention Team for Law Enforcement and mental health workers. I have a few of my friends in the audience out there. I was actually working today that's why I don't have a jacket or tie. You know 324 days is a lot so I'm working all of the time."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "It is. I understand."

GARY WEITZEN: "On behalf of my son and the 1 in 34 children in New Jersey, I just want to thank you for taking time to recognize this."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you for what you do, really."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Gary, always a pleasure."

GARY WEITZEN: "Thank you. Thank you so much. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Well thank you. Thank you Director.

And before we do open the floor to public comments on the Budget, I wanted to review some of the highlights of this years' budget.

The Clerk of the Board already read the budget totals, so what I want to talk about is what this budget means to our taxpayers and residents.

We just heard where the money comes from and that's on the easel to your left. And where the money goes to that's the easel on your right. I'm not going to read all those figures again. They're the same figures you just heard from the Clerk of the Board. So that tells you all about the money. But what happens with that money? What does the budget cover?

Well, it covers all the core services provided to the 600,000 people that call Ocean County home.

It makes certain that our seniors who rely on so many senior programs we have, including our nutrition program that provide daily meals are fully funded.

I'm sure that Freeholder Joe Vicari will speak about this important program when he makes his comments.

It assures residents in Ocean County that they can attend Ocean County College at our Vo-Tech schools at an affordable price providing them with a quality education that is the cornerstone for opportunity, good jobs and a bright future.

The Board of Freeholders will also make sure that our 626 miles of roads and our 259 bridges and culverts are well maintained providing safe transportations and safe roads for our commuters, our residents and our visitors. After all we are a resort community.

In the budget, we provided the funds to do things as mundane as filling potholes, plowing the snow and clean storm drains. We also fund larger capital projects that improve our infrastructure such as bridge replacements, major road projects and intersection improvements.

We provide funding so that our Vehicle Services Department can repair the vehicles that do this work in a timely manner and keep them well-maintained in order for us to respond to emergencies, again, like plowing the snow, brining the roads and for day-to-day operations like moving recyclables.

It is also important to this Board of Freeholders to help protect the Barnegat Bay and our environment by funding our many Solid Waste Management Programs like household hazardous waste disposal and numerous recycling programs all under the leadership of our newest Freeholder, Gary Quinn.

We also fund the popular Pumpout Boat Program which helps keep our bay clean. Freeholder Gerry Little demands that with the largest veteran population in the State, the Freeholders make sure our programs are funded and easily accessible to all of our veterans.

We also take care of our most needy and vulnerable residents with services that help them keep a roof over their head and food on the table.

And with the support of the entire Board of Freeholders I made sure we are properly funding our departments that provide Law and Public Safety across this County.

Our Sheriff's Department, our Prosecutor's Office, our Correction's Department, our Security Department and our Juvenile Services Department work tirelessly to protect everyone in our County. They are working to meet the ongoing challenges brought on by the opioid crises. It is our commitment to help those affected by the addictions so they know support and help is available for them. But we also make sure that our Law and Public Safety agencies are working to reduce the crime that is linked to this crises so we are all safe in our homes and in our neighborhoods.

Funding is also in place to make sure training for our volunteer firefighters and EMTS will be available to the men and women of Ocean County that want to help and protect their neighbors at our Training Center in Waretown. And that our newest Police Officers, Sheriff Officers, Corrections Officers, will all receive the best training possible at our Ocean County Police Academy in Lakewood.

Freeholder Director Haines has made certain the budget includes the funds necessary to make sure our residents and visitors have premier parks to visit. Everyone needs a break from the day-to-day and our Department of Parks and Recreation really does have something for everyone – from our younger residents, to our nature lovers to our sports enthusiasts to our retirees.

This Board is funding the maintenance and upkeep of the 135 buildings that make up County Government where all these services are provided. From our courthouse to all of the 21 library facilities to our administrative offices, our Buildings and Grounds Department makes sure the buildings are well kept – that they're safe and that they're ready for use by all of our employees and the public.

The revenues for this budget come from several sources but the largest is your tax dollars. However, I want you to know that the amount to be raised by taxation in the 2019 budget is below the 2% State mandated spending cap.

The budget is also supported, and we talked about it when the Clerk read the original resolution, the budget is supported by \$28 million in surplus. And this healthy surplus allows us to maintain a AAA bond rating which helps to give us the best possible interest rates when we need to borrow money for large capital projects. A healthy surplus also allows us to be prepared for emergencies like the economic crises of the early 2000 years or natural disasters like we saw with Superstorm Sandy. This County stood ready to meet those challenges. And because of the surpluses in place, we were able to keep a stable tax rate. We have a stable tax rate now and we're going to have a stable tax rate in the future.

The County tax rate under this budget, in fact, is down a half a cent bringing the rate to about 34 cents per \$100 of equalized property value. It is the third consecutive year that the rate has been lowered – which is what we pledged to do as we rebound from a downturn in the economy and Superstorm Sandy.

For years this Board of Freeholders has promised a "no surprise" budget that continues our conservative and disciplined approach to budgeting. And this year we continue to keep our pledge.

The Board works as a team with our County staff, including our Administrator, our CFO and all our Department Heads to develop our budget including this 2019 budget.

This budget provides our residents with quality programs and services while keeping Ocean County affordable and a great place to live, work and play.

Madam Director, that concludes my remarks and I thank you for the opportunity to present the 2019 Budget as we prepare to hear public comment."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you Freeholder Kelly. I just want to thank you as well as our staff that work very hard on that budget. I just want to make a few comments and then I'll ask my fellow Freeholders. But mainly, I just want to talk about what I feel, is to me, very close to my heart. I have been on the Ocean County College Foundation Board for 18 years and I'm now the liaison to Ocean County College. And I just want to talk about how the funding positively has affected Ocean County College and the students.

This budget includes \$15.7 million for Ocean County College, which is an increase of \$454,000.

For over 50 years, Ocean County has helped New Jersey's first community college – OCC - educate and develop thousands of Ocean County students. Operating budget support provided by this Board allows Ocean County College to offer first-rate higher education to the citizens of Ocean County at a very affordable price.

OCC currently offers 39 academic programs and 17 certificate programs as well as 23 fully on-line programs leading to the Associate in Arts (A.A.), the Associate in Science (A.S.), or the Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degrees.

Operating support from the Board of Freeholders allows OCC to provide a host of support services that help students succeed. Ocean County College provides academic coaching, mentoring and tutoring through the Center for Student Success. In addition, the Writing Center assists all students looking for help with any aspect of writing and the Math Center provides professional and peer Mathematics assistance for all students. Disability Services provides academic adjustments and support for students with all types of disabilities.

Our funds also go to supporting the Nursing program at OCC. The Ocean County College School of Nursing graduated 136 students in the 2017-2018 academic year. Students who complete the nursing program are eligible to take the state licensure examination required to practice as a Registered Nurse. OCC's licensure passing rate for 2018 was 91.18%, which is above the national scores. Job placement rates for OCC Nursing graduates are 100%.

With the support of the County, OCC is able to offer a Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral Degrees right here in Ocean County through partnerships with Kean University and Thomas Edison State College. These alliances are unique and they position Ocean County College at the forefront of community college innovation.

OCC's tuition rate is one of the lowest in the State and when combined with Kean University's on-campus program, citizens of Ocean County can obtain a Bachelor's degree for under \$35,000. For students who wish to complete their degrees on-line, a partnership with Thomas Edison State University allows students to study at OCC for three years and obtain a Bachelor's degree for under \$19,000. Providing these affordable pathways to an undergraduate or graduate degree is just one of the many ways the County's support benefits OCC's students.

The support provided by the County allows OCC to work closely with all Ocean County High Schools and many students begin taking OCC courses at a discounted rate while in high school.

In addition to earning a college credit early, there are a number of other benefits to dual-enrollment programs. These programs introduce students to the rigors of college coursework early, and recent studies have shown that students who participate in dual-enrollment programs are more likely to go on to get a college degree.

Most OCC courses transfer directly to four-year universities for full credit, and thus, save both time and money before students enter college full time.

By the fall of 2019, OCC will offer at least one college course in all 15 of the public high schools in Ocean County.

Ocean County College attracts a very high percentage of the students graduating from Ocean County high schools. In fact, yield rates from seven Ocean County high schools exceeded 30% for fall of 2018.

As you can see, the money we provide to the college goes a long way in providing opportunities to Ocean County residents that may not be afforded elsewhere.

And I just want to say one thing. As I said I sit on the Ocean County College Foundation Board, which I have for 18 years. We give away over \$600,000.00 worth of scholarships to people that live in Ocean County that apply to go to OCC. It's very easy to do. All they need to do is apply on-line – answer some of the questions and it's a 250 word essay. I am constantly out there making sure wherever I speak, to make sure I let people know – I am very proud of OCC. We are the premier. In fact, we are the only community college that had a 12% increase in enrollment, and that's something we can all speak of very highly about throughout the County, that we have one of the best community colleges in the State.

And I'm very proud and I thank the Freeholders for not only all the other programs that we do here in Ocean County, but also for what we provide for the residents that are able to attend OCC.

And now I think we'll call on Freeholder Vicari."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Director. This is my 30th budget as a County Freeholder — probably next to John Bartlett — probably the most any budget in the history of the State has voted on. And why is it so important to us? It's really a blueprint of what Ocean County is all about and why I first went for Freeholder, 38 years ago, it's called 'quality of life.' It's called 'affordability.' And something else that's very important — that every student that's in Ocean County reaches their full potential.

We are very fortunate today to talk during the budget process that we have the leadership of two of our schools that are here today. They're going to talk in a few minutes from Toms River Regional School District and Brick Township. For Brick Township, I put 28 years in there as a Teacher and as Administrator before I became a Superintendent. So I know first-hand what's taking place with education. As a matter of fact I worked with Ocean County College and the Vocational School for many years with what they call, 'pre-school to grade 16,' where there will be a smooth transition with curriculum going back and forth.

And also our priority has been not only in our Vocational Schools to teach jobs that don't even exist today. There's no name for it because the economy is changing so fast. The job market is changing so fast globally. So we're training students with the skills that are so necessary and so important in the Vocational School. And all of our students in the Vocational School, not only live here...after they graduate, the majority will always get a job and will continue to live here in Ocean County.

So what we're doing is training the workforce that will be in Ocean County for the next 50 years – very, very important. This Board of Freeholders has always given top priority to educational programs.

I want to tell you a little story. We're building a Performing Arts Building. You know what we received? \$8 million from the State. You know what they received in Hudson County? And I gave the reports going back last year - \$165 million! And we had to go begging for \$8 million because the building is going to cost us \$30 million. But working with Ocean County College we were able to build and will be one of the finest schools. We have what they call, 'blue-ribbon academies,' that are not only recognized in the State of New Jersey, but are recognized nationally throughout the United States. We have a waiting list. Everyone gets a job. And you know you talk about Law Enforcement – you talk about people on drugs – what's the best investment to make? It's called education.

I moved from North Jersey where I was a teacher. Why did I come to Ocean County? Quality of life – but to raise my children where they get the best opportunities as possible.

And that's why education is so important to this Board of Freeholders. When we give the Vocational School \$19 million to help support the Vocational School because I believe that we should be getting more from the State of New Jersey.

But besides working with the educational opportunities for the last 40 years in Ocean County, one thing that is very important to us having a population of 580,000 people are our senior citizens. And when they look back later on and they'll say, 'What did Ocean County do?' We help the old, the disabled, the people that cannot help themselves. And the elderly people are very important to us. It's about 200,000 people. And you figure their caregivers – it's about 176,000 plus the caregivers. And what this Board has done, in priority, even when we didn't have money in the budget, we moved money around, we took care of our seniors with home-delivered meals. Why? They can't afford it. Their age is there and so some of them can't cook. They can't use the microwave oven. So what we have done is continuously given them money. Now, what does it mean? Well, our theme has always been, even before I became a Freeholder of this Board, is seniors should be treated with respect and with dignity.

Do you realize one day in an emergency room for a senior citizen...we can feed them for one full year – one full year! And what we have done when the State of New Jersey and the Federal Government refused to give us more money, we went to the people of Ocean County. And their generosity spoke out loud and clear. Protect our seniors and the vast majority are veterans. Many served in World War II – the greatest generation of people. Even in difficult times, during the recessions that we had – the two recessions, during Superstorm-we always took care of our senior citizens.

The Director is here today - Maria LaFace - and what we're talking about today, we meet weekly, is we're going to open a new center. We're building it in Stafford Township, the Southern Service Center, to better feed our seniors - to make sure they are treated with respect and dignity. But something else, we give a social component that's involved with that. Because they're confined to their houses. Many of them just lost their spouse. Many of them...

their children unfortunately they live either far away or they lost them. So they go there – they watch T.V. – to socialize and see different people. And that goes to show that when we talk about the quality of life…how we reach out to many different people.

And this budget, as Freeholder Kelly, who did an outstanding job working with him – it is not only under cap, but we have a surplus in case there is another Superstorm. No one knows what's happening. But it's fiscally responsible. It meets all of the needs of Ocean County. The easiest thing for us to do since the tax rate is going down - the easiest thing to do is to take the easy way out. Couldn't we reduce taxes more so? How do you do it? Increase the debt service - play with the numbers - play with anticipated revenues. And we have never done that. Because of the fact of one thing. You don't know where the economy is going to go. You have to put the needs of the people first. We have a growing population. We lead the State of New Jersey with senior citizens, 85 and over. And what happens? They need more and more services. Special needs students in our Vocational School – very, very expensive. And what have we done? We train them for jobs. Because some day their parents are not going to be there and we look forward to all of that saying, 'Wait. What are we going to do?'

So I think it's looking ahead. Doing the best thing. We don't look for election to election of what we can do to make a decision. This budget is a sound, fiscal, conserved budget. It takes care of all of the needs of Ocean County. We can always spend more money. Going back about a year ago, I did an outline of how much money we could spend between new buildings and all. It was between \$250 million to \$325 million. We could, but we're not going to do that. Why? Because Joe Meyers from Buildings and Grounds makes sure that the 135 buildings, that we maintain those buildings.

Unfortunately the school board...you go before the voters and they can vote it down. With us it's different. The people of Ocean County trusted us as County Freeholders, the five of us, to give them a fiscal, conservative program to fund with the Board of School Estimate, Ocean County College, under the leadership of Freeholder Ginny Haines and myself met with the Vocational School to make sure we meet all the needs. And that's why we are very concerned with the public comment today, to see where we should go in the future. What we do today may not be the same as what we may do next year. But we don't know until we listen to the people of Ocean County.

Thank you Freeholder Haines for the opportunity. And if any questions later on in the public portion, we would be more than happy to listen to you. Thank you."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you Freeholder Vicari. Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Director. I would like to join Freeholder Kelly and you Director, and Freeholder Vicari in congratulating this Board and Freeholder Quinn...Freeholder Kelly and Freeholder Quinn.

As Freeholder Vicari just said this is a fiscally, responsible budget. It reduces the tax rate for the third consecutive year. I think there are very, very few Counties in this entire State that could emulate that in any way.

I'm particularly delighted as liaison to veterans that we have in our veteran's budget this year – sufficient funding to have a new full-time position for the Southern Resource Center to make sure that we can care for the veterans in the southern part of the County. Freeholder Vicari has enhanced tremendously the senior services in the southern part of the County, and we need to do the same with veterans. We had a part-time person there for a number of years and we're really looking forward to this now.

I'm also very pleased that we have about \$25 million to maintain our roads and bridges that Freeholder Kelly mentioned in his comments. This is very important. We have the largest road system in the state and we do our very best to maintain it. And we promise our Health Department that we're going to take care of 'Sunset Avenue.' It's an inside joke. They're smiling there. We're going to take care of that and that's part of that funding that we have. We do our best to care for our roads and bridges here in the County.

We maintain an adequate surplus so that...a healthy surplus so that we can maintain our AAA Bond Rating, which again, very few Counties in the entire country achieve that. I think this is about our fifth or sixth consecutive year and that's one of our priorities because it reduces the cost for our taxpayers and builds an adequate base so that we can do the capital projects that we need to do.

So, with that, I'd like to thank again, Freeholder Kelly for his leadership, our Budget Officer, Julie Tarrant and our Administrator and all of our staff for working together to achieve another sound budget for 2019. Thank you Director."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you Freeholder Little. Okay, Freeholder Quinn."

FREEHOLDER QUINN: "Last but not least. Just thinking back on what Freeholder Vicari said, this is my first budget as a Freeholder sitting up here. I certainly have a long way to go to catch up to you Joe, but it's certainly a great experience even though I've only been here two and half months. Freeholder Kelly really covered a lot of what's involved in the budget and laid it out extremely well so we all know each and every thing that's going to be involved. But you know, like the other guy said, it is a very fiscally responsible, conservative budget. There's no question about it.

My background over the last 20 years in being with municipal budgets has been on a much smaller version of what the County deals with on an annual basis. But this budget certainly includes everything, in my eyes, that we need to continue to move forward to make Ocean County the great County that it is. Staffing is going to go up a little bit.

The programs that we offer – road improvements we do – all the different services that we offer throughout the County are going to continue to grow as we move forward. And that's a great thing. And doing all of that at the same time as being able to reduce the tax rate a half a penny, this year as well as over the last three years, is really a great thing for the taxpayers of Ocean County.

So I have to applaud the Freeholder Board - the other four Freeholders up here because like I said, I wasn't here and they've been consistently doing the right thing in making the right decisions for the residents of Ocean County. And believe me, it's a true honor to be able to sit up here now and be part of the team looking forward.

I have to give special thanks to Julie Tarrant. I know when we walk out of here today and this budget gets adopted, you're going to start on next years' already because I know it's an ongoing process every year that you have to be able...so you're doing a tremendous job and I can't thank you enough for everything that you've done.

Carl, Mike Fiure is in the back there – you know you guys work hand-in-hand with Julie throughout the year and you've done a great job and continue to do a great job for the residents. So we're very lucky to have you.

The Freeholder Board – Jack, you taking over for John Bartlett was definitely a great situation for the Freeholder Board to be in. You stepped in there and haven't missed a beat, and done a fantastic job taking and doing what's good for the County, but doing what's good for the Freeholder Board overall.

Director, Gerry, Joe, I thank you for welcoming me into the mix and including me in the process. And I look forward more to getting involved in it as we move forward next year.

Freeholder Kelly made one comment with regards to the fact that we are all part of a team, but the team not only consists of the people that I just mentioned. At the end of the day it's all our Directors, our Department Heads, many of which are sitting in this room today. The budget gets put in place. The budget is put together by the folks I mentioned, but each and every one of you takes and handles it throughout the year and makes sure that the programs are done – the money is spent properly and that things stay in line with where the Freeholder Board wants it.

So to me being a part of this entire team, whether it be the Freeholder Board or the entire team of this entire room, truly, truly is an honor for me and I look forward to getting involved a little bit more next year and doing the right thing for the residents of Ocean County.

Thank you to everyone. It was certainly a pleasure to be able to participate and I look forward to it. Thank you Director."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you Freeholder Quinn. Yes, it is a joint effort as you mentioned, between Freeholder Kelly, our staff and all of the Department Heads because they need to work to get what they need for their department to make sure they work to continue to provide the services that are necessary to keep Ocean County the way it is, as the number one County in the State of New Jersey.

Okay, after we finish that, we'll continue on with the...oh that's right. I forgot we have a Public Hearing. We have to hear from the public. Okay, I'll open the Public Hearing. If there's anyone that would like to come forward to talk about the budget and give your comments, if you'll come up to the microphone and give your name and address."

SAL MASTROBERTI, TOMS RIVER: "The reason why I came up is because of an article that was in a paper about three weeks ago. Well, the Democrats want to keep the President's name, Donald Trump's name, off of the... out of the papers."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Excuse me Mr. Mastroberti, are you talking about the budget? Because right now this is the Public Hearing on the budget."

SAL MASTROBERTI: "Okay. Sorry."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "And then we'll be opening our Public Hearing later after we finish the agenda and you can give your comments, your general comments."

SAL MASTROBERTI: "Okay."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay? Thank you. Would anybody else like to speak about the budget? If you come forward and give your name and address."

JEFF FACKENTHAL, 316 CURACAO STREET, TOMS RIVER: "I'm a water conservationist. And does it have to pertain to this year's budget or one in the future? Because with the BASF (Ciba-Geigy) plant, they want to, I guess, sell off part of their property so that they don't have to pay the taxes on it or whatever or for building. And my thought on that particular piece of property is that it's...it would be a great place to put a reservoir to kind of prevent a Superstorm Sandy sort of backflow."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Is this pertaining to something in the budget? You're talking about putting money into the budget? You would like to see the County purchase...?"

JEFF FACKENTHAL: "Purchase part of that property if it's able to. I mean it's got to be an alphabet soup worth of, you know, federal agencies because you did finish cleaning up its land area. But my proposal was...I would have a lake built on that piece of property where you can take all your storm water run-off and make it a combined sewer

right over and process the waste-water treatment onto that."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "I certainly understand but we really want to talk more about the budget – things like that. I certainly understand and I will talk with some of the people in our departments with regards to that. This is just strictly for the budget."

JEFF FACKENTHAL: "Okay."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "You can talk after. We do have a public session."

JEFF FACKENTHAL: "Alright. I'll wait for later."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay. Thank you. Is there anyone else that would like to talk on the budget?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "If there are no further questions or suggestions for this budget or next year, I move to close the public portion of the budget."

No additional comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

I. RESOLUTIONS

CLERK CILENTO: "We have Consent Resolutions, I-1 through I-26."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "I would just like to say that on two of these Resolutions – if you look at number five – which is opposing the State mandated school funding formula which adversely affects the Toms River School District. And number six – opposing the current State mandated school funding formula which affects Brick Township Schools. We do have individuals here that would like to say a few words.

So at this time, I would just like to ask... Superintendent Healy would like to speak first about it on number five and then Brick Township?

And of course we have the President of the School Board, Joe Nardini here who is also going to speak."

DAVID HEALY: "Thank you Director Haines - members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Just state your name."

DAVID HEALY, SUPERINTENDENT OF TOMS RIVER SCHOOLS, 1144 HOOPER AVE, TOMS RIVER: "First I want to thank the Freeholders for having...I want to thank Freeholder Vicari for really engaging in a conversation with myself and the Board President Nardini really to get to this point. It's pretty obvious to the Freeholders and the County how invested Freeholder Vicari is in public education. It's a passion of his. I join each year as we recognize our teachers of the year. And when I had a conversation with Freeholder Vicari regarding really what the devastating impact on, not only Toms River, but the many districts in Ocean County as a result of 'S-2' and really what amounts to the 'draconian cuts' in state aid. The highest County in the state, by the way, for two years in a row in terms of cuts to state aid.

So we appreciate the resolution. We were actually in Trenton this morning. We were testifying at the first of two Assembly Budget Committee hearings. And we will also be testifying at two Senate Budget Committee hearings. So our students joined us and also a young lady, Gianna Danielle, who will be speaking tonight. I had the pleasure of joining her and some of her PLE students – really represented Toms River Schools in impressive fashion. Very proud, you know, to be part of it.

So in terms of really impacts, and I'll just try to be brief. What does it mean to...and I'm also joined by Superintendent of Bricktown Schools that are also going to be significantly impacted. But Toms River alone, we're looking at an \$83 million cumulative loss in the next six years. \$2.7 (million) alone this year on top of the \$2.4 (million) last year. This year we're looking at finding over 80 positions for year one and over 400 positions in the next five years thereafter.

We're looking at doing everything we can just to maintain mandated programs and looking at possibly and likely eliminating and reducing non-mandated programs including full-day kindergarten among other things.

For us, and as a Superintendent along with the Board that have worked so hard to just continue a long tradition of building an outstanding school system, it's pretty disheartening. We hope that our testimony today, and in the past, hasn't fallen on deaf ears and that they hear us and they heed to some of the requests we're making.

Anything that the Freeholders can do in addition to this, we'd be very grateful. But I want to thank you, Freeholder Vicari, for really putting this together – really acknowledging what the impact is on – on what you say is a great County, and it is, and a great school district.

So, we want to thank you and on behalf of my school district that we thank you very much and thank you for giving me the time to speak."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you. On behalf of the Brick Township Superintendent of Schools – your name."

GERARD DALTON, SUPERINTENDENT OF BRICK TOWNSHIP PUBLIC SCHOOLS: "I'd like to also offer my thanks for your support. Freeholder Vicari reached out to me. I actually got to meet you last year for the first time at the 'Teacher of the Year' breakfast and your continued support is very much appreciated. Hearing about education from this group is a wonderful thing to hear, but we are looking at devastating effects. For Brick Township Schools, we are looking at a cumulative effect of over \$40 million. This year alone is \$2.7 million. I'm looking at the elimination of jobs for people, and that's another big concern too. We're talking about taking people out of work. Large class sizes – so much so that I'm concerned that we can't even fit the children in the classrooms if this continues at this point. And we all know that schools are the backbone of any community.

You've all spoke so eloquently today about the pride in our educational system. Our continued work, all of our school districts with Ocean County College and their level of support of us in the 'K-12' setting has been amazing and continues to grow.

But our concern is, 'What is this going to look like if this continues a few years down the road?' So when Freeholder Vicari reached out to me and we had multiple conversations on this and offered support, I willingly took that support because this is all of us together and we need to move this forward and make sure that our voices are heard at the state level.

I've been working very closely with Toms River. We will speak to anyone who will hear us. We've been to the Governor's office. We've been to Senator Sweeney's office. We will go...I joke...I worked in Mercer County for eight years in the school district. I've been to Trenton more times in the eight months that I'm working here, than I was in the whole time I worked in Mercer County. But that's okay. That's our job. We take on that responsibility. We thank you for taking on the responsibility that you take on and we thank you for your continued support."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you very much. It's very sad that I think Ocean County still...it always was the fastest growing County. And I think it's continuing to be the fastest growing County in the state. And for us to lose the funding is absolutely, just unheard of. I mean we had 11 schools that got funding and 18 schools that did not, and some of them... our largest school districts didn't receive funding and it really is unheard of.

So I'm hoping...and I understand just one comment I'll make on this that Bayonne, nothing against Bayonne whatsoever, but apparently they received \$7 million in 'pre-k funding' last week. It just doesn't make sense to me when we are growing down here. And I'm not sure whether Bayonne has grown or not, but if that's 'pre-k,' what about our students that are K through 12 that are down here in Ocean County, when, and as I said, to me, we are still the fastest growing County and we're going to continue to grow so it's still very important that we get our funding.

And I'm very glad for what all of you are trying to do to restore the funding. So, hopefully, they did not fall on deaf ears and that something will be done to correct that because it affects all of the taxpayers in Ocean County. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I'd just like to make one brief comment to what was said on those two resolutions. And as you know, I have a passion for education in Ocean County. And I also taught in different areas of North Jersey before I came here so I could compare what has taken place. And what we're talking about is 'equality.' Why should the students in Ocean County be treated unfairly and not be given the same opportunity because of your zip code – because you live someplace else. And if you live up in North Jersey, you get substantially more money and the students are getting more opportunities.

The people in Ocean County are hard-working people – middle-class people. And they come here with their children – with their families – they want to raise their families. Now we've seen with the two school districts - Toms River Regional and also Brick Township – we are going to take money out of a struggling community where people are talking about putting food on their table - paying their mortgage. So you know something? You wouldn't have to go to the college you want to – you'd have to make compromises. It's totally unfair and I'm getting tired of it.

And before I was a Freeholder, I served with another Freeholder by the name of Senator Len Connors. Fortunately, Freeholder Little was on his legislative staff and we were fighting for the same thing – equal opportunity – fair funding formula.

Two out of three school districts in Ocean County are losing money. It's more than losing money. It's creating a hardship in their township. It's going to create adverse conditions for their businesses. It's going to create adverse... increase...I'll be honest with people, blunt...the prime rate is going to go up. Why? The students are not being challenged in schools. They're not given equal opportunities.

So you know you pay me now, you pay me later, and that's what's going to happen. Going back several days ago I was interviewed by Chris Lundy from one of the on-line newspapers about (Route) 166. I was very blunt. I said, 'You know, 166 should have taken 12 months. It took 48 months.' He said, 'Why?' I told him why. And as a teacher I'm going to summarize it. I'm going to make it very clear. Okay? Go back, remember when...going back Governor Corzine made some statements and whatever. So I'm not going to say what the statements are but this is what I told him. And I'm going to repeat it now. 'Unicorns will fly over Ocean County before the people of Ocean County are treated fairly by the State of New Jersey.' Anyone in this room can disagree with that. For 40 years,

look at our road system – look at our schools. You're telling me that the students in Ocean County can't have good schools like in different parts of the State of New Jersey? We can't treat our teachers fairly. We can't pay them a decent salary. We have 'C' students suffer whether it be special needs or gifted and talented to reach their full potential. Why? Because the State of New Jersey refuses to do their job. Let them do their job. Let them treat people fairly. Why is it taking so many years, year after year? You know if you solve the problem this year, what about next year? We need a long-term solution to solve the educational formulas that have taken place throughout, not only Ocean County, other areas also.

We're talking today only about the two school districts that requested to come here. They didn't say Jackson or any place else, but there's still other school districts. So we want to be very fair, and that's what it comes down to.

You know I just read the letter from an Assemblywoman that's a former Freeholder – friend of Freeholder Director Haines – Freeholder, and now Assemblywoman, Serena DiMaso."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "She's an Assemblywoman."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "She's an Assemblywoman. And you know what she said? 'How can the State of New Jersey, two weeks ago, find an extra \$1 billion in their budget?' With a 'b,' \$1 billion. How can the State of New Jersey raise taxes so far this year by \$2.5 billion and increase spending by \$4 billion but not give the two school districts here from Toms River and Brick equality? Why is there such an inequity? And you know something? You're very calm because I want to see you get angry. I want to see you get mad like you did when you were on that bus and you went to Trenton. You did the right thing. You represented the students that you represent and I appreciate Joe Nardini, the President of the school district coming here because he has a passion of doing the right thing. And that's all we want. It's not political. It's not Democrat or Republican. It's treating our children fairly and decently. And so they can increase their opportunities and give them the tools that are necessary for an economy, in a global economy, that's growing very rapidly.

We have to make those decisions. And if not now, when? As President Kennedy said many, many years ago. And this is the time where it's going to have to stop. The message has to be loud and clear. I want you to know that this Board of Freeholders supports you, not only 100%, but we want to see these changes made, not only in Ocean County, but throughout the State of New Jersey.

And I want to thank you for coming today. And please bring this message back to the Board of Education tonight when you have your meeting. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you."

S. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 5:04 PM, Freeholder Director Haines asked members of the Board if anyone had comments. No comments were received, therefore, the Director closed Freeholder Comments.

T. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 5:04 PM, Freeholder Director Haines opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRECTOR HAINES: "And we'll now go to public comments. Those that would like to speak, come and make a comment, please step forward – give your name and address and we do have a 5 minute time limit.

Mr. Mastroberti, if you would like to come up. Now you have the opportunity to come and speak before us."

SAL MASTROBERTI: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "You're welcome. Just again, your name for the record."

SAL MASTROBERTI, 17 BLACKPOOL WAY, TOMS RIVER, OCEAN COUNTY: "Anyway, there was an article in the *Asbury Park Press* about three weeks ago, where the Democrats want to keep President Trump's name off of the ballot. I don't know if you gentleman and lady can do anything about it, but I think that something ought to be done to prevent them from doing that. After all, we are all here to...whether we like the President or not, his name does belong on the ballot because he's the President."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Well I do think that there is an organization I know that...there's a couple that are working on that, but just understand, there is nothing in the law that states that it's necessary...it's for... because they want him to show his income tax return. And there's nothing that states that you have to do that in order to run for office.

You know, they go and do something like that - are they going to also do it for the Governor? Are they going to do it for U.S. Senators? Are they going to do it for the Assembly, the Senate? They're going to do it for Congressmen and everybody else that runs for office? Are they going to make them show their tax returns? It's like saying if someone's eyes are blue they should not be able to be on the ballot. It really would be something that's unconstitutional. I'm sure if they tried to do it, and if they do pass something like that I'm sure it will be fought in court. But I'm sure that President Trump's name will be on the ballot next year."

SAL MASTROBERTI: "Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "You're welcome. And thank you for coming and speaking before us. Well, this other gentleman is going to speak first and then...no, the gentleman in the blue. If you just give your name and address again. Thank you."

JEFF FACKENTHAL, 316 CURACAO STREET, TOMS RIVER, NJ: "Okay. With the BASF site, they have determined that they're going to be there for the next 20 to 30 years still fixing the plume under Toms River, the Ciba-Geigy site.

And since they're going to have wastewater management there already...and the way that the northern end of the

County is growing particularly Lakewood, northern Toms River, Jackson area, I would suggest purchasing that property that they want to get rid of because they want to release it and sell it for property or you know, for income tax purposes or whatever. I want that you would put a combined sewer wastewater treatment plant on that property and have a reservoir there. Because with the 'Kirkwood Cohansey Aquifer' right underneath, it's in the middle of that County right there. If you had a reservoir right there it would filter the water...Alright let's start...with the combined wastewater treatment, if you were to send it to the reservoir and just let it perk down into the 'Kirkwood Cohansey,' it would extend the life of the reservoir which is currently not replenishing fast enough. There's reports that it will dry up before too long if we don't do something. If it's allowed to dry up, the saltwater will intrude and it will go a lot faster than a lot of other properties.

So the combined wastewater treatment plant on that property could be like, on the order of, say like, a kitchen or bathtub sink. You could put all that wastewater treatment water into that reservoir and build a pipeline, which is already in place because you have it from Ciba-Geigy...it goes all the way out past...it goes about a mile out into the ocean and we could discharge there.

So if you had a spectacular rain event, you could have all that stormwater from that northern quarter of the County go down, sit into that reservoir, and if it need be, you could open that up and you could push it out past the...the Army Corp of Engineers, they want to try and close it in. They want to try to close in the Barnegat Bay."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "The outfalls?"

JEFF FACKENTHAL: "That's the back-bay study. They want to try and close in the bay to prevent the stormwater surge coming up. You know, they could probably close off most of the bay except for extreme south down near Little Egg Harbor from their plan.

So, you know with all this going on, I don't know why you wouldn't take that piece of property and utilize it and this way you don't have a 'Sandy' repeat. And you know, that property you could do other things on there. You could put a school for agriculture on there. You could grow fish or you know things to help the bay replenish stock, etc. To me not purchasing that piece of property would be an opportunity lost for the future."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you very much for your comments. We really appreciate it. Is there anyone else that would like...yes, just your name and address?"

STEVEN BRILL, 806 JENNY COURT, EVERGREEN CONDOMINIUMS, BRICK: "It's been about a year since I appeared before you regarding the severe increase in noise that has resulted from both the Interchange 91 and the integrated, interrelated Garden State Parkway Shoulder widening projects.

You have accomplished nothing in the intervening months. Not one decibel of relief for Evergreen Woods homeowners. I wanted to know why, so I submitted an 'OPRA' request for a copy of the letter approving the Interchange 91 project for Categorical Exclusion from the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration.

Upon reading that document I found that Evergreen Woods Condominiums was not mentioned for sound mitigation. Burrsville Road was mentioned and some other miscellaneous areas – not Evergreen Woods!

To my surprise, Cherrywood Condominiums did not meet the NJTA requirements for a sound barrier based on the number of affected homes and yet they received one. That determination was made using a sound study that occurred on one day in June 2005 for a total of 6 hours! By the way that sound study was not finalized for another six years in 2011!

And the Categorical Exclusion letter was dated 2009! This explains why Evergreen Woods Condominiums appeared in the 2011 sound study but not in the 2009 Categorical Exclusion letter. Was Evergreen Woods purposely excluded? Well reading this sound study report, I can see why one might omit Evergreen Woods Condominiums.

The single monitoring station within Evergreen Woods was located in a wooded area not in the clear as required. The report also failed to model the impact from 38 feet of Garden State Parkway shoulder-wide clearing and the creation of an auxiliary lane to connect with the Interchange 91 project.

It also undercounted the number of homes that would have benefited from a sound barrier. Instead of 14 homes, it should have used an additional 16 homes. So that \$1 million noise wall cost should have been divided by 30 for a total cost per home of \$34,721 placing it under the cost cap of \$50,000 per home.

As for the other excuse regarding the unnamed tributary, all that was required was to extend the existing concrete conduit underneath the wall. I strongly suggest that you investigate why Evergreen Woods Condominiums was denied a sound barrier based upon the 2011 Sound Study and Cherrywood Condominiums under sound barrier policy which did not qualify, received one based upon the 2009 Federal Highway Authority Categorical Exclusion letter.

The Ocean County Engineering Department and the New Jersey Turnpike Authority failed to verify the accuracy of the pre-construction Sound Study for Interchange 91 with an after construction verification study. And the New Jersey Turnpike Authority on purpose did not study the Parkway highway expansion and shoulder widening in the Evergreen Woods Interchange 91 area as required by NEPA regulations where an Army Corp of Engineers Federal permit had been issued.

I demand that the Ocean County Freeholders and the New Jersey Turnpike Authority and the State Department of Transportation who submitted the premature application for the Categorical Exclusion get together to remediate the noise at Evergreen Woods Condominiums.

In summary, I expect more than silence from you! I brought a binder documenting everything I have stated and I have a copy for you and for the press if they want one. "

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you very much."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "If I may just for the record, Mr. Brill, we spoke many times about this. And this goes back many, many years that this Board of Freeholders has continuously recommended the appointments on a voluntary basis to the Parkway Authority and now the Turnpike Authority on numerous times, there is no representation. Most of the Garden State Parkway is in Ocean County, as you know, and there's no representation. When we did make progress, we had representation such as the Chairman of the Parkway was Joe Buckelew and we got tens of millions of dollars, if not hundreds of millions of dollars' worth of improvements. And at that time, even during Governor Corzine, I realized it's a political appointment to recommend a Democrat, a leading Democrat, Russell Corby. And it was unheard. And when you came, I said, that was several years ago, I said, 'If there was an appointment given in Ocean County I would recommend you to serve as a Commissioner.' Correct?"

STEVE BRILL: "Yes."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "What happens is they do not pay attention to us in Ocean County. Whether it be the roads on (Route) 166 and Route 9. Whether it be as you just heard from two schools districts, Toms River and Brick. We are the step-child of the State of New Jersey. We do not get anything from the state. Okay. We are a donor County. We get nothing. Okay. And we go there begging for whatever we want and maybe we get the crumbs off the table, in plain English. That's what it comes down to. And that's why I made those comments. I'm not being sarcastic. I just want you to be honest. And I spoke to you many, many times about this. We looked at it. I don't know what else to do. Every time you gave us the information, we sent it in total to the State of New Jersey and to the Turnpike Authority and the Garden State Parkway. If there is something else we can do, I'll do it. I spoke to the mayor many times, Mayor Ducey. You went there many times also. The Council looked at it. I am sympathetic on what you were talking about but there is very little that I can think of that I can do at this particular time. If you can think of something, a letter or whatever. You send me a letter and I will send it to the Turnpike Authority. And I think that's more than fair. Thank you."

STEVE BRILL: "Okay."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I will tell you I'm...because I also know Mr. Brill and thought we might make some progress and we did write and we passed resolutions. And Mr. Brill took the time to write. We thought we were making some progress but the Authority has not done anything to remediate and I agree... I have to tell you again, it's not our project. You know, we're an advocate for you and we will continue to be. And I'm embarrassed that we got nothing accomplished. And you sat in my office as a gentleman with myself and the Engineer - thought we were making some progress but really nothing came out of those meetings at all. Nothing came out of that at all. And we did try then again, Joe. As you said, we just weren't treated, in my view, fairly at all.

I have no problem writing another letter but I will tell you right now, face to face, I think it will do us as much good as it did last time."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "I just want to make one comment. I'm fully understanding of what you're saying because I know when I was in the New Jersey Legislature representing this district, we met with the Parkway Authority on another area which is, 'Dover Walk.' And it was at that time it was going to cost \$1 million a mile. And they said you needed to plant more natural things like trees. They refused to even consider, you know, doing that and that was many years ago when I was in the Legislature.

So the Parkway Authority...I think they choose the areas that they want to do...walls...when they're doing work on the Parkway and then other areas they choose not to. I don't understand why they do it but it seems our requests have gone, again, another thing has fallen on deaf ears.

So, of course as Freeholder Vicari and Freeholder Kelly had mentioned, we will help you. We'll just do another letter again to see what possibly we can do to help you. But I thank you for coming today and expressing your comments and leaving the information for us. We certainly do appreciate it."

STEVE BRILL: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR HAINES: "Is there anyone else that would like to speak? Come before us and talk? Do we have a motion to adjourn?

There being no additional comments received, Freeholder Director Haines called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 5:19 PM.

NARRATIVE FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

COUNTY OF OCEAN 2019

The Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders, with the assistance of the County Administrator, Office of Management and Budget, County Engineer, County Planning Board and the County Comptroller, has developed this six-year Capital Improvement Program and Budget. The Capital Improvement Program was developed with the cooperation and consideration of recommendations of the various County Departments.

The County's continuing growth requires that the Board of Chosen Freeholders anticipates and plans for the increasing demands for County facilities and services. The Capital Improvement Program was prepared to guide County investment in land, facilities and equipment through 2024. The Program and Budget will be adjusted each year to reflect changing conditions including new Federal and State legislation, variations in the general economy, emerging demands of the public and modifications in the growth rate which may result in changes in revenue patterns and demand for new facilities or services. The Capital Improvement Program is realistic and attainable within the financial capabilities of the County and it provides for the future needs of Ocean County residents.

The accompanying forms which comprise the Capital Budget and six-year Capital Improvement Program have been completed in accord with regulations adopted by the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey pursuant to powers authorized by NJSA 52:27BB-10, NJSA 40A:4-43 to 45. The Capital Budget forms list all projects scheduled for startup for the 2019 Budget year and the source of funding for each project. A summary of Anticipated Funding Sources and Amounts is also included. Please note that this summary shows funding needed for new capital projects. It does not include previous appropriations for projects to be continued in 2019. For this reason, the funding summary differs slightly from the total cost shown for the Capital Program.

The total cost of all Capital Improvement Projects over the six-year period is \$311,672,467. Many of the projects will be funded under State and Federal Grant Programs or through the annual Budget on a "pay-as-you-go" basis. The larger projects will be funded by short-term borrowing. Bonds will be issued at the most advantageous times to secure low interest rates.

Freeholder Director Virginia Haines opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Freeholder Director Haines opened the meeting by introducing Michael Mangum, the director of the Parks Department to discuss the renovations at A. Paul King Park in Manahawkin, NJ.

The Freeholder Director and Michael Mangum told the board that a new NJDEP approved pre-cast concrete restroom facility will be replacing the last of the Enviro-Vac units at the County park. The facility, sidewalks and grill area will also be upgraded to meet ADA compliance. The approximate project cost will be \$600,000.

Freeholder Director Haines introduced Freeholder Quinn and Anthony Agliata, the Planning Department Director to discuss the Household Hazardous Waste Program for 2019. Freeholder Ouinn explained to the Board that the disposal program, which is in its 30th year, is free to Ocean County residents, although they must pre-register. collection limits are 200 pounds for dry material, and 20 gallons total for liquids brought in containers less than 5 gallons each. There are 3 sites available to any County resident for drop off. Lakewood's collection date is 3/31/19, Toms River's date is 5/4/19, and Stafford Township is on 6/1/19. All times are from 9-3, and are located at each town's Department of Public Works.

Freeholder Vicari and Anthony Agliata spoke about the 2020 Census Program. The Freeholder explained that every 10 years the census is conducted. The accuracy of the count is very important because State and Federal funding is allocated on a per person basis. A committee will be put together over the course of this year in order to prepare for the April 2020 Census. Mr. Agliata and the Planning Department have been working for the past 6 months on GIS mapping for the area. The Freeholder mentioned the importance of reaching out to every senior citizen to ensure each one is counted.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda, which included the Recommendation to Advertise for the Reconstruction and Resurfacing of Portions of Certain County Roads, Contract 2018C, and the Replacement of curb and Sidewalk at Various Locations in Ocean County, Contract 2019. There was a Recommendation for Award for the Reconstruction of East County Line Road (CR 526) from Apple Street to Rte 549, Phase III, in Lakewood Township. The contractor is CJ Hesse from Belford, NJ in the amount of \$1,625,202.67. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the March 6, 2019 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 6, 2019. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Haines asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Vicari mentioned that he would like to see the Performing Arts Academy moved to the Ocean County College campus for the Fall of 2019. Mike Fiure told the Freeholder it's schedule was provided to the County indicating the approximate date of completion would be September of 2020. Freeholder Director Haines said that she was attending a function to honor Freeholder Bartlett at the college, and would speak with Jon Larsen about the completion date. Mr. Block said the sale of the bonds occurred in December 2017, after the required contracts were in place.
