DIRECTOR QUINN: "Why don't we approve the resolution and then I'm going to read the resolution. This would have been number one on our agenda had we prepared the agenda."

CLERK CILENTO: "But I prepared the agenda."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "You buried it in the middle, but we're certainly not going to take that and forget about it so why don't you just go through that and we'll vote."

CLERK CILENTO: "Should I finish the rest of them?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Do you want to do the rest of it and then we'll come back and do this one?"

CLERK CILENTO: "Yes, do you want to do that?"

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "No, let's do H-2 right now and I'll make a motion to approve H-2."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "I move to close the debate and I support the first move with a second."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Okay, then we'll take a roll call."

Roll call vote taken.

And on this one, you've done for my three years here, you've read them all. This one I am reading because this is very special."

CLERK CILENTO: "Okay, thank you."

Director Quinn reads resolution H-2 into the record.

DIRECTOR QUINN: "I'm going to go last. So I'm going to have the Commissioners go individually and we'll start with Commissioner Little because I know everyone has a few things to say and I can promise you they're all good."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "They are all good. And with pleasure, Mr. Director, thank you. One of the aspects of MAC which some of you may not be aware of although you heard the resolution, she kind of started over in the Planning Department and that goes way back to the time when George Buckwald, a former Freeholder, was Chairman of that board and I was Vice-Chairman and I would bring my son who was about that tall then. He is now six feet and he's a Navy Lieutenant and has been overseas. And MAC was always so gracious to him and my son certainly remembers all those times at the Planning Board.

One night my car wouldn't start and we had a big problem there and my son was crying back then and MAC put her

arm around him. And MAC was always so gracious at the Planning Board and that was my first experience with her. And then the years passed and I came here. And MAC it's been a pleasure working with you. You've been a good friend and I wish you many, many years of happiness and health in your retirement. It's well deserved. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Commissioner Vicari."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Yes and thank you. And MAC's office is close to my office and every time I pass by I always stop in usually and the topic of conversation is usually two things. One, we talk about grandchildren. And the second thing is, I say 'MAC, what's happening today? Do we have anyone that's asking for information for OPRA? We want to be as transparent as possible.' And automatically the answer is, 'Whatever the people want in Ocean County, we give it to them, we accommodate them.'

Like MAC, I've been here 32 years, 42 years, I think the important thing is that I have never remembered anyone coming to this meeting or getting a letter of complaint saying they weren't treated professionally, we didn't get the information we wanted, or we had to wait a long amount of time. In most cases, we try to get the information as quick as possible. And when people call the County offices we always take pride in getting a person and that's one of the reasons why the switchboard that we have now, it's not where you leave a message. But the second thing is that we greet them with the proper greeting. But I think the most important thing is that when they hang up that phone and we say thank you for calling, they realize they were treated as a person with dignity and respect and that's extremely important.

In all my years dealing with MAC, 32 years, I have never seen her lose her temper. The workflow is like tremendous. And she just goes continuously. And we want to thank you for setting the office straight, not just yourself, but to go into the Administrative Offices especially on, usually the meeting is on Wednesday – I call it 'Whacky Wednesday' – today it's a Tuesday because of the holiday - it is very, very busy. And she always has time even if she's doing two or three things at once, we interrupt, we ask her for information, and that's what makes our county the best county as far as being not only professional but in dealing with people. It's a people business. When you call up we treat you as a customer. We treat you with respect. And we want you to feel like you're the most important phone call that we get, the most important phone call of the day.

So good luck with your endeavors and I'm sure you are going to enjoy your grandchildren."

CLERK CILENTO: "Oh I will. I hope I enjoy them as much as you do."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "That's what life is all about. Thank you."

CLERK CILENTO: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. Well MAC, I don't even know how many years I've known you and it goes to way before...I don't know if I was in the Legislature then or when I was head of the Lottery or what...but I can remember many times coming to Carl's office and you were there. And how many times that you helped me through the years. And of course, then I became a Freeholder, now Commissioner. But everything that everybody has said is so true. You are a person who is so caring and I truly never heard you raise your voice, but I'm sure there's plenty of times that you've had that anger but you did so well in keeping it down. It was really good. And I see one of the fellow employees that had been here, Mary Lou Powner, who worked in the Clerk of the Board's Office...I can't even think of when...it was back in the 80's."

MARY LOU POWNER: "Oh my gosh, 1983."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "So it's been a very, very long time. There are so many people whose lives that you've touched that they have been very, very lucky to know you. I feel very fortunate to have known you prior to becoming a Freeholder, knowing you now, but always considering you a friend. I just had the pleasure of, because Clerk of the Board – I am liaison to that department, and I can honestly say you have been a true asset. A true person who has been there doing whatever is going to be right for the people of Ocean County and of course the Freeholders/Commissioners. It's very hard for me to say Commissioners because I'm just so used to the Freeholder term which I like a lot better. But I just can't thank you enough for the dedication that you have given to each and every one of us up here and also to the people of Ocean County because you don't just serve us, you serve the people of Ocean County. You've done an excellent job.

I'm going to miss you. But I know that you are going to be enjoying that time with your grandchildren, both those that live here in New Jersey and of course your grandchildren in Colorado. But all the best to you MAC. Don't forget that we're here and hopefully we'll get to see each other now and then, grabbing dinner, if we'll be able to. But all the best to you in your retirement and laying on the beach and learning golf and all the other things that you want to do. Just thank you, thank you so much for what you did for us."

CLERK CILENTO: "Thank you Freeholder Haines."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Commissioner Kelly."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you. I think it's interesting listening to the other comments this morning that two words have come up over and over. One was you never get angry and two was you're going to learn how to golf. I will tell you, if you learn how to golf you're going to get angry. (laughter) It will just happen. But one thing that shows just how effective, efficient, and good an employee you are is that your bosses from the Planning Board when they went to the Administrator's Office said there's one person we need to take with us from Planning and it was you. And your name came from the Planning Board, Alan Avery is the one that named you MAC. At first I didn't know what that name stood for and I was wondering how does he get MAC out of that? But then I understood it.

I've got to tell you that everybody said how good of an employee you are and you are a great employee, you're a great person, but what stands out to me is the conversation we had of why you are going to retire. 'I'm going to miss the job', you actually said and 'I don't know really know that I want to do this. But I want to retire while I'm young enough to enjoy my grandchildren. I'm young enough and I'm healthy enough and I want to spend time with them.""

CLERK CILENTO: "It's true. I want to be able to play baseball." (laughter)

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "And golf! So those are two great reasons to retire and I can assure you while you might miss the office a little bit, you will cherish the time with your grandchildren much more. Thank you for your dedicated service."

CLERK CILENTO: "Thank you Jack."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Carl."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "I am privileged to have known Mary Ann for a very long time. I know I came to the County 34 years ago and knew Alan as well. When Alan retired and I came over to the Administrator's Office, that was 11 years ago, and the two people sitting in the office were MAC and Debbie. And the question was, do you want to keep those two employees in there? Absolutely because I have known MAC for a long time. And I was glad I was able to retain and keep her on because she was that steady person. And I will let a little secret out too, some years later we were discussing about the person for an Assistant Administrator and we were kidding around and trying to think who in the county of 2,000 employees – who would be good? I will now on the date of her retirement give that credit that she came up with the name of Mike Fiure."

ASSISTANT ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Awe, thank you MAC!"

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Mike is there now."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "She says she's sorry! (laughter)

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "However, this is a great family but then again you are never left untouched because when Betty Vasil, another good Clerk of the Board and a good person, left, you know what? All the sudden all eyes turned around and said, the Commissioners said you know who a good person is for this job? MAC. So I lost a secretary, but the Board gained a very good Clerk. She has excelled everywhere she went. She has been a very good person working for, working with. And I know that she actually did struggle a little bit with the choice because she does like working, but as Jack said the right reason won out – spend time with your grandkids while you can. And I know you are going to enjoy it. I thank you for all the help you gave to me and what you have brought to the job and to me. So good luck and I'm jealous you got out before me." (laughter)

CLERK CILENTO: "Well, you need to do that soon too because you have lots of grandchildren."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Carl. MAC I know, I think you know how difficult it is to see you leave from my standpoint. I mean certainly what my fellow Commissioners and Carl have said is all so, so true when it comes to your work ethic and the job you've done here for the county over the years that you've been here, but I started here at the same time you stepped up to be the Clerk of the Board and I have to tell you how thankful I was because you welcomed me with open arms after a very difficult time after having lost John Bartlett and going through what the county had gone through. And it was a tough time for the county to get over but the welcome you gave me and the mentoring you gave me during those initial years, the freshman years, meant the world to me because not only did it mean the world to me as somebody as one of my coworkers working together, but as a friend. We built a relationship as a friend. And I remember a lot of the conversations we've had over the last couple of years always related to grandchildren because you and I are on the same page when it comes to that. But we truly are going to miss you. But thank you for everything you've done for this county and everything that you put into the years that you've been here."

But all those years ago when you had faith in me and you hired me and Alan Avery interviewed me, and I was going to take another job the next day when he called to say that I could come to work for the county and I said okay. I've enjoyed every minute working with all of the county staff here. There's never a day I didn't want to come. You make it difficult for me because I don't like to speak in public. But I've appreciated working with everybody here.

I started first with Jack (Sahradnik) and Gerry when we were doing Planning Board. And I've met just about everybody that works in the county I think at some point or another and it's always been a pleasure to work with everybody. I hope I made the right decision. But my grandkids think I did. Thanks."

R. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:26 PM, Director Quinn received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Okay, moving on to Commissioner Comments. Commissioner Little."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. I will run through our COVID report. We have 185 new cases overnight. That brings us to 74,084. Deaths that are associated with COVID - 2,076. And we do have a little discrepancy in that we had an additional death in a long-term care facility overnight, however, the state total for our deaths remains the same so they'll probably catch up tomorrow. I'll skip the breakthrough cases that Freeholder Kelly and the rest of the Board were talking about last week for the moment. We have 20 municipalities with at least one case, 20 out of 33 – Lakewood, Jackson, Brick are the highest. Long-term care facilities – 20 - 5,332 cases and that is 7.1% of all of the cases are in nursing homes and 719 deaths of our elderly residents in nursing homes which is 34.6% of the total. A very sad number of course.

Testing, we are continuing our testing program at Ocean County College and we have administered 30,341 PCR tests as of this week. And vaccinations, we are continuing our clinics and so far now we have vaccinated or administered 112,355 vaccinations through our Ocean County Health Department and of course many other private health care facilities or hospitals, etc., have administered others as well, but our Health Department has administered that number.

And with the breakthrough cases which many folks are actually very interested in at this point in time as the pandemic continues, we have 1,912 known, confirmed breakthrough cases in Ocean County. And in the last week we had 174.

It's a lot of statistics. But again, out of those breakthrough cases there have been no expirations documented at this time for anyone in the breakthrough cases. And they continue to, we have 7 hospitalizations in the last week. But again the symptoms and the health impacts seem to be reduced for those people who are fully vaccinated. So that's the good news, the positive news of this is although people may get infected after they've been fully vaccinated, the illness is not as severe. And as of this week now, of all of our new cases, about 13.4% are breakthrough cases — people that are fully vaccinated, about 13%. So that's something we all need to be aware of. And that is my report for today, Mr. Director, unless someone from the Board has any questions. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Commissioner Vicari."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Yes, thank you, if I may. The first item is that I just want to give an update. In April, this Board of Commissioners passed a strongly worded resolution opposing a 25% increase for New Jersey Natural Gas. And yesterday there was a public hearing by phone which I represented the county and I just want to report two things. One is it was before the Board of Commissioners and what I found very upsetting at the end was the way it was advertised. Besides myself, there was one other mayor and one other person in an area where they probably have over one million customers in the State of New Jersey. No one knew about it. Why? It's the way they advertised it. And it was so bad even the print was so small I couldn't even read the telephone number. So I made it very clear. I also stressed that when the gas company does a new line, a gas line, and when they replace something the road is in terrible condition. A year or two later – either it's a municipal road or a county road – it has to be done over again and it costs the taxpayers a lot of money. So again, I hope we get someplace but I don't know. But remember, utility companies have a strong lobbyist. They put a lot of money into the lobbyist companies, their consultants, into campaigns on state and federal levels.

So again, I hope we get someplace. But the 25% increase, they said 'Well, it's only for a senior citizen, it's only about \$30.00 a month.' I said, 'If you talk to anyone from Senior Services they'll tell you for the last several years before the increase a lot of seniors in Ocean County, 200,000 seniors, have to lower the heat in their house because they can't afford the heat.' And many of them for the last four or five years have been reporting they shut off the hot water! They don't have hot water because they can't afford to pay for the natural gas to heat the hot water! So it's either to put food on the table or the gas company. So I think it was unreasonable for them to ask for 25%. And it's the game they play all the time. They ask for 25%, they get 8% and they say, 'Well we did you a favor.' No they didn't do us a favor. In difficult times with COVID-19 this is not the time to talk about raising any kind of a fee or increasing any kind of utility rate in New Jersey and especially in Ocean County where the hardship is more so because if you look at the income level and you look up last year seniors got 1.2% that's all. And New Jersey Natural Gas, in my opinion, it's incorrigible for them to even ask for that high of a rate increase. So again, I hope we get someplace. What I am going to do and I decided today that whenever there is an advertisement for a rate increase and they want public input where no one knows about it, I'm going to put a little bit more effort into going to different organizations which is difficult by using Senior Services and getting more people to complain on the phone and especially given the human condition of how much of a hardship it is for them to say it's only \$30.00. And one of their answers was, 'Well there's the ratepayer and there's the stockholder.' And basically what they said was well we have to take care of the stockholder.

And a lot of the money for the increase is going for the Southern Reliability service. That is the pipeline they put in which they said was going to pay for itself. Well, that also was a capital program that's going to have to be paid for with a new rate increase that will have an impact on all the residents in Ocean County.

And the last item, briefly, is that we are very fortunate with the storms that took place last week. They went around Ocean County. There were fourteen, I believe, counties that were devastated. As of today I checked again with JCP&L – in our neighboring county in areas that are less than an hour away, there are over 200,000 people that are still without electric. And one of the problems which we have never spoken about before and it's very, very unusual, it wasn't just the short period of time when they had severe rain which was devastating, but is also what they call a straight-line wind. It's right before a tornado. When the wind goes in one direction from 57 mph to 100 mph and it can go as far as 200 miles. And that's what, according to representatives of Jersey Central Power & Light, caused most of the problems. So we were lucky. Fortunately for us it didn't hit Ocean County. But again, it's something that we have to be prepared for. And whenever I talk to a utility company like JCP&L and I oppose their rate increases, but I say you have to be resilient to handle storms – ice storms, snow storms, wind storms, whatever the case may be. So I'm not against rate increases, I'm against how the increase is being utilized. So again, we feel sorry for our neighboring counties. Basically Monmouth County and Burlington County have suffered again.

And one of the things that has happened, a lot of cars were covered with water. And I'll tell you what's going to happen in five days. It happens every single time. The people get their car, they wash it down with a power washer and you'll see the car for sale cheaper than ever before because they can't manufacture cars because of the microchips (shortage). So what we do in Consumer Affairs, of course, we give out warnings for it because there is a shortage of used cars. But it always happens because there are no microchips, the cars will be on sale and you're going to say, 'Well why is it \$2,000 or \$3,000 below market?' Because you couldn't sell the car if you wanted to, it's illegal in the State of New Jersey if a car is submerged in water unless you tell a person and use it for parts. So that is going to be a new existing problem that we do have. So again, not only do the people experience hardships but sometimes they purchase a car without knowing what's taking place and we want the consumer to be aware of that. That concludes my report at this time.

I know we have a lot of other people so I'll continue at the next meeting with an update of what's taking place in tourism. My goal is, next year, to increase tourism to \$6 billion. When I first was elected it was like \$2.5 billion. One

of the problems that we do have is a labor shortage of everything. And that's a serious problem we have right now because of the stimulus that we had, many people that could work or were able to work would not work because they received more money staying home than working. That concludes my report. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you. Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. First I just, again thank you MAC for everything that you've done for us. The other thing is sort of a sad thing. Many of you may know Laura Benson. She is our Assistant County Counsel. Unfortunately yesterday her sister-in-law died in a tragic automobile accident and I'm asking if you would all just keep Laura Benson's family in your prayers. Of course it was very unexpected and she had to fly out this morning. But it's a tragic, tragic thing to happen to lose any family member. But of course, Laura has been our County Counsel for a very long time and so if you could just, as I said, keep her family in your prayers because it's a very difficult time for her brother and the children and things such as that as well as the rest of the family. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you. Commissioner Kelly."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "No further comments."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "And I have no comments other than to say thank you again to MAC. And with that, I will open up the floor to public comment."

S. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:37 PM, Director Quinn opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public, as follows:

DIRECTOR QUINN: "If anyone would like to speak, raise your hand, come up to the microphone and give your name and address."

JOE AMORE, SILVERTON ROAD, TOMS RIVER: "Good afternoon. And I guess I would be remiss if I didn't congratulate MAC who I have never met, but that was quite a ceremony. I'm sure everybody made clear you deserve it."

CLERK CILENTO: "Thank you."

JOE AMORE: "I'm sorry to be dressed so casually but I'm on my way to physical therapy from here. So I wanted to make a brief, unscripted comment about the moratorium on evictions since I am a landlord. It sort of mirrors the mire that we had and still suffer with I guess as a result of the unemployment fiasco. But here's a classic example of how tenants can game the system.

My two tenants which happen to be in Holiday City have Social Security, they can afford their rents, but they just decided not to pay anymore. One of them is not even on a lease anymore. He's on a month to month, but he said he's not going anywhere. And this is just for the record, so if there is any media here you can report this. But the one tenant whose got his own business has just decided unilaterally that he's not going to pay rent anymore until I don't know when quite honestly. But when I offered him, and both tenants quite frankly, the opportunity that I would fill out the forms for them for County rental assistance they took umbrage about the fact that I was going to pry into their personal financial lives and refused to cooperate. They don't want the money. They don't want to disclose any information about the fact that they can afford their rent. So these people are really playing out the game. And I guess it goes back to the same thing as the issue with the unemployment benefits. There's just no regulation as to who is eligible and who isn't.

So I am out thousands and thousands of dollars worth of rent. I am very fortunate, my partner and I don't have any mortgages on these couple of homes. But for those who do, this game is going on. And I don't know what the answer is, but there is a reason to make some awareness to the folks who just decide arbitrarily to take advantage of the system. Now I hope I made a little bit of awareness of it, but that's really all my remarks are for today."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Mr. Amore, you're in a very unique situation because we've had people come before us where it's in the opposite situation where the tenants want to do the paperwork and the landlords aren't willing to talk about the paperwork. So we are seeing a lot of these situations occur. As you know, the Rental Assistance Program we have – we're running the first one right now which is \$18 million, and the second one which is going to be starting up next month is \$19 million. I think, and I'm not a lawyer, but I think your only way of going at this point in time would be to file the paperwork to go into court for an eviction because the outfit we're using for the Rental Assistance Program also have people in the courts themselves from that outfit so that when they go before the judge, the judge is ordering the people to go over and talk to the rental assistance folks to get the money caught up. Otherwise, if they don't cooperate you're going to have success in getting yourself an eviction and at that point in time you'll have a judgement if the people refuse to go back and do that."

JOE AMORE: "Let me interrupt if you don't mind..."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Sure."

JOE AMORE: "...because we considered that and we certainly understand that we can get a judgement. But if you get a judgement in September or October, what do you do when you get to January when you can't get a second judgement? Your judgement is frozen."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "No, you can. You can go back in if they continue to be in default. But if you get the judgement...the judgement comes after going to court for the eviction notice. But if you get the eviction, at some point in time the Governor is not going to be able to continue to allow this to occur and you're going to see the Sheriff's Department have the ability at that point in time to go back out and start evicting people. It's just a terrible situation. We've had people just like yourself, and most of them from our senior communities, come before us that are in that same boat and some of them have young people that just say, 'Well I'm just not going to pay rent. I don't have to pay the rent.' We've had people say, 'The Governor told me I don't have to pay rent.' But those are not the..."

JOE AMORE: "That's not my case. I feel, you know my heart goes out to those who simply could not afford it."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "They couldn't do it. Yeah."

JOE AMORE: "However, in the cases that I am dealing with and I know that I am not alone in this, they can't give any percentages as to really how this game is being played by the tenant. But when you have a tenant that tells you point blank, 'If you even come near this property I'm going to call the police on you.' And this guy doesn't even have a lease. But that's the way these things get played out. You know that, I guess, better than I do. But I thought I'd bring a little more attention to the matter."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "We appreciate you letting us know because it is happening throughout the state. And every time they extend that rent assistance ability or the unemployment, like Commissioner Vicari has said over and over in the last couple of months, it's hurt our labor force drastically because of that extra \$300 of unemployment money. So we had a summer where we could have had a real recovery down at the shore. We had a good summer. Don't get me wrong, but we could have had a much better summer if there was labor out there. But the Governor chose not to have that money disappear until Fall which is going to happen very shortly. But the rental assistance is the same way.

But we are doing everything we can to work with tenants and landlords willing to take and work together. Today I think we had \$220,000.00 additional on our agenda which we approved to give to landlords. Julie and Carl and Mike are doing this on a weekly basis. We've got, I think, 1200 more people in the pipeline that we are working on right now. So we want to help you, but we have to get at this point in time, the tenants to be able to cooperate unless you get into court and the judge orders the tenant to go over and sit down with the group Witt O'Brien – the outfit we are using – to take and fill out the paperwork and move forward from there. It's not that involved of a process. You're not really giving out a lot of your own personal financial information. The lease is the document which you have..."

JOE AMORE: "Well I'm not as a landlord. But the tenants want to conceal their information. That's the real sort of dark side of this. But I appreciate you giving me a forum. I had my comments."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "We wish you the best and if you do succeed in getting the tenant to cooperate, certainly reach out to us right away. We'll get the paperwork going."

JOE AMORE: "By the time I get a judgement against him it will be January and guess what? He won't have the \$10,000-\$15,000 that he owes me. That's all I'm trying to bring to the floor."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Try to reinforce to them that they can avoid that happening in the future if they just cooperate and fill out the paperwork because you will certainly qualify."

JOE AMORE: "Yes, thanks very much for listening to me."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you for coming in, sir."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "If I just may add something else to it."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Yes."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "And I've said it many times so I'm just going to summarize it. There was an economic summit that took place in Ocean County in the beginning of the year and I was on the panel along with Congressman Kim, Secretary of State of New Jersey and several local leaders statewide and two things they said continuously. And I want to quote, I'm not paraphrasing. Congressman Andy Kim said, 'Gaming the system. There will be people gaming the system.' And he was very forceful. He did a great job with it. He said, 'People will game the system.' Well they said something else. They read the regulations but people must be held accountable. And he said it time and time again. The problem was the State of New Jersey and the federal government had good programs, good intentions, but there were people, according to our Congressman, who were gaming the system as far as that goes.

And the Secretary of State that represented the Governor of the State of New Jersey intentionally said with the stimulus program 'continuously we're going to monitor it'. It wasn't monitored. 'We're going to hold people accountable.' They weren't held accountable. And unfortunately what it did, it encouraged people that wouldn't ordinarily do it as far as getting an unemployment stimulus check, a federal stimulus check, not paying their rent – people that had no intentions of doing it were looking at their neighbors saying, 'Wait a minute! He's not working.

I'm not working. I can live better not working.' And unfortunately, I'm not exaggerating, a lot of people, good people that had a good work ethic, after they saw all this money come – billions of dollars and trillions of dollars – decided not to work. Because why should I work if I can live better and then not pay taxes on it. And again, this was all said and it was all part of the documentation and there was a tape on it. It was filmed. I wish I could get a tape and I could show you some of the comments that were made by the Secretary of the State of New Jersey representing the Governor and also our Congressman said the thing better than I just said it. But they knew what was going to happen. They did predict it. It was a forecast that it would be an economic problem. I thank you for the input."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you."

JOE AMORE: "I'd like to politely be excused. I have another appointment."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Good luck with your physical therapy. Okay, just your name and address please."

CATHY STILLWELL, 950 BROOK ROAD, LAKEWOOD: "I'm here tonight to ask for your help. First of all, I appreciated Mr. Vicari's comment about the courtesy at the county level, the follow-through and that we are your customers. I appreciate that very much because I am retired. I was the Director of Construction and Director of Customer Care for Lennar which is a national health company.

I have had a project by the county ongoing in front of my home for almost three years now. The project started with clearing of trees that were left as 3-foot high stumps, ruts in my front yard and just a general mess to the front yard. Initially when it happened I was being advised that the work was going to be followed through that summer and they were doing a widening of my road, Brook Road, where it leads to County Line Road. They were doing a widening there and so they were taking property that was in the right-of-way – no issue. But they left it like that. Nothing happened in the summer. And with me continually communicating with the Engineer's Office, finally we got the stumps cut down and the grading done and we added a berm so that we had growth on it so that we weren't seeing all of this going on.

We were told that the work was going to commence then. First promised in the summer, then promised in the fall. The work couldn't begin in the fall because the asphalt plants were closed. It was going to begin the next spring. It didn't start the next spring. We came around to fall again with still this condition. The county did come and grind down the stumps and put in some mulch but that was it.

So I was told last fall that the work was going to be completed in March of 2021. So late February 2021 I called the County Engineer's Office and I was told I was mistaken, it was going to be completed by the end of March not begun by the beginning of March. Okay? So I waited.

Nothing happened in March. I called again. It's now going to be in May. It's going to be completed in May. The contractor showed up in May. When he initially arrived he told me it was going to take three days to do the work which I couldn't believe with the amount of work that was going to be done there. Three weeks later he was still working on it. He left the project in the beginning of June and didn't return. I didn't know what was going on. I figured they were coming back.

When they left the project, mind you, the road is torn up and patched. I took pictures so you can see it today. The road is torn up and patched. The storm drains that they put in, some of them are three inches above the pavement. When they left in June, I couldn't get one of my vehicles out of my driveway because the curb was so high at the roadway so I started calling again to the county. And I said, 'What is the timetable for this work being completed?' They were going to get back to me and let me know what the timetable was. Weeks went by with me calling to find out. Finally the county came out, put in the curbs that belonged on my driveway and they patched the asphalt so now I could get out. That was August 13th. Again, the contractor left in June.

I have been asking the county what is the timetable for this guy coming back and completing the work because I have pictures - there are barrels laying around, cement bags laying around, concrete structures laying around. It's all in front of our house on the other side of the street but it's distributed all along the street. As of last Friday the County Engineer's Office cannot give me a timetable for the work being done and cannot give me a timetable for the cleanup if the work isn't going to be done. So I'm frustrated about it. It's been two and a half years. It's been an ongoing thing. The last summer has been ridiculous. And I'm looking for a timeframe for when this work is going to be done and I still can't get it."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Would you stay after today's meeting? I'd like to meet with you and the County Engineer."

CATHY STILLWELL: "Sure."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "And we'll look at this today and I promise you will get an answer."

CATHY STILLWELL: "Okay. I appreciate that. Yes."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Okay. Alright, so John you'll stay after the meeting too? We'll go up to my office and I'll do the best I can to get to the bottom of this."

CATHY STILLWELL: "Okay, thank you for your time."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you for your comments."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Mrs. Stillwell. Anyone else? Yes, just your name and address."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI, BRICK: "Good afternoon Commissioners. This is my first time here. I have a couple of talking points. It is about election integrity. So for me to come here for the first time and speak for the first time, obviously this is a very important issue and I know I'm not alone in that.

What I did want to address is the decision by the Board to go with Dominion Voting System. And I am going to be doing a lot of referencing to the meeting on August 18th where Dr. Phil Nufrio, candidate for County Commissioner, made some points about this as well. I think he asked the Board a pretty simple question which was, 'After hearing the recommendation of senior staff in the Board of Elections and without public discussion, how was it that you were going to award the voting machine contract to Dominion?' And I just wanted to kind of follow up with other questions after that because the testimony afterwards from Mr. Holman, Chairman of the Board of Elections, he said that the Board of Elections only advised this Board on the purchase of the voting machine. But then he also said that senior staff didn't really want ES&S machines. And later in that same meeting I believe it was Commissioner Kelly, you did acknowledge that the Board of Elections did in fact have a completely different opinion from this Board on which machines to buy excluding of course, County Clerk, Mr. Colabella, and of course Frank Holman who was cited in several media reports about his support for Dominion.

Now the media reports said that the senior staff in the Board of Elections overwhelmingly recommend ES&S and they even referred to ES&S as superior in comparison and that's noted in several media accounts. But it wasn't just senior staff in the Board of Elections who expressed concern, it was also ballot security experts who had spent more than a year studying this purchase and evaluating competing brands for the voting machines. They said flat out that Dominion models would be less secure, harder to use for voters and more prone to mechanical breakdown. So since you all voted for Dominion anyway I just wanted to know if there was something that you guys knew that the election experts did not.

There were also election officials in Essex, Warren, Hunterdon, Union, Cape May and other counties who have chosen to replace their machines with ES&S models because they said the system has proven to be reliable, easy for voters, easy for poll workers and have been a major success. But again, since you all voted for Dominion anyway you must know something that the other New Jersey officials don't know.

There was also a gentleman who is on the New York State Board of Elections but he was interviewed and he flat out said that they rejected Dominion machines decades ago because they just were not safe. He also added that for some reason New Jersey brought the same machines in and the voters deserve better. So again, since you all voted for Dominion anyway do you think you know something about Ocean County voters and what they deserve more than we do?

Most of you asserted that you had no knowledge of receiving campaign contributions from Adam Perna and his company Election Graphics, both of which represent Dominion Voting System. But the media headlines between August 3rd and 23rd of this year tell a different story and these are just four examples I found. It said 'Ocean County pushing to spend \$10 million on Dominion Voting machine funds after receiving campaign contributions', 'County Commissioners to award \$2.7 million to purchase Dominion Voting machines from large political donor', 'Ocean County set to buy voting machines it's experts said not to', 'Ocean County GOP and Democrats battle over voting machines, pay to play claims', so on and so forth. It must be a coincidence that every article also provided identical dollar amounts in campaign contributions from Dominion to Commissioners, all of the Commissioners sitting on this Board, as well as the County Administrator, the County Surrogate, the County Sheriff and the County Clerk. It must also be a coincidence that all the reports cited that these figures came from official campaign finance reports and state records.

The members of this Board and Frank Holman maintain that the meeting of the 18th at least that the better and cheaper option was Dominion, but nobody was really transparent about the reasons other than a feeling that they were better. Mr. Holman did refer to the ES&S machines not having a ballot chain of evidence that was complete, but I don't know if ES&S didn't meet the standard for Governor Murphy's mandate - I don't know how they would be considered for the contract to begin with. Also, if in fact Dominion was the better option, I don't understand why the Request for Proposal issued on July 30th removed requirements for security measures, batter backup, transportability, ease of use for poll workers and voters and certification requirements by the Election Assistance Commission which is the agency responsible for certifying the equipment. So how does removing all of these items to accommodate Dominion make them the better option in your mind?

You know most of you also acknowledge irregularities surrounding the November election as well. Director Quinn, you went as far as saying that the voting machine decision would ensure that Ocean County races will continue to be safe and not fraudulent like we all know they were in different parts of the country. Yet this Board thought it was wise to ignore practical expert advice from the Board of Elections and the voting machine and ballot security experts and I'm just curious as to why.

Ocean County has been my home for the past 30 years. I think it deserves more than group think. I know those of you who own successful businesses probably wouldn't assume this kind of risk in your own organizations. And like Dr.

Nufrio said in his argument on the 18th it's about quality and not quantity or cost. And I hate to even bring this up but you know in Berkeley Township we're learning about how compromises like this can be very dangerous. You know I'm sure that the leaders in Berkeley Township thought it was a good idea to switch from wood to aluminum lifeguard stands in 2020 because they were cheaper and they were lighter and they made sense. But we learned that the lack of foresight cost the life of a 19-year-old aspiring Marine. They must have neglected to consider things and my argument is that I think the Board seriously neglected to consider potential disastrous outcomes that are liable for us by investing in a scrutinized company like Dominion.

And in closing I just ask the Board to reflect upon other things that might have been neglected to be considered in this decision. You know, did you consider the reputation of Dominion as the subject of national election integrity controversy since the November 4th of 2020? Did you consider the large portion of Ocean County's constituency that doesn't trust and continues to question Dominion Voting System based on its reputation? Did you think to include the public in this voting machine decision given the gravity of its importance? You know, maybe if there was a press release there would be more people who would volunteer for it. I'm not sure. Did you consider that the elections where Dominion machines are predominantly used are currently being audited in multiple counties throughout Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Texas and Wisconsin now? At the end of the day I just want to know how much thought and what was thought about from this Board by this Board to really consider the totality of the circumstances in this decision because to be honest, how Frank Holman simply put it, I guess the impression that everybody just did not like ES&S. And you can go to Mr. Nufrio's website. He has that meeting in its entirety on there. And these are things that were said in that meeting. So I would just be happy if we address that here today."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Mr. Director, I would like to address some of these issues. I was at every meeting. I was at every demonstration starting with December of '19. I was in Princeton. I was across the street for both of them.

To go back to a couple of things, Dominion has never contributed one dime to the Ocean County GOP. The information is erroneous. They went back over 20 years. The gentleman that you mentioned with the graphics company – it is not associated with Dominion whatsoever. It just happens to be another contractor who happens to work with doing the graphic part for the voting. That's the other thing.

The one thing is that last year's election, if you remember, we mailed out 445,000 mail-in ballots. The only people that used the voting machines were those that were handicapped. Everyone else had to go and fill out a mail-in ballot. The Dominion machines that we have, it's a Sequoia. We have had them since 19..."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "About 15 years or so."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Fifteen years we've had them. The company that owned Sequoia was not Dominion. It was a company that went bankrupt. Dominion bought the Sequoia. That is why it is under Dominion. It is not the same machine that has been used in all of the elections last year. And if anyone remembers, we did a mail-in ballot per the Governor of the State of New Jersey. Very few people voted by machine.

And the election integrity in the County of Ocean in all of the years that we have had our voting machines they have never, ever had any ballot or anything questionable happen with any of our machines. Since I was at all of them I felt that the no ink e-book that you are going to be signing in, that you're going to be using...and remember, we are only doing this because the Governor has ordered us to go and change machines. We would have stayed with the machines we had with no problem and we have never had a problem with our machines.

So the thing is that we have with the machines that we are working with, they're working well. I was, as I said, I was there. And we are not paying \$10 million for the machines. The State of New Jersey is reimbursing us and I think our machines are only costing..."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "\$900,000.00"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "\$900,000.00. So the information that you're getting is all erroneous. None of it is true. I attended them. I saw the ES&S machine and I saw the Dominion machine. From day one I liked the Dominion machine a lot better. I don't know the individuals for Dominion. I don't know the individuals from the graphic company whatsoever. My job is to make sure that we're going to pick a machine that I feel is the better one. If the employees at two different meetings – one they said that they liked it and the other one, it was split. I was sitting there. I heard what they had to say along with our County Clerk as well as our County Administrator heard exactly what they were saying. So some of the things that you have said, you have received the wrong information. If you wanted the right information you could have called my office. You could have come up and I would have explained all of that information right to you. But I have no problem with you coming here and saying it, but if you're going to go and state certain things at least state the facts and find out the true facts, not what you're reading on a website which we have already told the doctor that he was erroneous in what he had said. I would not make the County of Ocean buy machines if I did not feel that they were going to be the best machines for the people of Ocean County. My family has been in this county for several hundred years. I have maintained my integrity with anything that I have done in any of my positions to make sure that everything is done the right and proper way. And I take great pride in what I try to do for this county. And I do not like when someone comes here and questions the integrity of this entire Board with erroneous information."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "I don't think the information was erroneous. I mean these are allegations of criminal

activity and you said that. But if these are only allegations, why not have it redacted? I mean this is serious. And if they were true and donors to your campaign, why would you want their names? I'm just saying. You don't have any way of knowing. But if at the end of the day if you found out that these individuals did this..."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "But we have said this. We have said this. I can't help it if someone comes, like the doctor did, to several meetings to say that we took and contributions were made. I will tell you not one member of this Commissioner Board knows who contributes to any of the campaigns. We are not part of any of the finance part of any election."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "But you knew about the media allegations. You know how to file for a redaction. These are allegations about criminal activities. Why would you not have this kind of stuff removed from the media if it's incorrect? You have the opportunity to present information to the media outlets who reported it."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "But we say this to the media but whether they print it or not, we cannot control that part of it. All I can tell you..."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "If you tell them you will sue for defamation they'll remove it. They'll redact it. I mean, I'm just..."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "We gave the information exactly how it is. And it was not just myself, you had the County Clerk who is the one that has to do the ballot. What he recommends also is extremely important of what is going to be on the voting machine. The ES&S system was not going to enable us to put our ballot on, correct me and maybe Mr. Block who is a former County Clerk and is the County Administrator can give a little bit more of an explanation with regards to that. But I don't mind people coming in and asking us questions, but don't go and say these things that are erroneous. And this has been said to us by this doctor many, many times. We went and told him that it is not true, but he doesn't want to believe it. He puts what he wants on the website. We cannot stop that. This is a free country. People can write what they want."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "The reports also said that it went to vote and I think it was Mr. Block who blocked the vote for ES&S."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "He did not block the vote. He did not block any vote."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Well, that's what I was asking. Is that true? Maybe it wasn't you then, it might be..."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "I have no power to block any vote. Maybe the word block is used because it is my last name."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "It might have been that. Sorry."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "I think that....(inaudible) The previous speaker, the doctor, pointed out quotes from a Board of Elections meeting. He did not mention there that eight days later there was a second meeting in which there was discussion and in which the County Clerk, Scott Colabella, myself as the former County Clerk and Administrator, the Commissioner was there and there was another discussion about the voting machines at which time there was a formal vote taken. And that vote was the motion to approve Dominion. And a motion and a second in which Frank Holman made a motion and Rabbi Schenkolewski seconded it. The vote wound up as a tie, 2-2, because there are four members. That's all there are. And at that point there was a comment by Secretary Wyatt Earp who said...the Chairman asked him, 'Would you like to make a motion?' He said, 'No. This is only an advisory vote anyway so no, no thank you.' And that was the sum total of the vote. It came out officially on the record a 2-2 vote. So everyone expressed their opinion and that's fine.

I think you have to go back to, when you start talking about the elections, you have to first of all understand that any machine purchased in New Jersey, any county that goes to buy a voting machine and they are the only ones that buy them, can only buy those that are certified by the State of New Jersey by the Secretary of State's Office. And the Dominion machine that was purchased by Ocean County was just certified this year. It was one of the allowable options. And there were only four total. Avante which did participate and got certified. Hart, then ES&S and Dominion. And of the 21 counties in New Jersey, all of them have either ES&S or Dominion. There is no other machine. And right now, I don't have my folder with me, I think it was 9 and 12. So there are 9 counties that have Dominion and 12 that have ES&S. Well, that's pretty close to being even. And counties of both parties have both machines so it just comes out to be a preference.

On top of that, the machine that was selected is a paper-based system. It's not electronic. There is a direct electronic machine which is available – Dominion doesn't even make it anymore. ES&S is sort of a hybrid. Their machine, their XL has a board where there is a touch screen with a little card that has yet to meet the paper-trail mandate. But that card is printed by the machine, where the Dominion is hand marked by the voter. So if there is a recount, the actual voter's hand-marked (ballot) is a print on demand system. You go to the poll, and by the way I left out that it's only for early voting. The new machines are only for early voting. You go in and say I am 'Carl Block', you get an authorization from the electronic poll book that we're being forced to use, we'll go over to the machine and it brings up a Stafford 8 ballot – that's where I live, it will say okay I can push print and it will print me a ballot. I can go in the corner and mark it up with my hand, go over to the machine, put it in and done, it's down in that hopper. It is the custody of the Board of Elections. If there's any recount in the future, although they do recheck the machines, you can

hand count and site verify the paper ballot. That's what the argument across this country has been about, one of them, is that we have that basis to check. We will have that. I think that was something the Board wanted to try to make sure that we had a machine that felt that there was integrity and a way to check to make sure."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Did the ES&S not have the same paper print? You said a little machine that didn't have any printout?"

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "No paper. Their paper trail is you put in a blank piece of paper it's about this long, you put it into the machine. It sucks it up into the machine. You then go and push the buttons of who you want. I want 'Carl Block for Dog Catcher'. And then say okay I'm ready, it brings you to a paper ballot and it has been printed on by the machine like you are doing a grocery tape. The machine prints it. And you say okay it's 'Carl Block for Dog Catcher', I'm good with that. You push vote and it takes the paper back into the machine and it counts a bar code that was additionally printed on the machine. But you can't site verify the bar code because you don't know what that is. But you did see it printed. That was number one. Number two, the system is based on Windows 7 – that was put in the RFP. Windows 7 is no longer supported. So that seemed to be, our IT Department brought that up, is that a problem? Now, I'm sure and my understanding is that ES&S and I'm not going to say a bad thing about them, they have a good machine. They're a good company. They're big. I'm not going to knock their machine. And they're going to do certification (inaudible) my guess is. But that's what they gave to us in our RFP. So you have a Windows setup machine that didn't have a site verifiable, didn't have the paper in front of it. But it's not a bad machine. I'm not going to knock it. But the Dominion, they do the site verifiable hand filled out ballot in the hopper. And those 450,000 ballots that were counted last year that no one had a problem with and do you know what system they were counted with? Dominion. So when you look at the Sequoia machines that we have and they have been used and we tally them and you know who services them? Dominion. So there has been no question about any of this integrity prior to this election cycle and they have been servicing them. Those machines, some of them had to be replaced, (inaudible). But for right now, the only Dominion based system and it will be paper based will be early voting which, again as the Commissioner pointed out, we weren't looking to do that and didn't want to. Quite frankly, as a former election official, I think that was rushed. They didn't get enough time to let everything get played out and get everything planned well. But no, we were told we have to do it this year. There have to be electronic poll books. And they have to be sequestered machines. The machines we put out for early voting, at 6:00 PM on Sunday before the election early voting will end and those machines will be locked up. They will be transported to a warehouse in Lakewood and sequestered. They can't be touched until after the polls close on Tuesday. Well obviously then we didn't have enough machines. We had to buy more.

And because the state is mandating the purchase of those extra machines and all of the electronic poll books, the state is reimbursing the county for 100% of everything we buy because they mandated it. So the process, the certification, the purchase and the certification of the machines all is in the state's lap. I hope I cleared something up."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Okay. Yes it did. And just for the interest of time, I know there are some other people, if any of you are willing to speak after the meeting I'm not sure if that's even a thing."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Let me just say one thing because you are referring to a lot of articles that you keep referencing in your comments and you have to understand that unfortunately in the world we live in today the media is much, much different than it was 20 years ago. 20 years ago to get your message out there, to get people informed, you took out space in the newspaper. You sent out fliers, you sent out mailers. This whole thing started unfortunately about this donation thing with a website on social media where there was a story put out there and Dr. Phil picked up on it. And Dr. Phil is a very nice gentleman, but if you believe what you're reading in these sites you are on the wrong path because 99% of it is not true. We get attacked all the time on social media. We get attacked a lot of times on different sites that have picked up the story from social media. If you want to read something that is truthful, Erik is here from the Asbury Park Press, Dan is here. They make the effort to come to our meetings. They're informed and they are out there informing the public. But if we lived our lives worrying about what is put out there on social media, and I'm not only saying it in Ocean County, but you know even when you refer to the national elections, look what's going on around this country. You turn on channel 2, channel 4, channel 7, channel 5 – everybody twists the news the way that they want to do it. They're giving their narrative on the news versus the fact that this is really what...when Walter Cronkite was around...I'm a lot older than you are, but you know back in those days you had people that really reported the news. So we're living in a different world. But I can assure you when we saw the story that was put on media we had people in the organization go out and check the ELEC boards because if there was anything given it would have been returned. And that wasn't a path that any of us would go down. But like Commissioner Haines said, we don't get involved in campaign funding. We don't get involved in any of that stuff because we don't want to know about it. We got elected by the people and when we take our seats up here we represent all the people. We're not just representing our party. We're representing Republicans, Democrats and Independents in the county.

With the regards to the machines themselves, I took the time, I sat down and went through the demonstrations with them because I felt it was important to make sure I educated myself. That's the only way I'm going to learn. And at the end of the day the Dominion machine, knowing that we have the highest population of seniors in the entire state, the Dominion machine...and I'm up there. I'm in one of those senior categories now. It was the easiest machine for somebody to take and use. You are getting a ballot whether you want to punch it out on the machine itself or if you want to fill it out like we did on the SATs when we were kids. You fill it out, it goes back in and we have a paper trail.

We go above and beyond in the county here and Commissioner Haines really puts a lot of time and effort into making sure that security is there. Not only do we have to secure those machines that are out for early voting, we have to

secure Internet service, we're putting cameras in everything, we have Sheriff's Officers guarding all of our boxes around the county. We really spend a lot of money doing what we have to do, but it's to preserve the integrity of the election because we don't want to be compared to a lot of the other counties throughout the country where there have been problems. Our biggest argument I said to Dr. Phil a few times, in order to get to the point where we have election integrity at 100%, we need voter i.d. We need the ability for people to say okay this is who I am and we know that person has one vote, we all have one single vote, and that's your right as an American citizen to do that.

But we appreciate you coming in here, but I would just say don't believe everything that goes into these social media sites. A lot of these, whether it be the news media or whether it be...I trust Erik, I trust Dan, because they make the effort to come in here. And I'll tell you honestly sometimes their stories are written which we don't agree with, but they're telling the truth to the people that we represent that live in this county. But you are very passionate about what you believe in and I certainly thank you for coming in today."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Thank you for your time."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "And Mr. Director if I can add to Commissioner Haines offer, I'm here all day too. Any questions you have feel free to come into the office, call, any time we'll be glad to give you the proper information."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I would just like to say one thing. Just with the integrity, our IT Department has worked with the Office of Homeland Security on every single election. Every single election we are working with Homeland Security in regards to it. They have been partnering in the weekly Office of Homeland Security preparing this with the Early Elections Working Group, security meetings recently. The Security subgroup is combined with the continuation of operations subgroup. The groups discuss and plan for all IT security topics to include but not limited to network connectivity, hardware configuration, installation and physical security of equipment at early election sites. All election equipment has been certified by SONJ Elections and the Office of Homeland Security. Connectivity for the e-poll books will be provided by Firstnet which is the high-speed nationwide wireless broadband service dedicated to public safety. The voting machines will not be connected to the Internet at any time throughout the entire election process. The Ocean County Information Technology belongs EI-ISAC, Election Infrastructure Information Structure Sharing and Analysis Center which supports the cybersecurity needs of the election subsector. This provides access to an elections-focused cyber defense solution, instant response and remediation threat and the monetary cybersecurity awareness and training products. This is what our IT Department does besides what our Election Department does and everyone else that is involved, the County Clerk's Office also, is involved with the entire election process.

One of the things, I went to the training last week for the new e-books because that's what is in. I wanted to see how they work. I will be going to the training also for the new machines that are only going to be used for the early voting. One of the things with the e-books when you come in, it's just like if you're going to be signing like a credit card. Now I'm sure many of you when you sign, do you sign your real signature or do you do a very quick thing? Many people, that's how they sign it. Well, the poll worker who is there and if you sign it and it doesn't look like the signature that the poll worker is seeing, they can't ask you for i.d. unless they challenge the voter. So that is the only way we are ever going be able to make sure. So someone could go like this and unless the poll worker goes and challenges it and it's not matching, there is nothing we can do with regards to that. The poll worker has to ask. And there is a spot on the machine where the poll worker can hit 'challenge the voter'. That's the only way we're ever going to be doing it so that we can make sure that the voter that is coming in and his name is 'John Smith' – that it's going to be the 'John Smith' that he's saying he is because that signature should be matching. So that is some of things that I learned when I went to the new poll books which I'm very happy with just with the poll books. It was very easy for them to operate. And it's just now when the voting machines come in this is strictly, as Mr. Block stated, strictly for early voting only then we'll go back to the regular machines. But the poll books for you to sign in will be the new ones. And that is everything that the Governor has ordered us to do. And the State of New Jersey is now going to be paying for all 21 counties to change the entire election process. It's not just Ocean County. It's every single one is doing it. I just wanted to give you a little bit more of the information for the security of what we do here in Ocean County.3

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO, 68 DECATUR AVENUE, SEASIDE PARK: "I don't have COVID. I have a little touch of bronchitis so bear with me. Just two quick points. The New Jersey Law Enforcement Election Commission indicated that this Election Graphics did give money to not only the Commissioners, but also to the County Clerk. That to me raises a question of if you are getting some kind of money from some group that's connected to elections then that's a conflict of interest. I'm sorry, but it's a conflict of interest.

Point two, the lady mentioned the other counties that decided to go with ES&S for the same reasons, you know they just felt that the ES&S was a better machine with regard to the voter, etc. And I think in light of all of these questions on Dominion, Dominion, Dominion, Dominion, Dominion, Dominion, Dominion, maybe you should have pushed the pause button a bit and said let's not go into this right away and let's really carefully look at both of these machines before we make a decision. That to me would have been a better way to go. And with that, I will leave it at that. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Just briefly, we did do our due diligence. We went through the process as has been explained to you today as to why we made the decision that we made and moved on from there.

With regards to the issue about campaign contributions, Dr. Phil if you want to bring in anything that you can possibly get on paper and show it to us we will be happy to look at it. But in the beginning when this issue was first brought up with you, and just to be clear you are the candidate running against the Board in this November's election, but when you brought that up your comments were that Dominion made donations to all the people on this Board as well as I believe Scott Colabella and everyone else. Now you are talking about a subcontractor made contributions. I can't tell you because I've stated as well as everyone else has stated, we did not take contributions as far as we know nor do we get involved in checking who gives us contributions because it would be a conflict for us to get involved at that level.

Your other point...I lost my train of thought..."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO: "...the other counties."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "The other counties. When it comes to the other counties I think we made it very clear at our last meeting two weeks ago that the Dominion versus ES&S machines were pretty well split throughout the entire State of New Jersey. And that means that a lot of counties up north that are Democratic counties did go for Dominion. It's not a political thing. The ones that thought Dominion was better got Dominion. The ones who thought ES&S was better went with ES&S. The bottom line that I think I didn't bring up with this young lady here was I don't trust the bar code. I trust the fact that there is a ballot there that we know who filled out that ballot if we ever have to have a recount and we can take and make sure that those things are legitimate. And the bottom line is I don't disagree with you on pausing. If the Governor had said okay let's wait until next year and put this all into play next year, there is not a person up here that would have objected to it. But the Governor decided that this had to be rushed through and that we had to have it in place for this year's election which is why we are trying to get everything done, trying to get our people trained, trying to get all the people we need to be able to work the elections. But we do appreciate you coming in though today, sir. Sir, in the back. Oh, Sam! I'm sorry. I didn't even see your hand."

SAMUEL CAMMARATO, 269 TEAKWOOD DRIVE, BAYVILLE: "I come here before you to ask for your help here with two issues. First, the Berkeley Township Route 9 milling and paving. And next the Berkeley Township Western Boulevard expansion. I have to just, again apologize, I have to read this because my memory isn't as good as it used to be. In the 'used to' days it was very good. You know the 'used to days' when we used to do things? Today is a little different.

Route 9 from Beachwood to Lacey has been scheduled to be milled and paved for the last few years. I understand that Route 9 is a state road and not under your jurisdiction because if it was under your jurisdiction I know for a fact you would have fixed it in a second. It is also my understanding that New Jersey DOT had publicly stated that when the New Jersey Natural Gas had completed their reconstruction of Route 9, the New Jersey DOT would begin their milling and paving of Route 9. New Jersey Natural Gas has completed their repairs. However, currently on the New Jersey DOT statewide work schedule page there isn't any scheduled work for Route 9, Berkeley Township for 2021 and 2022. Mayor Amato and the Berkeley Township Council have adopted resolutions imploring the state to get this road milled and paved. I am asking for your consideration in adopting a similar resolution imploring, no demanding, the State of New Jersey order their contractor to get Route 9 milled and paved as soon as possible. We've endured driving on this mess for far too long. Thank you. And I would like to now..."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Sam, let me just address that real quick because I live in Lacey and we certainly went through exactly the same scenario with New Jersey Natural Gas digging up the roadways for probably the better part of a year. We don't know for sure when the state will actually mill and pave the whole road, but I have to tell you once they got the work finished in Lacey Township – all the pipelines in – the contractor that they brought in to take and do the restoration which unfortunately was only done on one side of the road from the curbline itself over to the center of the roadway - they did a fabulous job. And our argument down there was why didn't you just do the whole road? You had the machinery there, you had the equipment and all that to do it. But the answer we got was that they were only under contract to do what they disturbed which is why they did that.

But I think I'm sure we can try to find out when that phase is going to be done because I think Berkeley...I know it came through late last night and it was still being dug up down by just south of ShopRite. So I think there are still connections being made there. But certainly we'll put some calls in to find out. And no problem we will do a resolution for you without a doubt."

SAMUEL CAMMARATO: "Well again, our only concern was that – I apologize for the smart watch. It's not so smart! (laughter) Because it talks when it should listen. (laughter) But at any rate, what we are concerned about is that again the DOT stated that as soon as the work was done they were going to start, but there's not even a mention on their statewide page that lists all of the work that they're going to do throughout the state as you probably well know. And as the work is completed, it's taken off and as new work is assigned it is put on. There's nothing for 2021 to 2022 for Berkeley Township. But I thank you for that resolution that you will do."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "And we will do that without a problem. And if you have nine or ten hours after the meeting, I'll go through with you and name all of the promises that we have from the DOT that were never finished. But the DOT..."

SAMUEL CAMMARATO: "But we appreciated that you don't give up."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "No we will not give up."

SAMUEL CAMMARATO: "Good. Next I would like to briefly speak about the Berkeley Township's Western Boulevard expansion and again ask for your help in making that happen. Western Boulevard now dead ends at Northern Boulevard in Pinewald. If expanded with approximately 2 miles of an extension road, that would create an effective bypass of our current congested Route 9, a two-lane highway through Bayville, providing a more direct north/south route than the current route through Beachwood.

Now listen to this, in July 2011 a now retired Ocean County Engineer Frank Scarantino stated that the federal government is providing \$550,000.00 to see if such a route can be found. This company – PB Americas, Inc. of New York City would act as its consulting engineer on that project. My questions to the Board are first what was the results of that report if it was ever done? And whether or not we like it Berkeley Township is one of, if not the fastest growing town in Ocean County, an alternate road needs to be constructed to alleviate the congestion on Route 9. With that in mind, this Western Boulevard road expansion, in my opinion, is not a major construction project compared to highway construction and is only approximately 2 miles long and once built will be of a major help to eliminate congestion on Route 9 through Beachwood, Berkeley Township and Lacey. This project is I believe under your control. The residents of Berkeley Township and all the drivers that use Route 9 would greatly appreciate your intervention in this matter and will not forget your help in getting this Western Boulevard extension built. And I want to thank you for your kind attention."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "I'll just tell you that is a very, not controversial, but it's been tough. We've been working on that for years. And I've worked very closely with Mayor Amato and the County Engineer but one thing I don't remember right now is what happened with the study you are talking about under Frank who worked for me some years back as the County Engineer right before."

SAMUEL CAMMARATO: "Well this wasn't to say anything bad about the engineer."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Oh no, I know. I'm not saying that. I just can't remember is what I'm telling you. Did we get the report done?"

COUNTY ENGINEER JOHN ERNST: "We have a report. I can pull that report together."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "And will you please make sure that you do a synopsis of it at least and get it to Frank what it says. I just really don't remember. I remember doing it. I don't remember all of what happened with it and what it said. But I do know there are a lot of different reasons that it makes it tough for us. You said it's under our control. It is semi under our control, but we have to get many approvals – CAFRA approvals, Pinelands approvals and all kinds of other approvals. So I'm going to have to relook at that study myself to remember exactly what it said. It was done, as you said, a number of years back. So the Engineer will get that for us and do a synopsis of it."

SAMUEL CAMMARATO: "Again, I thank you and the Board. And I just want to end by talking about something different that was said earlier today. I'd like to thank Commissioner Vicari for your help in fighting this terrible 25%, and I had never heard of that and I'm in stuff all the time, 25% increase. People sometimes forget when they're working and they're in good health that senior citizens live on a fixed income. They can't wake up one morning when they get a bill that's more for their TV or for their gas or for their electric. They can't just say well you know what? I'll just work a couple hours more. There is no work for a couple hours more. They don't work. They're retired. And they're on a fixed income. And when prices go up that means that when they pay that, they have to now pay or give up rather something else. As you pointed out, either food or medication is first on the list that they have to either decrease or give up.

And finally, I've never met you but I can't think of a better reason to retire than to spend more time with your grandchildren. I know I do."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Let me just make one brief comment before you sit down on the Western Boulevard thing because Mayor Amato has reached out to us. Councilman Bacchione, Jimmy Byrnes, we spoke to a lot of them. And we certainly are not in any way not in favor of that roadway because Route 9 is a disaster. We all know that. We all do travel it every day. And I remember back in 2011 when Frank was involved because I was the Mayor in Lacey Township at the time and the idea behind the roadway at that time was to take and get traffic back there because you didn't have the interchange in Berkeley to get on the Parkway and we were trying to get traffic down into Lacey to get onto the interchange. And the problem that came up back then which we don't know if it still exists or not that's why I said to the Mayor and the rest of the Council members, we have to sit down and revisit these maps because all the traffic at that point was going to dump right into the main center of the school districts in Lacey and there was a lot of pushback from the families down there. Not to say that it's going to happen now because the interchange is there now and that certainly diverts a lot of traffic onto the Parkway in Berkeley versus going into Lacey. But I had a conversation as recently as last night with Jimmy Oris who is your Engineer down there and I had talked to Jimmy a while back about 'come on in, bring us the maps, let's sit down and figure out what we have to take and do to make this thing work' because we know now on the horizon there is actually somebody that wants to develop the shopping center and turn it into a redevelopment center. That's a win, win not only for Berkeley Township – ratables, jobs, (inaudible) to the county. We want to see that taken and put into play and see that site developed so that it's a showplace for Berkeley Township. You know, it's been sitting dormant for so many years. So Jimmy told me last night that he was going to reach out to me in the next couple of days. I'll set up an appointment and get him in here. But once we figure out what obstacles we have, we want to try to iron them out and then work as hard as we can to get this thing going."

SAMUEL CAMMARATO: "What else could we ask? I want to thank the Board again. Stay safe."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "If I may, just make two points before you leave. With New Jersey Natural Gas, the problem that we have without the senior communities meeting it is very difficult and for example I know you are one of the leaders, and we could not read the advertisement. I had a very difficult time yesterday at 4:30 trying to even dial the number because it wasn't very clear and I was not allowed to get on because there was a communication problem with the State of New Jersey Board of Public Utilities so I had to wait until the next session that went on.

The first session, I believe there were only two people of over a million people that are ratepayers in that area. No one knows about it because what they do intentionally, and I said intentionally and I want them to know about it, they advertise so no one calls up. Not one senior called up.

The second thing, as you know when I was Superintendent, Western Boulevard was an issue in 2005 and one of the issues that they spoke about was the (inaudible) Act. It was decided it would be a partner of the township, the county, the state and federal government and if there were any businesses there they would participate in a partnership. So therefore, the cost factor was extremely less than what the report said. So I remember the report and I remember what happened in Berkeley basically because the bus transportation would be made safer for the children of Berkeley Township. Thank you."

SAMUEL CAMMARATO: "Well I want to thank you again. Thank you all."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thanks Sam. Did you want to speak in the back sir? Okay, Jimmy and Doc one minute. Commissioner Kelly is going upstairs to meet with the folks that he has to meet with. He apologizes, but we do have other meetings going on so he had to try to stay on track."

Commissioner Kelly leaves the meeting at 5:37 PM.

JIM BYRNES, 219 DOGWOOD DRIVE, BAYVILLE: "First of all, I wish the young lady would have checked her facts but as a Berkeley Township Council member I really take offense to her theatrics that she's got to bring in the life of a young man into this conversation. That is sick. And I do take offense and she should have all her facts together.

Okay, first of all I want to thank the Commissioners and the Sheriff's Office for their presence on the bay this year with their watercrafts. Saturday there was a boat sinking there and they were there right along with the State Police, Coast Guard and the County had two watercrafts there. So that worked out nice and I hope it grows for next year.

On the Western Boulevard, we have been looking at the Western Boulevard. Also, if there could be a Hickory Boulevard bypass around the (OCUA) treatment plant. Alan, our Engineer has been looking at it and I'm sure once Jim Oris makes the meeting with you we will come in and talk about that. But until the state does something at that Mizzen intersection there, Western Boulevard is going to come right into a bottleneck there. And I know Berkeley wasn't invited to the DOT meeting on that stretch from Mizzen to the Parkway . They had a meeting there. So if we could get brought into that next time...

Out at Joint Base McGuire there are going to be up 13,000 Afghans out there. Last week I was asked to go down to Quantico and help out down there with Fort Pickett where I hear today that they are just coming in and out of the base. I was told I had to bring a sleeping bag because there weren't village for me. So I said, 'Well I'm a disabled guy. Sleeping in the woods is history.' But out there and I've been following it through, I've been calling Congressman Kim's office every day, and their plan is to release them to any family members that they have. So if they have a cousin 'Mojo' somewhere, they're going to be going there. And then they'll be releasing the rest as they come through. And I know Commissioner Director, we've had this conversation with Mayor Vaz. You know he's got a good eye on it. But I also did talk to Superintendent Trethaway from Manchester and there is one sending district for JBL schools. Well, they're talking about making five sending districts around the base now to send these young kids out to school. First of all, I don't know why they can't go to school on the base. And the county, between sending them out into the county which would really hurt our social services and now to impact our schools, you know there is definitely a language problem, culture problem and everything. But I've told Congressman Kim's office to make sure that they are diluted throughout the tri-state (area), not that Ocean County is a low fruit here so let's send them there. We have Governor Murphy and I heard Menendez and Booker today, that they've been out there and everything is beautiful. Well, I'll be out there Thursday. And I know that you have your finger on this as well as anybody else, but we really need to keep an eye on this.

There used to be a veterans, well it wasn't a veterans but it was a Base Honorary Commanders Group that came from the county and from what I hear they don't have that anymore. And we would have more of a presence out there."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "The Veterans and Military Affairs? Is that what you are talking about?"

JAMES BYRNES: "No it was an Honorary Commanders Group."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "They still have the Honorary Commanders Group but I'm not sure...because I know people that are Honorary Commanders."

JAMES BYRNES: "They still have it going?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "As far as I know, yes they do because I know Laura Rickett is one."

JAMES BYRNES: "Yeah, I heard that they might have disbanded that."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Not that I know of because they called on her to go out to one of the bases to work with them with the Afghans. But then what happened is they ended up because of what had happened, they ended up...they canceled it. But I know the Honorary Commanders are still called upon. But, Jim, what I'll do is I'll check with Laura."

JAMES BYRNES: "Yeah, if you would."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Because her son happens to be in the Air Force and he is on leave and he brought her new grandchild so she saw him for a couple days. But I'll check with Laura on that.

Just to also let you know before I forget is Congressman Smith was at a meeting at the Joint Base on I think September 2nd. He was there. Congressman Norcross was there and Congressman Kim, but if you would also like to get some...I know he doesn't represent Berkeley Township, Congressman Smith, but I was on the phone. He had called me last week or the week before about everything that was there. But I mean I would just give him a call and he might be able to give you also some more information if you know Congressman Smith. I know he does have an office, I think it's like in the Freehold/Whiting area. I think that's part of his district."

JAMES BYRNES: "I know he was working along with Congressman Kim."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "But he has been because he's one of the senior Congressmen and he's ranked number one or two in the country with getting legislation signed into law. Congressman Smith has, which have always been human rights things as well as other medical things that affected individuals – the legislation that he signed in. But I know that he's very on top of all this with everything that's been going on at the Joint Base. So if you would like to have more information, not that our other Congressman didn't give it, but if you would like to have more information you could always call Congressman Smith."

JAMES BYRNES: "I know he was a big help in Bricktown with the clinic. But whatever help we could get out there. And I have a pass so I'm in and out if anybody wants to go out. But I'll be on top of that. But thanks for everything you guys do. Have a good retirement. Believe me, it's nice!"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thanks Jim. Rich? Just your name and address please."

RICH ELLIOTT, VIRGINIA AVENUE, BAYVILLE: "First off I want to tell you, your Sheriff happens to be one of the best Sheriffs in this state. (applause) He was tremendous, tremendous on your COVID-19 response. Tremendous! Recently, Berkeley had a problem with a water issue. Everybody in the world knows about it. He responded immediately. He was a great help. Him and his department are the best. The best!"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "I should have put you on speaker. He just texted me." (laughter)

RICH ELLIOTT: "That's alright, he already knows it. I talk to him as much as I can possibly run into him. The Western Boulevard extension, I know it's been going on for a long time and I will tell you the previous administration in Berkeley Township screwed that whole deal up. I'm sorry that you guys are stuck with it, but something needs to be done there. I don't know what to do. I could tell you what to do, but I don't tell Engineers too good.

The other thing is, there is a road from Hickory Lane to Northern Boulevard. The road has been there for more than 60 years. It was never paved. It's a compacted gravel road, compacted by 80,000 pound trucks for more than 60 years. Your Road Department is good. They could go there, grade it — you have piles of millings you could use for base. They could have that road done in two or three days. You don't need an engineer to go over there and tell you what to do because there is nothing there but sand. And when the water would run off the pavement you wouldn't have water. I don't see a giant expense for that. But I will tell you, the people in Berkeley are suffering. The trucks drive across their front lawns. They're making turns on streets that are not made for trucks because they don't know the actual directions in and out of Hickory Lane. I see the county trucks, now I'm not saying who. I wouldn't even take a picture of them. They can't make the turns. The roads are not big enough.

You also have a road there that's half a county road and half a township road. The speed limit goes from 25 on the township road to 35 on the county road. It's treacherous. There are accidents. There are school bus stops there. You guys should step up, and ladies excuse me, it ain't that hard to get that road open. It's been open. The road is there. No trees, no nothing needs to be done. Open the gates and pave it. If somebody wants to go there, let them go. If they don't want to go, but I guarantee...I know of a certain company that sends out 60 vehicles a day would go out that way. And I know one of the county trucks would rather go that way than come through the neighborhood. So if there's something you can do to get that going...I don't see it taking...I don't know I might be exaggerating...three days because I'm a private employee, I'm not a public employee. I understand all these issues, but you don't need an engineer. You don't need a lawyer. You own it. The road is there. Improve it and open the gates. The gates are there. I mean I can't see it being that hard."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "If you were here 25 years ago, Commissioner Little would send the trucks out Monday. We have this thing called DEP now that we have to, unfortunately, listen to."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "Well I was here 25 years ago and I was in great arguments with past administrations about a lot of things there. That's why I'm no longer with those administrations. But that's neither here nor there."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "We're going to sit down with Jimmy and figure out the best way to go."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "Jimmy who?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Jimmy Oris."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "I told you, you don't need an engineer. (laughter) You tell Jim Oris that Rich Elliott said you don't need an engineer!" (laughter)

DIRECTOR QUINN: "I'll let him know."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "And I'll bet you most of the engineers around will tell you I'm a man of my word."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "And I'd love to think we could do it the way you want to do it, but I just know we're going to end up in jail. (laughter) I'll wait until Commissioner Vicari is the Director again because only the Commissioner goes to jail."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "If you need some volunteers I can get you volunteers. You just have to turn around for a little."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Rich, there was a fellow by the name of Ben Mabie. If he was still the Administrator."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "It would have been done yesterday!"

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "He would get it done yesterday. Ben Mabie didn't care about regulations, engineers or whatever, he got it done."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "Ben Mabie, Eugene Johnson, Jimmy Johnson, all those guys would have had it done."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "It's a different day."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "Every single one of them would have had that done."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "That's true. You're probably right. You can't do that today."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "I know I'm right. Well, I'm not even going to get into that conversation. The other thing is, Western Boulevard, I live very close to Western Boulevard. I know the traffic has increased there tremendously recently in the last year or so, maybe two years. I have spoken to some members of this Board and I have spoken to the Engineering Department and I have spoken to the gentlemen on the job when they come out to fix the problems. The problems on Western Boulevard were created by the gas company's contractors. I have spoken to other Commissioners about this before. They did not do their jobs correctly. And exactly what you said before, as soon as the term runs out for their bonds – bing, bing, bing – you guys have a road that is collapsing. I live right by one of those collapsing areas. When the trucks go down they make a lot of noise in the middle of the night when they hit those bumps. When you have private contractors with little bitty trailers with their lawnmowers and everything, the parts are flying all over the place. You have had cars flip over there because they are trying to avoid the bumps. They get in each other's way, they end up on people's front lawns. It's not that hard to get your guys over there to fix it. Your guys are good. I know most of your supervisors. I know most of your employees that work in your Road Department. They're really good guys. Get the engineers out of the way." (laughter)

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Which stretch of Western are you talking about?"

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "Closer to Northern. The cross street is Virginia I think. That's where the people have the lion out in front of their house. A guy was upside down on their front lawn there. But there are a lot of issues with Western Boulevard that were not caused by the county. I don't know what the answers are to hold these people responsible for this. I can tell you they were private contractors for the gas company. I saw the work being done. I couldn't even believe that our engineers approved it when they mauled underneath Western Boulevard right after you guys paved it. They were too close to the pavement, I mean depth-wise. When the maul went under it broke the pavement and then you're done."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "It dips the whole thing."

RICHARD ELLIOT: "And once you get one it just keeps going. The other thing I will tell you and this is for Ginny Haines. I am a disabled vet. I am not as disabled as Jimmy Byrnes, but I am retired. I am a disabled vet. I didn't get any of that stimulus money. They gave me nothing to stay home. And I'm on the verge of being forced out of my house. I lost my wife a year and a half ago. I lost a lot of personal things. That's my business. But I didn't get any of

that stimulus money all these people are getting to sit home and do nothing."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I didn't say you did."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "Well I know you didn't, but you were talking about how everybody got the stimulus this and that."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "No I didn't. I didn't talk about the stimulus. I wasn't the one that talked about stimulus. I was talking about the Election Board."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "Whatever it is, it is. If you didn't, I apologize. But somebody did."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "No that's quite alright. But I'm just saying I didn't talk about the stimulus."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "It was probably Jimmy Byrnes talking about it then. Yeah, he didn't get it either. And I'm sure Sam didn't get it either because Sam was who was talking about it to you I thought."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "No."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "Who did you talk to? One of them."

SAMUEL CAMMARATO: "I talked to Senator Connors. That's who I talked to."

RICHARD ELLIOTT: "As far as all the other things, I'm sure that you are going to be able to address them. But I don't see any reason why you can't put that bypass in. I mean if you need help getting it done, let me know. I work nights. (laughter) Thank you very much for your time. I appreciate it."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you. Doc, I'll give you two minutes."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO, SEASIDE PARK: "I'll be less. I don't want to hold you guys up. This was a long meeting. I've been following the infrastructure money coming into New Jersey. Menendez and Booker announced in late August the State of New Jersey is going to be getting \$8.3 billion in roads, bridges and highway money. And I want to follow through on what these two gentlemen were talking about with regard to road construction. What are we doing to lobby the state to get our fair share into Ocean County which could supplement our capital budget I would assume so we can begin doing this kind of work that these gentlemen are mentioning?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "The bill itself that you're talking about in D.C. has not gone through yet."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO: "Well they announced that we are getting as a state, \$8.3 billion."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "The state has been getting a lot of money. There's no doubt about it."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO: "Why aren't we making our point to the state? That's my question."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Yes, as soon as we know the state gets money and it's going to be divvied out to the counties, our administration is on the phone right away. We're looking at whatever we have to do – grant applications – whether it's going to be a grant, whether it's going to be a loan. We participate in everything. But the bottom line is and you can go back and look at the record, we are not one of the counties that gets a lot of money."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO: "I know that, unfortunately. How can we lobby the state so we can get our fair share?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "You're a Democrat. Go ask for us. Ask the Democratic Senators to bring that money down to Ocean County."

DR. PHIL NUFRIO: "That's my plan, sir."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thanks Phil. Anyone else? Okay, seeing none, can I have a motion to adjourn?"



In accordance with the Act, and for the purpose of raising funds to finance the purposes set forth in the Ordinances, there shall be issued bonds of the County in the aggregate principal amount of \$21,795,000, unless adjusted pursuant to Section 13 hereof, pursuant to the Ordinances. All of said bonds shall constitute a single issue for purposes of the Local Bond Law and shall be designated "General Improvement Bonds, Series 2021" (the "Bonds").

Details of Bonds. The Bonds will be issued in the form of one certificate for the aggregate principal amount of bonds maturing in each year and will be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America. Each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of The Depository Trust Company ("DTC"), which will act as securities depository. The certificates will be on deposit with DTC. DTC will be responsible for maintaining a book entry system for recording the interests among its participants. The participants will be responsible for maintaining records regarding the beneficial ownership interests in the bonds on behalf of individual purchasers. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$1,000 or more through book entries made on the books and records of DTC and its participants. The Bonds will bear interest payable semiannually at a rate or rates per annum, expressed in a multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1%, as proposed by the successful bidder in accordance with the Notice of Sale authorized herein. The Bonds shall be substantially in the form as provided in this Resolution, with such omissions, insertions and variations as are properly required. Certificated Bonds; Successor Securities Depository. In the event the County determines that it is in the best interests of the beneficial owners of the Bonds (the actual purchasers of the bonds) that they be able to obtain certificated bonds, the County may notify DTC of the availability of bond certificates. In such event, the County will appoint a paying agent and the County will issue, transfer and exchange bond certificates as required by DTC and others in appropriate amounts. DTC may determine to discontinue providing its services with respect to the bonds at any time by giving a reasonable amount of notice in writing to the County and discharging its responsibilities with respect thereto. In the event of such determination, if the County fails to identify another qualified securities depository as successor to DTC, the County will appoint a paying agent and the County will issue and deliver replacement bonds in the form of fully registered certificates. - Redemption. (A) The Bonds maturing prior to August 1, 2031 are not subject to Section 5. redemption prior to maturity.

Such notice shall further state that on such date there shall become due and payable upon each bond to be redeemed the principal amount of such bond plus the applicable premium, if any, payable upon the redemption thereof, or the specified portion of the principal thereof in the case of a bond to be redeemed in part only, together with interest accrued to such date, and that from and after such date interest thereon shall cease to accrue and be payable. The County shall mail or cause to be mailed a copy of such notice postage prepaid, not less than thirty (30) days, nor more than sixty (60) days prior to the date fixed for redemption, to the registered owner of any bond all or a portion of which is to be redeemed, at his last address, if any, appearing upon the registry books kept by or on behalf of the County. For so long as the book-entry only form remains in effect and the bonds are registered in the name of DTC, or its nominee, the County will not be responsible for mailing of notices of redemption to anyone other than DTC, and the County shall comply with such additional or supplemental requirements are specified in the Letter of Representations by and between the County and DTC or otherwise.

Notice having been given in the manner provided above, the bonds or the portions thereof called for redemption and specified in such notice shall become due and payable on the redemption date specified in such notice at the principal amount thereof plus the premium, if any, applicable on such date, plus unpaid interest on such bonds or portions thereof accrued to such date. Upon presentation and surrender thereof at the place or the places specified in such notice, such bonds or portions thereof shall be paid at the principal amount thereof plus the applicable premium, if any, plus unpaid interest on such bonds or portion thereof accrued to such date. If any officer whose signature appears on the Bonds ceases to hold office before the delivery of the bonds, his/her signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes. In addition, any Bond may bear the signature of, or may be signed by, such persons as at the actual time of the signing of such Bond shall be the proper officers to sign such bond although at the date of such bond such persons may not have been such officers.

Section 8. Reissuance of Mutilated, Destroyed, Stolen or Lost Bonds. - All Bids must be submitted through PARITY. No telephone, telefax, telegraph or personal delivery Bids will be accepted.
 - 3. All Bids for the Bonds must be submitted on an "All or None" ("AON") basis.
- Each proposal submitted must name the rate or rates of interest per annum to be borne by the Bonds and the rate or rates named must be multiples of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1%. Not more than one rate may be named for the Bonds of each maturity. There is no limitation on the number of rates that may be named. The difference between the lowest and the highest rates named in the proposal shall not exceed three per centum (3%) with a maximum coupon of 5% and 0% coupon not permitted. Each proposal submitted must state the purchase price, which must equal or exceed \$22,884,750 (105%), with a maximum bid price of \$25,064,250 {00274464:v4/94-63-/072}

(115%). The Bonds will be awarded to the bidder on whose bid the total loan may be made at the lowest true interest cost (as such term is defined herein). The purchaser must also pay an amount equal to the interest on the Bonds accrued to the date of payment of the purchase price.

"Bid"

"True Interest Cost" or "TIC" computed by determining the interest rate, compounded semi-annually, necessary to discount the debt service payments to the date of the bonds and to the price bid, excluding interest accrued to the delivery. The True Interest Cost serves as the basis for awarding bonds to winning Bidders.

The successful bidder may, at its option, refuse to accept the Bonds if prior to their delivery any income tax law of the United States of America shall provide that the interest thereon is includable in gross income for federal income tax purposes, or shall be so includable at a future date. In such case the deposit made by the bidder shall be returned and it will be relieved of its contractual obligations arising from the acceptance of its proposal.

If the Bonds qualify for issuance of any policy of municipal bond insurance or commitment therefor at the option of a bidder, any purchase of such insurance or commitment therefor shall be at the sole option and expense of the bidder and any increased costs of issuance of the Bonds resulting by reason of such insurance, unless otherwise paid, shall be paid by such bidder. Any failure of the Bonds to be so insured or of any such policy of insurance to be issued shall not in any way relieve the purchaser of its contractual obligations arising from the acceptance of its proposal for the purchase of the Bonds.

The County reserves the right to reject any and all Bids and to the extent permitted by law to waive any irregularity or informality in any Bid.

Establishment of Issue Price

The County intends that the provisions of Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1(f)(3)(i) (defining "competitive sale" for purposes of establishing the issue price of the Securities) will apply to the initial sale of the Securities (the "Competitive Sale Requirements") because:

- the County shall disseminate this Notice of Sale to potential (1) Underwriters in a manner that is reasonably designed to reach potential Underwriters;
 - **(2)** all bidders shall have an equal opportunity to bid;
- the County may receive bids from at least three Underwriters of municipal bonds who have established industry reputations for underwriting new issuances of municipal bonds; and
- the County anticipates awarding the sale of the Securities to the bidder who submits a firm offer to purchase the Securities at the highest price (or lowest interest cost), as set forth in this Notice of Sale.

Any bid submitted pursuant to the Notice of Sale shall be considered a firm offer for the purchase of the Securities, as specified in the bid.

In the event that the Competitive Sale Requirements are not satisfied for the Bonds, all bids will be rejected and the sale of the Bonds will be cancelled.

In the event that the Competitive Sale Requirements are satisfied, the winning bidder shall assist the County in establishing the issue price of the Securities and shall execute and deliver to the County at Closing an "issue price" or similar certificate setting forth the reasonably expected initial offering price to the Public or the sales price or prices of the Securities, together with the supporting pricing wires or equivalent communications.

Sales of any Securities to any person that is a related party to an Underwriter shall not constitute sales to the Public for purposes of this Notice of Sale. Further, for purposes of this Notice of Sale:

- (i) "Public" means any person other than an Underwriter or a related party,
- (ii) "Underwriter" means (A) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract with the County (or with the lead Underwriter to form an underwriting syndicate) to participate in the initial sale of the Securities to the Public and (B) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract directly or indirectly with a person described in clause (A) to participate in the initial sale of the Securities to the Public (including a member of a selling group or a party to a retail distribution agreement participating in the initial sale of the Securities to the Public),

It is anticipated that CUSIP identification numbers will be printed on the Bonds, but neither the failure to print such number on any Bond nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure or refusal by the winning bidder thereof to accept delivery of and pay for the Bonds. The County's financial advisor will request the CUSIPs and will provide CUSIP Global Services with the final details of the sale, including the identity of the winning bidder.

The purchaser shall be obligated to furnish to the County, when and if requested prior to the delivery of the Bonds, such information requested by the County as shall be necessary to enable the County to determine the "issue price" of the Bonds as defined in Section 1273 and 1274 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code").

A Preliminary Official Statement has been prepared and is available for viewing in electronic format on www.i-dealprospectus.com and may also be obtained from the County's financial advisor identified in the last paragraph of this Notice. The Preliminary Official Statement is deemed to be a final official statement, as of its date, within the meaning of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission, but is subject to (a) completion with certain pricing and other information to be made available by the successful bidder for the Bonds and (b) amendment. The Preliminary Official Statement, as so revised, will constitute the final "Official Statement". By the submission of bids for the Bonds, the successful bidder contracts for the receipt, within seven (7) business days of the award of the Bonds, of a reasonable number of copies of the final Official Statement at the expense of the County, with any additional copies of the final Official Statement that the successful bidder shall reasonably request to be provided at the sole cost and expense of the successful bidder. In order to complete the final Official Statement, the successful bidder must furnish the following information to the County's financial advisor and Bond Counsel by email or facsimile transmission or overnight delivery received by the County's financial advisor and Bond Counsel within twenty-four (24) hours after the award of the Bonds: (a) initial offering prices (expressed as a price, exclusive of accrued interest, or yield per maturity), and (b) any other material information necessary for the final Official Statement but not known to the County (such as the bidder's purchase of credit enhancement). In addition, the successful bidder must, if requested by the County, furnish a written confirmation of its bid.

The County will undertake to provide certain continuing disclosure in accordance with Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission. A description of this undertaking is contained in the Preliminary Official Statement under the heading "CONTINUING DISCLOSURE".

The successful bidder will be furnished at the time the Bonds are delivered with: (1) the opinion of GluckWalrath LLP, Freehold, New Jersey, in substantially the form set forth in the Preliminary Official Statement; and (2) certificates in form satisfactory to said law firm evidencing the proper execution and delivery of the Bonds and receipt of payment therefor and the fact that the Bonds will not be arbitrage bonds within the meaning of the Code; and (3) a certificate, dated as of the date of delivery of the Bonds, and signed by the officers who signed the Bonds, stating that no litigation is then pending or to the knowledge of such officers threatened to restrain or enjoin the issuance or delivery of the Bonds or the levy or collection of taxes to pay the Bonds or the interest thereon, or questioning the validity of the statutes or the proceedings under which the Bonds are issued, and that neither the corporate existence or boundaries of the County nor the title of any of said officers to their respective offices, is being contested; and (4) the County's Continuing Disclosure Certificate substantially in the form described in the Preliminary Official Statement.

The successful bidder is advised of the responsibility to file an annual disclosure statement on political contributions with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.13 (P.L. 2005, c.271, s.3) if the successful bidder receives contracts in excess of \$50,000 from public entities in a calendar year. Section 11. <u>Term Bond Option.</u> As provided in the Notice of Sale, a bidder may aggregate consecutive principal maturities of the Bonds, for which such bidder bids the same interest rate, into term bonds. Each such term bond will be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption as provided in Section 5(C) hereof, in the amounts and on the dates that would have been consecutive serial maturities had no term bond designation been made.

Section 12. Delegation of Power to Award and Sell Bonds. The County Comptroller is delegated on behalf of the County the power to award and sell the Bonds to the successful bidder. The County Comptroller shall report the results of such sale in writing at the next meeting of the Board of Commissioners.

Section 13. Adjustment to Maturity Schedule. The County Comptroller is hereby delegated the authority (if the County Comptroller deems it to be in the best interests of the County), up to 24 hours prior to the date of advertised sale and within 4 hours after the award of the Bonds, to adjust the maturity schedule of the Bonds in increments of \$1,000, provided however, that after the award of the Bonds (i) no maturity schedule adjustment shall exceed 10% upward or downward of the principal for any maturity as specified herein (or as adjusted prior to the date of advertised sale) and (ii) the aggregate adjustment to the maturity schedule shall not exceed 10% upward or downward of the aggregate principal amount of bonds as specified herein (or as adjusted prior to the date of advertised sale) and as adjusted will not exceed the amount of the Ordinances. NOTICE OF ANY ADJUSTMENT TO THE MATURITY SCHEDULE OF THE BONDS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE ADVERTISED SALE SHALL BE GIVEN BY CAUSING A NOTICE THEREOF TO BE PUBLISHED ON TM3 NEWS SERVICE. The dollar amount bid by the successful bidder shall be adjusted to reflect any adjustments in the aggregate principal amount of bonds to be issued. The adjusted bid price will reflect changes in the dollar amount of the underwriter's discount and the original issue premium or discount, but will not change the per bond underwriter's discount as calculated from the bid and the Initial Public Offering Prices required to be delivered to the County. Notice of any such adjustment shall be given to the successful bidder in the manner specified in the Notice of Sale. In the event of any such adjustment, the dollar amount (but not the interest rate or rates) bid by the successful bidder will be adjusted as provided in the Notice of Sale.

Section 14. Postponement of Sale. The County Comptroller is hereby delegated the authority (if the County Comptroller deems it to be in the best interests of the County) (i) to postpone from time to time the sale of the Bonds from the date specified in the Notice of Sale (or, in the case of a rescheduled sale, from such rescheduled date), in each case upon not less than 24 hours' notice, and (ii) to reschedule such sale upon not less than 48 hours' notice. Notice of any such postponement and rescheduling shall be given in the manner specified in the Notice of Sale. In the event of any such postponement and rescheduling, the County Comptroller may (and shall, if required by the Local Bond Law) cause a revised Notice of Sale and/or a revised summary thereof to be prepared and published.

Section 15. Agreements with The Depository Trust Company. The Comptroller is hereby authorized to make representations and warranties, to enter into agreements and to make all arrangements with DTC, as may be necessary in order to provide that this issue of the County's bonds will be eligible for deposit with DTC, and to satisfy any obligations undertaken in connection therewith.

Section 16. Authorization for Official Statement. The Comptroller, Chief Financial Officer, Clerk of the Board of Commissioners, auditor, bond counsel and other officers, agents and employees of the County are authorized to prepare and distribute information with respect to the County in connection with the sale of the bonds in such form as may be approved by the Comptroller. The preparation and distribution of a Preliminary Official Statement pertaining to the bonds is hereby authorized. The Comptroller is hereby authorized to deem final the Preliminary Official Statement for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission. The Director of the Board of Commissioners, the County Administrator, the Chief Financial Officer and the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners are hereby authorized and directed to execute a final official statement relating to the bonds, with such changes, revisions, insertions and omissions from the Preliminary Official Statement as may be approved by the Comptroller.

- Section 17. Pledge of County. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean in the State of New Jersey is hereby pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and said bonds shall be general obligations of the County payable as to principal and interest from ad valorem taxes which may be assessed on the taxable property within said County without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 18. <u>Determination of Average Period of Usefulness</u>. It is hereby determined and stated that the average period of usefulness of the several purposes for which the Bonds are to be issued under the Ordinances described in Section 1 above, according to their respective lives, as determined in said Ordinances, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds to be issued for said several purposes, is a period of 22.69 years, computed from the date of said Bonds.
- Section 19. Investment of Proceeds of Bonds. The County will make no use of the proceeds of the Bonds which would cause the bonds to be arbitrage bonds; and the County hereby imposes on itself and all officers having custody or control of the proceeds of the bonds, throughout the term of the bonds, the obligation to comply with applicable requirements of Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and Regulations Sections 1.148-0 through 1.148-11 and 1.150-1 and 1.150-2, and all other applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Service, so that the Bonds will not be or become arbitrage bonds.
- Section 20. Tax Covenants. In order to maintain the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of interest on the Bonds, and for no other purpose, the County covenants to comply with each applicable requirement of the Code, applicable to the bonds,, and the County covenants not to take any action or fail to take any action which would cause the interest on the bonds to lose the exclusion from gross income for federal income taxation purposes under Section 103 of the Code. In furtherance of the covenant contained in the preceding sentence, the County agrees to comply with the Arbitrage Certificate and Letter of Instructions (the "Letter of Instructions") as to the Code delivered by Bond Counsel on the date of initial issuance and delivery of the Bonds, as such letter may be amended from time to time, as a source of guidance for achieving compliance with the Code.

The County covenants and agrees with the holders of the Bonds that the County shall not take any action or omit to take any action, which action or omission, if reasonably expected on the date of initial issuance and delivery of the bonds, would cause the bonds to be "private activity bonds" or "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Sections 141(a) and 148, respectively, of the Code, or any successor provision.

- Section 21. Bonds Not Federally Guaranteed. The County covenants that it will take no action which would cause the Bonds to be federally guaranteed (within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code).
- Section 22. Continuing Disclosure. A Continuing Disclosure Certificate in substantially the following form is hereby approved, and the County Comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver a Continuing Disclosure Certificate on behalf of the County in substantially such form, with such insertions and changes therein as the County Comptroller may approve, such approval to be evidenced by his/her execution thereof:

(Form of Continuing Disclosure Certificate for the Bonds)

CONTINUING DISCLOSURE CERTIFICATE

This Continuing Disclosure Certificate (the "Disclosure Certificate") is executed and delivered by the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Issuer") in connection with the issuance by the Issuer of \$______ principal amount of its General Improvement Bonds, Series 2021 (the "Bonds"). The Bonds are being issued pursuant to Bond Ordinances (the "Ordinances") duly adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the Issuer (the "Board") on various dates, and a resolution duly adopted by the Board on September 14, 2021 (the "Resolution"). The Bonds are dated October ___, 2021 and shall mature on August 1 in the years 2022 through 2039, inclusive. The Issuer covenants and agrees as follows:

Section 1. Purpose of the Disclosure Certificate. This Disclosure Certificate is being executed and delivered by the Issuer for the benefit of the Bondholders and Beneficial Owners of the Bonds and in order to assist the Participating Underwriter in complying with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as the same may be amended from time to time ("Exchange Act").

<u>Definitions.</u> In addition to the definitions set forth in the Resolution, which apply to Section 2. any capitalized term used in this Disclosure Certificate unless otherwise defined in this Section, the following capitalized terms shall have the following meanings:

"Annual Report" shall mean any Annual Report provided by the Issuer pursuant to, and as described in, Sections 3 and 4 of this Disclosure Certificate.

"Beneficial Owner" shall mean any person which (a) has the power, directly or indirectly, to vote or consent with respect to, or to dispose of ownership of, any Bonds (including persons holding Bonds through nominees, depositories or other intermediaries), or (b) is treated as the owner of any Bonds for federal income tax purposes.

"Bondholder" shall mean any person who is the registered owner of any Bond, including holders of beneficial interests in the Bonds.

"Continuing Disclosure Information" shall mean: (i) the Annual Report; (ii) any notice required to be filed with the Repositories pursuant to Section 5 hereof; and (iii) any notice of an event required to be filed with the Repositories pursuant to Section 3(c) hereof.

"Dissemination Agent" shall mean the Issuer, or any successor Dissemination Agent designated in writing by the Issuer and which has filed with the Issuer a written acceptance of such designation.

"EMMA" shall mean the Electronic Municipal Market Access System ("EMMA"), an internet based filing system created and maintained by the MSRB in accordance with the SEC Release, pursuant to which issuers of tax-exempt bonds, including the Bonds, and other filers on behalf of the such issuers shall upload Continuing Disclosure Information to assist underwriters in complying with the Rule and to provide the general public with access to such Continuing Disclosure Information.

"Financial Obligation" means a (i) debt obligation; (ii) derivative instrument entered into in connection with, or pledged as security or a source of payment for, an existing or planned debt obligation; or (iii) guarantee of (i) or (ii). The term "Financial Obligation" shall not include municipal securities as to which a final official statement has been provided to the MSRB consistent with the Rule.

"Listed Events" shall mean any of the events listed in Section 5(a) of this Disclosure Certificate.

"MSRB" shall mean the Municipal Bonds Rulemaking Board established pursuant to Section 15B(b)(1) of the Exchange Act.

"National Repository" shall mean the MSRB, through the internet facilities of EMMA, or any other public or private repository or entity that shall hereafter be designated by the SEC as a repository for purposes of the Rule.

"Official Statement" shall mean the Official Statement of the County, dated relating to the Bonds.

"Participating Underwriter" shall mean any of the original underwriters of the Bonds required to comply with the Rule in connection with offering of the Bonds.

"Repository" or "Repositories" shall mean each National Repository and each State Repository, if any.

"Rule" shall mean Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) adopted by the SEC under the Exchange Act, as the same may be amended from time to time.

"SEC Release" shall mean Release No. 34-59062, of the SEC, dated December 5, 2008.

"State" shall mean the State of New Jersey.

"State Repository" shall mean any public or private repository or entity designated by the State as a state repository for the purpose of the Rule and recognized as such by the SEC. As of the date of this Disclosure Certificate, there is no State Repository.

Section 3. Provision of Annual Reports.

- The Issuer shall, or shall cause the Dissemination Agent to, not later than nine (9) (a) months after the end of its fiscal year, commencing with the report for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2021, provide to the MSRB in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB, an Annual Report which is consistent with the requirements of Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate. The Annual Report may be submitted as a single document or as separate documents comprising a package, and may cross-reference other information as provided in Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate; provided that the audited financial statements of the Issuer may be submitted separately from the balance of the Annual Report and later than the date required above for the filing of the Annual Report if they are not available by that date. If the Issuer's fiscal year changes, it shall give notice of such change to MSRB. Any and all items that must be included in the Annual Report may be incorporated by reference from other information that is available to the public on the MSRB's Internet Web site, or that has been filed with the SEC.
- Not later than fifteen (15) Business Days prior to the date specified in subsection (a) for making available or providing the Annual Report, the Issuer shall provide the Annual Report to the Dissemination Agent (if other than the Issuer). If the Issuer is unable to provide to the MSRB an Annual Report by the date required in subsection (a), the Issuer shall, in a timely manner, send a notice to the MSRB in substantially the form attached as Exhibit A, in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB. All documents provided to the MSRB shall be accompanied by identifying information as prescribed by the MSRB.
- The Dissemination Agent shall file a report with the Issuer certifying that the Annual (c) Report has been provided to the MSRB pursuant to this Disclosure Agreement, stating the date it was provided.
- Section 4. Content of Annual Reports. The Issuer's Annual Report shall contain or include by reference the following:
 - The audited financial statements of the Issuer for the prior fiscal year, prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards (GAAS) as from time to time in effect, and as prescribed by the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State pursuant to Chapter 5 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes. If the Issuer's audited financial statements are not available by the time the Annual Report is required to be filed pursuant to Section 3(a), the Annual Report shall contain unaudited financial statements and the audited financial statements shall be filed in the same manner as the Annual Report when they become available.
 - The financial information and operating data set forth in the Official Statement _, 2021 prepared in connection with the (including Appendix A thereto) dated _ sale of the Bonds, under the captions: "Schedule of Bond and Note Maturities", "Tax Information", "Ocean County Leading Tax Ratables - 2021", "County of Ocean Statement of Statutory Debt Condition ___ _, 2021", "List of Authorized Debt as of 2021" and "Debt Ratios".

Section 5. Reporting of Significant Events.

- (a) Pursuant to the provisions of this Section 5, the Issuer shall give, or cause to be given, notice of the occurrence of any of the following events with respect to the Bonds:
 - principal and interest payment delinquencies; 1.
 - 2. non-payment related defaults, if material;
 - 3. unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;
 - unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties; 4.
 - 5. substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
 - adverse tax opinions, the issuance by the Internal Revenue Service of proposed or final determinations of taxability. Notices of Proposed Issue (IRS Form 5701-TEB) or other material notices or determinations with respect to the tax status of the security, or other material events affecting the tax status of the Bonds;
 - 7. modifications to rights of Bondholders, if material;
 - 8. Bond Calls, if material and tender offers;
 - 9. defeasances;
 - release, substitution, or sale of property securing repayment of the Bonds, if material;

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- 11. rating changes.
- 12. bankruptcy, insolvency, receivership or similar events of the Issuer, which shall be considered to occur when any of the following occur: the appointment of a receiver, fiscal agent or similar officer for the Issuer in a proceeding under the U.S. Bankruptcy Code or in any other proceeding under state or federal law in which a court or governmental authority has assumed jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the Issuer, or if such jurisdiction has been assumed by leaving the existing governing body and officials or officers in possession but subject to the supervision and orders of a court or governmental authority, or the entry of an order confirming a plan of reorganization, arrangement or liquidation by a court or governmental authority having supervision or jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the Issuer;

 - The undertaking, as amended or taking into account such waiver, would, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, have complied with the requirements of the Rule at the time of the original issuance of the Bonds, after taking into account any amendments or interpretations of the Rule, as well as any change in circumstances; and
 - The amendment or waiver does not, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, materially impair the interests of the Bondholders or Beneficial Owners of the Bonds.

In the event of any amendment or waiver of a provision of this Disclosure Certificate, the Issuer shall describe such amendment in the next Annual Report, and shall include, as applicable, a narrative explanation of the reason for the amendment or waiver and its impact on the type (or in the case of a change of accounting principles, on the presentation) of financial information or operating data being presented by the Issuer. Section 9. Additional Information. RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF COUNTY OF OCEAN'S COLLEGE **CAPITAL** IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SERIES 2021 AUTHORIZED BY A BOND ORDINANCE HERETOFORE ADOPTED TO FINANCE THE FISCAL YEAR 2020 AND 2021 CAPITAL RENEWAL AND REPLACEMENT FACILITIES PROJECTS AT OCEAN COUNTY COLLEGE IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, AND PROVIDING FOR THE FORM, MATURITY DATES AND OTHER DETAILS OF SAID BONDS AND DESIGNATING A PAYING AGENT FOR SAID BONDS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean, in the State of New Jersey (the "County"), has, on July 7, 2021, finally adopted Bond Ordinance No. 2021-19 (the "Ordinance") authorizing bonds and bond anticipation notes to finance a portion of the cost of the capital renewal and replacement facilities improvement projects at Ocean County College (the "College") in said County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of School Estimate of the College has heretofore determined by resolutions adopted March 27, 2019 and March 25, 2020, that certain amounts of money are necessary for certain capital projects at the College, and the Board of Commissioners of the County has heretofore determined, by the Ordinance, to appropriate and borrow such amounts by the issuance of bonds or notes of the County pursuant to the Local Bond Law and the hereinafter-defined County College Bond Act; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable and necessary to issue the County's college capital improvement bonds pursuant to the Ordinance, in an aggregate principal amount of \$4,210,000, unless adjusted pursuant to Section 12 hereof, and it is deemed advisable and in the best interests of the County to provide for the sale, form, maturity date and other matters in connection with the bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Authority for Resolution. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes (the "Act"), the Board of Commissioners has previously adopted the Ordinance, which Ordinance authorized the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$4,210,000, and the Board of Commissioners has determined to issue at this time, pursuant to said Ordinance and Chapter 12 of the Laws of New Jersey of 1971, effective January 28, 1971, and the acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto (the "County College Bond Act"), bonds in the amount of \$4,210,000, unless adjusted pursuant to Section 12 hereof. To the extent any premium is received by the County from the sale of the bonds, such premium shall be allocated to the appropriation under said Ordinance.

Authorization of Bonds. In accordance with the Act and the County College Bond Act, and for the purpose of raising funds to finance the purposes set forth in the Ordinance, there shall be issued bonds of the County in the aggregate principal amount of \$4,210,000, unless adjusted pursuant to Section 12 hereof, pursuant to the Ordinance. All of said bonds shall constitute a single issue and shall be designated "College Capital Improvement Bonds, Series 2021" (the "College Bonds"). The period of usefulness of the improvements financed by the proceeds of the Bonds is 40 years.

Details of Bonds. The College Bonds will be issued in the form of one certificate for the aggregate principal amount of College Bonds maturing in each year and will be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America. Each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of The Depository Trust Company ("DTC"), which will act as securities depository. The certificates will be on deposit with DTC. DTC will be responsible for maintaining a book entry system for recording the interests among its participants. The participants will be responsible for maintaining records regarding the beneficial ownership interests in the bonds on behalf of individual purchasers. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$1,000 or more through book entries made on the books and records of The DTC and its participants. The College Bonds will bear interest payable semiannually at a rate or rates per annum, expressed in a multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1%, as proposed by the successful bidder in accordance with the Notice of Sale authorized herein. The College Bonds shall be substantially in the form as provided in this Resolution, with such omissions, insertions and variations as are properly required. Said College Bonds shall be dated the date of delivery, shall bear interest at the rate or rates specified by the successful bidder therefor in accordance with the Notice of Sale hereinafter provided for, said interest to be payable on February 1 and August 1, commencing on February 1, 2022, and shall mature (unless adjusted by the County Comptroller pursuant to Section 12 hereof) on August 1 in the following years and amounts:

Certificated Bonds; Successor Securities Depository. In the event the County determines that it is in the best interests of the beneficial owners of the College Bonds (the actual purchasers of the College Bonds) that they be able to obtain certificated bonds, the County may notify DTC of the availability of bond certificates. In such event, the County will appoint a paying agent and the County will issue, transfer and exchange bond certificates as required by DTC and others in appropriate amounts. DTC may determine to discontinue providing its services with respect to the bonds at any time by giving a reasonable amount of notice in writing to the County and discharging its responsibilities with respect thereto. In the event of such determination, if the County fails to identify another qualified securities depository as successor to DTC, the County will appoint a paying agent and the County will issue and deliver replacement bonds in the form of fully registered certificates. Whenever DTC requests the County to do so, the County will cooperate with DTC in taking appropriate action (a) to make available one or more separate certificates evidencing the bonds to any participant of DTC having bonds credited to its DTC account or (b) to arrange for another securities depository to maintain custody of certificates evidencing the bonds.

Section 5. Redemption. The College Bonds shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity.

Section 6. Payment of College Bonds. The principal of and the interest on the College Bonds will be paid by TD Bank, National Association, Cherry Hill, New Jersey, as the County's paying agent (the "Paying Agent"), to DTC by or on behalf of the County on their respective due dates. Interest on the College Bonds will be credited to the participants of DTC as listed on the records of DTC as of each next preceding January 15 and July 15 (the "Record Dates" for the payment of interest on the College Bonds).

Execution of Bonds. Said College Bonds shall be executed in the name of the County by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Commissioner-Director and the Chief Financial Officer and the seal of the Board of Commissioners shall be affixed, imprinted, engraved or reproduced thereon and attested by the manual signature of the Clerk or a Deputy Clerk of the Board of Commissioners. If any officer whose signature appears on the College Bonds ceases to hold office before the delivery of the Bonds, his/her signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes. In addition, any College Bond may bear the signature of, or may be signed by, such persons as at the actual time of the signing of such bond shall be the proper officers to sign such College Bond although at the date of such bond such persons may not have been such officers

Section 8. Reissuance of Mutilated, Destroyed, Stolen or Lost Bonds. In case any College Bond shall become mutilated or destroyed, stolen or lost the County shall execute and deliver a new bond of like tenor and amount as the bond so mutilated, destroyed, stolen or lost, in exchange and substitution for such mutilated bond and upon surrender of such mutilated bond, or in lieu of and substitution for the bond destroyed, stolen or lost upon filing with the County evidence satisfactory to the County that such bond has been destroyed, stolen or lost and proof of ownership thereof, and upon furnishing the County with indemnity satisfactory to it and complying with such other reasonable regulations as the County may prescribe, and paying such expenses as the County may incur in connection therewith.

Form of College Bonds. Subject to the provisions of this Resolution, each College Section 9. Bond shall be in substantially the following form, with such omissions, insertions, endorsements and variations as may be required by the circumstances and be required or permitted by this Resolution or as may be consistent with this Resolution and necessary or appropriate to conform to the rules and requirements of any governmental authority or any usage or requirement of law with respect thereto:

THE COUNTY IS ALSO SELLING ITS \$21,795 000* GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SERIES 2021 (THE "GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS""). THE COUNTY HAS ISSUED A SEPARATE NOTICE OF SALE FOR THE GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS. THE TERMS OF EACH NOTICE OF SALE WILL APPLY TO EACH SERIES OF BONDS, RESPECTIVELY.

IF THE COMPETITIVE SALE REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF TREASURY REGULATIONS SECTION 1.148-1(f)(3)(i), INCLUDING THE RECEIPT OF THREE BIDS ARE NOT MET FOR THE COLLEGE BONDS, ALL BIDS WILL BE REJECTED AND THE SALE OF THE COLLEGE BONDS WILL BE CANCELLED.

All Bids (as defined below) must be submitted in their entirety through PARITY until 11:15 a.m., New Jersey time on September 21, 2021 (see "Bidding Details"). To bid, Bidders (as defined below) must submit either (i) a certified, treasurer's or cashier's check or (ii) complete a wire transfer, in either case in the amount of \$84,200 (the check or wire transfer being hereinafter referred to as the "Deposit"), to secure the County from any loss resulting from a failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of its bid. The Deposit must be submitted to the County prior to the time for submission of bids, and if in the form of a certified, treasurer's or cashier's check, at the following address:

The use of PARITY shall be at the Bidder's risk and expense, and the County shall have no liability with respect thereto.

If a check is used, it must be a certified, treasurer's or cashier's check payable to the County and such check (together with a name and return address) should be sent to Julie N. Tarrant, County Comptroller, County Administration Building, Department of Finance, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, New Jersey 08754. Checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned upon the award of the College Bonds. Any bidder that does not have a representative present at the bid announcement is requested to include with its good faith deposit overnight packaging or other return envelope for the return of its Deposit (if not the successful bidder). In the absence of other arrangements, the check of any unsuccessful bidder will be returned by certified first class mail to such name and return address as specified by such bidder when such Deposit was provided. By submitting a proposal for the College Bonds, each bidder shall be deemed to have accepted any and all risks of loss associated with the return of its Deposit. Upon return of its Deposit, each such unsuccessful bidder shall

acknowledge same by signing and returning a receipt to such effect provided by the County. If a wire transfer is used, such transfer must be completed and confirmed received by the County prior to the opening of the bids.

The Deposit of the winning bidder will be applied to the purchase price of the College Bonds. In the event the winning bidder fails to comply with the terms of its accepted bid, the Deposit will be retained by the County as liquidated damages. The winning bidder shall not be entitled to any interest earnings in respect of the

The College Bonds are to be issued in book-entry only form and all bidders for the College Bonds must be participants of The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, or affiliated with its participants. The College Bonds will be issued in the form of one certificate for the aggregate principal amount of the College Bonds maturing in each year and will be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America. Each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co. as nominee of The Depository Trust Company (collectively, "DTC"). The certificates will be on deposit with DTC. DTC will be responsible for maintaining a book entry system for recording the interests of its participants or the transfer of the interests among its participants. The participants will be responsible for maintaining records regarding the beneficial ownership interests in the College Bonds on behalf of the individual purchasers. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$1,000 or more through book entries made on the books and records of DTC and its participants.

The College Bonds will be dated the date of delivery and will bear interest at the rate or rates of interest per annum specified by the successful bidder therefor in accordance herewith, payable on February 1, 2022, and semiannually thereafter on the first days of August and February in each year until maturity by payment to DTC.

The College Bonds shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity.

For so long as the book-entry form remains in effect and the College Bonds are registered in the name of DTC, the County will not be responsible for mailing of notices of redemption to anyone other than DTC.

The College Bonds are general obligations of the County and unless paid from other sources the County is authorized and required by law to levy ad valorem taxes upon all real property taxable by the County for the payment of the College Bonds and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount. The College Bonds shall also be entitled to the benefits of Chapter 12 of the Laws of New Jersey of 1971, and the acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto (the "County College Bond Act").

Each proposal submitted must name the rate or rates of interest per annum to be borne by the College Bonds and the rate or rates named must be multiples of one-eighth or one-twentieth of one per centum. The proposed rate or rates of interest to be borne by the College Bonds shall not exceed five percent (5.00%), 0% not permitted. Not more than one rate may be named for the College Bonds of the same maturity. There is no limitation on the number of rates that may be named. The difference between the lowest and the highest rates named in the proposal shall not exceed three per centum (3%). Each proposal submitted must be for all of the College Bonds and the purchase price specified in the proposal must equal or exceed \$4,210,000, with a maximum bid price of \$4,631,000 (110%).

If the competitive sale requirements under the provisions of Treasury Regulations Section 1.148(f)(3)(i), including the receipt of three bids are not met for the College Bonds, all bids will be rejected and the sale of the College Bonds will be cancelled. If at least three bids for the College Bonds are received and the competitive sale requirements under the provisions of Treasury Regulations Section 1.148(f)(3)(i) (defining "competitive sale" for purposes of establishing the issue price of the Bonds) are met, the College Bonds will be awarded to the bidder on whose bids for the College Bonds may be made at the lowest true interest cost. Such true interest cost shall be computed by determining the interest rate, compounded semi-annually, necessary to discount the debt service payments to the date of the College Bonds and to the price bid, excluding interest accrued to the delivery date. No proposal shall be considered that offers to pay an amount less than the principal amount of the College Bonds offered for sale or under which the total loan is made at an interest cost higher than the lowest true interest cost to the County under any legally acceptable proposal, and if two or more such bidders offer to pay the lowest true interest cost, then the College Bonds will be sold to one of such bidders selected by lot from among all such bidders. The purchaser must also pay an amount equal to the interest (if any) on the College Bonds accrued to the date of payment of the purchase price. The right is reserved to reject all bids and to reject any bid not complying with this Notice.

It is requested that each proposal be accompanied by a computation of the true interest cost to the County under the terms of the proposal in accordance with the method of calculation described in the preceding paragraph (computed to six decimal places), but such computation is not to be considered as part of the proposal for College Bonds.

The County reserves the right to postpone, upon not less than 24 hours' notice, the date and time established for receipt of Bids. ANY SUCH POSTPONEMENT WILL BE PUBLISHED ON TM3 NEWS SERVICES, BEFORE 4:00 P.M. ON THE DAY BEFORE THE SALE. If any date fixed for the receipt of Bids and the sale of the College Bonds is postponed, an alternative sale date will be announced through TM3 New Services at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to such alternative sale date. On any such alternative sale date, any Bidder may submit a Bid for the purchase of the College Bonds in conformity in all respects with the provisions of the Notice of Sale, except for the date of sale and except for the changes announced on www.tm3.com at the time the sale date and time are announced.

Within 30 minutes of the award of the College Bonds, the County must receive from the successful bidder an email or telecopy (an "Initial Public Offering Price Telecopy") stating the prices at which such successful bidder intends that each stated maturity of the College Bonds shall initially be offered to the public. which for this purpose excludes bond houses, brokers or similar persons acting in the capacity of underwriters or wholesalers (the "Initial Public Offering Prices"). The successful bidder shall make a bona fide initial public offering of the College Bonds at the Initial Public Offering Prices stated in their Initial Public Offering Price Telecopy.

The County Comptroller of the County may, up to 24 hours prior to the date of advertised sale of and within 4 hours after the award of the College Bonds, adjust the maturity schedule of the College Bonds in increments of \$1,000, provided however, that after the award of the College Bonds (i) no maturity schedule adjustment shall exceed 10% upward or downward of the principal for any maturity as specified herein (or as adjusted prior to the date of advertised sale) and (ii) the aggregate adjustment to the maturity schedule shall not exceed 10% upward or downward of the aggregate principal amount of bonds as specified herein (or as adjusted prior to the date of advertised sale) and as adjusted will not exceed the amount authorized by the Ordinance. NOTICE OF ANY ADJUSTMENT TO THE MATURITY SCHEDULE OF THE COLLEGE BONDS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE ADVERTISED SALE SHALL BE GIVEN BY CAUSING A NOTICE THEREOF TO BE PUBLISHED ON TM3 NEWS SERVICES. The dollar amount bid by the successful bidder shall be adjusted to reflect any adjustments in the aggregate principal amount of College Bonds to be issued. The adjusted bid price will reflect changes in the dollar amount of the underwriter's discount and the original issue premium or discount, but will not change the per bond underwriter's discount as calculated from the bid and the Initial Public Offering Prices required to be delivered to the County as stated herein. The County shall notify the successful bidder of the final maturity schedule and the resulting adjusted purchase price no later than 5:00 p.m., New Jersey time, on the day of the sale and award of the College Bonds. The interest rate or rates specified by the successful bidder for each maturity will not be altered. The successful bidder may not withdraw its bid as a result of any such adjustment, and shall be bound by the terms thereof.

It is expected that the College Bonds will be delivered to the successful bidder on or about October 5, 2021 at the Freehold, New Jersey offices of GluckWalrath LLP or at such other time or place mutually agreed upon by the purchaser and the County. AT THE TIME OF DELIVERY OF THE COLLEGE BONDS, THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT FOR THE COLLEGE BONDS THROUGH THE USE OF IMMEDIATELY AVAILABLE FUNDS. No interest will be paid upon the deposit made by the successful bidder.

Each electronic proposal must be submitted through PARITY. No bidder will see any other bid, nor will any bidder see the status of its bid relative to other bids—i.e., whether its bid is a leading bid. To the extent any instructions or directions set forth on PARITY conflict with this Notice of Sale, the terms of this Notice of Sale shall control. For further information about PARITY, potential bidders may call PARITY at IPREO at (212) 849-5021. The County may, but is not obligated to, acknowledge its acceptance in writing of any bid submitted electronically through PARITY. In the event that a bid for the College Bonds is submitted through PARITY, the bidder further agrees that the County may regard the electronic transmission of the bid through PARITY (including information about the purchase price of the College Bonds, the interest rate or rates to be borne by the College Bonds, the term College Bonds, if any, specified, the initial public offering price of each maturity of the College Bonds and any other information included in such transmission) as though the same information were submitted on the official "Proposal for College Bonds" provided by the County and executed by a duly authorized signatory of the bidder. If a bid submitted electronically through PARITY is accepted by the County, the terms of the official "Proposal for College Bonds" and this Notice of Sale and the information that is electronically transmitted through PARITY shall form a contract, and the successful bidder shall be bound by the terms of such contract.

PARITY is not an agent of the County, and the County shall have no liability whatsoever based on any bidder's use of PARITY, including but not limited to any failure by PARITY to correctly or timely transmit information provided by the County or information provided by the bidder.

The County may choose to discontinue use of electronic bidding through PARITY by issuing a notification to such effect through TM3 News Services, or by other available means, no later than 4:00 p.m., New Jersey Time, on the last business date prior to the bid date.

Once the bids are communicated electronically through PARITY to the County, each bid will constitute an official "Proposal for College Bonds" and shall be deemed to be an irrevocable offer to purchase the College Bonds on the terms provided in this Notice of Sale. For purposes of submitting all "Proposals for College Bonds," whether electronically or sealed, the time as maintained on PARITY shall constitute the

Each bidder shall be solely responsible to make necessary arrangements to access PARITY for purposes of submitting its bid in a timely manner and in compliance with the requirements of this Notice of Sale. Neither the County nor IPREO shall have any duty or obligation to any bidder, or be responsible for the proper operation of, or have any liability for any delays or interruptions of, or any damages caused by PARITY. The County is using PARITY as a communication mechanism, and not as the County's agent, to conduct the electronic bidding for the College Bonds. By using PARITY each bidder agrees to hold the County harmless for any harm or damages caused to such bidder in connection with its use of PARITY for bidding on the College Bonds.

- 2. All Bids must be submitted through PARITY. No telephone, telefax, telegraph or personal delivery Bids will be accepted.
 - 3. All Bids for the College Bonds must be submitted on an "All or None" ("AON") basis.
- Each proposal submitted must name the rate or rates of interest per annum to be borne by the College Bonds and the rate or rates named must be multiples of one-eighth or one-twentieth of one per centum. The proposed rate or rates of interest to be borne by the College Bonds shall not exceed five percent (5.00%). Not more than one rate may be named for the College Bonds of the same maturity. There is no limitation on the number of rates that may be named. The difference between the lowest and the highest rates named in the proposal shall not exceed three per centum (3%). Each proposal submitted must be for all of the College Bonds and the purchase price specified in the proposal must equal or exceed \$4,210,000, with a maximum bid price of \$4,631,000 (110%). Definitions

"Bid" any confirmed purchase offer received by PARITY on or before the proposal submission deadline.

"Bidder" any firm registered and approved for participation in sale.

"Winning Bid" any purchase offer made by a Bidder and received by PARITY that, at the end of the bidding time period, results in the lowest True Interest Cost that is acceptable to the County.

"True Interest Cost" or "TIC" computed by determining the interest rate, compounded semi-annually, necessary to discount the debt service payments to the date of the bonds and to the price bid, excluding interest accrued to the delivery. The True Interest Cost serves as the basis for awarding bonds to winning Bidders.

The successful bidder may, at its option, refuse to accept the College Bonds if prior to their delivery any income tax law of the United States of America shall provide that the interest thereon is includable in gross income for federal income tax purposes, or shall be so includable at a future date. In such case the deposit made by the bidder shall be returned and it will be relieved of its contractual obligations arising from the acceptance of its proposal.

If the College Bonds qualify for issuance of any policy of municipal bond insurance or commitment therefor at the option of a bidder, any purchase of such insurance or commitment therefor shall be at the sole option and expense of the bidder and any increased costs of issuance of the College Bonds resulting by reason of such insurance, unless otherwise paid, shall be paid by such bidder. Any failure of the College Bonds to be so insured or of any such policy of insurance to be issued shall not in any way relieve the purchaser of its contractual obligations arising from the acceptance of its proposal for the purchase of the College Bonds.

Establishment of Issue Price

The Issuer intends that the provisions of Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1(f)(3)(i) (defining "competitive sale" for purposes of establishing the issue price of the Securities) will apply to the initial sale of the Securities (the "Competitive Sale Requirements") because:

(1) the Issuer shall disseminate this Notice of Sale to potential Underwriters in a manner that is reasonably designed to reach potential Underwriters;

- (2) all bidders shall have an equal opportunity to bid;
- the Issuer may receive bids from at least three Underwriters of municipal bonds who have established industry reputations for underwriting new issuances of municipal bonds; and
- the Issuer anticipates awarding the sale of the Securities to the bidder who submits a firm offer to purchase the Securities at the highest price (or lowest interest cost), as set forth in this Notice of Sale.

Any bid submitted pursuant to the Notice of Sale shall be considered a firm offer for the purchase of the Securities, as specified in the bid.

In the event that the Competitive Sale Requirements are not satisfied for the College Bonds, all bids will be rejected and the sale of the College Bonds will be cancelled.

In the event that the Competitive Sale Requirements are satisfied, the winning bidder shall assist the Issuer in establishing the issue price of the Securities and shall execute and deliver to the Issuer at Closing an "issue price" or similar certificate setting forth the reasonably expected initial offering price to the Public or the sales price or prices of the Securities, together with the supporting pricing wires or equivalent communications.

Sales of any Securities to any person that is a related party to an Underwriter shall not constitute sales to the Public for purposes of this Notice of Sale. Further, for purposes of this Notice of Sale:

- (i) "Public" means any person other than an Underwriter or a related party,
- "Underwriter" means (A) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract with the Issuer (or with the lead Underwriter to form an underwriting syndicate) to participate in the initial sale of the Securities to the Public and (B) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract directly or indirectly with a person described in clause (A) to participate in the initial sale of the Securities to the Public (including a member of a selling group or a party to a retail distribution agreement participating in the initial sale of the Securities to the Public),
- a purchaser of any of the Securities is a "related party" to an Underwriter if the Underwriter and the purchaser are subject, directly or indirectly, to (i) at least 50% common ownership of the voting power or the total value of their stock, if both entities are corporations (including direct ownership by one corporation of another), (ii) more than 50% common ownership of their capital interests or profits interests, if both entities are partnerships (including direct ownership by one partnership of another), or (iii) more than 50% common ownership of the value of the outstanding stock of the corporation or the capital interests or profit interests of the partnership, as applicable, if one entity is a corporation and the other entity is a partnership (including direct ownership of the applicable stock or interests by one entity of the other), and
- (iv) "Sale Date" means the date that the Securities are awarded by the Issuer to the winning bidder.

All actions to be taken by the Issuer under this Notice of Sale to establish the issue price of the Securities may be taken on behalf of the Issuer by the Issuer's financial advisor identified herein and any notice or report to be provided to the Issuer may be provided to the Issuer's financial advisor or Bond Counsel.

It is anticipated that CUSIP identification numbers will be printed on the College Bonds, but neither the failure to print such number on any Bond nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure or refusal by the winning bidder thereof to accept delivery of and pay for the College Bonds. The County's financial advisor will request the CUSIPs and will provide CUSIP Global Services with the final details of the sale, including the identity of the winning bidder.

The purchaser shall be obligated to furnish to the County, when and if requested prior to the delivery of the College Bonds, such information requested by the County as shall be necessary to enable the County to determine the "issue price" of the College Bonds as defined in Section 1273 and 1274 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code").

A Preliminary Official Statement has been prepared and is available for viewing in electronic format on www.i-dealprospectus.com and may also be obtained from the County's financial advisor identified in the last paragraph of this Notice. The Preliminary Official Statement is deemed to be a final official statement, as of its date, within the meaning of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission, but is subject to (a) completion with certain pricing and other information to be made available by the successful bidder for the College Bonds and (b) amendment. The Preliminary Official Statement, as so revised, will constitute the final "Official Statement". By the submission of bids for the College Bonds, the successful bidder contracts for the receipt, within seven (7) business days of the award of the College Bonds, of a reasonable number of copies of the final Official Statement at the expense of the County, with any additional copies of the final Official Statement that the successful bidder shall reasonably request to be provided at the sole cost and expense of the

successful bidder. In order to complete the final Official Statement, the successful bidder must furnish the following information to the County's financial advisor and Bond Counsel by email or facsimile transmission or overnight delivery received by the County's financial advisor and Bond Counsel within twenty-four (24) hours after the award of the College Bonds: (a) initial offering prices (expressed as a price, exclusive of accrued interest, or yield per maturity), and (b) any other material information necessary for the final Official Statement but not known to the County (such as the bidder's purchase of credit enhancement). In addition, the successful bidder must, if requested by the County, furnish a written confirmation of its bid.

The County will undertake to provide certain continuing disclosure in accordance with Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission. A description of this undertaking is contained in the Preliminary Official Statement under the heading "CONTINUING DISCLOSURE".

The successful bidder will be furnished at the time the College Bonds are delivered with: (1) the opinion of GluckWalrath LLP, Trenton, New Jersey, in substantially the form set forth in the Preliminary Official Statement; and (2) certificates in form satisfactory to said law firm evidencing the proper execution and delivery of the College Bonds and receipt of payment therefor and the fact that the College Bonds will not be arbitrage bonds within the meaning of the Code; and (3) a certificate, dated as of the date of delivery of the College Bonds, and signed by the officers who signed the College Bonds, stating that no litigation is then pending or to the knowledge of such officers threatened to restrain or enjoin the issuance or delivery of the College Bonds or the levy or collection of taxes to pay the College Bonds or the interest thereon, or questioning the validity of the statutes or the proceedings under which the College Bonds are issued, and that neither the corporate existence or boundaries of the County nor the title of any of said officers to their respective offices, is being contested; and (4) the County's Continuing Disclosure Certificate substantially in the form described in the Preliminary Official Statement.

The successful bidder is advised of the responsibility to file an annual disclosure statement on political contributions with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.13 (P.L. 2005, c.271, s.3) if the successful bidder receives contracts in excess of \$50,000 from public entities in a calendar year. It is the successful bidder's responsibility to determine if filing is necessary. Additional information on this requirement is available from ELEC at 888-313-3532 or at www.elec.state.nj.us.

Award of the College Bonds to the successful bidder or rejection of all bids is expected to be made within two (2) hours after announcement of the bids, but such successful bidder may not withdraw its proposal until after 5:30 p.m. of the day of such bid-opening and then only if such award has not been made prior to the withdrawal.

The County Comptroller is hereby delegated the authority (if the County Comptroller deems it to be in the best interests of the County) up to 24 hours prior to the date of advertised sale and within 4 hours after the award of the bonds, to adjust the maturity schedule of the College Bonds in increments of \$1,000, provided that (i) no maturity schedule adjustment shall exceed 10% upward or downward of the principal for any maturity as specified herein (or as adjusted prior to the date of advertised sale) and (ii) the aggregate adjustment to the maturity schedule shall not exceed 10% upward or downward of the aggregate principal amount of bonds as specified herein (or as adjusted prior to the date of advertised sale) and as adjusted will not exceed the amount authorized by the Ordinance. NOTICE OF ANY ADJUSTMENT TO THE MATURITY SCHEDULE OF THE COLLEGE BONDS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE ADVERTISED SALE SHALL BE GIVEN BY CAUSING A NOTICE THEREOF TO BE PUBLISHED ON TM3 NEWS SERVICE. The dollar amount bid by the successful bidder shall be adjusted to reflect any adjustments in the aggregate principal amount of College Bonds to be issued. The adjusted bid price will reflect changes in the dollar amount of the underwriter's discount and the original issue premium or discount, but will not change the per bond underwriter's discount as calculated from the bid and the Initial Public Offering Prices required to be delivered to the County. Notice of any such adjustment shall be given to the successful bidder in the manner specified in the Notice of Sale. In the event of any such adjustment, the dollar amount (but not the interest rate or rates) bid by the successful bidder will be adjusted as provided in the Notice of Sale.

Postponement of Sale. The County Comptroller is hereby delegated the authority (if the Chief Financial Officer deems it to be in the best interests of the County) (i) to postpone from time to time the sale of the College Bonds from the date specified in the Notice of Sale (or, in the case of a rescheduled sale, from such rescheduled date), in each case upon not less than 24 hours' notice, and (ii) to reschedule such sale upon not less than 48 hours' notice. Notice of any such postponement and rescheduling shall be given in the manner specified in the Notice of Sale. In the event of any such postponement and rescheduling, the County

Comptroller may (and shall, if required by the Local Bond Law) cause a revised Notice of Sale and/or a revised summary thereof to be prepared and published.

- Section 14. Agreements with The Depository Trust Company. The Comptroller is hereby authorized to make representations and warranties, to enter into agreements and to make all arrangements with DTC, as may be necessary in order to provide that this issue of the County's College Bonds will be eligible for deposit with DTC, and to satisfy any obligations undertaken in connection therewith.
- Section 15. Authorization for Official Statement. The Comptroller, Chief Financial Officer, Clerk of the Board of Commissioners, auditor, bond counsel and other officers, agents and employees of the County are authorized to prepare and distribute information with respect to the County in connection with the sale of the College Bonds in such form as may be approved by the Comptroller. The preparation and distribution of a Preliminary Official Statement pertaining to the College Bonds is hereby authorized. The Comptroller is hereby authorized to deem final the Preliminary Official Statement for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission. The Director of the Board of Commissioners, the County Administrator, the Chief Financial Officer and the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners are hereby authorized and directed to execute a final official statement relating to the bonds, with such changes, revisions, insertions and omissions from the Preliminary Official Statement as may be approved by the Comptroller.
- Section 16. <u>Pledge of County.</u> The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean in the State of New Jersey is hereby pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said College Bonds and said College Bonds shall be general obligations of the County payable as to principal and interest from ad valorem taxes which may be assessed on the taxable property within said County without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 17. Investment of Proceeds of College Bonds. The County will make no use of the proceeds of the College Bonds which would cause the College Bonds to be arbitrage bonds; and the County hereby imposes on itself and all officers having custody or control of the proceeds of the College Bonds, throughout the term of the College Bonds, the obligation to comply with applicable requirements of Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and Regulations Sections 1.148-0 through 1.148-11 and 1.150-1 and 1.150-2, and all other applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Service, so that the College Bonds will not be or become arbitrage bonds.
- Section 18. Tax Covenants. In order to maintain the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of interest on the College Bonds, and for no other purpose, the County covenants to comply with each applicable requirement of the Code, applicable to the bonds, and the County covenants not to take any action or fail to take any action which would cause the interest on the College Bonds to lose the exclusion from gross income for federal income taxation purposes under Section 103 of the Code. In furtherance of the covenant contained in the preceding sentence, the County agrees to comply with the Arbitrage Certificate and Letter of Instructions (the "Letter of Instructions") as to the Code delivered by Bond Counsel on the date of initial issuance and delivery of the College Bonds, as such letter may be amended from time to time, as a source of guidance for achieving compliance with the Code.

The County covenants and agrees with the holders of the bonds that the County shall not take any action or omit to take any action, which action or omission, if reasonably expected on the date of initial issuance and delivery of the College Bonds, would cause the bonds to be "private activity bonds" or "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Sections 141(a) and 148, respectively, of the Code, or any successor provision.

- Section 19. <u>Bonds Not Federally Guaranteed</u>. The County covenants that it will take no action which would cause the College Bonds to be federally guaranteed (within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code).
- Section 20. Designation of Paying Agent; Acceptance. TD Bank, National Association, Cherry Hill, New Jersey, is hereby designated to act as Paying Agent for the College Bonds. The County may at any time or from time to time by supplemental resolution appoint one or more other Paying Agents for such College Bonds. Each Paying Agent shall be a bank, trust company or national banking association doing business and having its principal office in the State of New Jersey, having trust powers, willing and able to accept the office on reasonable and customary terms and authorized by law to perform all the duties imposed upon it by this Resolution. Each Paying Agent shall signify its acceptance of the duties and obligations imposed upon it by this Resolution by executing and delivering to the County a written acceptance thereof.
- Section 21. Responsibilities of Paying Agent. The recitals of fact herein and in the College Bonds contained shall be taken as the statements of the County and the Paying Agent assumes no responsibility for the correctness of the same. The Paying Agent does not make any representations as to the validity or sufficiency of this Resolution or of any bonds issued hereunder or in respect of the security afforded by this Resolution, and shall not incur any responsibility in respect thereof. The Paying Agent shall not be under any responsibility or duty with respect to the issuance of the bonds or the application of the proceeds thereof or the application of any moneys paid to the County or others in accordance with this Resolution. The Paying Agent shall not be under any obligation or duty to perform any act which would involve it in expense or liability or to institute or defend any action or suit in respect of this Resolution or the bonds, or to advance any of its own moneys, unless properly indemnified. The Paying Agent shall not be liable in connection with the performance of its duties hereunder except for its own negligence or default.
- Section 22. Funds Held in Trust. All moneys held by the Paying Agent, as such, at any time pursuant to the terms of this Resolution shall be and hereby are assigned, transferred and set over unto the

Paying Agent in trust for the purposes and under the terms and conditions of the Resolution.

Section 23. Evidence on Which the Paying Agent May Act. The Paying Agent shall be protected in acting upon any notice, resolution, request, consent, order, certificate, opinion, bond, or other paper or document believed by it to be genuine, and to have been signed or presented by the proper party or parties. Whenever the Paying Agent shall deem it necessary or desirable that a fact or matter be proved or established prior to taking or suffering any action hereunder, such fact or matter (unless other evidence in respect thereof be herein specifically prescribed) may be deemed to be conclusively proved and established by a certificate signed by an employee or officer of the County stating the same, and such certificate shall be full warrant for any action taken or suffered in good faith under the provisions of this Resolution in reliance thereon, but in its discretion the Paying Agent may in lieu thereof accept other evidence of such fact or matter or may require such further or additional evidence as to it may seem reasonable. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, any request, order, notice or other direction required or permitted to be furnished pursuant to any provision hereof by or on behalf of the County to the Paying Agent shall be sufficiently executed if executed by an employee or officer of the County.

Section 24. Compensation and Expenses. Unless otherwise provided by contract with the Paying Agent, the County shall pay to the Paying Agent from time to time reasonable compensation for all services rendered by it hereunder, and also reimbursement for all its reasonable expenses, charges, legal and engineering fees and other disbursements and those of its attorneys, agents and employees, incurred in and about the performance of its powers and duties hereunder. The County shall indemnify and save the Paying Agent harmless against any liabilities which it may incur in the exercise and performance of its powers and duties hereunder and which are not due to its negligence or default.

Ownership of Bonds. The Paying Agent may become the owner of or may deal in Section 25. bonds as fully and with the same rights it would have if it were not the Paying Agent.

Resignation. The Paying Agent or any successor thereof may at any time resign and be discharged of its duties and obligations created by this Resolution by giving not less than sixty days' written notice to the County and mailing notice thereof, specifying the date when such resignation shall take effect, to the bondholders. Such resignation shall take effect upon the day specified in such notice unless previously a successor shall have been appointed by the County or bondholders as herein provided, in which event such resignation shall take effect immediately on the appointment of such successor.

Removal. The Paying Agent, or any successor thereof, may be removed at any time by the holders of a majority in principal amount of the bonds then outstanding, excluding any bonds held by or for the account of the County, by an instrument or concurrent instruments in writing signed and duly acknowledged by such bondholders or by their attorneys duly authorized in writing and delivered to the County. The County may remove the Paying Agent at any time, for such cause as shall be determined in the sole discretion of the County by filing with the Paying Agent an instrument signed by an officer of the County and by mailing notice thereof to bondholders.

Appointment of Successor. In case the Paying Agent, or any successor thereof, shall resign or shall be removed or shall become incapable of acting, or shall be adjudged a bankrupt or insolvent, or if a receiver, liquidator or conservator of the Paying Agent or of its property shall be appointed, or if any public officer shall take charge or control of the Paying Agent or of its property or affairs, a successor may be appointed by the holders of a majority in principal amount of the bonds then outstanding, excluding any bonds held by or for the account of the County, by an instrument or concurrent instruments in writing signed by such bondholders or their attorneys duly authorized in writing and delivered to such successor Paying Agent, notification thereof being given to the County and the predecessor Paying Agent. Pending such appointment, the County shall forthwith appoint a Paying Agent to fill such vacancy until a successor Paying Agent (if any) shall be appointed by bondholders as herein authorized. The County shall mail notice to bondholders of any such appointment within twenty days after such appointment. Any successor Paying Agent appointed by the County shall, immediately and without further act, be superseded by a Paying Agent appointed by the bondholders. If in a proper case no appointment of a successor Paying Agent shall be made pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this Section within forty-five days after the Paying Agent shall have given to the County written notice of resignation as provided in Section 26 hereof or after the occurrence of any other event requiring or authorizing such appointment, the Paying Agent or any bondholder may apply to any court of competent jurisdiction to appoint a successor. Said court may thereupon, after such notice, if any, as said court may deem proper and prescribe, appoint such successor Paying Agent. Any Paying Agent appointed under the provisions of this Section shall be a bank or trust company or a national banking association, doing business and having its principal office in the State of New Jersey and authorized by law to perform all the duties imposed upon it by this Resolution.

Transfer of Rights and Property to Successor. Any successor Paying Agent Section 29. appointed hereunder shall execute, acknowledge and deliver to its predecessor Paying Agent and also to the County, an instrument accepting such appointment, and thereupon such successor Paying Agent without any further act, deed or conveyance, shall become fully vested with all moneys, estates, properties, rights, powers, duties and obligations of such predecessor Paying Agent, but the Paying Agent ceasing to act shall nevertheless, on the written request of the County or of the successor Paying Agent, execute, acknowledge and deliver such instruments of conveyance and further assurances and do such other things as may reasonably be required for more fully and certainly vesting and confirming in such successor Paying Agent all the right, title and interest of the predecessor Paying Agent in and to any property held by it under this Resolution, and shall pay over, assign and deliver to the successor Paying Agent any money or other property subject to the trusts and conditions

herein set forth. Should any deed, conveyance or instrument in writing from the County be required by such successor Paying Agent for more fully and certainly vesting in and confirming to such successor Paying Agent any such moneys, estates, properties, rights, powers and duties, any and all such deeds, conveyances and instruments in writing shall, on request, and so far as may be authorized by law, be executed, acknowledged and delivered by the County. Any such successor Paying Agent shall promptly notify the other Paying Agent of its appointment as such Paying Agent.

Section 30 Merger or Consolidation. Any company into which the Paying Agent may be merged or converted or with which it may be consolidated or any company resulting from any merger, conversion or consolidation to which it shall be a party or any company to which the Paying Agent or a court of competent jurisdiction may sell or transfer all or substantially all of its corporate trust business, shall be the successor to the Paying Agent without the execution or filing of any paper or the performance of any further act; provided that such company shall be a bank or trust company or national banking association which is qualified to be a successor to the Paying Agent under Section 28 hereof and shall be authorized by law to perform all the duties imposed upon it by this Resolution.

Continuing Disclosure. A Continuing Disclosure Certificate in substantially the following form is hereby approved, and the County Comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver a Continuing Disclosure Certificate on behalf of the County in substantially such form, with such insertions and changes therein as the County Comptroller may approve, such approval to be evidenced by his/her execution thereof:

CONTINUING DISCLOSURE CERTIFICATE

This Continuing Disclosure Certificate (the "Disclosure Certificate") is executed and delivered by the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Issuer") in connection with the issuance by the Issuer of \$ principal amount of its College Capital Improvement Bonds, Series 2021 (the "Bonds"). The Bonds are being issued pursuant to a Bond Ordinance (the "Ordinance") duly adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the Issuer (the "Board") on July 7, 2021, and a resolution duly adopted by the Board on September 14, 2021 (the "Resolution"). The Bonds are dated October ___, 2021 and shall mature on August 1 in the years 2022 through 2026, inclusive. The Issuer covenants and agrees as follows:

Purpose of the Disclosure Certificate. This Disclosure Certificate is being executed and delivered by the Issuer for the benefit of the Bondholders and Beneficial Owners of the Bonds and in order to assist the Participating Underwriter in complying with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as the same may be amended from time to time ("Exchange Act").

<u>Definitions</u>. In addition to the definitions set forth in the Resolution, which apply to Section 2. any capitalized term used in this Disclosure Certificate unless otherwise defined in this Section, the following capitalized terms shall have the following meanings:

"Annual Report" shall mean any Annual Report provided by the Issuer pursuant to, and as described in, Sections 3 and 4 of this Disclosure Certificate.

"Beneficial Owner" shall mean any person which (a) has the power, directly or indirectly, to vote or consent with respect to, or to dispose of ownership of, any Bonds (including persons holding Bonds through nominees, depositories or other intermediaries), or (b) is treated as the owner of any Bonds for federal income tax purposes.

"Bondholder" shall mean any person who is the registered owner of any Bond, including holders of beneficial interests in the Bonds.

"Continuing Disclosure Information" shall mean: (i) the Annual Report; (ii) any notice required to be filed with the Repositories pursuant to Section 5 hereof; and (iii) any notice of an event required to be filed with the Repositories pursuant to Section 3(c) hereof.

"Dissemination Agent" shall mean the Issuer, or any successor Dissemination Agent designated in writing by the Issuer and which has filed with the Issuer a written acceptance of such designation.

"EMMA" shall mean the Electronic Municipal Market Access System ("EMMA"), an internet based filing system created and maintained by the MSRB in accordance with the SEC Release, pursuant to which issuers of tax-exempt bonds, including the Bonds, and other filers on behalf of the such issuers shall upload Continuing Disclosure Information to assist underwriters in complying with the Rule and to provide the general public with access to such Continuing Disclosure Information.

"Financial Obligation" means a (i) debt obligation; (ii) derivative instrument entered into in connection with, or pledged as security or a source of payment for, an existing or planned debt obligation; or (iii) guarantee of (i) or (ii). The term "Financial Obligation" shall not include municipal securities as to which a final official statement has been provided to the MSRB consistent with the Rule.

"Listed Events" shall mean any of the events listed in Section 5(a) of this Disclosure Certificate.

"MSRB" shall mean the Municipal Bonds Rulemaking Board established pursuant to Section 15B(b)(1) of the Exchange Act.

"National Repository" shall mean the MSRB, through the internet facilities of EMMA, or any other public or private repository or entity that shall hereafter be designated by the SEC as a repository for purposes of the Rule.

"Official Statement" shall mean the Official Statement of the County, dated relating to the Bonds.

"Participating Underwriter" shall mean any of the original underwriters of the Bonds required to comply with the Rule in connection with offering of the Bonds.

"Repository" or "Repositories" shall mean each National Repository and each State Repository, if any.

"Rule" shall mean Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) adopted by the SEC under the Exchange Act, as the same may be amended from time to time.

"SEC Release" shall mean Release No. 34-59062, of the SEC, dated December 5, 2008.

"State" shall mean the State of New Jersey.

"State Repository" shall mean any public or private repository or entity designated by the State as a state repository for the purpose of the Rule and recognized as such by the SEC. As of the date of this Disclosure Certificate, there is no State Repository.

Section 3. Provision of Annual Reports.

- The Issuer shall, or shall cause the Dissemination Agent to, not later than nine (9) months after the end of its fiscal year, commencing with the report for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2021, provide to the MSRB in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB, an Annual Report which is consistent with the requirements of Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate. The Annual Report may be submitted as a single document or as separate documents comprising a package, and may cross-reference other information as provided in Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate; provided that the audited financial statements of the Issuer may be submitted separately from the balance of the Annual Report and later than the date required above for the filing of the Annual Report if they are not available by that date. If the Issuer's fiscal year changes, it shall give notice of such change to MSRB. Any and all items that must be included in the Annual Report may be incorporated by reference from other information that is available to the public on the MSRB's Internet Web site, or that has been filed with the SEC.
- Not later than fifteen (15) Business Days prior to the date specified in subsection (a) for making available or providing the Annual Report, the Issuer shall provide the Annual Report to the Dissemination Agent (if other than the Issuer). If the Issuer is unable to provide to the MSRB an Annual Report by the date required in subsection (a), the Issuer shall, in a timely manner, send a notice to the MSRB in substantially the form attached as Exhibit A, in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB. All documents provided to the MSRB shall be accompanied by identifying information as prescribed by the MSRB.
- The Dissemination Agent shall file a report with the Issuer certifying that the Annual Report has been provided to the MSRB pursuant to this Disclosure Agreement, stating the date it was provided.
- Section 4. Content of Annual Reports. The Issuer's Annual Report shall contain or include by reference the following:
 - The audited financial statements of the Issuer for the prior fiscal year, prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards (GAAS) as from time to time in effect, and as prescribed by the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State pursuant to Chapter 5 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes. If the Issuer's audited financial statements are not available by the time the Annual Report is required to be filed pursuant to Section 3(a), the Annual Report shall contain unaudited financial statements and the audited financial statements shall be filed in the same manner as the Annual Report when they become available.
 - The financial information and operating data set forth in the Official Statement (including Appendix A thereto) dated _ , 2021 prepared in connection with the sale of the Bonds, under the captions: "Schedule of Bond and Note Maturities", "Tax Information", "Ocean County Leading Tax Ratables - 2021", "County of Ocean Statement of Statutory Debt Condition June ____, 2021" and "Debt Ratios". 5, 2021", "List of Authorized Debt as of_

Section 5. Reporting of Significant Events.

Pursuant to the provisions of this Section 5, the Issuer shall give, or cause to be (a) given, notice of the occurrence of any of the following events with respect to the Bonds:

- 1. principal and interest payment delinquencies;
- non-payment related defaults, if material;
- 3 unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;
- 4. unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties;
- 5. substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
- 6. adverse tax opinions, the issuance by the Internal Revenue Service of proposed or final determinations of taxability. Notices of Proposed Issue (IRS Form 5701-TEB) or other material notices or determinations with respect to the tax status of the security, or others material events affecting the tax status of the Bonds;
- 7. modifications to rights of Bondholders, if material;
- 8. Bond Calls, if material and tender offers;
- 9 defeasances:
- 10. release, substitution, or sale of property securing repayment of the Bonds, if material;
- 11. rating changes.
- 12. bankruptcy, insolvency, receivership or similar events of the Issuer, which shall be considered to occur when any of the following occur: the appointment of a receiver, fiscal agent or similar officer for the Issuer in a proceeding under the U.S. Bankruptcy Code or in any other proceeding under state or federal law in which a court or governmental authority has assumed jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the Issuer, or if such jurisdiction has been assumed by leaving the existing governing body and officials or officers in possession but subject to the supervision and orders of a court or governmental authority, or the entry of an order confirming a plan of reorganization, arrangement or liquidation by a court or governmental authority having supervision or jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the Issuer;
- 13. the consummation of a merger, consolidation, or acquisition involving the Issuer or the sale of all or substantially all of the assets of the Issuer, other than in the ordinary course of business, the entry into a definitive agreement to undertake such an action or the termination of a definitive agreement relating to any such actions, other than pursuant to its terms, if material;

- If disclosure of a Listed Event is required, the Issuer shall, in a timely manner not in excess of ten business days after the occurrence of the event, file a notice of such occurrence with the MSRB in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB. All documents provided to the MSRB shall be accompanied by identifying information as prescribed by the MSRB.
- Termination of Reporting Obligation. The Issuer's obligations under this Disclosure Certificate shall terminate upon the legal defeasance, prior redemption or payment in full of all of the Bonds. If such termination occurs prior to the final maturity of the Bonds, the Issuer shall give notice of such termination in the same manner as for a Listed Event under Section 5(c).
- Dissemination Agent. The Issuer may, from time to time, appoint or engage a Section 7. Dissemination Agent to assist it in carrying out its obligations under this Disclosure Certificate, and may discharge any such Dissemination Agent, with or without appointing a successor Dissemination Agent. The Dissemination Agent shall not be responsible in any manner for the content of any notice or report prepared by the Issuer pursuant to this Disclosure Certificate. The initial Dissemination Agent shall be the Issuer.
- Amendment; Waiver. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Disclosure Section 8. Certificate, the Issuer may amend this Disclosure Certificate, and any provision of this Disclosure Certificate {00274462;v3/94-63-/072}

may be waived, provided that the following conditions are satisfied:

- If the amendment or waiver relates to the provisions of Section 3(a), 4 or 5(a), it may only be made in connection with a change in circumstances that arises from a change in legal requirements, change in law, or change in the identity, nature or status of an obligated person with respect to the Bonds, or the type of business conducted;
- The undertaking, as amended or taking into account such waiver, would, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, have complied with the requirements of the Rule at the time of the original issuance of the Bonds, after taking into account any amendments or interpretations of the Rule, as well as any change in circumstances; and
- The amendment or waiver does not, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, materially impair the interests of the Bondholders or Beneficial Owners of the Bonds.

In the event of any amendment or waiver of a provision of this Disclosure Certificate, the Issuer shall describe such amendment in the next Annual Report, and shall include, as applicable, a narrative explanation of the reason for the amendment or waiver and its impact on the type (or in the case of a change of accounting principles, on the presentation) of financial information or operating data being presented by the Issuer. In addition, if the amendment relates to the accounting principles to be followed in preparing financial statements, (i) notice of such change shall be given in the same manner as for a Listed Event under Section 5(c), and (ii) the Annual Report for the year in which the change is made should present a comparison (in narrative form and also, if feasible, in quantitative form) between the financial statements as prepared on the basis of the new accounting principles and those prepared on the basis of the former accounting principles.

Additional Information. Nothing in this Disclosure Certificate shall be deemed to prevent the Issuer from disseminating any other information, using the means of dissemination set forth in this Disclosure Certificate or any other means of communication, or including any other information in any notice of occurrence of a Listed Event, in addition to that which is required by this Disclosure Certificate. WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners seek to ensure a workplace where employees can exercise their religious beliefs and practices; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to set forth the procedures employees must follow to request a reasonable accommodation for religious purposes:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, on this 14th day of September, 2021, the County of Ocean Religious Accommodation Policy which is attached to this Resolution is hereby adopted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution, and the County of Ocean Religious Accommodation Policy, shall be sent to the County Administrator, all Department Heads, all collective bargaining majority representatives, and provided to all current and future County Employees.

COUNTY OF OCEAN RELIGIOUS ACCOMMODATION POLICY

I. **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to set forth the procedure by which employees may request a reasonable accommodation for religious purposes in accordance with Title VII of Federal Law and New Jersey's Law Against Discrimination.

H. **POLICY**

The County of Ocean is committed to respecting the religious beliefs and practices of all employees. As part of this commitment, the County of Ocean will make good faith efforts to provide reasonable religious accommodations to employees whose sincerely held religious practices or beliefs conflict with a County policy, procedure, or other employment requirement, unless such an accommodation would create an undue hardship. An undue hardship is a significant expense or difficulty placed on the County of Ocean. This may include accommodations that are unduly expensive, disruptive, interfere with the essential functions of the employee's job, or would alter the operational needs of the County.

An accommodation may be a change in job, using paid leave or leave without pay, allowing an exception to the dress and appearance code that does not affect safety requirements, or for other aspects of employment. The County will consider religious accommodations requests by employees based on the totality of the circumstances.

The County of Ocean prohibits discrimination, harassment, and retaliation on the basis of religion. For more information, refer to the County of Ocean Policy Against Discrimination and Harassment.

PROCEDURES FOR REQUESTING ACCOMMODATION III.

- A. Requesting a Religious Accommodation: An employee whose religious beliefs or practices conflict with his or her job, with County's policy or practice on dress and appearance, or with other aspects of employment, and who seeks a religious accommodation must submit a written request for the accommodation to his or her immediate supervisor. The written request will include the type of religious conflict that exists and the employee's suggested accommodation.
- Evaluation of the request by Immediate Supervisor: The immediate В. supervisor will evaluate the request considering whether a work conflict exists due to a sincerely held religious belief or practice and whether an accommodation is available that is reasonable and that would not create an undue hardship on County's business. Depending on the type of conflict and suggested accommodation, the supervisor may confer with his or her manager and with the Director of Employee Relations.
- C. Meeting between employee requesting religious accommodation and Immediate Supervisor: The supervisor and employee will meet within ten (10) days of the written request to discuss the employee's request. After speaking with the employee, the immediate supervisor shall render a decision and offer an accommodation if possible. Within seventy-two (72) hours of the meeting, the immediate supervisor shall set forth in writing the proposed accommodation and provide same to the employee. If the employee accepts the proposed religious accommodation, the immediate supervisor will implement the decision.

Supervisors shall document the meeting, including but not limited to the date(s), time of meeting, location, persons present, details of the employee's request, details of alternatives proposed; and the decision on the requested outcome. This documentation shall be provided to Director of Employee Relations and shall be maintained in the employee's personnel file.

D. Appeal by employee to Department Head: Following the meeting between the employee requesting a religious accommodation and the immediate supervisor, if the employee is not satisfied with the immediate supervisor's proposed accommodation, the employee may reject same. Upon rejection of the proposed accommodation, the employee may appeal, in writing, to the Department Head. In the written appeal, the employee shall provide all documents and information, as well the written decision from the immediate supervisor.

E. Meeting between employee requesting religious accommodation and Department Head: The department head and employee will meet within ten (10) days of the filed written appeal to discuss the employee's request. During this meeting, the employee will present information in support of the sought after accommodation and why the accommodation proposed by the immediate supervisor is unsatisfactory. The department head shall consider the information presented and discuss with the employee any other alternative accommodations. Within seventy-two (72) hours of the conclusion of the meeting, the department head shall provide to the employee, in writing, a proposed accommodation. If the employee accepts the proposed religious accommodation, the immediate supervisor will implement the decision.

Department Heads shall document the meeting, including but not limited to the date(s), time of meeting, location, persons present, details of the employee's request, details of alternatives proposed; and the decision on the requested outcome. This documentation shall be provided to Director of Employee Relations and shall be maintained in the employee's personnel file

- Appeal by employee to Director of Employee Relations: Following the F. meeting between the employee and the department head, if the employee is not satisfied with the department head's proposed accommodation, the Upon rejection of the proposed employee may reject same. accommodation, the employee may appeal in writing to the Department Head. In the written appeal, the employee shall provide all documents and information, as well the written decisions from the immediate supervisor and department head.
- Meeting between employee requesting religious accommodation and G. Director of Employee Relations: The Director of Employee Relations and employee will meet within ten (10) days of the filed written appeal to discuss the employee's request. During this meeting, the employee will present information in support of the sought after accommodation and why the accommodation proposed by the immediate supervisor and department head are unsatisfactory. The Director of Employee Relations shall consider the information presented and discuss with the employee any other alternative accommodations. Within seventy-two (72) hours of the conclusion of the meeting, the Director of Employee Relations shall provide to the employee a proposed accommodation. There shall be no appeal of the Director of Employee Relations' decision regarding the proposed accommodation.

Director of Employee Relations shall document the meeting, including but not limited to the date(s), time of meeting, location, persons present, details of the employee's request, details of alternatives proposed; and the decision

on the requested outcome. This documentation shall be maintained in the employee's personnel file.

H. Factors to be considered in determining a reasonable accommodation request: Reasonable accommodations will be determined on a case-by-case basis. Factors that are considered in this determination include the nature of the accommodation requested, the duration of the request, alternative accommodations, the impact on the operation of the department/unit, and the ability of the individual to perform the essential functions of the position if the accommodation is granted.

IV. NO RETALIATION

The County takes its anti-discrimination and anti-harassment policy seriously. There shall be no retaliation of adverse job action taken against any employee based upon the employee's request for an accommodation or rejection of a proposed accommodation.

V. DISSEMINATION

The County shall distribute this policy or a summarized notice of it, to all of its employees, including part-time and seasonal employees. This Policy shall be provided to all new employees upon start of employment. Further, this policy shall be posted on the County's online Employee Portal.

Director Quinn and Mr. Agliata presented two properties recommended for acquisition by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee. The first is a 9.33-acre property in Brick Township off Princeton Avenue. The property owners accepted a negotiated offer of \$1,250,000.00. The County is being asked to provide \$600,000.00, the Township \$400,000.00, and TPL/Green Acres will provide \$250,000.00 toward the acquisition. The Township will be responsible for maintaining the property after closing. The second property recommended for acquisition by the NLTFAC is a 2.92-acre property located in the Township of Lacey. The owners accepted a negotiated offer in the amount of \$9,000.00. The property is adjacent to over 1,200 acres of NLTF open space known as the Roosevelt City project area. Acquisition of this property will further support wildlife Introduced Open September 14,2021 and enable the County to vacate streets and consolidate its Official Repolitions. 2027 1982 NLTFAC has also recommended the acceptance of a 40-acre property donation located off Route 9 Atlantic City Blvd. in Berkeley Township. The property is

adjacent to a 745-acre property known as NJ Pulverizing. The Barnegat Branch Rail Trail runs through the middle of this property. Commissioner Vicari asked if the land had been tested for pollution since it is near the OC Utilities Authority. Mark Villinger reported that the land is clean, and could be expanded upon in the future if the County so desired.

Commissioner Little shared the latest coronavirus statistics for Ocean County. There were 145 new cases creating a cumulative total of 68,603. There were two new deaths totaling 2,025. Twenty towns were affected with at least one case. The three towns with the highest number of cases were Toms River with 18, Jackson with 18, and Lakewood with 16. The Health Department performed 134 tests over the last 7 days, totaling 29,872 to date. 42 tests were performed at Southern Regional, 63 at the Health Department, and 46 at Great Adventure. Commissioner Little reported that there has been an increase in requests for the Pfizer vaccine. There have been 790 breakthrough cases in Ocean County, 139 of them in the last week alone. Of those 790 cases, only two have been hospitalized.

Commissioner Vicari mentioned that August is National Immunization Awareness Month. The Ocean County Library system has exhibits on display explaining various facts on viruses and vaccinations.

Commissioner Kelly notified the Board that the County lost the appeal in the Federal Immigrant Trust Directive suit. The case will now be heard in NJ State court, where the County hopes to find success. Directive 2018-6 states that if the County releases an illegal immigrant from custody, and there are federal charges pending, we may not notify the federal authorities of the inmate's release. Commissioner Kelly is very frustrated by this directive, because the County had always been able to cooperate with Federal authorities in the past. Mr. Sahradnik will continue pursuing the lawsuit at the State level. The Board agreed.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included adding a no passing zone on Motor Rd. in Pine Beach. The expansion of Route 9 is finally under investigation. There will be pedestrian upgrades, and the number of lanes will be increased. There will be a briefing after September 7, 2021. Commissioner Kelly is very pleased that the project seems to be moving forward. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the August 18, 2021 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of August 18, 2021. There were no questions or comments.

Director Quinn asked the Board members for comments.

Commission or Vicari acknowledged local baseball player Todd Frazier for winning Adopted the Olympiemsilver Predal for Team USA Baseball. He mentioned that he was a Little Official Resolution#: 2021001326 League World Series winner, Toms River South graduate, Major League Baseball player, and a two time member of the All-Star Team.

There were no additional comments.

Mr. Block notified the Board that the 1027 Hooper Avenue project is under construction. The Toms River Caudina redevelopment zone will be the new location for the Federal VA Clinic. The County is discussing with Toms River Township the logistics of having an exit from our 1027 Hooper Avenue project onto Caudina Avenue.

With the Board's permission, Mr. Block said that the Voting Machine and e-Poll Book resolutions will be on the August 18, 2021 agenda, pending receipt of the RFP's. The items need to be ordered as soon as possible to ensure ample time for training. E-Poll Books will be used for early voting and the general election as well. The County may also need to purchase routers if the State does not supply them, to allow poll book information to be uploaded directly and enable connectivity between devices. The new voting machines will only be utilized for early voting.

Ms. Cilento read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Vicari, seconded by Commissioner Little, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:41pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Deputy Director Little opened the meeting by wishing Administrator Carl Block a Happy 70th Birthday, and by presenting Commissioner Vicari a proclamation commemorating the Vicari's 50th wedding anniversary, both on August 21.

Deputy Director Little has decided to reinstate an ongoing coronavirus planning meeting to discuss COVID-19 policies and procedures going forward. Commissioner Little said Ocean County will be planning for the third round of shots to be administered. The third vaccination can be administered 80 days after the second shot. There were 164 new cases, 20% of those were breakthrough cases (fully vaccinated for over one month, Introduced on: Contracted on: 70,558 positive cases and 2050 deaths have been recorded official risk (Cocan 2020 official risk (Cocan 2020

a cumulative total of 5,268 cases; and 712 deaths. The Health Department has administered 111,790 vaccines at various clinics throughout the County. There have been 1,238 confirmed breakthrough cases. 19% of all new cases have already been vaccinated. In the last week, there were 186 new breakthrough cases. 153 were ill, 11 were hospitalized, one was critical, but none have passed away.

Commissioner Vicari mentioned that the best weapon against the virus is information. The Ocean County Library will be continuing their COVID-19 information sessions through September. They will be providing patrons with Science based information and handouts related to the virus. Commissioner Vicari extended his thanks to the staff at all County hospitals who are responsible to service over 1.3 million visitors during the summer months.

Commissioner Kelly and Julie Tarrant discussed the 2021 Bond Sale. Ocean County will be issuing \$26,005,000 in new bonds, including \$21,795,000 General Obligation Bonds, as well as \$4,210,000 in Chapter 12 College Bonds, of which the principal and interest are paid by the State. These bonds will be used to fund various road construction and bridge replacement projects, renovations and repairs to 129 Hooper Avenue, and Ocean County College's new Administration Building which will be funded by the State, County, and the College itself. There will be an online bond auction on Tuesday, September 21, 2021. Bonds are free from NJ tax. Ms. Tarrant expects to maintain the County's AAA Bond rating.

Mr. Ernst and Commissioner Kelly reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for the reconstruction and resurfacing of portions of certain county roads in Lakewood, Brick, Manchester and Toms River, Contract 2020D. The County will do a resolution in support of Point Pleasant Beach's Safe Route to School Grant Program Funding, and Jackson Township's new traffic signal at New Central Avenue. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the September 1, 2021 Board meeting.

Commissioner Kelly asked John Ernst if the county would be contributing to the construction cost for the Toms River downtown redevelopment plan. Mr. Ernst said that Toms River received a \$5.6 million federal build grant. Ocean County did the survey to determine needed upgrades. The developers will be responsible for any additional costs.
