Courting Success

It all started back in 1965, when Joel Pritchard a U.S. Congressman from Washington State and Bill Bell, his friend and a successful businessman, returned to Pritchard's home on Bainbridge Island, WA (near Seattle) to find their families sitting around with nothing to do. The property had an old badminton court so Pritchard and Bell looked for some badminton equipment and could not find a full set of rackets. They improvised and started playing with ping-pong paddles and a perforated plastic ball. The following weekend, Barney McCallum was introduced to the game at Pritchard's home. Soon, the three men created rules, relying heavily on badminton. They kept in mind the original purpose, which was to provide a game that the whole family could play together, according to USAPicklelball.org.

Nearly six decades later, Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in the United States and during the last four years it has grown 224.5% the USA Pickleball organization noted.

"Ocean County is certainly part of the pickleball movement," said Ocean County Commissioner Virginia E. Haines, Chairwoman of the Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation. "While the growth of the game continues to increase, we are making every effort to meet the interest of our residents eager to play."

Ocean County is working on increasing the number of pickleball courts at Ocean County parks whether creating new courts or converting older tennis courts into pickleball or multi-use courts.

"We provide the opportunity for all sports but pickleball seems to be the one that people really want to play," Haines said. "Like USAPickleball.org says, it's a great sport for beginners, easy to learn, social and fun."

A recent visit to the new Pickleball Court at Ocean County Park brought out an enthusiastic group that could not have been happier with the new outdoor courts.

"This is what we want to see," Haines said. "Our parks are for the enjoyment of everyone."

In order to meet the Pickleball needs of residents, Ocean County converted two tennis courts into six pickleball courts at Ocean County Park in Lakewood. A combination pickleball/tennis court has also been added and resurfacing of the additional seven tennis courts there is also taking place.

At Tip Seaman County Park in Tuckerton, the County converted two tennis courts into six pickleball courts and also resurfaced four tennis courts. The courts at Beaver Dam County Park, Point Pleasant, also were resurfaced in order to create one combination court and one tennis court.

"Pickleball courts are available at Jakes Branch County Park in Beachwood with two combination pickleball/tennis courts and two tennis courts," Haines said. "The popularity of the game, which certainly has come a long way since the days when it started out with a badminton set and a plastic ball in Washington State, has us looking at other areas that we can construct pickleball courts."

She added that the new county park that will be constructed in Manchester Township also will include pickleball courts.

The courts are open to the public, free of charge, when the parks are open which is from dawn to dusk daily.

"We do not require reservations for courts however we do ask players, if the courts are full to rotate out to give others who are waiting an opportunity to play," Haines said.

She added anyone wanting to learn how to play pickleball can check the Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation's program guide for opportunities on learning how to play or improving ones skills.

"We are pleased to offer our residents the chance to be part of the fastest growing sport in the U.S.," Haines said. "The sport offers enjoyment for the entire family. It's a great way to exercise and enjoy the outdoors at many of our county parks."

Bird Feeder Bandit or Fantastic Forester?



Eastern Gray Squirrels are mammals that have the knack to delight or dismay. These agile, problem-solving rodents are among a group of more than 200 species of squirrels world-wide. Often best known for their acrobatic antics or seemingly indecisive nature when crossing a road, gray squirrels play an important role in what's known as seed dispersal. As winter approaches, squirrels carry their food and bury it in several locations. They hide more food than they will recover and eat. The forgotten nuts and seeds will eventually sprout leading to a natural method of replanting forests.

Squirrel "Digs"

Gray squirrels will use old woodpecker holes or natural tree cavities as dens to live in and raise young. Gray squirrels will also build large nests composed of leaves and twigs. Generally, dens are made at least 20 feet off the ground. Gray squirrels are often social and will share their nests with other gray squirrels during certain times of the year.



On The Menu.....

Considered omnivores, gray squirrels primary foods are nuts, flowers, seeds, incests, mushrooms...and let's not forget your backyard bird feeder!

Fun Facts

-Gray squirrels are very vocal animals that use a variety of calls, including harsh squalls, warning barks, chucks, mews, purrs, and tooth chattering, to communicate with other squirrels.

-Eastern gray squirrels typically live up to 3 years in the wild, though some wild squirrels have been found to reach the ripe age of 13.

- 1. Recreation personnel in charge of each program will have the final decision in all matters, especially where participant safety is concerned.
- 2. Due to the strenuous nature of some of our activities, recreation personnel reserve the right to deny a participant entry into a program. If the participant has already paid a fee, this fee will be reimbursed in accordance with our refund/credit policy.
- 3. Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited on all recreational programs.
- 4. All participants and their guardians must realize there may be some unavoidable hazards involved in all recreation programs. At the start of the program you will be asked to sign a Waiver of Liability Form, which is mandatory in order to attend the program and must be signed.
- 5. It is the participant's or guardian's responsibility to inform staff members of any medical problems that may inhibit your participation in a program. Please consult your doctor if you are not sure.
- 6. Please be advised that all return times are approximate. The actual times depends on the ability of the participants, prevailing weather, field conditions, and unforeseen circumstances.
- 7. All children under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult, except programs specifically designed for young children.
- 8. Age range for programs have been designated according to program content and will be strictly adhered to.
- 9. WARNING! Ticks may be present on all outdoor programs. To protect yourself from Lyme Disease, we recommend participants spray clothing with insect repellent which contains DEET, wear light color clothes, tuck pants into your boots or socks, always change clothes as soon as you return home and check yourself over closely for ticks. Deer ticks are present all year round.
- 10. WARNING! The rabies epidemic is present throughout the state. For your safety, please enjoy wildlife from a distance, report any wildlife behaving strangely to park staff.


